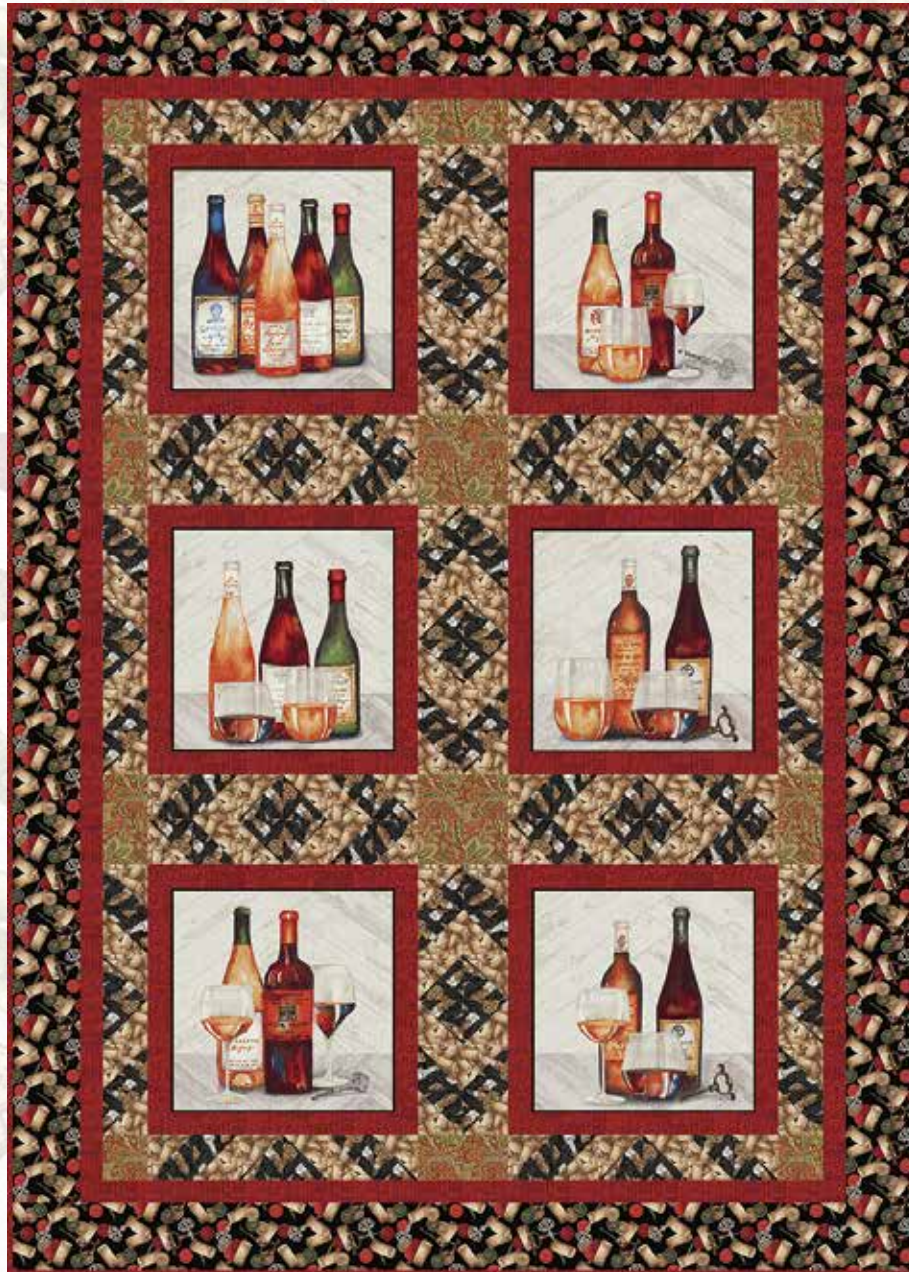

# AFTER FIVE

## Quilt 1

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### Materials

$\frac{2}{3}$ yard	Wine Bottle Blocks - Multi (A)	348-89
1 $\frac{1}{8}$ yards	Words Texture - Burgundy (B)	344-88*
$\frac{2}{3}$ yard	Packed Corks - Brown (C)	342-33
$\frac{2}{3}$ yard	Bottle Toppers - Black (D)	340-94
$\frac{1}{4}$ yard	Paisley - Multi (E)	345-85
$\frac{5}{8}$ yard	Tossed Corks and Corkscrews - Multi (F)	346-98
3 $\frac{3}{4}$ yards	Wine Labels - Multi (Backing)	339-48

\*Includes binding

### Cutting Instructions

Please note: All strips are cut across the width of fabric (WOF) from selvage to selvage edge unless otherwise noted.

#### From the Wine Bottle Blocks - Multi (A):

- Fussy cut (6) 10  $\frac{1}{2}$ " squares, each centered on a block.

#### From the Words Texture - Burgundy (B), cut:

- (3) 2" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (12) 2" x 10  $\frac{1}{2}$ " strips.
- (4) 2" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (12) 2" x 13  $\frac{1}{2}$ " strips.
- (3) 1  $\frac{1}{2}$ " x WOF strips. Sew the strips together end to end with diagonal seams and cut (2) 1  $\frac{1}{2}$ " x 48  $\frac{1}{2}$ " strips.
- (2) 1  $\frac{1}{2}$ " x 34  $\frac{1}{2}$ " WOF strips.
- (5) 2  $\frac{1}{2}$ " x WOF strips for the binding.

#### From the Packed Corks - Brown (C), cut:

- (2) 2  $\frac{7}{8}$ " x WOF strips. Sub-cut (24) 2  $\frac{7}{8}$ " squares.
- (6) 2  $\frac{1}{2}$ " x WOF strips. Sub-cut (48) 2  $\frac{1}{2}$ " x 4  $\frac{1}{2}$ " strips.

#### From the Bottle Toppers - Black (D), cut:

- (2) 2  $\frac{7}{8}$ " x WOF strips. Sub-cut (24) 2  $\frac{7}{8}$ " squares.
- (6) 2  $\frac{1}{2}$ " x WOF strips. Sub-cut (96) 2  $\frac{1}{2}$ " squares.

#### From the Paisley - Multi (E), cut:

- (2) 2  $\frac{1}{2}$ " x WOF strips. Sub-cut (24) 2  $\frac{1}{2}$ " squares.

#### From the Tossed Corks and Corkscrews - Multi (F), cut:

- (3) 3  $\frac{1}{2}$ " x WOF strips. Sew the strips together end to end with diagonal seams and cut (2) 3  $\frac{1}{2}$ " x 50  $\frac{1}{2}$ " strips.
- (2) 3  $\frac{1}{2}$ " x 40  $\frac{1}{2}$ " WOF strips.

#### From the Wine Labels - Multi (Backing), cut:

- (2) 64" x WOF strips for the backing. Sew the strips together and trim to make the 48" x 64" back.

### Block Assembly

**Note:** Pay attention to the unit orientations when assembling the various components. Use a  $\frac{1}{4}$ " seam allowance with right sides together (RST) unless otherwise noted.

- Sew (1) 2" x 10  $\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric B strip to each side of (1) 10  $\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric A square. Sew (1) 2" x 13  $\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric B strip to the top and to the bottom of the Fabric A square to make (1) Unit 1 square (Fig. 1). **Trim the unit to measure 12  $\frac{1}{2}$ " x 12  $\frac{1}{2}$ ".** Repeat to make (6) Unit 1 squares total.

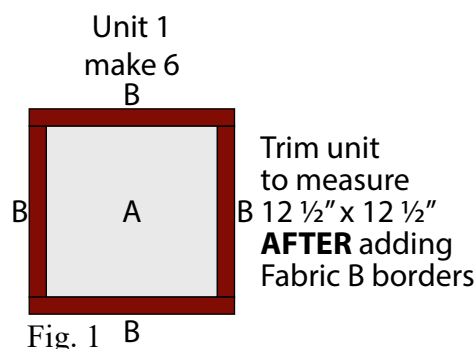

- Place (1) 2  $\frac{7}{8}$ " Fabric C square on top of (1) 2  $\frac{7}{8}$ " Fabric D square, right sides together. Draw a line across the diagonal of the top square (Fig. 2). Sew  $\frac{1}{4}$ " away from each side of the drawn diagonal line (Fig. 2). Cut the (2) squares apart on the drawn diagonal line (Fig. 3) to make (2) half-square triangles. Trim the half-square triangles to measure 2  $\frac{1}{2}$ " square to make (2) Unit 2 squares (Fig. 4). Repeat to make (48) Unit 2 squares total.

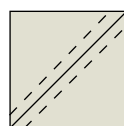

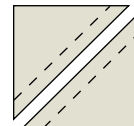

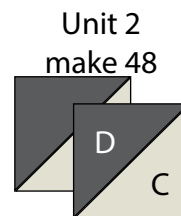

- Place (1) 2  $\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric D square on the left side of (1) 2  $\frac{1}{2}$ " x 4  $\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric C strip, right sides together (Fig. 5). Sew across the diagonal of the square from the upper left corner to the lower right corner (Fig. 5). Flip open the triangle formed and press (Fig. 6). Trim away the excess fabric from behind the triangle, leaving a  $\frac{1}{4}$ " seam allowance.

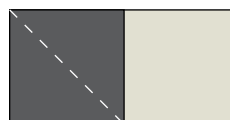

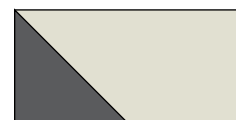

4. Place another 2 ½" Fabric D square on the right side of the 2 ½" x 4 ½" Fabric C strip, right sides together (Fig. 7). Sew across the diagonal of the square from the upper left corner to the lower right corner (Fig. 7). Flip open the triangle formed and press. Trim away the excess fabric from behind the triangle, leaving a ¼" seam allowance to make (1) Unit 3 strip (Fig. 8).

5. Repeat Steps 3-4 to make (24) Unit 3 strips total.

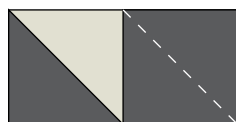

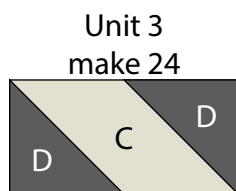

6. Repeat Steps 3-4 and refer to Figure 9 for fabric identification, placement and seam direction to make (24) Unit 4 strips.

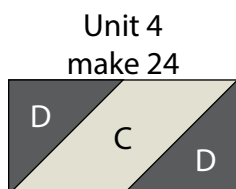

7. Sew (1) Unit 3 strip to the left end of (1) Unit 4 strip. Sew (1) Unit 2 square to each end of the newly sewn strip to make (1) Unit 5 strip (Fig. 10). Repeat to make (24) Unit 5 strips total.

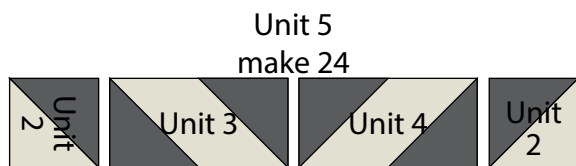

8. Sew (1) 2 ½" Fabric E square to each end of (1) Unit 5 strip to make (1) Unit 6 strip (Fig. 11). Repeat to make (12) Unit 6 strips total.

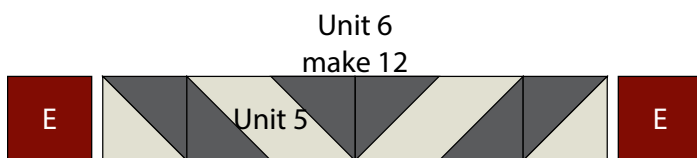

9. Sew (1) Unit 5 strip to each side of (1) Unit 1 square. Sew (1) Unit 6 strip to the top and to the bottom of the newly sewn strip to make (1) 16 ½" Block One square (Fig. 12). Repeat to make (6) Block One squares total.

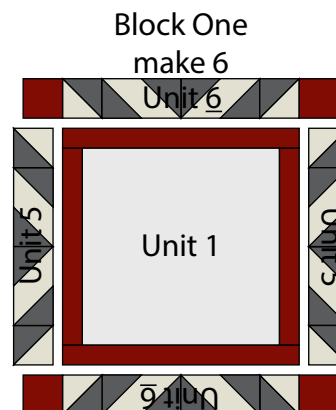

10. Sew (2) Block One squares together to make Row One. Repeat to make Row Two and Row Three. Sew the (3) rows together in numerical order to make the 32 ½" x 48 ½" Center Block (Fig. 13).

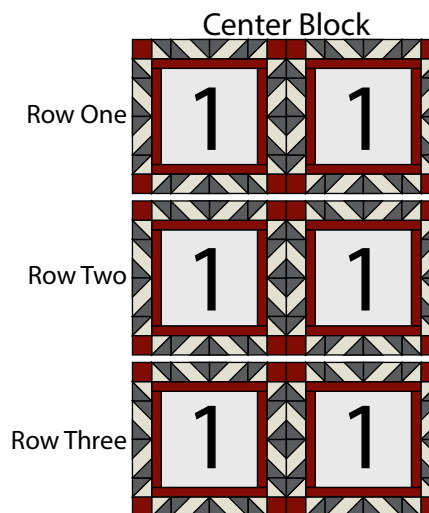

# AFTER FIVE

## Quilt 1

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### Quilt Top Assembly

*(Follow the Quilt Layout while assembling the quilt top.)*

11. Sew (1) 1 ½" x 48 ½" Fabric B strip to each side of the Center Block. Sew (1) 1 ½" x 34 ½" Fabric B strip to the top and to the bottom of the Center Block.

12. Sew (1) 3 ½" x 50 ½" Fabric F strip to each side of the Center Block. Sew (1) 3 ½" x 40 ½" Fabric F strip to the top and to the bottom of the Center Block to make the quilt top.

13. Layer and quilt as desired.

14. Sew the (5) 2 ½" x WOF Fabric B strips together, end to end with 45-degree seams, to make the binding. Fold this long strip in half lengthwise with wrong sides together and press.

15. Bind as desired.
