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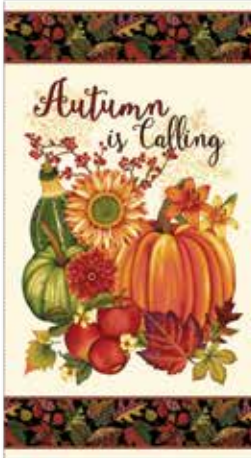

1/4 yard	Folio - Dark Pumpkin (D)	7755-32
1/4 yard	Folio - Butter (E)	7755-03
1 5/8 yards	Foulard - Cream (F)	2526-33
1/2 yard	Circle Dots - Pumpkin (G)	2520-35
1/2 yard	Folio - Wine (H)	7755-89
1/4 yard	Folio - Gold (I)	7755-33
1/3 yard	Folio - Forest (J)	7755-68

Cutting Instructions

Please note: all strips are cut across the width of fabric (WOF) from selvage to selvage edge unless otherwise noted.

From the Blocks - Red (A):

- Fussy cut (6) 6 1/2" squares, each centered on a design.

From the Folio - Sepia Brown (B), cut:

- (2) 2" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (12) 2" x 6 1/2" strips.
- (3) 2" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (12) 2" x 9 1/2" strips.

From the Paisley - Pumpkin (C), cut:

- (2) 3 1/2" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (24) 3 1/2" x 2 3/4" strips.
- (3) 3 1/8" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (36) 3 1/8" squares.

From the Folio - Dark Pumpkin (D), cut:

- (2) 3 1/8" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (24) 3 1/8" squares.

From the Folio - Butter (E), cut:

- (1) 3 1/8" x WOF strip. Sub-cut (12) 3 1/8" squares.

From the Foulard - Cream (F), cut:

- (1) 4" x WOF strip. Sub-cut (4) 4" squares.
- (6) 2 1/2" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (88) 2 1/2" squares.
- (5) 2 1/2" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (44) 2 1/2" x 4" strips.
- Fussy cut (10) 6 1/2" squares, each centered on a design.

From the Circle Dots - Pumpkin (G), cut:

- (4) 3 1/2" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (48) 3 1/2" squares.

From the Folio - Wine (H), cut:

- (4) 3 1/2" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (24) 3 1/2" x 6 1/2" strips.

From the Folio - Gold (I), cut:

- (2) 3 1/2" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (24) 3 1/2" squares.

From the Folio - Forest (J), cut:

- (2) 3 7/8" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (12) 3 7/8" squares.

From the Folio - Black (K), cut:

- (2) 3 7/8" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (12) 3 7/8" squares.
- (4) 1 1/2" x WOF strips. Sew the strips together end to end with diagonal seams and cut (2) 1 1/2" x 65 1/2" strips.
- (3) 1 1/2" x WOF strips. Sew the strips together end to end with diagonal seams and cut (2) 1 1/2" x 54 1/2" strips.
- (7) 2 1/2" x WOF strips for the binding.

From the Folio - Tan (L), cut:

- (5) 1 1/2" x 40 1/2" WOF strips.
- (6) 1 1/2" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (16) 1 1/2" x 12 1/2" strips.

From the Folio - Dark Olive (M), cut:

- (4) 2 1/2" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (44) 2 1/2" x 3" strips.

From the Circle Dots - Green (N), cut:

- (1) 5 1/2" x WOF strip. Sub-cut (2) 5 1/2" x 6 1/2" strips.
- (8) 2 1/2" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (44) 2 1/2" x 6 1/2" strips.

From the Patterned Leaves - Black (Backing), cut:

- (2) 62" x WOF strips for the backing. Sew the strips together and trim to make the 62" x 75" back.

Block Assembly

Note: Pay attention to the unit orientations when assembling the various components.

1. Sew (1) 2" x 6 1/2" Fabric B strip to each side of (1) 6 1/2" Fabric A square. Sew (1) 2" x 9 1/2" Fabric B strip to the top and to the bottom of the Fabric A square. **Trim the block to measure 8" square** to make (1) Unit 1 square (Fig. 1). Repeat to make (6) Unit 1 squares total.

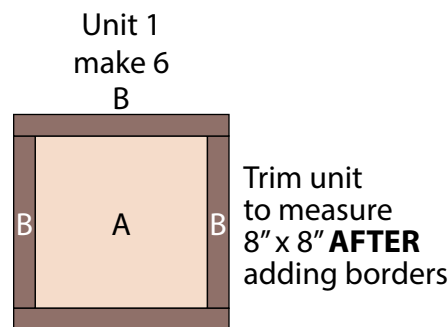
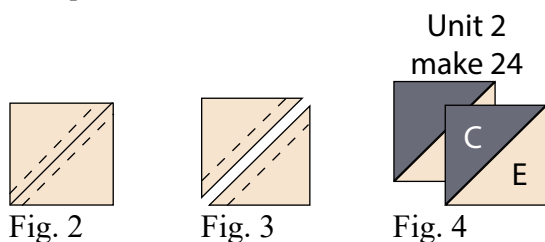


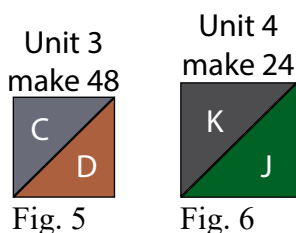

2. Place (1) $3\frac{1}{8}$ " Fabric E square on top of (1) $3\frac{1}{8}$ " Fabric C square, right sides together. Draw a line across the diagonal of the top square (Fig. 2). Sew $\frac{1}{4}$ " away from each side of the drawn diagonal line (Fig. 2). Cut the (2) squares apart on the drawn diagonal line (Fig. 3) to make (2) half-square triangles. Trim the half-square triangles to measure $2\frac{3}{4}$ " to make (2) Unit 2 squares (Fig. 4). Repeat to make (24) Unit 2 squares total.

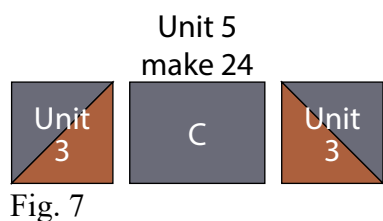


3. Repeat Step 2 and refer to Figures 5 for fabric identification and placement to make (48) Unit 3 squares.

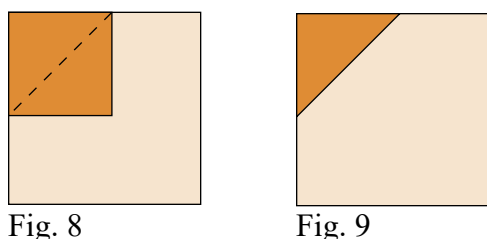
4. Repeat Step 2 and refer to Figure 6 for fabric identification and placement while using (12) $3\frac{7}{8}$ " Fabric J squares and (12) $3\frac{7}{8}$ " Fabric K squares to make (24) $3\frac{1}{2}$ " Unit 4 squares.



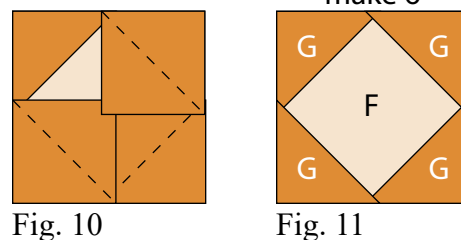
5. Sew (1) Unit 3 square to each end of (1) $3\frac{1}{2}$ " x $2\frac{3}{4}$ " Fabric C strip to make (1) Unit 5 strip (Fig. 7). Repeat to make (24) Unit 5 strips total.



6. Place (1) $3\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric G square on the top left corner of (1) $6\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric F square, right sides together (Fig. 8). Sew across the diagonal of the smaller square from the upper right corner to the lower left corner (Fig. 8). Flip open the triangle formed and press (Fig. 9). Trim away the excess fabric from behind the triangle $\frac{1}{4}$ " away from the sewn seam.

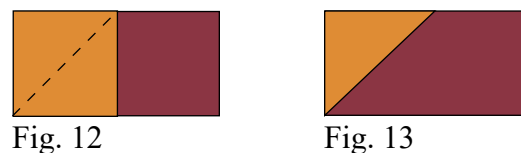


7. Follow Figure 10 for the seam direction to add a $3\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric G square to each of the remaining corners of the $6\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric F square to make (1) Unit 6 square (Fig. 11).



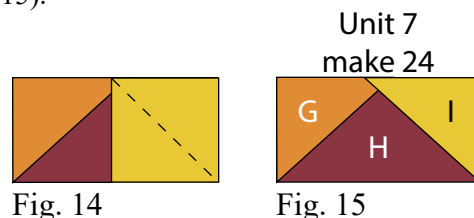
8. Repeat Steps 6-7 to make (6) Unit 6 squares total.

9. Place (1) $3\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric G square on the left side of (1) $3\frac{1}{2}$ " x $6\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric H strip, right sides together (Fig. 12). Sew across the diagonal of the square from the upper right corner to the lower left corner (Fig. 12). Flip open the triangle formed and press (Fig. 13). Trim away the excess fabric from behind the triangle, leaving a $\frac{1}{4}$ " seam allowance.

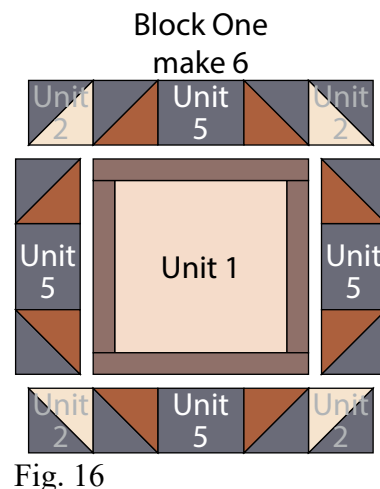


10. Place (1) $3\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric I square on the right side of the $3\frac{1}{2}$ " x $6\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric H strip, right sides together (Fig. 14). Sew across the diagonal of the square from the upper left corner to the lower right corner (Fig. 14). Flip open the triangle formed and press. Trim away the excess fabric from behind the triangle, leaving a $\frac{1}{4}$ " seam allowance to make (1) Unit 7 strip (Fig. 15).

11. Repeat Steps 9-10 to make (24) Unit 7 strips total.



12. Sew (1) Unit 2 square to each end of (1) Unit 5 strip to make the top row. Repeat to make the bottom row. Sew (1) Unit 5 strip to each side of (1) Unit 1 square to make the middle row. Sew the (3) rows together lengthwise to make (1) Block One square (Fig. 16). Repeat to make (6) Block One squares total.



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13. Repeat Step 12 and refer to Figure 17 for component identification, placement and orientation to make (6) Block Two squares.

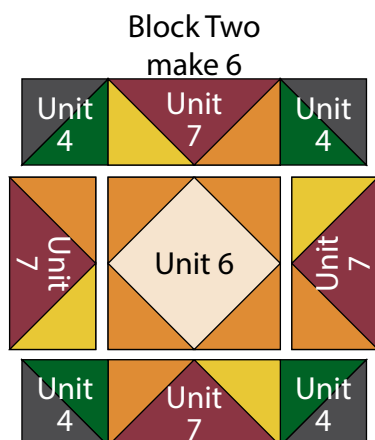

14. Place (1) 2 ½" Fabric F square on the top half of (1) 2 ½" x 3 ½" Fabric M strip, right sides together (Fig. 18). Sew across the diagonal of the small square from the upper left corner to the lower right corner (Fig. 18). Flip open the triangle formed and press. Trim away the excess fabric from behind the triangle ¼" away from the sewn seam to make (1) Unit 8 strip (Fig. 19). Repeat to make (22) Unit 8 strips total.

15. Repeat Step 14 and refer to Figure 20 for fabric identification, placement and seam direction to make (22) Unit 9 strips.

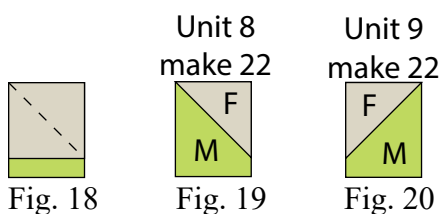

16. Repeat Step 14 and refer to Figure 21-22 for fabric identification, placement and seam direction while using (44) 2 1/2" x 6 1/2" Fabric N strips and (44) 2 1/2" Fabric F squares to make (22) Unit 10 strips and (22) Unit 11 strips.

17. Sew (1) Unit 10 strip to the left side of (1) Unit 11 strip lengthwise to make (1) Unit 12 rectangle (Fig. 23). Repeat to make (22) Unit 12 rectangles total.

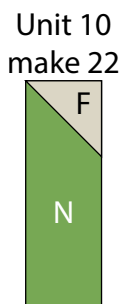

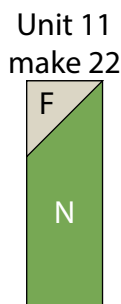

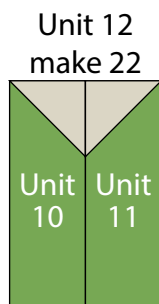

18. Sew (1) 2 ½" x 4" Fabric F strip to the top of (1) Unit 8 square. Sew the newly sewn strip to the left side of (1) Unit 12 rectangle. Sew (1) 2 ½" x 4" Fabric F strip to the top of (1) Unit 9 square. Sew the newly sewn strip to the right side of the Unit 12 to make (1) Unit 13 rectangle (Fig. 24). Repeat to make (22) Unit 13 rectangles total.

19. Repeat Steps 6-7 and refer to Figure 25 for fabric identification, placement and seam direction while using (2) 5 ½" x 6 ½" Fabric N strips and (4) 4" Fabric F squares to make (2) Unit 14 rectangles.

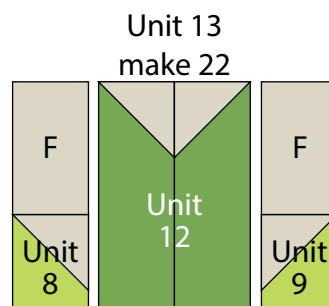

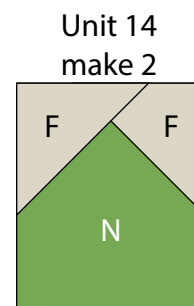

20. Sew (3) Unit 13 rectangles, (1) Unit 14 rectangle and (3) Unit 13 rectangles together in that order top to bottom to make (1) Side Border (Fig. 26). Repeat to make a second Side Border.

21. Sew (5) Unit 13 rectangles together. Sew (1) 6 ½" Fabric F square to each end of the newly sewn strip to make the Top Border (Fig. 27). Repeat to make the Bottom Border.

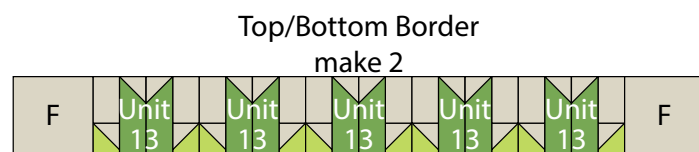

Quilt Top Assembly

(Follow the Quilt Layout while assembling the quilt top.)

22. Sew together (1) 1 ½" x 12 ½" Fabric L strip, (1) Block One square, (1) 1 ½" x 12 ½" Fabric L strip, (1) Block Two square, (1) 1 ½" x 12 ½" Fabric L strip, (1) Block One square and (1) 1 ½" x 12 ½" Fabric L strip, in that order from left to right, to make Row One. Repeat to make Row Three.

23. Sew together (1) 1 ½" x 12 ½" Fabric L strip, (1) Block Two square, (1) 1 ½" x 12 ½" Fabric L strip, (1) Block One square, (1) 1 ½" x 12 ½" Fabric L strip, (1) Block Two square and (1) 1 ½" x 12 ½" Fabric L strip, in that order from left to right, to make Row Two. Repeat to make Row Four.

24. Sew (5) 1 ½" x 40 ½" Fabric L strips and the (4) pieced rows, in numerical order, together lengthwise and alternating them, to make the Center Block.

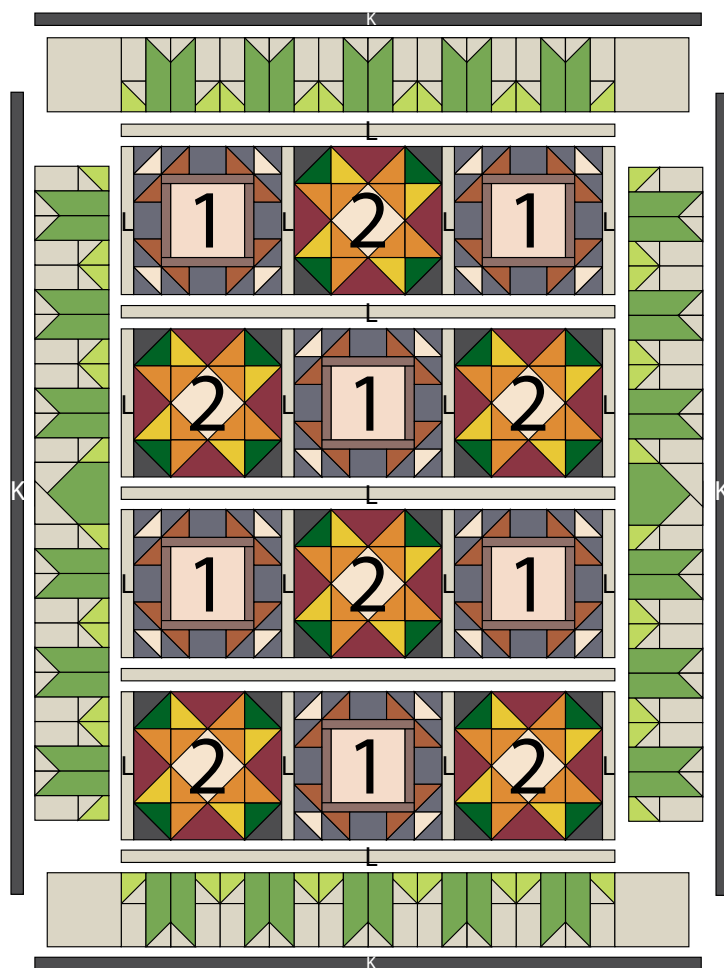
25. Sew (1) Side Border to each side of the Center Block. Sew the Top Border and Bottom Border to the top and to the bottom of the Center Block.

26. Sew (1) 1 ½" x 65 ½" Fabric K strip to each side of the Center Block. Sew (1) 1 ½" x 54 ½" Fabric K strip to the top and to the bottom of the Center Block to make the quilt top.

27. Layer and quilt as desired.

28. Sew the (7) 2 ½" x WOF Fabric K strips together, end to end with 45-degree seams, to make the binding. Fold this long strip in half lengthwise with wrong sides together and press.

29. Bind as desired.
