(1) $27 / 8>$ square.
-(1) $21 / 2 " \times$ WOF strip. Sub-cut (16) $21 / 2 "$ squares.
From the Geometrics - Red (H), cut:
- (1) $47 / 8 " x$ WOF strip. Sub-cut (2) $47 / 8 "$ squares and
(5) $27 / 8 "$ squares.
-(1) $21 / 2 " \times$ WOF strip. Sub-cut (16) $21 / 2 "$ squares.
From the Serpentine Vines - Prussian Blue (I), cut:
- (1) $47 / 8$ " x WOF strip. Sub-cut (2) $47 / 8$ " squares and
(2) $27 / 8 "$ squares.
- (1) $21 / 2 " x$ WOF strip. Sub-cut (16) $21 / 2 "$ squares.

From the Calico Sprays - Cream (J), cut:

- (1) $47 / 8 "$ x WOF strip. Sub-cut (8) $47 / 8 "$ squares.

From the Vine Leaves - Olive Green (K), cut:

- (1) $47 / 8 " x$ WOF strip. Sub-cut (2) $47 / 8$ " squares and
(4) $27 / 8 "$ squares.
-(1) $21 / 2 " x$ WOF strip. Sub-cut (16) $21 / 2 "$ squares.
From the Scattered Flowers - Light Pink (L), cut:
- (1) $47 / 8$ " $\times$ WOF strip. Sub-cut (2) $47 / 8 "$ squares and
(4) $27 / 8 "$ squares.
- (1) $21 / 2 "$ x WOF strip. Sub-cut (16) $21 / 2 "$ squares.

From the Quirky Paisleys - Caramel (M), cut:

- (1) $47 / 8 " x$ WOF strip. Sub-cut (2) $47 / 8 "$ squares.
- (1) $21 / 2 " x$ WOF strip. Sub-cut (16) $21 / 2 "$ squares.

From the Moire Trails - Prussian Blue (N), cut:

- (1) $47 / 8 " x$ WOF strip. Sub-cut (2) $47 / 8 "$ squares and
(3) $27 / 8 "$ squares.
- (1) $21 / 2 " x$ WOF strip. Sub-cut (16) $21 / 2 "$ squares.

From the Quirky Paisleys - Medium Teal (O), cut:

- (1) $47 / 8 "$ x WOF strip. Sub-cut (2) $47 / 8$ " squares.
- (1) $21 / 2 " x$ WOF strip. Sub-cut (16) $21 / 2 "$ squares.

From the Tossed Leaves - Cream (P), cut:

- (1) $47 / 8 " x$ WOF strip. Sub-cut (6) $47 / 8 "$ squares.

From the Tossed Leaves - Light Pink (Q), cut:

- (1) $47 / 8 " x$ WOF strip. Sub-cut (2) $47 / 8 "$ squares and
(2) $27 / 8 "$ squares.
- (1) $21 / 2 " x$ WOF strip. Sub-cut (16) $21 / 2 "$ squares.

From the Calico Sprays - Cream (Backing), cut:

- (2) 83 " x WOF strips for the backing. Sew the strips together and trim to make the 83 " x $83 "$ back.

## Quilt 2

Block Assembly
Note: The arrows in figures represent the fabric print direction. Pay attention to the fabric and unit orientations when assembling the various components. Use a $1 / 4$ " seam allowance with right sides together (RST) unless otherwise noted.

1. Place (1) $27 / 8 "$ Fabric C square on top of (1) $27 / 8 "$

Fabric E square, right sides together. Draw a line across the diagonal of the top square from the upper right corner to the lower left corner (Fig. 1). Sew $1 / 4$ " away from each side of the drawn diagonal line (Fig. 1). Cut the (2) squares apart on the drawn diagonal line (Fig. 2) to make (2) half-square triangles. Trim the half-square triangles to measure $21 / 2$ " square to make (1) Unit 1A square and (1) Unit 1B square (Fig. 3).

5. Place (1) $47 / 8 "$ Fabric F square on top of (1) $47 / 8 "$ Fabric G square, right sides together. Draw a line across the diagonal of the top square from the upper right corner to the lower left corner (Fig. 37). Sew $1 / 4$ " away from each side of the drawn diagonal line (Fig. 37). Cut the (2) squares apart on the drawn diagonal line (Fig. 38) to make (2) half-square triangles. Trim the half-square triangles to measure $41 / 2 "$ square to make (1) Unit 35 A square and (1) Unit 35B square (Fig. 39).

7. Place (1) $21 / 2 "$ Fabric F square on the left side of (1) $21 / 2 " \times 41 / 2 "$ Fabric C strip, right sides together (Fig. 57). Sew across the diagonal of the square from the upper right corner to the lower left corner (Fig. 57). Flip open the triangle formed and press. Trim away the excess fabric from behind the triangle, leaving a $1 / 4$ " seam allowance (Fig. 58).

8. Place another $21 / 2$ " Fabric F square on the right side of the $21 / 2 " \times 41 / 2 "$ Fabric C strip, right sides together (Fig. 59). Sew across the diagonal of the square from the upper left corner to the lower right corner (Fig. 59). Flip open the triangle formed and press. Trim away the excess fabric from behind the triangle, leaving a $1 / 4$ " seam allowance to make (1) Unit 53 strip (Fig.60).
9. Repeat Steps 7-8 to make (8) Unit 53 strips total.

13. Sew together (1) Unit $35 A$ square, (1) Unit 66 square and (I) Unit 36A, in that order from left to right, to make the top row (Fig. 86).
14. Sew (1) Unit 66 square to each side of (1) Unit 22 square to make the middle row (Fig. 86).
15. Sew together (1) Unit 36B square, (1) Unit 66 square and (1) Unit 35B square, in that order from left to right, to make the bottom row (Fig. 86).
16. Sew together the (3) rows from Steps 13-15 lengthwise to make (1) $121 / 2$ " Block One square (Fig. 86).

18. Sew together (1) Block One square, (1) $121 / 2 "$ Fabric A square, (1) Block Two square, (1) $121 / 2 "$ Fabric A square and (1) Block Three square, in that order from left to right, to make Row One (Fig. 99).
19. Repeat Step 18 and refer to Figure 99 for component identification, placement and orientation to make Row Two through Row Five.
20. Sew together the (5) pieced Rows, lengthwise and in numerical order from the top to the bottom, to make the $601 / 2 " \times 601 / 2 "$ Center Block (Fig. 99).

## Quilt Top Assembly

(Follow the Quilt Layout while assembling the quilt top.)
21. Center (1) 2" x 67 " Fabric B strip on (1) side of the Center Block and pin in place. Start sewing the strip a $1 / 4 "$ from the top edge of the block and stop a $1 / 4$ " from the bottom edge. DO NOT TRIM THE EXCESS. Repeat with the opposite side.
22. Repeat Step 21 to sew (1) 2" x 67 " Fabric B strip to the top and to the bottom of the Center Block, making sure to stop and start $1 / 4$ " away from each end of the block. To miter each corner, fold the Center Block on a diagonal, wrong side together. This should line up the strips from adjacent sides (Fig. 100).
23. Starting at the sewn seam (represented by the arrow in Figure 100), draw a 45-degree line to the edge of the fabric. Sew on the drawn line. Trim the excess fabric leaving a $1 / 4$ " seam. Repeat this step with the remaining corners.

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24. Center (1) $61 / 2 " \times 79 "$ Fabric A strip on (1) side of the Center Block and pin in place. Start sewing the strip a $1 / 4 "$ from the top edge of the block and stop a $1 / 4 "$ from the bottom edge. DO NOT TRIM THE EXCESS. Repeat with the opposite side.
25. Repeat Step 24 to sew (1) $61 / 2 " \times 79 "$ Fabric A strip to the top and to the bottom of the Center Block, making sure to stop and start $1 / 4$ " away from each end of the block. To miter each corner, fold the Center Block on a diagonal, wrong side together. This should line up the strips from adjacent sides (Fig. 100).
26. Starting at the sewn seam (represented by the arrow in Figure 100), draw a 45 -degree line to the edge of the fabric. Sew on the drawn line. Trim the excess fabric leaving a $1 / 4$ " seam. Repeat this step with the remaining corners to make the quilt top.
27. Layer and quilt as desired.
28. Fold the $21 / 2 " \times 312^{\prime \prime}$ WOF Fabric B binding strip in half lengthwise with wrong sides together and press.
29. Bind as desired.
