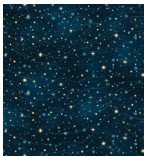

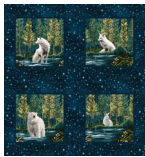

Cutting Instructions

Notes:

- Please check www.henryglassfabrics.net for pattern updates prior to starting the project.
- All strips are cut across the width of fabric (WOF) from selvedge to selvedge edge unless otherwise noted.

Fabric A, cut:

- (12) 2½" x WOF
- (1) 2½" x WOF; subcut
 - (4) 2½" x 2"
 - (4) 2½" x 1"
- (1) 2" x WOF; subcut
 - (4) 2" x 2½"
 - (4) 1½" x 2½"

Fabric B, cut:

- (4) 2" x WOF; cut and piece as needed to make
 - (2) 2" x 40½"
 - (2) 2" x 25½"
- (4) 1½" x WOF; subcut
 - (16) 1½" x 8½"
- (6) 1½" x WOF; subcut
 - (16) 1½" x 10½"
- (4) 1" x WOF; subcut
 - (8) 1" x 19"
- (3) 1" x WOF; subcut
 - (8) 1" x 10½"
- (8) 2½" x WOF for the binding

Fabric C, cut:

- (12) 2½" x WOF
- (1) 2" x WOF; subcut
 - (8) 2" x 2½"
 - (4) 1½" x 2½"
 - (4) 1" x 2½"

Fabric D, fussy cut:

- (8) 8½" squares each centered on a block or around the boundary of the design, whichever dimension is smaller

Fabric E, fussy cut:

- (1) 22½" x 40½ rectangle centered on design

Fabric F, cut:

- (4) 5" x WOF; subcut
 - (8) 5" x 19"
- (2) 3" x WOF; subcut
 - (8) 3" x 9½"
- (2) 2½" x WOF; subcut
 - (2) 2½" x 24½"
- (3) 2½" x WOF; subcut
 - (8) 2½" x 10½"
- (3) 2½" x WOF; sew together end to end with diagonal seams and cut (2) 2½" x 52½"

Sewing

- Sew using a $\frac{1}{4}$ " (0.64cm) seam allowance with right sides together (RST) unless otherwise indicated. Press seams towards the darker fabric, unless otherwise indicated.
- The arrows in the figures represent the fabric print direction. Pay attention to the fabric and unit orientations when assembling the various components.

- Sew (1) $2'' \times 40\frac{1}{2}''$ **Fabric B** strip to each side of the $22\frac{1}{2}'' \times 40\frac{1}{2}''$ **Fabric E** rectangle. Sew (1) $2'' \times 25\frac{1}{2}''$ **Fabric B** strip to the top and bottom of the **Fabric E** rectangle to make (1) Unit 1 rectangle (**Fig. 1**). **Trim the unit, centered, to measure $24\frac{1}{2}'' \times 42\frac{1}{2}''$.**
- Sew (1) $2\frac{1}{2}'' \times 24\frac{1}{2}''$ **Fabric F** strip to the top and bottom of the Unit 1 rectangle to make (1) $24\frac{1}{2}'' \times 46\frac{1}{2}''$ Quilt Center (**Fig. 2**).

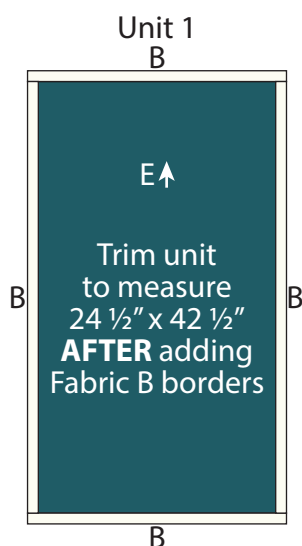
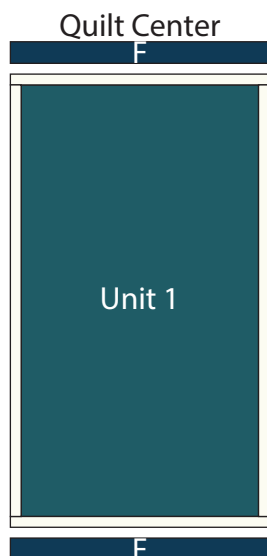

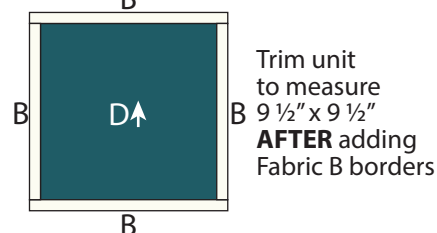


- Sew (1) $1\frac{1}{2}'' \times 8\frac{1}{2}''$ **Fabric B** strip to each side of (1) $8\frac{1}{2}''$ **Fabric D** square. Sew (1) $1\frac{1}{2}'' \times 10\frac{1}{2}''$

Fabric B strip to the top and bottom of the **Fabric D** square to make (1) Block One square (**Fig. 3**). **Trim the block to measure $9\frac{1}{2}'' \times 9\frac{1}{2}''$.** Repeat to make an additional (7) Block One squares.

- Sew (1) $2\frac{1}{2}'' \times$ WOF **Fabric A** strip to the left side of (1) $2\frac{1}{2}'' \times$ WOF **Fabric C** strip lengthwise to make (1) Strip Set 1 (**Fig. 4**). Repeat to make an additional (5) Strip Set 1's.
- From the (6) Strip Set 1's cut (88) $2\frac{1}{2}'' \times 4\frac{1}{2}''$ Unit 2 rectangles (**Fig. 5**).

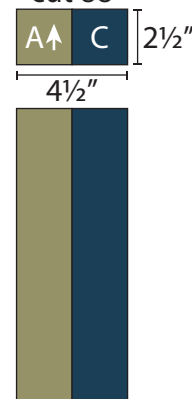

- Sew (1) $2\frac{1}{2}'' \times$ WOF **Fabric C** strip to the left side of (1) $2\frac{1}{2}'' \times$ WOF **Fabric A** strip

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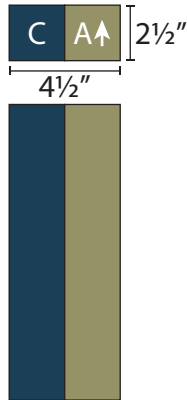
lengthwise to make (1) Strip Set 2 (**Fig. 6**). Repeat to make an additional (5) Strip Set 2's.

- From the (6) Strip Set 2's cut (88) $2\frac{1}{2}" \times 4\frac{1}{2}"$ Unit 3 rectangles (**Fig. 7**).

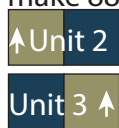

- Sew (1) Unit 2 rectangle to the top of (1) Unit 3 rectangle lengthwise to make (1) $4\frac{1}{2}" \times 4\frac{1}{2}"$ Unit 4 square (**Fig. 8**). Repeat to make an additional (87) Unit 4 squares.

- Sew (1) $1\frac{1}{2}" \times 2\frac{1}{2}"$ **Fabric C** strip to the left end of (1) $1\frac{1}{2}" \times 2\frac{1}{2}"$ **Fabric A** strip to make (1) $1\frac{1}{2}" \times 4\frac{1}{2}"$ Unit 5 strip (**Fig. 9**). Repeat to make a second Unit 5 strip.

- Sew (1) $1\frac{1}{2}" \times 2\frac{1}{2}"$ **Fabric A** strip to the left

end of (1) $1\frac{1}{2}" \times 2\frac{1}{2}"$ **Fabric C** strip to make (1) $1\frac{1}{2}" \times 4\frac{1}{2}"$ Unit 6 strip (**Fig. 10**). Repeat to make a second Unit 6 strip.

- Sew (1) $2" \times 2\frac{1}{2}"$ **Fabric A** strip to the left end of (1) $2" \times 2\frac{1}{2}"$ **Fabric C** strip to make (1) $2" \times 4\frac{1}{2}"$ Unit 7 strip (**Fig. 11**). Repeat to make a second Unit 7 strip.
- Sew (1) $2" \times 2\frac{1}{2}"$ **Fabric C** strip to the left end of (1) $2" \times 2\frac{1}{2}"$ **Fabric A** strip to make (1) $2" \times 4\frac{1}{2}"$ Unit 8 strip (**Fig. 12**). Repeat to make a second Unit 8 strip.

- Sew (1) $1" \times 2\frac{1}{2}"$ **Fabric C** strip to the top of (1) $2\frac{1}{2}" \times 1"$ **Fabric A** strip to make (1) $1" \times 4\frac{1}{2}"$ Unit 9 strip (**Fig. 13**). Repeat to make a second Unit 9 strip.
- Sew (1) $2\frac{1}{2}" \times 1"$ **Fabric A** strip to the top of (1) $1" \times 2\frac{1}{2}"$ **Fabric C** strip to make (1) $1" \times 4\frac{1}{2}"$ Unit 10 strip (**Fig. 14**). Repeat to make a second Unit 10 strip.

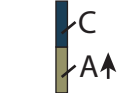
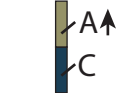

- Sew (1) $2\frac{1}{2}" \times 2"$ **Fabric A** strip to the top of (1) $2" \times 2\frac{1}{2}"$ **Fabric C** strip to make (1) $2" \times 4\frac{1}{2}"$ Unit 11 strip (**Fig. 15**). Repeat to make a second Unit 11 strip.

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16. Sew (1) 2" x 2½" **Fabric C** strip to the top of (1) 2½" x 2" **Fabric A** strip to make (1) 2" x 4½" Unit 12 strip (**Fig. 16**). Repeat to make a second Unit 12 strip.

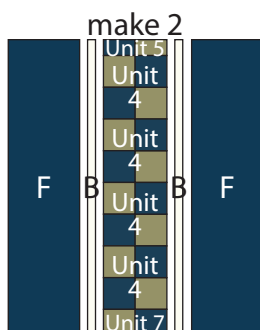

17. Sew together (1) Unit 5 strip (4) Unit 4 squares and (1) Unit 7 strip in that order from top to bottom. Sew (1) 1" x 19" **Fabric B** strip to each side of the newly sewn rectangle. Sew (1) 5" x 19" **Fabric F** strip to each side of the rectangle to make (1) 14½" x 19" Block Two rectangle (**Fig. 17**). Repeat to make a second Block Two rectangle.

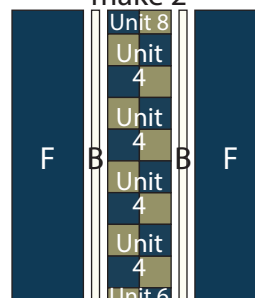

18. Repeat Step 17 and refer to **Figure 18** for component identification, placement and orientation to make (2) 14½" x 19" Block Three rectangles.

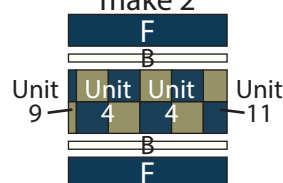

19. Sew together (1) Unit 9 strip, (2) Unit 4 squares and (1) Unit 11 strip in that order from left to right. Sew (1) 1" x 10½" **Fabric B** strip to the top and bottom of the newly sewn rectangle. Sew (1) 2½" x 10½" **Fabric F** strip to the top and to the bottom of the rectangle to make (1) 10½" x 9½" Block Four rectangle (**Fig. 19**). Repeat to make a second Block Four rectangle.

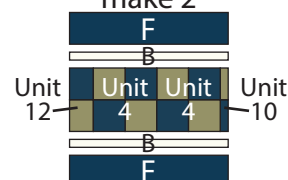

20. Repeat step 19 and refer to **Figure 20** for component identification, placement and orientation to make (2) 10½" x 9½" Block Five rectangles.

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21. Sew (1) 3" x 9½" **Fabric F** strip to each side of (1) Block One square. Sew (1) Block Two rectangle to the top of the newly sewn rectangle and (1) Block Three rectangle to the bottom of the newly sewn rectangle to make (1) 14½" x 46½" Inner Side Border (**Fig. 21**). Repeat to make a second Inner Side Border.
22. Sew together (1) 3" x 9½" **Fabric F** strip, (1) Block One square, (1) Block Four rectangle (1) Block One square, (1) Block Five rectangle, (1) Block One square and (1) 3" x 9½" **Fabric F** strip, in that order from left to right, to make the 52½" x 9½" Inner

Top Border (**Fig. 22**). Repeat to make the Inner Bottom Border.

23. Sew together (17) Unit 4 squares from top to bottom to make (1) 4½" x 68½" Outer Side Border (**Fig. 23**). Repeat to make a second Outer Side Border.
24. Sew together (15) Unit 4 squares from left to right to make (1) 60½" x 4½" Outer Top Border (**Fig. 24**). Repeat to make the Outer Bottom Border.

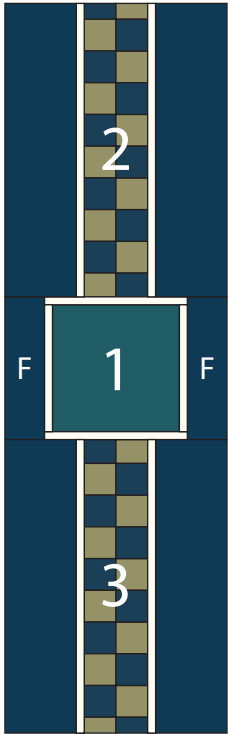

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Quilt Top Assembly

Follow the Quilt Layout (Page 9) while assembling the quilt top.

25. Sew (1) Inner Side Border to each side of the Quilt Center.
26. Sew the Inner Top Border and Inner Bottom Border to the top and to the bottom of the Quilt Center.
27. Sew (1) 2½" x 52½" **Fabric F** strip to the top and bottom of the Quilt Center.
28. Sew (1) Outer Side Border to each side of the Quilt Center.
29. Sew the Outer Top Border and the Outer Bottom Border to the top and to the bottom of the Quilt Center to complete the quilt top which should measure 60½" x 76½".
33. Lay both loose ends of binding flat along the quilt edge. Where these two loose ends meet, fold them back onto themselves and press to form a crease. Using this crease as your stitching line, sew the two open ends of the binding together, right sides matching. Trim seam to ¼" and press seam open. Finish sewing the binding to the quilt top.
34. Turn the binding over the raw edge to the back of the quilt and hand or machine stitch in place.

Layering, Quilting and Finishing

30. Layer the backing (wrong side up), batting, and quilt top (right side up). Baste the layers together and quilt as desired. Trim excess batting and backing even with the top of the quilt.

Binding

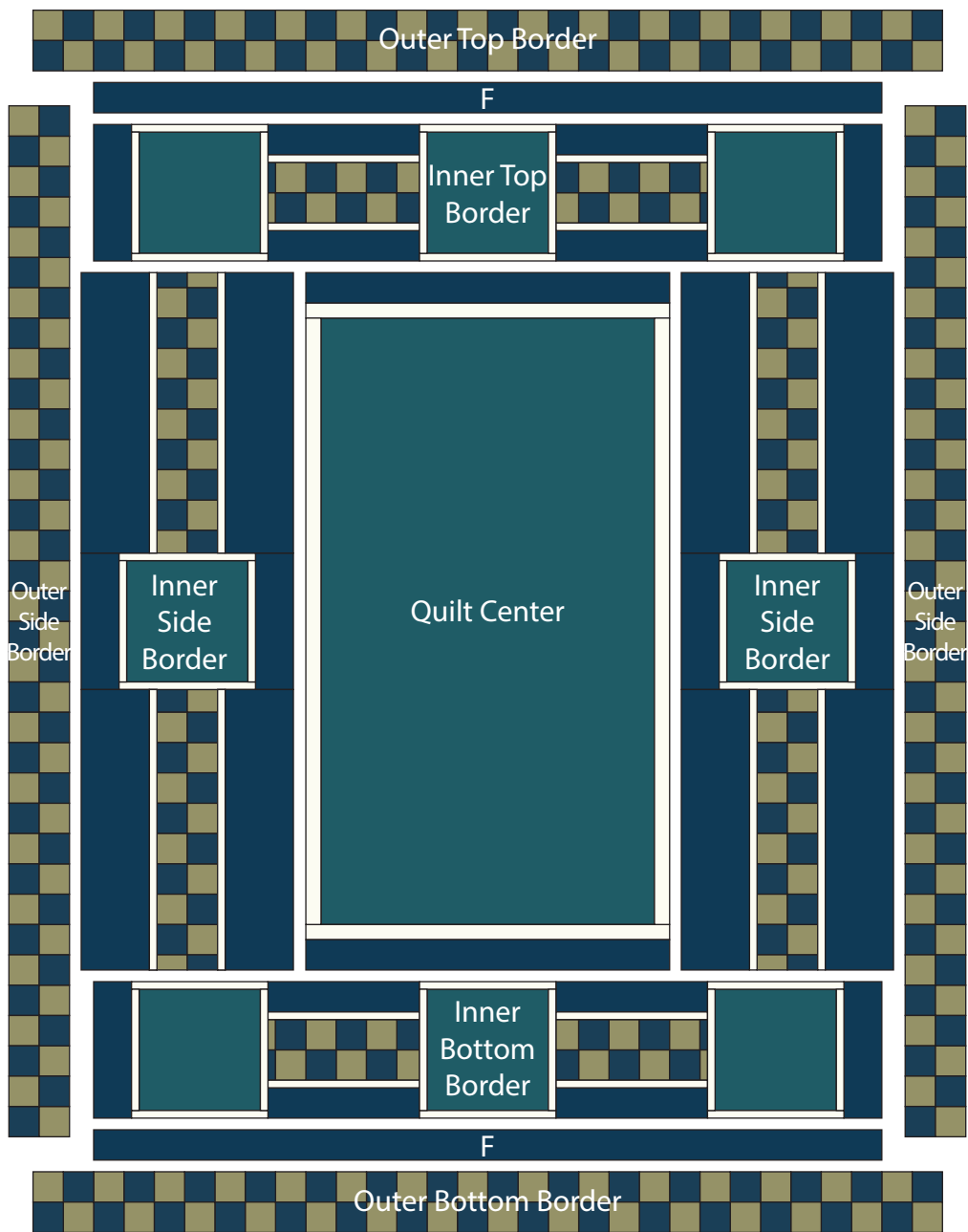
31. Sew together (8) 2½" x WOF **Fabric B** binding strips end to end with diagonal seams. Press the seams open. Press the binding strip in half wrong sides together.
32. Leaving an 8" tail of binding and beginning along an edge of the quilt top, match raw edges of the binding to the raw edges of the quilt top. Sew the binding to the outside edge around all four sides and miter corners. Stop sewing approximately 12" from where you started and backstitch.
