

## Runner Cutting Instructions

### Notes:

- Please make sure to check [henryglassfabrics.net](http://henryglassfabrics.net) for pattern updates prior to starting the project.
- All strips are cut across the width of fabric (WOF) from selvage to selvage edge unless otherwise noted.

### Fabric A, cut:

- (1) 4½" x WOF; subcut
- (4) 4½" squares

### Fabric B, cut:

- See instructions to cut (4) Strawberries
- (5) 2½" x WOF for the binding

### Fabric C, cut:

- (2) 4½" x WOF; subcut
- (15) 4½" squares

### Fabric D, cut:

- (2) 4½" x WOF; subcut
- (15) 4½" squares

### Fabric E, cut:

- (2) 10½" x WOF; subcut
- (4) 10½" squares

### Fabric F, cut:

- See instructions to cut (4) Strawberry Tops

### Fabric G, cut:

- (6) 1½" x WOF; subcut
- (8) 1½" x 10½"
- (8) 1½" x 12½"


### Backing, cut:

- (1) 64" x 28" WOF

## Runner Sewing

- Sew using a ¼" seam allowance with right sides together (RST) unless otherwise indicated. Press seams towards the darker fabric, unless otherwise indicated.
  - The arrows in the figures represent the fabric print direction. Pay attention to the fabric and unit orientations when assembling the various components.
1. Following the manufacturer's instructions, trace the listed number of each template onto the paper side of the fusible web. Roughly cut out each template about 1/8" outside the drawn lines.
  2. Press each template onto the wrong side of the fabrics as listed on the templates. Cut out each template on the drawn lines.
  3. Arrange and press (1) **Fabric B** Strawberry and (1) **Fabric F** Strawberry Top onto (1) 10½" **Fabric E** square (**Fig. 1**).
  4. Finish the raw edges of each shape with a decorative stitch such as a buttonhole or satin stitch to make (1) Unit 1 square (**Fig. 1**).
  5. Repeat Steps 3-4 to make (4) Unit 1 squares total.



6. Sew (1) 1½" x 10½" **Fabric G** strip to each side of (1) Unit 1 square. Sew (1) 1½" x 12½" **Fabric G** strip to the top and bottom of the Unit 1 square to make (1) 12½" Block One square (**Fig. 2**). Repeat to make (4) Block One squares total.

7. Sew (1) 4½" **Fabric C** square to the top and to the bottom of (1) 4½" **Fabric D** square to make the 4½" x 12½" Left Side Border (**Fig. 3**).
8. Sew (1) 4½" **Fabric D** square to the top and to the bottom of (1) 4½" **Fabric C** square to make the 4½" x 12½" Right Side Border (**Fig. 4**).



- Sew together (6) 4½" **Fabric D** squares and (6) 4½" **Fabric C** squares alternating them from left to right. Sew (1) 4½" **Fabric A** square to each end of the newly sewn strip to make the 56½" x 4½" Top Border (**Fig. 5**). Repeat to make the Bottom Border.

## Runner Top Assembly

- Sew together the (4) Block One squares, paying attention to the orientation of the blocks, to make the Runner Center (**Fig. 6**).
- Sew the Left Side Border and Right Side Border to the left and right sides of the Runner Center (**Fig. 6**).
- Sew the Top Border and Bottom Border to the top and to the bottom of the Runner Center Block to make the Runner Top (**Fig. 6**).

## Runner Layering, Quilting and Finishing


- Layer the backing (wrong side up), batting, and runner top (right side up). Baste the layers together and quilt as desired. Trim excess batting and backing even with the top of the runner.

## Runner Binding

- Sew together (5) 2½" x WOF **Fabric B** binding strips end to end with diagonal seams. Press the seams open. Press the binding strip in half wrong sides together.
- Leaving an 8" tail of binding and beginning along an edge of the table runner, match raw edges of the binding to the raw edges of the runner top. Sew the binding to the outside edge around all four sides and miter corners. Stop sewing approximately 12" from where you started and backstitch.
- Lay both loose ends of binding flat along the quilt edge. Where these two loose ends meet, fold them back onto themselves and press to form a crease. Using this crease as your stitching line, sew the two open ends of the binding together, right sides together. Trim seam to ¼" and press seam open. Finish sewing the binding to the runner top.
- Turn the binding over the raw edge to the back of the runner and hand or machine stitch in place.



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## Place Mat Cutting Instructions

### Notes:

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- All strips are cut across the width of fabric (WOF) from selvage to selvage edge unless otherwise noted.

### Fabric A, cut:

- (2) 4½" x WOF; subcut
- (3) 4½" x 14½" strips

### Fabric B, cut:

- (6) 2½" x WOF for the binding of (3) place mats

### Fabric C, cut:

- (2) 4½" x WOF; subcut
- (3) 4½" x 14½"

### Fabric D, cut:

- (5) 2½" x WOF; subcut
- (6) 2½" x 11½"
- (6) 2½" x 15½"

### Fabric E, cut:

- (5) 2½" x WOF; subcut
- (6) 2½" x 11½"
- (6) 2½" x 15½"
- (6) 2½" x WOF for the binding of (3) place mats

### Fabric F, fussy cut:

- (6) 11½" squares each centered on a block

### Backing, cut:


- (3) 22" x WOF; subcut
- (6) 22" x 18" rectangles

## Place Mat Sewing

- Sew using a ¼" seam allowance with right sides together (RST) unless otherwise indicated. Press seams towards the darker fabric, unless otherwise indicated.
- The arrows in the figures represent the fabric print direction. Pay attention to the fabric and unit orientations when assembling the various components.


1. Sew (1) 2½" x 11½" **Fabric D** strip to each side of (1) 11½" **Fabric F** square. Sew (1) 2½" x 15½" **Fabric D** strip to the top and to the bottom of the **Fabric F** square to make (1) Unit 2 square (**Fig. 7**). **Trim the unit to measure 14½" x 14½"**. Repeat to make (3) Unit 2 squares total.

2. Sew (1) 2½" x 11½" **Fabric E** strip to each side of (1) 11½" **Fabric F** square. Sew (1) 2½" x 15½" **Fabric E** strip to the top and bottom of the **Fabric F** square to make (1) Unit 3 square (**Fig. 8**). **Trim the unit to measure 14½" x 14½"**. Repeat to make (3) Unit 3 squares total.



3. Sew (1) 4½" x 14½" **Fabric C** strip to the right side of (1) Unit 2 square to make (1) 18½" x 14½" Place Mat #1 top (**Fig. 9**). Repeat to make (3) Place Mat #1 tops total.



4. Sew (1) 4½" x 14½" **Fabric A** strip to the right side of (1) Unit 3 square to make (1) 18½" x 14½" Place Mat #2 top (**Fig. 10**). Repeat to make (3) Place Mat #2 tops total.

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## Place Mat Layering, Quilting and Finishing

5. Layer the backing (wrong side up), batting, and quilt top (right side up). Baste the layers together and quilt as desired. Trim excess batting and backing even with the top of the place mats.
9. Turn the binding over the raw edge to the back of the place mat and hand or machine stitch in place.
10. Repeat Steps 7-9 with remaining (2) Place Mat #1 tops and **Fabric E** binding strips.
11. Repeat Steps 7-9 with the Place Mat #2 tops and **Fabric B** binding strips.

## Place Mat Binding

6. Sew together (6) 2½" x WOF **Fabric E** binding strips end to end with diagonal seams. Press the seams open. Press the binding strip in half wrong sides together. Cut the strip into (3) equal pieces.
7. Leaving an 8" tail of binding and beginning along an edge of (1) Place Mat #1 top, match raw edges of the binding to the raw edges of the place mat top. Sew the binding to the outside edge around all four sides and miter corners. Stop sewing approximately 12" from where you started and backstitch.
8. Lay both loose ends of binding flat along the place mat edge. Where these two loose ends meet, fold them back onto themselves and press to form a crease. Using this crease as your stitching line, sew the two open ends of the binding together, right sides matching. Trim seam to ¼" and press seam open. Finish sewing the binding to the place mat top.

## Napkin Cutting Instructions

### Notes:

- All strips are cut across the width of fabric (WOF) from selvage to selvage edge unless otherwise noted.

### Fabric A, cut:

(3) 20½" squares

### Fabric B, cut

(3) 20½" squares

### Fabric C, cut

(3) 20½" squares

### Fabric D, cut

(3) 20½" squares

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
## Napkin Sewing

- Sew using a ¼" seam allowance with right sides together (RST) unless otherwise indicated. Press seams towards the darker fabric, unless otherwise indicated.

1. Place (1) 20½" **Fabric C** square on top of (1) 20½" **Fabric B** square, right sides together. Sew the (2) squares together on all four sides, leaving a 4" opening for turning.
2. Turn right side out and press.
3. Top stitch 1/8" from edge to finish edges and close the opening to make (1) Napkin #1 (**Fig. 11**).




4. Repeat Steps 1-3 to make (3) Napkin #1's total.


5. Repeat Steps 1-4 and refer to **Fig. 12** for fabric identification and placement to make (3) Napkin #2's.


