





5/8 yard	Folio - Tan (F)	7755-46
1/4 yard	Circle Dots - Pumpkin (G)	2520-35
3/8 yard	Paisley - Black (H)	2523-99
1/4 yard	Folio - Wine (I)	7755-89
3/8 yard	Stripe - Red (J)	2525-88
1 3/8 yards	Autumn Floral - Black (K)	2524-99
5 yards	Tossed Leaves - Black (Backing)	2522-99

Cutting Instructions

Please note: all strips are cut across the width of fabric (WOF) from selvage to selvage edge unless otherwise noted.

From the Autumn Banner Panel - Cream (A):

• Fussy cut (1) 23" x 42 ½" panel, centered on the panel.

From the Folio - Sepia Brown (B), cut:

- (2) 2" x 42 ½" WOF strips, piece as needed.
- (2) 2" x 26" WOF strips.
- (3) 1 ½" x WOF strips. Sew the strips together end to end with diagonal seams and cut (2) 1 ½" x 52 ½" strips.
- (2) 1 ½" x 36 ½" WOF strips.

From the Patterned Leaves - Black (C), cut:

- (3) 5 ½" x WOF strips. Sew the strips together end to end with diagonal seams and cut (2) 5 ½" x 44 ½" strips.
- (2) 4 ½" x 34 ½" WOF strips.

From the Blocks - Red (D):

• Fussy cut (17) 6 ½" squares, each centered on a design.

From the Circle Dots - Green (E), cut:

- (1) 2 \%" x WOF strip. Sub-cut (8) 2 \%" squares.
- (1) 2 ½" x WOF strip. Sub-cut (16) 2 ½" squares.
- (7) 2 ½" x WOF strips for the binding.

From the Folio - Tan (F), cut:

- (3) 2 1/8" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (34) 2 1/8" squares.
- (2) 2 ½" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (17) 2 ½" squares and (14) 2" squares.
- (1) 2" x WOF strip. Sub-cut (20) 2" squares.

From the Circle Dots - Pumpkin (G), cut:

- (1) 2 \%" x WOF strip. Sub-cut (8) 2 \%" squares.
- (1) 2 ½" x WOF strip. Sub-cut (16) 2 ½" squares.

From the Paisley - Black (H), cut:

- (1) 2 \%" x WOF strip. Sub-cut (10) 2 \%" squares.
- (2) 2 ½" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (20) 2 ½" squares.

From the Folio - Wine (I), cut:

- (1) 2 1/8" x WOF strip. Sub-cut (8) 2 1/8" squares.
- (1) 2 ½" x WOF strip. Sub-cut (16) 2 ½" squares.

From the Stripe - Red (J), cut:

- (4) 1 ½" x WOF strips. Sew the strips together end to end with diagonal seams and cut (2) 1 ½" x 66 ½" strips.
- (3) 1 ½" x WOF strips. Sew the strips together end to end with diagonal seams and cut (2) 1 ½" x 50 ½" strips.

From the Autumn Floral - Black (K), cut:

- (4) 5 ½" x WOF strips. Sew the strips together end to end with diagonal seams and cut (2) 5 ½" x 68 ½" strips.
- (3) 5 ½" x WOF strips. Sew the strips together end to end with diagonal seams and cut (2) 5 ½" x 60 ½" strips.

From the Tossed Leaves - Black (Backing), cut:

• (2) 86" x WOF strips for the backing. Sew the strips together and trim to make the 68" x 86" back.

Block Assembly

Note: Pay attention to the unit orientations when assembling the various components.

1. Sew (1) 2" x 42 ½" Fabric B strip to each side of the 23" x 42 ½" Fabric A panel. Sew (1) 2" x 26" Fabric B strip to the top and to the bottom of the Fabric A panel. **Trim the block to measure 24** ½" **x** 44 ½" to make the Center Block (Fig. 1).



2. Place (1) 2 $\frac{7}{8}$ " Fabric E square on top of (1) 2 $\frac{7}{8}$ " Fabric F square, right sides together. Draw a line across the diagonal of the top square (Fig. 2). Sew $\frac{1}{4}$ " away from each side of the drawn diagonal line (Fig. 2). Cut the (2) squares apart on the drawn diagonal line (Fig. 3) to make (2) half-square triangles. Trim the half-square triangles to measure 2 $\frac{1}{2}$ " square to make (2) Unit 1 squares (Fig. 4). Repeat to make (16) Unit 1 squares total.












3. Repeat Step 2 and refer to Figures 5-7 for fabric identification and placement to make (16) Unit 2 squares, (20) Unit 3 squares and (16) Unit 4 squares.






Fig. 8 Fig. 9

4. Place (1) 2" Fabric F square on the top left corner of (1) 2 ½" Fabric E square, right sides together (Fig. 8). Sew across the diagonal of the smaller square from the upper right corner to the lower left corner (Fig. 8). Flip open the triangle formed and press (Fig. 9). Trim away the excess fabric from behind the triangle ¼" away from the sewn seam.


- 5. Follow Figure 10 for the seam direction to add a 2" Fabric F square to the lower right corner of the 2 ½" Fabric E square to make (1) Unit 5 square (Fig. 11).
- 6. Repeat Steps 4-5 to make (4) Unit 5 squares total.







7. Repeat Steps 4-5 and refer to Figures 12-14 for fabric identification, placement and seam direction to make (4) Unit 6 squares, (5) Unit 7 squares and (4) Unit 8 squares.







- 8. Sew (2) Unit 1 squares and (1) 2 ½" Fabric F square together in that order left to right to make the top row. Sew (2) 2 ½" Fabric E squares and (1) Unit 1 square together in that order left to right to make the middle row. Sew (1) Unit 5 square, (1) 2 ½" Fabric E square and (1) Unit 1 square together in that order to make the bottom row. Sew the (3) rows together to make (1) Block One square (Fig. 15). Repeat to make (4) Block One squares total.
- 9. Repeat Step 8 and refer to Figures 16-18 for component identification, placement and orientation to make (4) Block Two squares, (5) Block Three squares and (4) Block Four squares.




Quilt Top Assembly

(Follow the Quilt Layout while assembling the quilt top.)
10. Sew (1) 5 ½" x 44 ½" Fabric C strip to each side of the Center Block. Sew (1) 4 ½" x 34 ½" Fabric C strip to the top and to the bottom of the Center Block.

- 11. Sew (1) 1 ½" x 52 ½" Fabric B strip to each side of the Center Block. Sew (1) 1 ½" x 36 ½" Fabric B strip to the top and to the bottom of the Center Block.
- 12. Sew together (1) Block Three square, (1) 6 ½" Fabric D square, (1) Block Four square, (1) 6 ½" Fabric D square, (1) Block Two square, (1) 6 ½" Fabric D square, (1) Block Three square, (1) 6 ½" Fabric D square and (1) Block One square, in that order from top to bottom, to make the Left Side Border. Sew the Left Side Border to the left side of the Center Block.

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- 13. Repeat Step 12 and refer to the quilt layout for component identification, placement and orientation to make the Right Side Border, Top Border and Bottom Border. Sew the Right Side Border to the right side of the Center Block. Sew the Top Border and Bottom Border to the top and to the bottom of the Center Block.
- 14. Sew (1) 1 ½" x 66 ½" Fabric J strip to each side of the Center Block. Sew (1) 1 ½" x 50 ½" Fabric J strip to the top and to the bottom of the Center Block.
- 15. Sew (1) 5 ½" x 68 ½" Fabric K strip to each side of the Center Block. Sew (1) 5 ½" x 60 ½" Fabric K strip to the top and to the bottom of the Center Block to make the quilt top.
- 16. Layer and quilt as desired.
- 17. Sew the (7) 2 ½" x WOF Fabric E strips together, end to end with 45-degree seams, to make the binding. Fold this long strip in half lengthwise with wrong sides together and press.
- 18. Bind as desired.
