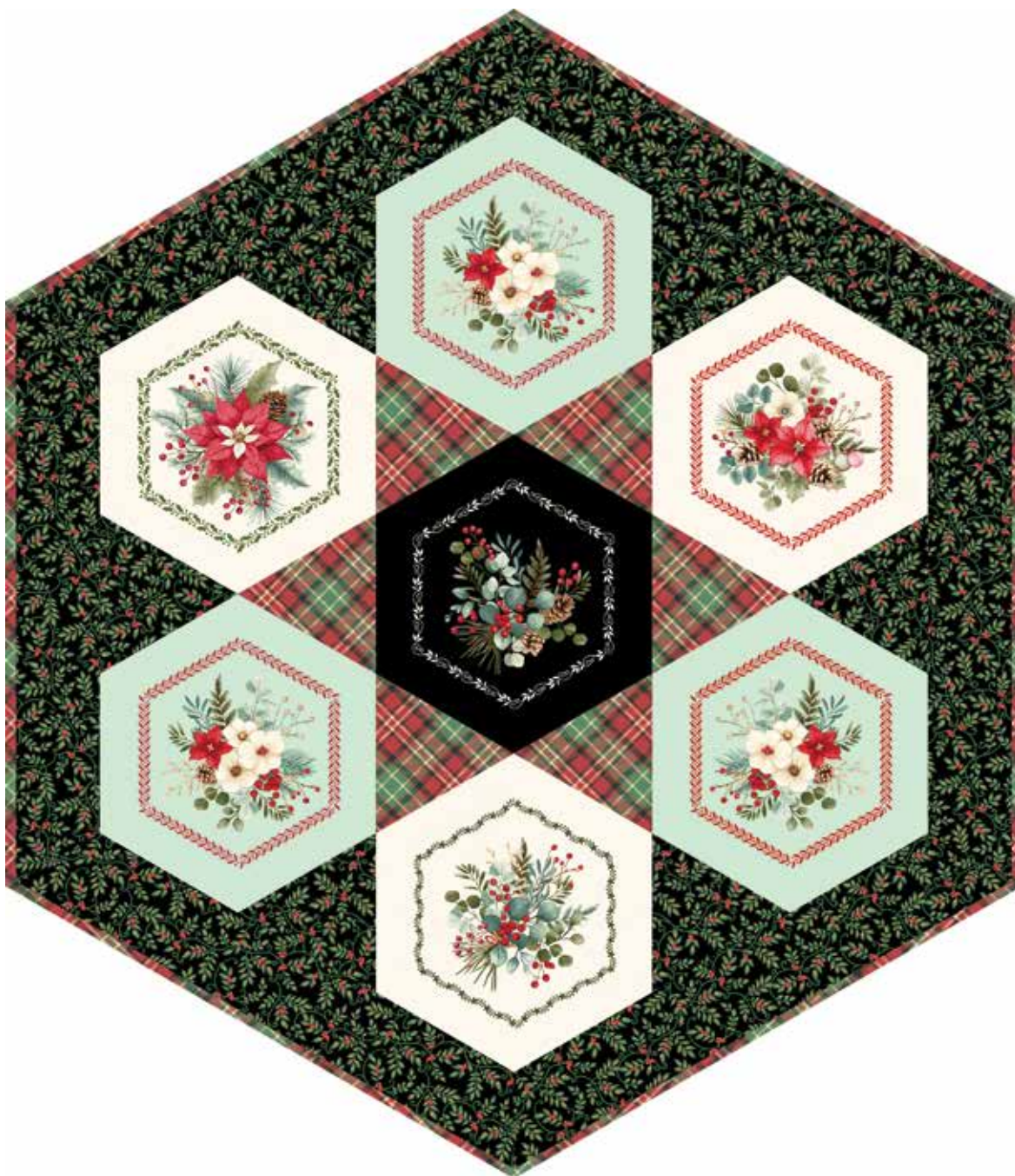

Cutting Instructions

Notes:

- Please make sure to check henryglassfabrics.net for pattern updates prior to starting the project.
- All strips are cut across the width of fabric (WOF) from selvage to selvage edge unless otherwise noted.

Fabric A, cut:

- (6) Template 2 triangles
- (6) Template 3 border strips

Fabric B, cut:

- (6) Template 2 triangles
- (3) 2½" x WOF for the binding

Fabric C, fussy cut:

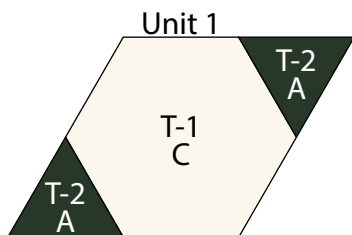
- (3) Template 1 cream hexagons
- (3) Template 1 mint hexagons
- (1) Template 1 black hexagon

Sewing

- Sew using a $\frac{1}{4}$ " seam allowance with right sides together (RST) unless otherwise indicated. Press seams towards the darker fabric, unless otherwise indicated.
- Pay attention to the unit orientations when assembling the various components.

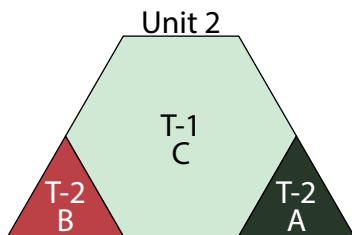
1. Sew (1) **Fabric A** Template 2 triangle to the lower left and upper right faces of (1) cream **Fabric C** Template 1 hexagon to make (1) Unit 1 piece (**Fig. 1**).

2. Sew (1) **Fabric B** Template 2 triangle to the lower left face and (1) **Fabric A** Template 2 triangle to the lower right face of (1) mint **Fabric C** Template 1 hexagon to make (1) Unit 2 piece (**Fig. 2**).

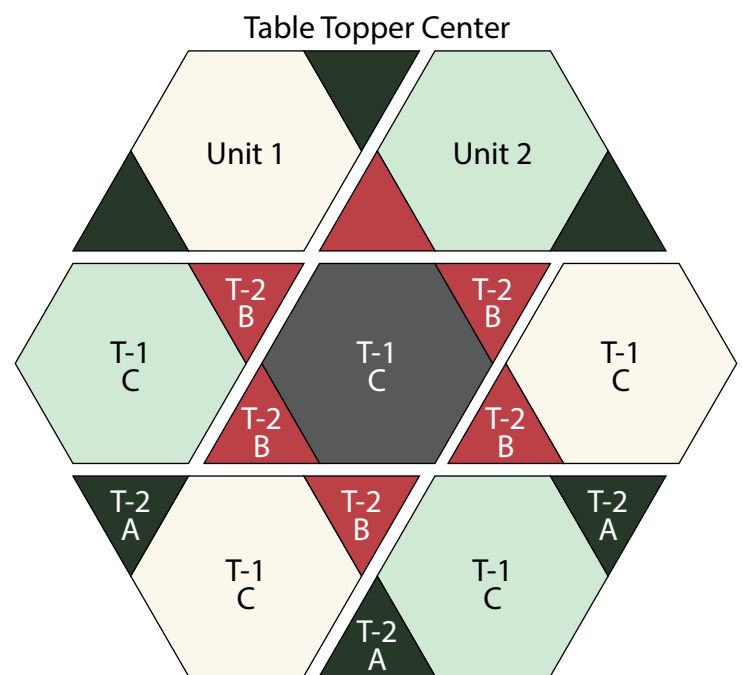


3. Sew together the Unit 1 and Unit 2 pieces as shown to make the top row (**Fig. 3**).
4. Repeat Steps 1-3 and refer to **Figure 3** for

fabric/template identification, placement, color and orientation to make the middle row and bottom row.

5. Sew together the (3) pieced Rows lengthwise to make the Table Topper Center (**Fig. 3**). Our Table Topper Center measured approximately $19\frac{7}{8}$ " x 23"

Quilt Top Assembly

Follow the Quilt Layout (Page 6) while assembling the quilt top.

6. Using your favorite Y-seam method, sew (1) **Fabric A** Template 3 border piece to each face of the Table Topper Center to complete the quilt top which should measure approximately $24\frac{3}{8}$ " x 28".

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Layering, Quilting and Finishing

7. Layer the backing (wrong side up), batting, and quilt top (right side up). Baste the layers together and quilt as desired. Trim excess batting and backing even with the top of the quilt.

Binding

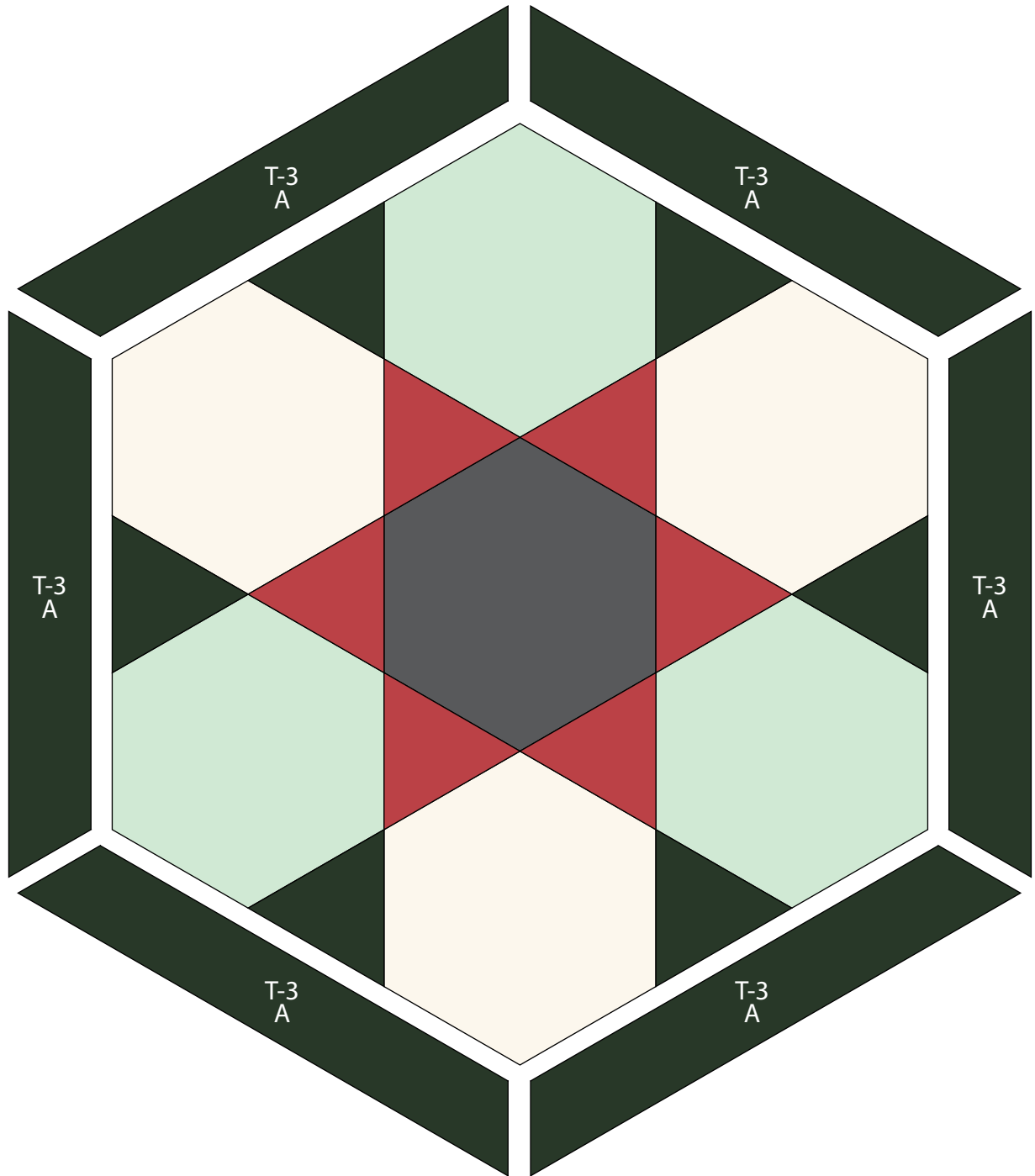
8. Sew together (3) 2½" x WOF **Fabric B** binding strips end to end with diagonal seams. Press the seams open. Press the binding strip in half wrong sides together.
9. Leaving an 8" tail of binding and beginning along an edge of the quilt top, match raw edges of the binding to the raw edges of the quilt top. Sew the binding to the outside edge around all six sides and miter corners. Stop sewing approximately 12" from where you started and backstitch.
10. Lay both loose ends of binding flat along the quilt edge. Where these two loose ends meet, fold them back onto themselves and press to form a crease. Using this crease as your stitching line, sew the two open ends of the binding together, right sides matching. Trim seam to ¼" and press seam open. Finish sewing the binding to the quilt top.
11. Turn the binding over the raw edge to the back of the quilt and hand or machine stitch in place.

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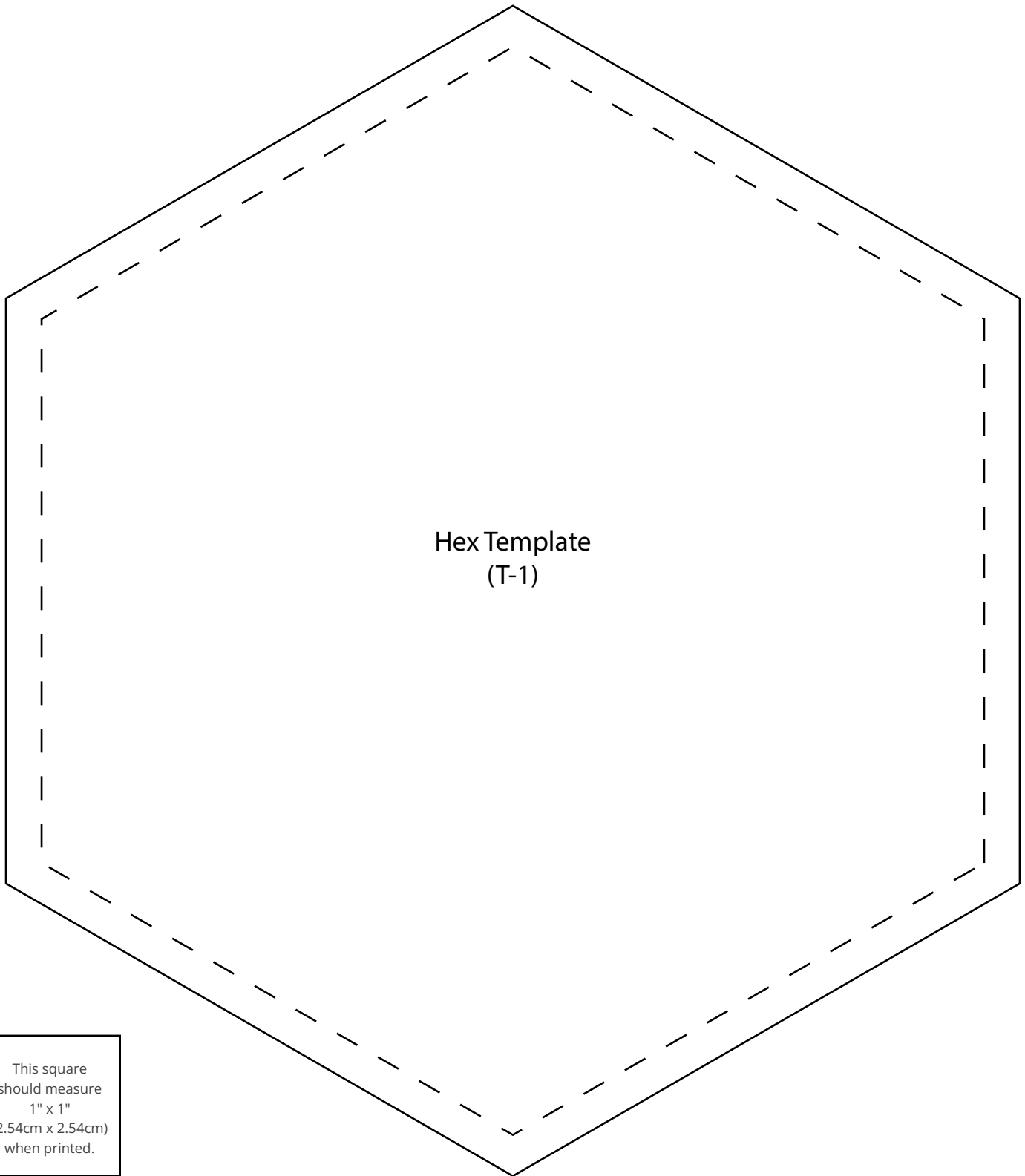
Quilt Layout



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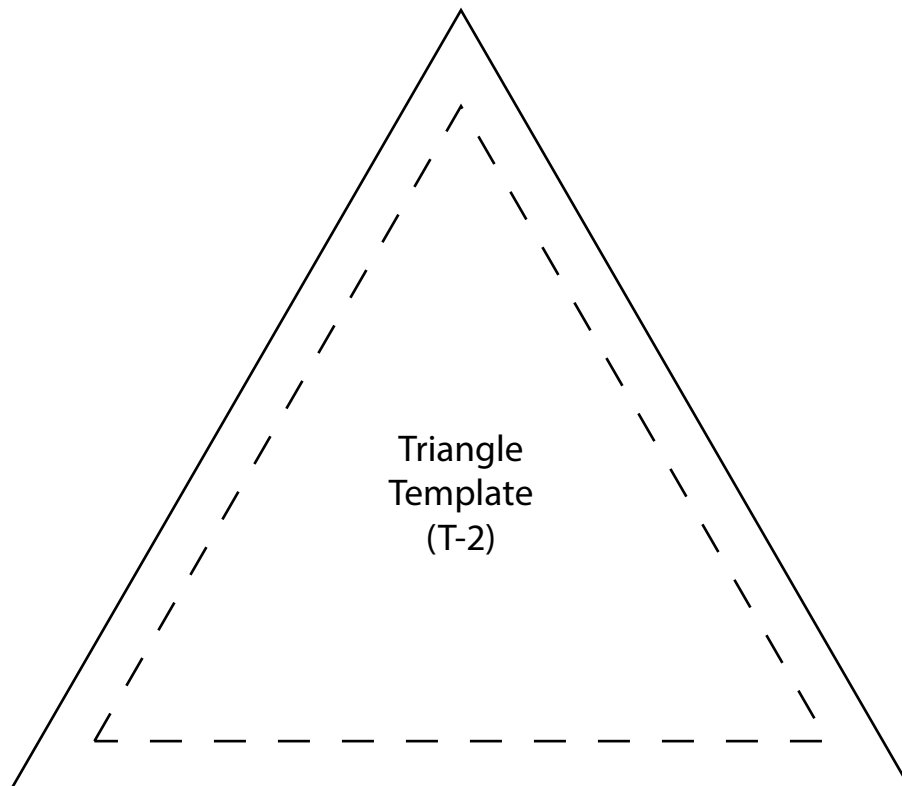

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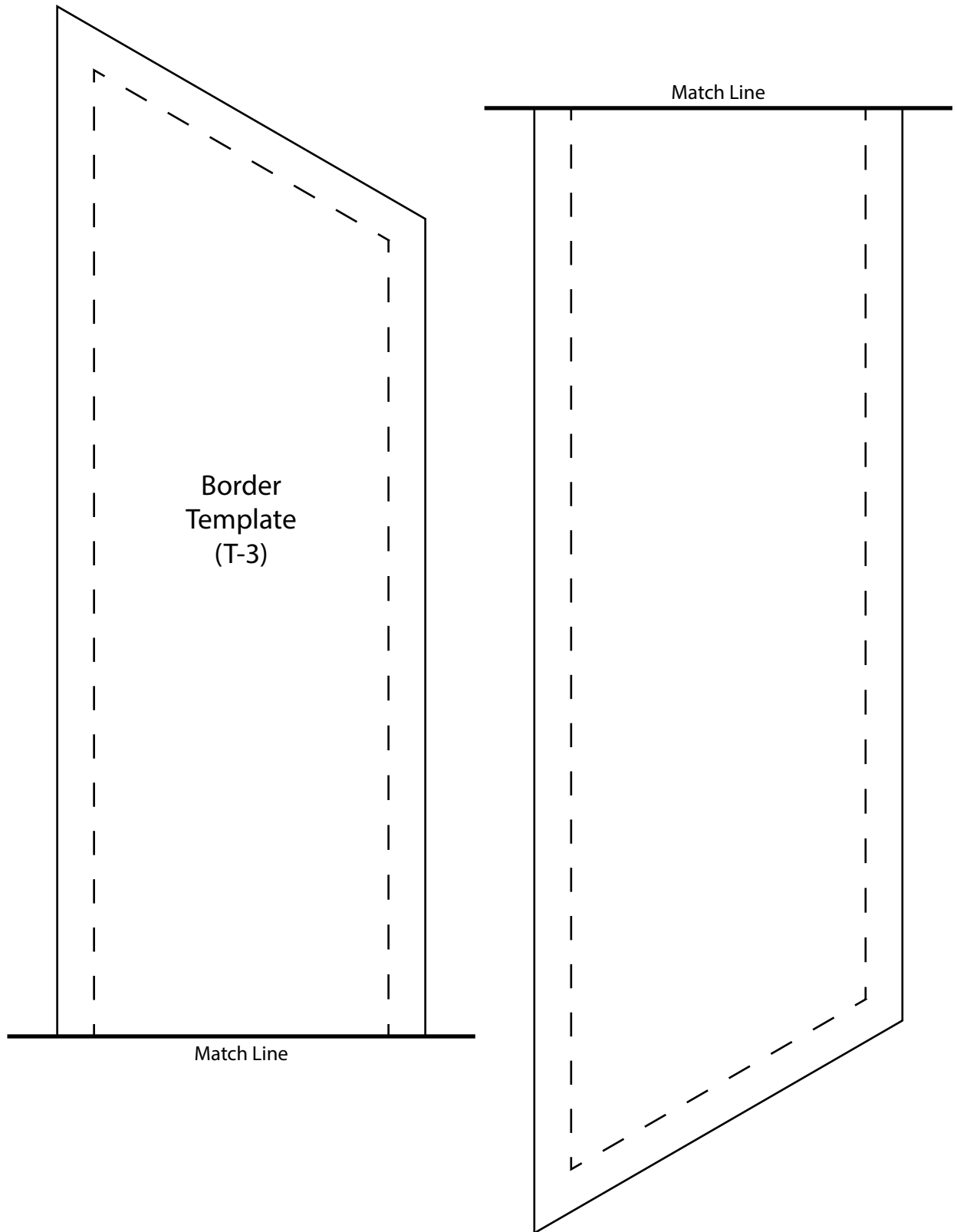
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
