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### Materials

1 panel	Animal Squares Panel - Multi (A)	6615-44
1 2/3 yards (1.53m)	Plaid - Red/Brown (B)	6616-88*
1/3 yard (0.31m)	Cardinals - White/Red (C)	6620-48
1/2 yard (0.46m)	Feathers - Brown (D)	6621-33
5/8 yard (0.58m)	Pinecones - Brown (E)	6619-33
3/4 yard (0.69m)	Branches - Brown/Cream (F)	6618-34
1/4 yard (0.23m)	Plaid - Green/Red (G)	6616-66
1 3/4 yards (1.61m)	Wood Texture - Cream (H)	6617-44
2 yards (1.83m)	Wildlife Allover - Multi (I)	6622-44
1/4 yard (0.23m)	Feathers - Red (J)	6621-88
5 yards (4.58m)	Branches - Green/Cream (Backing)	6618-64

\*Includes binding

### Cutting Instructions

*Please note: All strips are cut across the width of fabric (WOF) from selvage to selvage edge unless otherwise noted.*

#### From the Animal Squares Panel - Multi (A):

- Fussy cut (12) 9" x 7 1/2" blocks.

#### From the Plaid - Red/Brown (B), cut:

- (5) 1 3/4" x WOF strips. Sub-cut strips into (24) 1 3/4" x 7 1/2" strips.
- (8) 2 1/2" x WOF strips. Sub-cut strips into (24) 2 1/2" x 11 1/2" strips.
- (2) 1 1/4" x WOF strips. Sub-cut strips into (6) 1 1/4" x 7 1/2" strips.
- (2) 2" x WOF strips. Sub-cut strips into (6) 2" x 10 1/2" strips.
- (8) 2 1/2" x WOF strips for the binding.

#### From the Cardinals - White/Red (C), cut:

- (2) 4 1/2" x WOF strips. Sub-cut strips into (15) 4 1/2" squares.

#### From the Feathers - Brown (D), cut:

- (7) 2" x WOF strips. Sub-cut strips into (60) 2" x 4 1/2" strips.

#### From the Pinecones - Brown (E), cut:

- (3) 2" x WOF strips. Sub-cut strips into (60) 2" squares.
- (4) 1 1/2" x WOF strips. Sew the strips together end to end with diagonal seams and cut (2) 1 1/2" x 63 1/2" strips.
- (3) 1 1/2" x WOF strips. Sew the strips together end to end with diagonal seams and cut (2) 1 1/2" x 55 1/2" strips.

#### From the Branches - Brown/Cream (F), cut:

- (12) 2" x WOF strips. Sub-cut strips into (60) 2" x 7 1/2" strips.

#### From the Plaid - Green/Red (G), cut:

- (3) 2" x WOF strips. Sub-cut strips into (60) 2" squares.

#### From the Wood Texture - Cream (H), cut:

- (2) 2" x 60 1/2" Length of Fabric (LOF) strips.
- (2) 2" x 53 1/2" WOF strips from the remaining fabric, piece as needed.

#### From the Wildlife Allover - Multi (I), cut:

- (2) 6 1/2" x 65 1/2" LOF strips.
- (2) 6 1/2" x 55 1/2" WOF strips from the remaining fabric, piece as needed.
- From the remaining fabric, cut (3) 9" x 7 1/2" strips.

#### From the Feathers - Red (J), cut:

- (1) 6 1/2" x WOF strip. Sub-cut strip into (4) 6 1/2" squares.

#### From the Branches - Green/Cream (Backing), cut:

- (2) 85" x WOF strips for the backing. Sew the strips together and trim to make the 75" x 85" back.

### Block Assembly

*Note: Pay attention to the unit orientations when assembling the various components. Use a 1/4" seam allowance with right sides together (RST) unless otherwise noted.*

1. Sew (1) 1 3/4" x 7 1/2" Fabric B strip to each side (1) 9" x 7 1/2" Fabric A block. Sew (1) 2 1/2" x 11 1/2" Fabric B strip to the top and to the bottom of the Fabric A block to make (1) Block One (Fig. 1). **Trim the block to measure 10 1/2" square.** Repeat to make (12) Block Ones total.

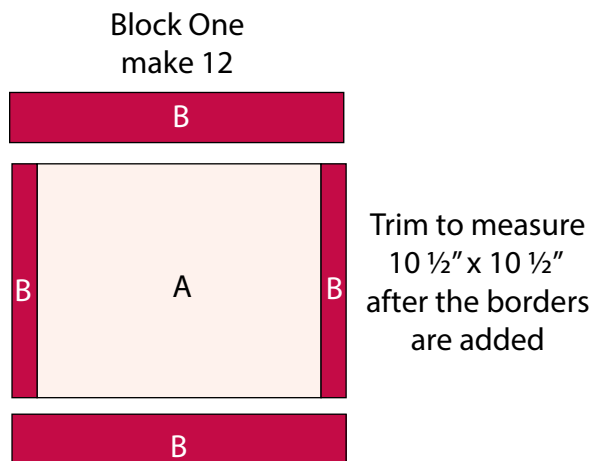

2. Sew (1)  $1\frac{1}{4}$ " x  $7\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric B strip to each side of (1)  $9$ " x  $7\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric I strip. Sew (1)  $2$ " x  $10\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric B strip to the top and to the bottom of the Fabric I square to make (1)  $10\frac{1}{2}$ " Block Two square (Fig. 2). Repeat to make (3) Block Twos total.

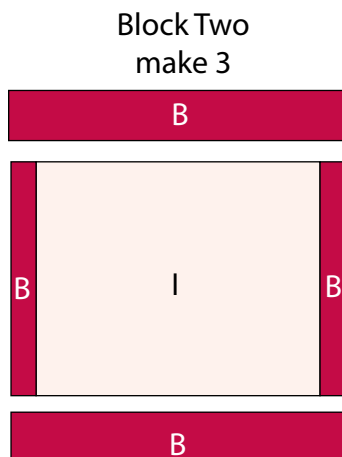

3. Sew (1)  $2$ " Fabric E square to each end of (1)  $2$ " x  $4\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric D strip to make the top row. Repeat to make the bottom row. Sew (1)  $2$ " x  $4\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric D strip to each side of (1)  $4\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric C square lengthwise to make the middle row. Sew together the (3) rows lengthwise to make (1)  $7\frac{1}{2}$ " Unit 1 square (Fig. 3). Repeat to make (15) Unit 1 squares total.

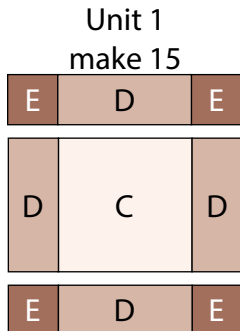

4. Sew (1)  $2$ " x  $7\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric F strip to each side of (1) Unit 1 square. Sew (1)  $2$ " Fabric G square to each end of (1)  $2$ " x  $7\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric G strip to make the top row. Repeat to make the bottom row. Sew together the (3) rows lengthwise to make (1)  $10\frac{1}{2}$ " Block Three square (Fig. 4). Repeat to make (15) Block Three squares total.

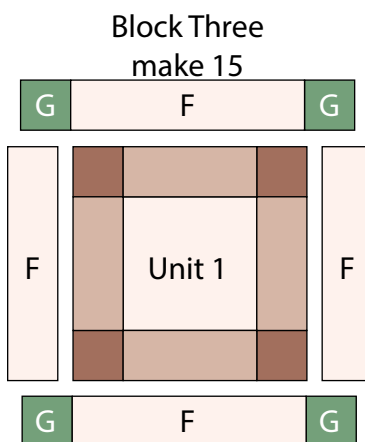
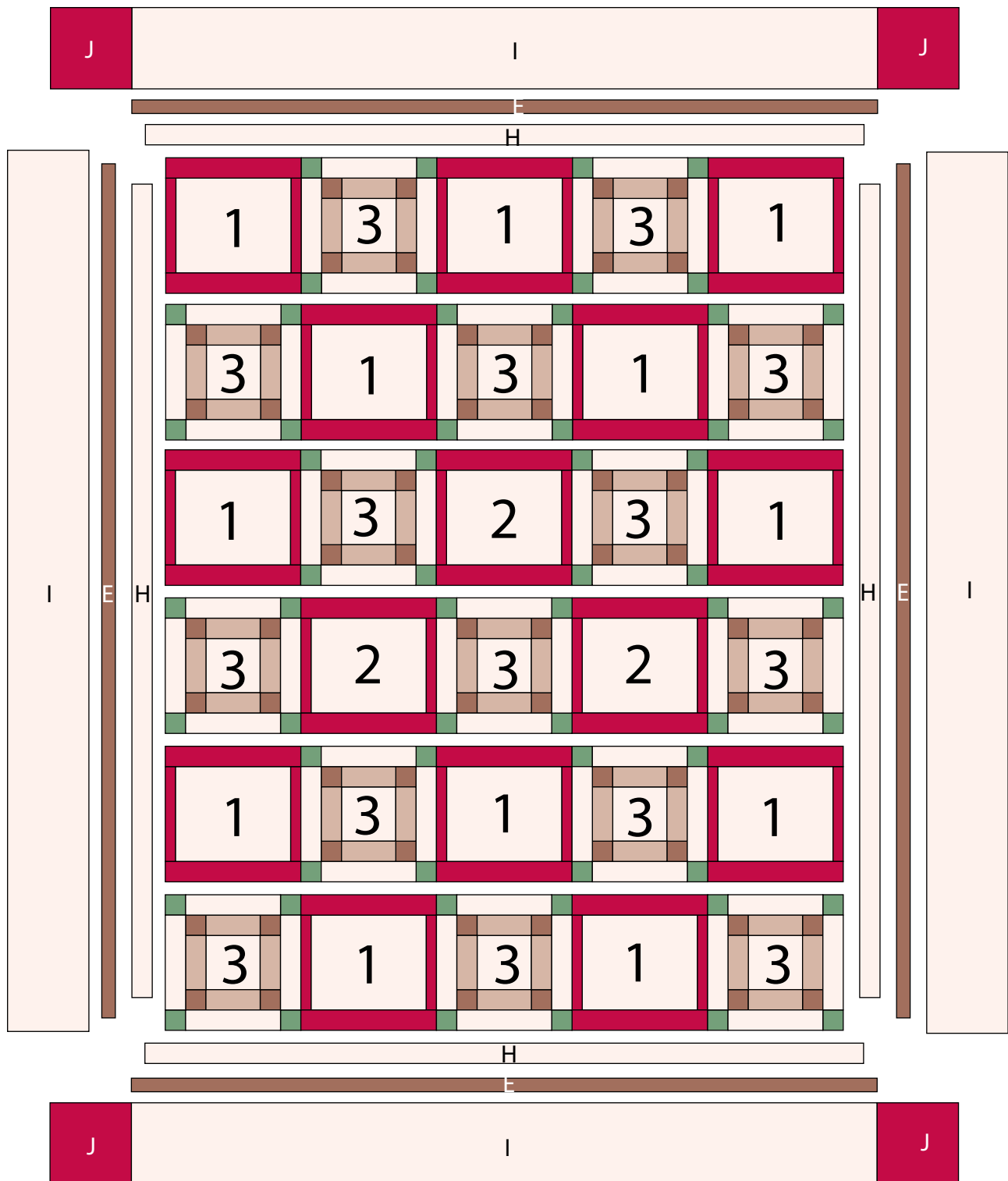

### Quilt Top Assembly

(Refer to the *Quilt Layout while assembling.*)

5. Sew together (3) Block One squares and (2) Block Three squares, alternating them from left to right, to make Row One. Repeat to make Row Five.
6. Sew together (3) Block Three squares and (2) Block One squares, alternating them from left to right, to make Row Two. Repeat to make Row Six.
7. Sew together (1) Block One square, (1) Block Three square, (1) Block Two square, (1) Block Three square and (1) Block One square, in that order from left to right, to make Row Three.
8. Sew together (3) Block Three squares and (2) Block Two squares, alternating them from left to right, to make Row Four.
9. Sew together the (6) pieced Rows, lengthwise and in numerical order from top to bottom, to make the Center Block.
10. Sew (1)  $2$ " x  $60\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric H strip to each side of the Center Block. Sew (1)  $2$ " x  $53\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric H strip to the top and to the bottom of the Center Block.
11. Sew (1)  $1\frac{1}{2}$ " x  $63\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric E strip to each side of the Center Block. Sew (1)  $1\frac{1}{2}$ " x  $55\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric E strip to the top and to the bottom of the Center Block.
12. Sew (1)  $6\frac{1}{2}$ " x  $65\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric I strip to each side of the Center Block. Sew (1)  $6\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric J square to each end of (1)  $6\frac{1}{2}$ " x  $55\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric I strip. Repeat to make a second strip. Sew the newly sewn strips to the top and to the bottom of the Center Block to make the quilt top.
13. Layer and quilt as desired.
14. Sew the (8)  $2\frac{1}{2}$ " x WOF Fabric B strips together, end to end with 45-degree seams, to make the binding. Fold this long strip in half lengthwise with wrong sides together and press.
15. Bind as desired.
