7/8 yard (0.80m)	Tossed Snowflakes - Teal Blue (D)	1368-71
1/8 yard (0.11m)	Folio Basics - Charcoal (E)	7755-96
1 yard (0.91m)	Folio Basics - White on White (F)	7755-01
1/2 yard (0.46m)	Folio Basics - Powder Blue (G)	7755-07
1/2 yard (0.46m)	Winter Woodland - Blue (H)	1363-71
1/2 yard (0.46m)	Packed Critters - Multi (I)	1362-78
7/8 yard (0.80m)	Tossed Bunny - Blue-Multi (J)	1365-73

### Cutting Instructions

*Please note: All strips are cut across the width of fabric (WOF) from selvage to selvage edge unless otherwise noted.*

#### From the Honeycomb - Multi (A), cut:

- (2) 4 1/2" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (10) 4 1/2" squares.

#### From the Folio Basics - Rose (B), cut:

- (4) 1 1/2" x WOF strips.

#### From the Folio Basics - Dusty Sage (C), cut:

- (4) 1 1/2" x WOF strips.
- (8) 2 1/2" x WOF strips for the binding.

#### From the Tossed Snowflakes - Teal Blue (D), cut:

- (3) 2 1/2" x WOF strips. Sew the strips together end to end with diagonal seams and cut (2) 2 1/2" x 60 1/2" strips.
- (3) 2 1/2" x WOF strips. Sew the strips together end to end with diagonal seams and cut (2) 2 1/2" x 52 1/2" strips.
- (5) 2" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (60) 2" x 3 1/2" strips.

#### From the Folio Basics - Charcoal (E), cut:

- (1) 1" x WOF strip.

#### From the Folio Basics - White on White (F), cut:

- (14) 2" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (280) 2" squares.
- (2) 1 3/4" x WOF strips.

#### From the Folio Basics - Powder Blue (G), cut:

- (7) 2" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (20) 2" x 12 1/2" strips.

#### From the Winter Woodland - Blue (H), cut:

- (7) 2" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (80) 2" x 3 1/2" strips.

#### From the Packed Critters - Multi (I), cut:

- (2) 6 1/2" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (10) 6 1/2" squares.

#### From the Tossed Bunny - Blue-Multi (J), cut:

- (7) 3 1/2" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (40) 3 1/2" x 6 1/2" strips.

#### From the Tossed Snowflakes - Multi-White (K), cut:

- (2) 3 7/8" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (20) 3 7/8" squares.
- (7) 3 1/2" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (80) 3 1/2" squares.

#### From the Border Stripe - Blue-Multi (L), cut:

- (2) 8 1/2" x 84" Length of Fabric (LOF) strips.
- (2) 8 1/2" x 72" LOF strips.

#### From the Knit Texture - Red (M), cut:

- (2) 3 7/8" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (20) 3 7/8" squares.

#### From the Tossed Squirrels - Red-White (Backing), cut:

- (2) 88" x WOF strips for the backing. Sew the strips together and trim to make the 76" x 88" back.

### Block Assembly

*Note: The arrows in figures represent the fabric print direction. Pay attention to the fabric and unit orientations when assembling the various components. Use a 1/4" seam allowance with right sides together (RST) unless otherwise noted.*

1. Place (1) 2" Fabric F square on the left side of (1) 2" x 3 1/2" Fabric H strip, right sides together (Fig. 1). Sew across the diagonal of the square from the upper right corner to the lower left corner (Fig. 1). Flip open the triangle formed and press. Trim away the excess fabric from behind the triangle, leaving a 1/4" seam allowance (Fig. 2).

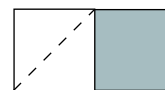

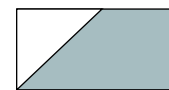

2. Place another 2" Fabric F square on the right side of the 2" x 3 1/2" Fabric H strip, right sides together (Fig. 3). Sew across the diagonal of the square from the upper left corner to the lower right corner (Fig. 3). Flip open the triangle formed and press. Trim away the excess fabric from behind the triangle, leaving a 1/4" seam allowance to make (1) Unit 1 strip (Fig. 4).

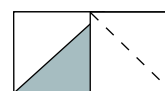

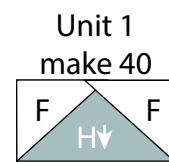

3. Repeat Steps 1-2 to make (40) Unit 1 strips total.

4. Repeat Steps 1-2 and refer to Figure 5 for fabric direction, placement and orientation to make (40) Unit 2 strips.

5. Repeat Steps 1-2 and refer to Figure 6 for fabric direction, placement and orientation to make (60) Unit 3 strips.

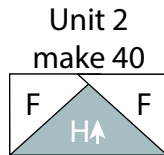

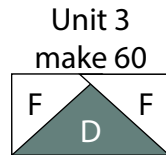

6. Sew (4) Unit 1 strips together end to end. Sew (1) 2" x 12 1/2" Fabric G strip to the bottom of the newly sewn strip lengthwise to make (1) Unit 4 strip (Fig. 7). Repeat to make (10) Unit 4 strips total.

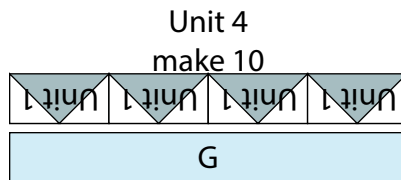

7. Sew (4) Unit 2 strips together end to end. Sew (1) 2" x 12 1/2" Fabric G strip to the top of the newly sewn strip lengthwise to make (1) Unit 5 strip (Fig. 8). Repeat to make (10) Unit 5 strips total.

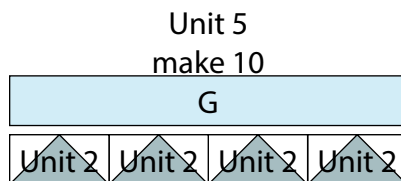

8. Sew (1) 1 3/4" x WOF Fabric F strip to each side of (1) 1" x WOF Fabric E strip lengthwise to make (1) Strip Set 1 (Fig. 9).

9. Cut the Strip Set 1 into (20) 3 1/2" x 2" Unit 6 strip (Fig. 10).

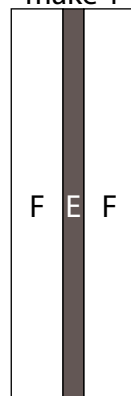

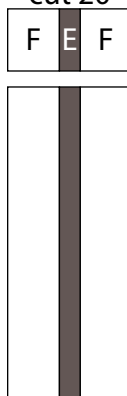

10. Sew (3) Unit 3 strips together lengthwise. Sew (1) Unit 6 strip to the bottom of the newly sewn strip to make (1) Unit 7 strip (Fig. 11). Repeat to make (20) Unit 7 strips total.

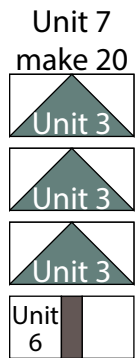

11. Sew (1) 1 1/2" x WOF Fabric B strip to the left side of (1) 1 1/2" x WOF Fabric C strip lengthwise to make (1) Strip Set 2 (Fig. 12). Repeat to make (4) Strip Set 2's total.

12. Cut the (4) Strip Set 2's into (100) 2 1/2" x 1 1/2" Unit 8 strips (Fig. 13).

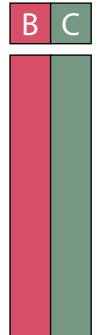

13. Sew (3) Unit 8 strips together end to end to make the top row. Repeat to make the bottom row. Sew (2) Unit 8 strips together end to end. Repeat to make a second strip. Sew (1) strip to each side of (1) 4 1/2" Fabric A square to make the middle row. Sew the (3) rows together lengthwise to make (1) 6 1/2" Unit 9 square (Fig. 14). Repeat to make (10) Unit 9 squares total.

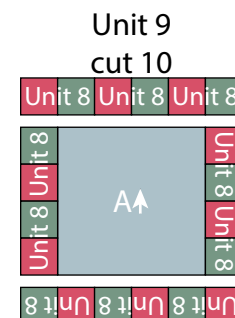

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14. Place (1)  $3\frac{7}{8}$ " Fabric K square on top of (1)  $3\frac{7}{8}$ " Fabric M square, right sides together. Draw a line across the diagonal of the top square from the upper right corner to the lower left corner (Fig. 15). Sew  $\frac{1}{4}$ " away from each side of the drawn diagonal line (Fig. 15). Cut the (2) squares apart on the drawn diagonal line (Fig. 16) to make (2) half-square triangles. Trim the half-square triangles to measure  $3\frac{1}{2}$ " to make (1) Unit 10A square and (1) Unit 10B square (Fig. 17). Repeat to make (10) sets of the Unit 10 squares total.

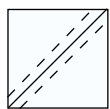

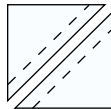

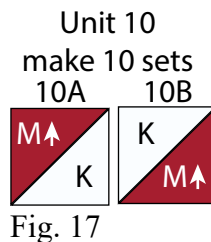

15. Place (1)  $3\frac{7}{8}$ " Fabric K square on top of (1)  $3\frac{7}{8}$ " Fabric M square, right sides together. Draw a line across the diagonal of the top square from the upper left corner to the lower right corner (Fig. 18). Sew  $\frac{1}{4}$ " away from each side of the drawn diagonal line (Fig. 18). Cut the (2) squares apart on the drawn diagonal line (Fig. 19) to make (2) half-square triangles. Trim the blocks to measure  $3\frac{1}{2}$ " to make (1) Unit 11A square and (1) Unit 11B square (Fig. 20). Repeat to make (10) sets of the Unit 11 squares total.

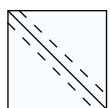

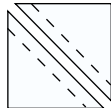

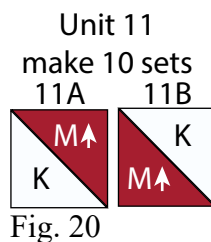

16. Place (1)  $3\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric K square on the left side of (1)  $3\frac{1}{2}$ " x  $6\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric J strip, right sides together (Fig. 21). Sew across the diagonal of the square from the upper right corner to the lower left corner (Fig. 21). Flip open the triangle formed and press. Trim away the excess fabric from behind the triangle, leaving a  $\frac{1}{4}$ " seam allowance (Fig. 22).

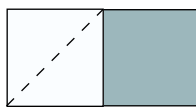

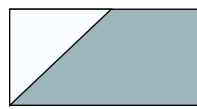

17. Place another  $3\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric K square on the right side of the  $3\frac{1}{2}$ " x  $6\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric J strip, right sides together (Fig. 23). Sew across the diagonal of the square from the upper left corner to the lower right corner (Fig. 23). Flip open the triangle formed and press. Trim away the excess fabric from behind the triangle, leaving a  $\frac{1}{4}$ " seam allowance to make (1) Unit 12 strip (Fig. 24).

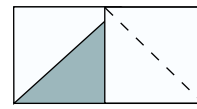

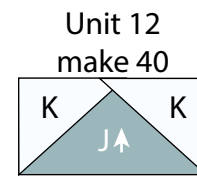

18. Repeat Steps 16-17 to make (40) Unit 12 strips total.

19. Sew (1) Unit 7 strip to each side of (1) Unit 9 square. Sew (1) Unit 4 strip to the top of the newly sewn strip and (1) Unit 5 strip to the bottom of the strip to make (1)  $12\frac{1}{2}$ " Block One square (Fig. 25). Repeat to make (10) Block One squares total.

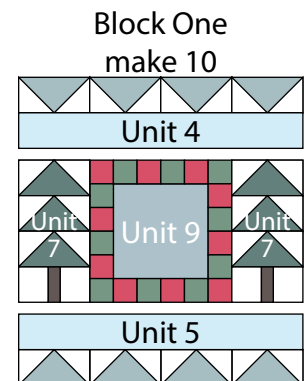

20. Sew together (1) Unit 10A square, (1) Unit 12 strip and (1) Unit 11A square, in that order from left to right, to make the top row (Fig. 26).

21. Sew (1) Unit 12 strip to each side of (1)  $6\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric I square to make the middle row (Fig. 26).

22. Sew together (1) Unit 11B square, (1) Unit 12 strip and (1) 10B square, in that order from left to right, to make the bottom row (Fig. 26).

23. Sew together the (3) rows from Steps 20-22 lengthwise to make (1)  $12\frac{1}{2}$ " Block Two square (Fig. 26).

24. Repeat Steps 20-23 to make (10) Block Two squares total.

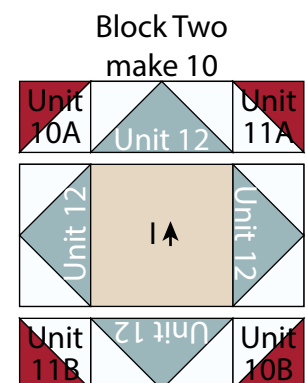
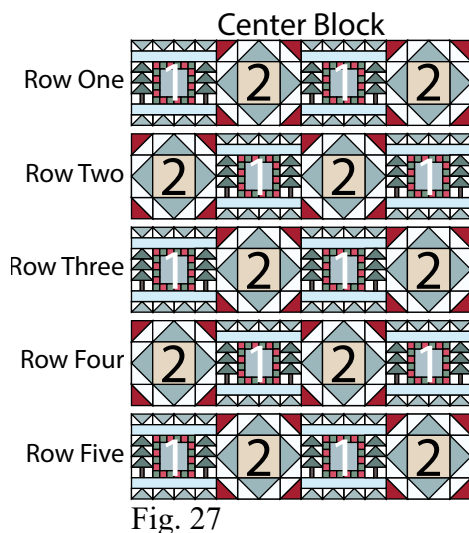

25. Sew together (2) Block One squares and (2) Block Two squares, alternating them from left to right, to make Row One (Fig. 27). Repeat to make Row Three and Row Five.

26. Sew together (2) Block Two squares and (2) Block One squares, alternating them from left to right, to make Row Two (Fig. 27). Repeat to make Row Four.

27. Sew the (5) pieced rows together lengthwise and in numerical order from the top to the bottom to make the 48 ½" x 60 ½" Center Block (Fig. 27).



### Quilt Top Assembly

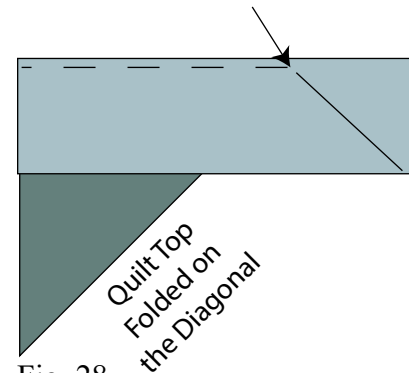
*(Follow the Quilt Layout while assembling the quilt top.)*

28. Sew (1) 2 ½" x 60 ½" Fabric D strip to each side of the Center Block. Sew (1) 2 ½" x 52 ½" Fabric D strip to the top and to the bottom of the Center Block.

29. Center (1) 8 ½" x 84" Fabric L strip on (1) side of the Center Block and pin in place. Start sewing the strip a ¼" from the top edge of the block and stop a ¼" from the bottom edge. **DO NOT TRIM THE EXCESS.** Repeat with the opposite side.

30. Repeat Step 29 to sew (1) 8 ½" x 72" Fabric L strip to the top and to the bottom of the Center Block, making sure to stop and start ¼" away from each end of the block. To miter each corner, fold the Center Block on a diagonal, wrong side together. This should line up the strips from adjacent sides (Fig. 28).

31. Starting at the sewn seam (represented by the arrow in Figure 28), draw a 45-degree line to the edge of the fabric. Sew on the drawn line. Trim the excess fabric leaving a ¼" seam. Repeat this step with the remaining corners to make the quilt top.



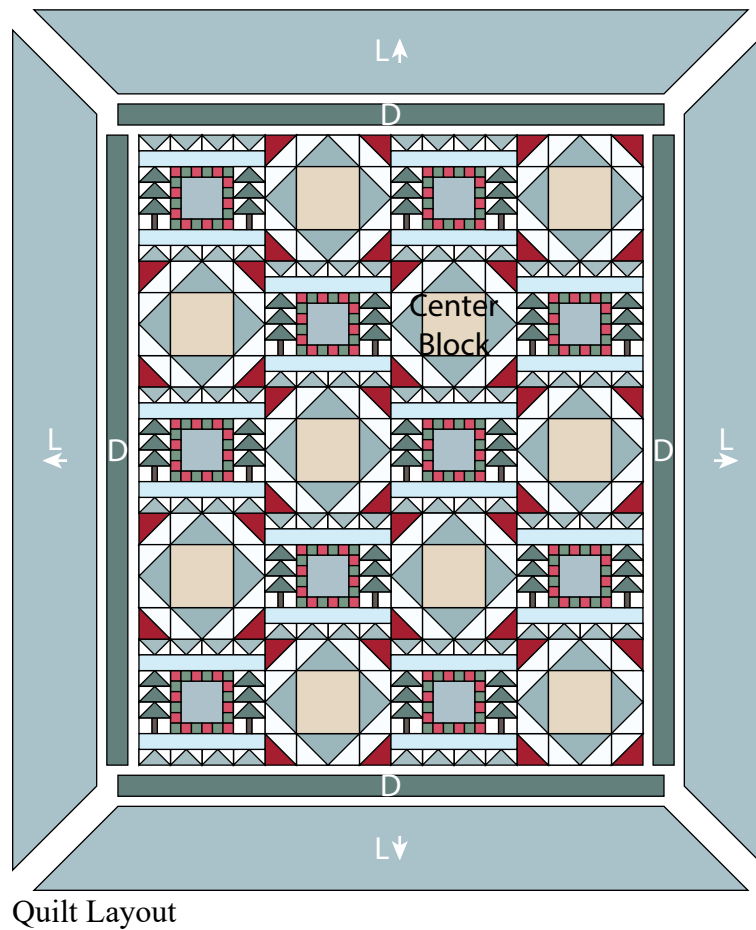
32. Layer and quilt as desired.

33. Sew the (8) 2 ½" x WOF Fabric C strips together, end to end with 45-degree seams, to make the binding. Fold this long strip in half lengthwise with wrong sides together and press.

34. Bind as desired.

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
