




Cutting Instructions

Please note: All strips are cut across the width of fabric (WOF) from selvage to selvage edge unless otherwise noted.

From the Give Thanks Panel - 36 inches x 44 inches – Cream/Tan (A):

• Fussy cut (1) 43" x 35" rectangle, centered on the panel.

From the Tossed Sprigs - Dark Gold (B), cut:

• (2) 3 ³/₄" x 35" WOF strips.

- (3) 3 ³/₄" x WOF strips. Sew the strips together end to end with diagonal seams and cut (2) 3 ³/₄" x 49 ¹/₂" strips.
- (1) 2 ⁷/₈" x WOF strip. Sub-cut (4) 2 ⁷/₈" squares and (8) 2 ¹/₂" squares.

From the Floral Buttons - Black/Brown (C), cut:

- (3) 2" x WOF strips. Sew the strips together end to end with diagonal seams and cut (2) 2" x 48 ¹/₂" strips.
- (4) 1 ¹/₂" x WOF strips. Sew the strips together end to end with diagonal seams and cut (2) 1 ¹/₂" x 67 ¹/₂" strips.
- (3) 1 ¹/₂" x WOF strips. Sew the strips together end to end with diagonal seams and cut (2) 1 ¹/₂" x 50 ¹/₂" strips.

From the Foulard Diamonds - Black/Cheddar (D), cut: (4) 21/3 w WOE string Sub ant (64) 21/3 appared

• (4) 2 ¹/₂" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (64) 2 ¹/₂" squares.

From the Foulard Diamonds - Black/Taupe (E), cut:

• (4) 2 ¹/₂" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (64) 2 ¹/₂" squares.

 From the Buttermilk Blenders - Cream (F), cut: (4) 2 ⁷/₈" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (46) 2 ⁷/₈" squares. (2) 2 ¹/₂" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (20) 2 ¹/₂" squares. (2) 2" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (40) 2" squares. (4) 1 ¹/₂" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (32) 1 ¹/₂" x 4 ¹/₂" strips. (6) 1 ¹/₂" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (32) 1 ¹/₂" x 6 ¹/₂" strips. 		
From the Acorns and Oak Leaves - Pumpkin (G), cut: • (1) 4 ¹ / ₂ " x WOF strip. Sub-cut (6) 4 ¹ / ₂ " squares.		
From the Tiny Wheels - Pumpkin (H), cut: • (1) 4 ¹ / ₂ " x WOF strip. Sub-cut (6) 4 ¹ / ₂ " squares.		
From the Floral Bud Trellis - Red (I), cut: • (1) 4 ¹ / ₂ " x WOF strip. Sub-cut (4) 4 ¹ / ₂ " squares.		
 From the Tiny Wheels - Red (J), cut: (1) 2 ⁷/₈" x WOF strip. Sub-cut (10) 2 ⁷/₈" squares. (2) 2 ¹/₂" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (20) 2 ¹/₂" squares. 		
 From the Tossed Sprigs - Green (K), cut: (1) 2 ⁷/₈" x WOF strip. Sub-cut (4) 2 ⁷/₈" squares and (8) 2 ¹/₂" squares. 		
 From the Floral Bud Trellis - Gold (L), cut: (1) 2 ⁷/₈" x WOF strip. Sub-cut (12) 2 ⁷/₈" squares. (1) 2 ¹/₂" x WOF strip. Sub-cut (12) 2 ¹/₂" squares. 		
 From the Tiny Berry Toss - Dark Pumpkin (M), cut: (1) 2 ⁷/₈" x WOF strip. Sub-cut (4) 2 ⁷/₈" squares and (8) 2 ¹/₂" squares. 		
 From the Floral Buttons - Squash (N), cut: (1) 2 ⁷/₈" x WOF strip. Sub-cut (6) 2 ⁷/₈" squares. (1) 2 ¹/₂" x WOF strip. Sub-cut (12) 2 ¹/₂" squares. 		
 From the Acorns and Oak Leaves - Green (O), cut: (1) 2 ⁷/₈" x WOF strip. Sub-cut (6) 2 ⁷/₈" squares. (1) 2 ¹/₂" x WOF strip. Sub-cut (12) 2 ¹/₂" squares. 		
 From the Tiny Berry Toss - Cream (P), cut: (4) 2" x WOF strips. Sew the strips together end to end with diagonal seams and cut (2) 2" x 69 ½" strips. (3) 2" x WOF strips. Sew the strips together end to end with diagonal seams and cut (2) 2" x 53 ½" strips. 		
 From the Novelty Toss - Cocoa (Q), cut: (4) 6 ¹/₂" x WOF strips. Sew the strips together end to end with diagonal seams and cut (2) 6 ¹/₂" x 72 ¹/₂" strips. (3) 6 ¹/₂" x WOF strips. Sew the strips together end to end with diagonal seams and cut (2) 6 ¹/₂" x 53 ¹/₂" strips. 		
From the Buttermilk Blenders - Brick (R), cut: • (8) 2 ¹ / ₂ " x WOF strips for the binding.		
From the Berry Branches - Red (Backing), cut:		


• (2) 92" x WOF strips for the backing. Sew the strips together and trim to make the 73" x 92" back.


Block Assembly

Note: The arrows in figures represent the fabric print direction. Pay attention to the fabric and unit orientations when assembling the various components. Use a ¼" seam allowance with right sides together (RST) unless otherwise noted.


1. Sew (1) $3\frac{3}{4}$ " x 35" Fabric B strip to each side of the 43" x 35" Fabric A rectangle. Sew (1) $3\frac{3}{4}$ " x 49 $\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric B strip to the top and to the bottom of the Fabric A rectangle to make the Center Block (Fig. 1). Trim the block to measure 48 $\frac{1}{2}$ " x 40 $\frac{1}{2}$ ".



2. Place (1) 2 $\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric E square on the top left corner of (1) 4 $\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric G square, right sides together (Fig. 2). Sew across the diagonal of the smaller square from the upper right corner to the lower left corner (Fig. 2). Flip open the triangle formed and press. Trim away the excess fabric from behind the triangle $\frac{1}{4}$ " away from the sewn seam (Fig. 3).



- 3. Follow Figure 4 for the seam direction to add a $2\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric E square to each of the remaining corners of the $4\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric G square to make (1) Unit 1 square (Fig. 5).
- 4. Repeat Steps 2-3 to make (6) Unit 1 squares total.




5. Repeat Steps 2-3 and refer to Figures 6-7 for fabric identification, placement, seam direction and orientation to make (4) Unit 2 squares and (6) Unit 3 squares.







6. Sew (1) 1 $\frac{1}{2}$ " x 4 $\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric F strip to each side of (1) Unit 1 square. Sew (1) 1 $\frac{1}{2}$ " x 6 $\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric F strip to the top and to the bottom of the Unit 1 square to make (1) Unit 4 square (Fig. 8). Repeat to make (6) Unit 4 squares total.



7. Repeat Step 6 and refer to Figures 9-10 for component identification and placement to make (4) Unit 5 squares and (6) Unit 6 squares.



8. Place (1) 2 $\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric D square on the top left corner of (1) Unit 4 square, right sides together (Fig. 11). Sew across the diagonal of the smaller square from the upper right corner to the lower left corner (Fig. 11). Flip open the triangle formed and press. Trim away the excess fabric from behind the triangle $\frac{1}{4}$ " away from the sewn seam (Fig. 12).






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
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9. Follow Figure 13 for the seam direction to add a $2\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric D square to each of the remaining corners of the Unit 4 square to make (1) Block One square (Fig. 14).

10. Repeat Steps 8-9 to make (6) Block One squares total.








12. Place (1) 2 $\frac{7}{8}$ " Fabric K square on top of (1) 2 $\frac{7}{8}$ " Fabric F square, right sides together. Draw a line across the diagonal of the top square from the upper left corner to the lower right corner (Fig. 17). Sew $\frac{1}{4}$ " away from each side of the drawn diagonal line (Fig. 17). Cut the (2) squares apart on the drawn diagonal line (Fig. 18) to make (2) half-square triangles. Trim the half-square triangles to measure 2 $\frac{1}{2}$ " square to make (2) Unit 7 squares (Fig. 19). Repeat to make (8) Unit 7 squares total.




13. Repeat Step 12 and refer to Figures 20-25 for fabric identification, placement and seam direction to make the indicated number of unit squares for Unit 8 through Unit 13. *Note: There will be (92) unit squares total for Unit 7 through Unit 13. Due to the directional fabric, only (12) of Unit 11 will be used.*




14. Place (1) 2" Fabric F square on the bottom left corner of (1) 2 $\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric K square, right sides together (Fig. 26). Sew across the diagonal of the smaller square from the upper left corner to the lower right corner (Fig. 26). Flip open the triangle formed and press. Trim away the excess fabric from behind the triangle $\frac{1}{4}$ " away from the sewn seam (Fig. 27).

15. Follow Figure 28 for the seam direction to add a 2" Fabric F square to the upper right corner of the $2\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric K square to make (1) Unit 14 square (Fig. 29).

16. Repeat Steps 14-15 to make a second Unit 14 square.



17. Repeat Steps 14-15 and refer to Figures 30-35 for fabric identification, placement, seam direction and orientation to make the indicated number of unit squares for Unit 15 through Unit 20. *Note: There will be (20) unit squares total for Unit 14 through Unit 20.*




18. Sew together (1) $2\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric F square and (2) Unit 7 squares, in that order from left to right, to make row one (Fig. 36).

19. Sew together (1) Unit 7 square and (2) $2\frac{1}{2}$ Fabric K squares, in that order from left to right, to make row two (Fig. 36).


20. Sew (1) Unit 7 square, (1) 2 ¹/₂" Fabric K square and (1) Unit 14 square together in that order from left to right to make the bottom row (Fig. 36).

21. Sew together the (3) rows from Steps 18-20 lengthwise to make (1) 6 ¹/₂" Block Four square (Fig. 36).

22. Repeat Steps 18-21 to make a second Block Four square.




23. Repeat Steps 18-21 and refer to Figures 37-42 for component identification, placement and orientation to make (2) Block Five squares, (2) Block Six squares, (5) Block Seven squares, (3) Block Eight squares, (2) Block Nine squares and (3) Block Ten squares.



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24. Follow Figure 43 and sew together (16) assorted Blocks into a 2×8 matrix to make the Inner Top Border. Repeat to make the Inner Bottom Border.



25. Sew together (1) Unit 8 square, (1) 6 ¹/₂" x 53 ¹/₂" Fabric Q strip and (1) Unit 7 square, in that order from left to right, to make the Outer Top Border (Fig. 44).



26. Sew together (1) Unit 9 square, (1) 6 ¹/₂" x 53 ¹/₂" Fabric Q strip and (1) Unit 10 square, in that order from left to right, to make the Outer Bottom Border (Fig. 45).

Quilt Top Assembly

(Follow the Quilt Layout while assembling the quilt top.) 27. Sew (1) 2" x 48 ¹/₂" Fabric C strip to the top and to the bottom of the Center Block.

28. Sew the Inner Top Border and the Inner Bottom Border to the top and to the bottom of the Center Block.

29. Sew (1) $1 \frac{1}{2}$ " x 67 $\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric C strip to each side of the Center Block. Sew (1) $1 \frac{1}{2}$ " x 50 $\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric C strip to the top and to the bottom of the Center Block.

30. Sew (1) 2" x 69 $\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric P strip to each side of the Center Block. Sew (1) 2" x 53 $\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric P strip to the top and to the bottom of the Center Block.


31. Sew (1) 6 $\frac{1}{2}$ " x 72 $\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric Q strip to each side of the Center Block.

32. Sew the Outer Top Border and the Outer Bottom Border to the top and to the bottom of the Center Block to make the quilt top.

33. Layer and quilt as desired.

34. Sew the (8) $2\frac{1}{2}$ x WOF Fabric R strips together, end to end with 45-degree seams, to make the binding. Fold this long strip in half lengthwise with wrong sides together and press.

35. Bind as desired.



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
