

***NOTE:** If making the Home Sweet Home Quilt, a second panel is not required for the tote.

- Batting (2) 21¹/₂" x 21" (0.55m x 0.53m) .
- Thread and sewing supplies •

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Cutting Instructions

Notes:

- Please make sure to check *henryglassfabrics.net* for pattern updates prior to starting the project.
- All strips are cut across the width of fabric (WOF) from selvage to selvage edge unless otherwise noted.

Fabric A, cut:

(2) 21" x 21¹/₂"

Fabric B, cut:

(2) 3" x 40"

Fabric C, cut:


(2) 211/2" x 161/2"

Fabric D, fussy cut:


(2) 21¹/₂" x 5" each centered on a floral stripe.

Sewing

- Sew using a ¼" seam allowance with right sides together (RST) unless otherwise indicated. Press seams towards the darker fabric, unless otherwise indicated.
- The arrows in the figures represent the fabric print direction. Pay attention to the fabric and unit orientations when assembling the various components.
- 1. Sew (1) 21¹/₂" x 5¹/₂" **Fabric D** strip to the top of (1) 21½" x 16½" **Fabric C** strip to make (1) 21¹/₂" x 21" Unit 1 rectangle (Fig. 1). Repeat to make a second Unit 1 rectangle.




- 2. Layer (1) Unit 1 rectangle and (1) 21¹/₂" x 21" piece of batting. Repeat with the second Unit 1 rectangle and batting piece. Quilt each piece as desired.
- 3. Layer the (2) quilted pieces wrong sides together. Sew down the sides and across the bottom to make the Outer Bag (**Fig. 2**).
- 4. Layer the (2) Fabric A rectangles RST. Sew down the sides and across the bottom leaving a 3"-4" opening along the bottom to make the Lining (Fig. 3).



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
- 5. Fold (1) 3" x 40" Fabric B strip in half lengthwise and sew down the long edge to form a tube (Fig. 4). Repeat with the second 3" x 40" **Fabric B** strip.
- 6. Turn (1) Fabric B tube right side out and press with the seam at the back. Topstitch down each edge to make (1) Handle (Fig. 5). Repeat to make a second Handle.



- 7. Position (1) Handle on the Outer Bag with each handle end 3" in from each side. Make sure the seam is showing up and baste in place. Repeat with the second Handle on the opposite side of the Outer Bag (**Fig. 6**).
- 8. Place the Outer Bag inside the Lining RST and pin all around the top, matching side seams. Sew around the top of the bag, taking extra care over the handles (Fig. 7).



- 9. Turn through the opening in the Lining and sew the opening closed (Fig. 8).
- 10. Push the Lining into the bag and topstitch around the top edge to complete the tote (Fig. 9).



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
