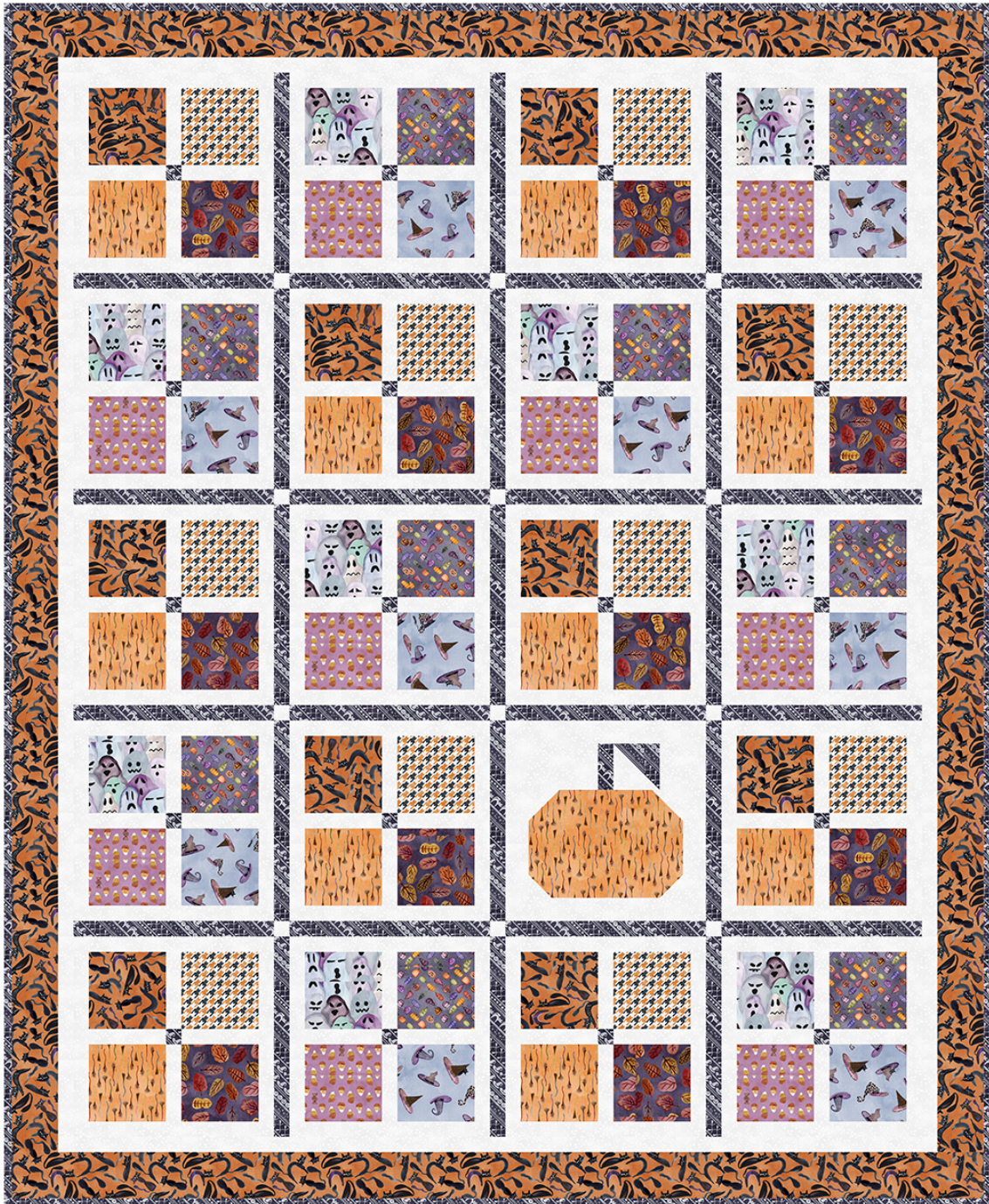


Fun Not Fright Quilt

100% Cotton Thread

Batting: 71" x 85" (1.80m x 2.16m)

CUTTING

Notes:

- Please make sure to check henryglass.net for pattern updates prior to starting the project.
- All strips are cut across the width of fabric (WOF) from selvage to selvage edge unless otherwise noted.

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Fabrics A and G, cut:

(2) 5½" x WOF; subcut (10) 5½" squares

Fabric B, cut:

(1) 10½" x WOF; subcut:

(1) 7½" x 10½" rectangle

(5) 5½" squares

(1) 5½" x WOF; subcut (5) 5½" squares, total of 10

Fabrics C, E, F, and H, cut:

(2) 5½" x WOF; subcut (9) 5½" squares

Fabric D, cut:

(2) 5½" x WOF; subcut (10) 5½" squares

(7) 3½" x WOF for border 2

Fabric I, cut:

(1) 13½" x WOF; subcut (26) 1½" x 13½" sashing rectangles

(1) 4" x WOF; subcut:

(1) 4" square

(1) 1½" X 3½" rectangle

(18) 1½" block cornerstone squares

(8) 2½" x WOF for binding

(3) 1½" x WOF; subcut (5) 1½" x 13½" sashing rectangles, total of 31

Fabric J, cut:

(2) 13½" x WOF; subcut:

(38) 1½" x 13½" rectangles

(14) 1½" x 11½" rectangles

(1) 11½" x WOF; subcut (24) 1½" x 11½" rectangles

(3) 5½" x WOF; subcut (76) ½" x 5½" rectangles

(1) 5" x WOF; subcut:

(1) 3½" x 5" rectangle

(1) 4" square

(2) 2½" squares

(1) 2" x 3½" rectangle

(2) 2" squares

(2) 2" strips; subcut:

(2) 2" x 13½" rectangles

(2) 2" x 10½" rectangles

(8) 1½" x WOF:

Set aside 7 strips for border 1

Cut 1 strip into (12) 1½" quilt cornerstone squares

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SEWING

Note: All seam allowances are $\frac{1}{4}$ " (0.64cm). Sew pieces with right sides together. Press seam allowances open unless otherwise indicated.

BLOCKS 1 AND 2

Sew a $\frac{1}{2}$ " x $5\frac{1}{2}$ " **Fabric J** rectangle between a $5\frac{1}{2}$ " square of **Fabrics D and G** (DG unit). Press the seams away from the sashing. Sew another $\frac{1}{2}$ " x $5\frac{1}{2}$ " **Fabric J** rectangle between a $5\frac{1}{2}$ " square of **Fabrics A and B** (AB unit). Press as before (**Fig. 1**).

Sew a $1\frac{1}{2}$ " **Fabric I** square between (2) $\frac{1}{2}$ " x $5\frac{1}{2}$ " **Fabric J** rectangles. Press the seams away from the sashing (**Fig. 2**).

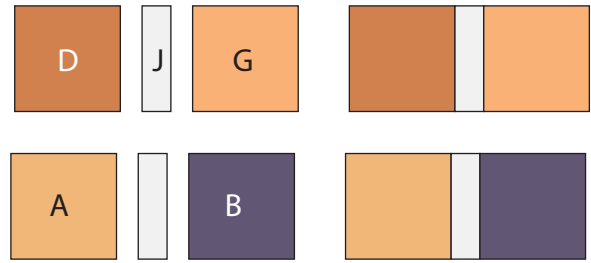
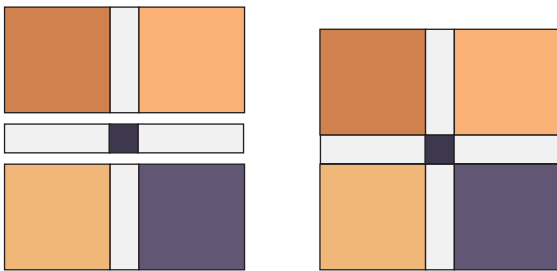

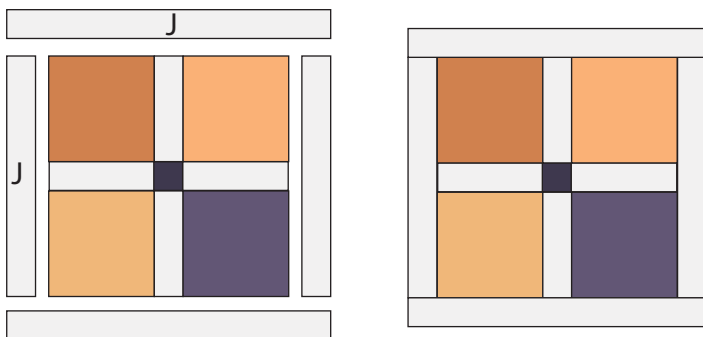

Sew the DG unit to the top and the AB unit to the bottom of the step 2 strip. Press the seams away from the sashing (**Fig. 3**).

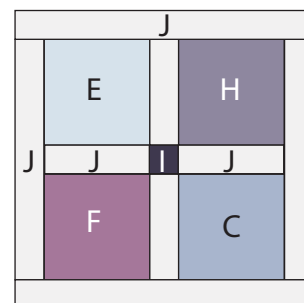
Sew a $1\frac{1}{2}$ " x $11\frac{1}{2}$ " **Fabric J** rectangle to either side of the step 3 unit. Press the seams away from the center. Sew a $1\frac{1}{2}$ " x $13\frac{1}{2}$ " **Fabric J** rectangle to the top and bottom of the unit. Press as before. Repeat to make (10) $13\frac{1}{2}$ " Blocks 1 (**Fig. 4**).

Repeat steps 1 – 4 with the $5\frac{1}{2}$ " squares of **Fabrics E, H, F, and C**, and the remaining $\frac{1}{2}$ " x $5\frac{1}{2}$ " **Fabric J** rectangles, $1\frac{1}{2}$ " **Fabric I** squares, $1\frac{1}{2}$ " x $11\frac{1}{2}$ " and $1\frac{1}{2}$ " x $13\frac{1}{2}$ " **Fabric J** rectangles to make (9) $13\frac{1}{2}$ " Blocks 2 (**Fig. 5**).

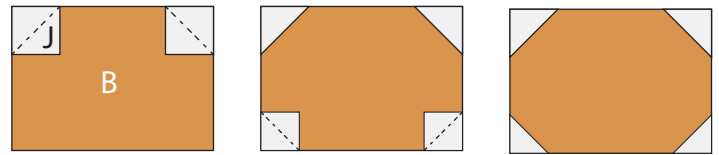


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BLOCK 3

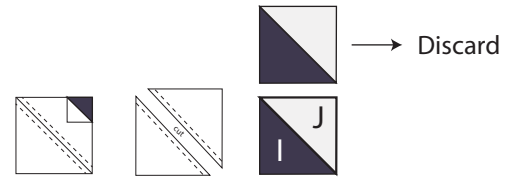
Draw a diagonal line on the wrong side of (2) 2½" **Fabric J** squares. With right sides together, place one marked square on a corner of the 7½" x 10½" **Fabric B** rectangle and stitch on the drawn line (notice the direction of the stitching line). Sew another square to the adjacent corner, as shown. Trim the seam allowances to ¼", flip open, and press. Similarly, sew the (2) 2" **Fabric J** squares to the bottom corners of the **Fabric B** rectangle (**Fig. 6**).

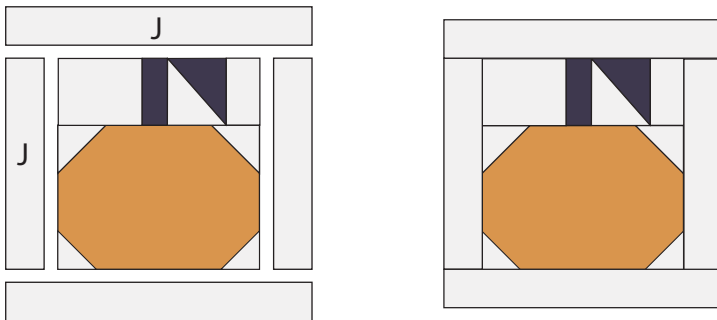
Mark the 4" **Fabric J** square as in step 6. With right sides together, layer the marked **Fabric J** square atop the 4" **Fabric I** square. Stitch ¼" from each side of the diagonal line and cut on the drawn line. Only one unit will be needed. Flip it open, press the seam toward the darker fabric, and trim dog ears. Trim the half-square triangle to 3½" (**Fig. 7**).

Arrange a 3½" x 5" **Fabric J** rectangle, a 1½" x 3½" **Fabric I** rectangle, the step 7 half-square triangle, and the 2" x 3½" **Fabric J** rectangle as shown. Sew the units together and press the seams in one direction. Sew this strip on top of the Step 6 unit and press the seam toward the bottom (**Fig. 8**).

Sew a 2" x 10½" **Fabric J** rectangle to either side of the step 8 unit. Press the seams away from the center. Sew a 2" x 13½" **Fabric J** rectangle to the top and bottom of the unit. Press as before. Make (1) 13½" Block 3 (**Fig. 9**).

QUILT TOP ASSEMBLY

Note: Follow the Quilt Layout Diagram (page X) while assembling the quilt top.

Lay out 5 rows of 4 alternating blocks and (3) 1½" x 13½" **Fabric I** sashing rectangles. Sew the blocks and sashing together in each row. Press the seams toward the sashing.

To make the horizontal sashing rows, sew together (4) 1½" x 13½" **Fabric I** sashing rectangles and (3) 1½" **Fabric J** cornerstone squares. Repeat to make 4 sashing strips. Press the seams toward the sashing.

Nest adjacent seams, sew the block and horizontal sashing rows together, and press the seams in one direction.

For border 1, sew (7) 1½" **Fabric J** strips together end to end using diagonal seams. Measure the vertical length of the quilt top through the center and cut 2 border strips to that length. Sew 1 strip to each side of the quilt top and press the seams toward the borders. Measure the width of the quilt top through the center. Cut 2 border strips to that length and sew 1 to the top and 1 to the bottom. Press the seams toward the borders.

Repeat step 13 with the (7) 3½" **Fabric D** strips to make and add border 2.

FINISHING

Sew together the (8) 2½" **Fabric I** binding strips end to end using diagonal seams. Press the seams open. Press the binding strip in half with the wrong sides together.

Layer the backing (wrong side up), batting, and quilt top (right side up). Baste the layers together and quilt as desired. Trim excess batting and backing even with the top of the quilt.

Leaving an 8" tail of binding and beginning along an edge of the quilt top, matching the raw edges of the binding to the raw edges of the quilt. Sew the binding to the outside edge around all four sides and miter corners. Stop sewing approximately 12" from where you started and backstitch.

Lay both loose ends of the binding flat along the quilt edge. Where these two loose ends meet, fold them back onto themselves and press to form a crease. Using this crease as your stitching line, sew the two open ends of the binding together, with the right sides matching. Trim the seam to ¼" and press it open. Finish sewing the binding to the quilt.

Turn the binding over the raw edge to the back of the quilt and hand or machine stitch in place.

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
