



Cutting Instructions

Please note: All strips are cut across the width of fabric (WOF) from selvage to selvage edge unless otherwise noted.

From the Allover Novelty - Cream (A), cut:

- (2) 2 1/2" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (5) 2 1/2" x 8 1/2" strips.
- (1) 2 1/2" x WOF strip. Sub-cut (7) 2 1/2" x 4 1/2" strips.

From the Words - Light Blue (B), cut:

- (2) 2 1/2" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (5) 2 1/2" x 8 1/2" strips.
- (1) 2 1/2" x WOF strip. Sub-cut (7) 2 1/2" x 4 1/2" strips.

From the Words - Cream (C), cut:

- (2) 2 1/2" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (5) 2 1/2" x 8 1/2" strips.
- (1) 2 1/2" x WOF strip. Sub-cut (7) 2 1/2" x 4 1/2" strips.

From the Words - Green (D), cut:

- (2) 2 1/2" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (5) 2 1/2" x 8 1/2" strips.
- (1) 2 1/2" x WOF strip. Sub-cut (7) 2 1/2" x 4 1/2" strips.

From the Snails - Pink (E), cut:

- (2) 2 1/2" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (5) 2 1/2" x 8 1/2" strips.
- (1) 2 1/2" x WOF strip. Sub-cut (7) 2 1/2" x 4 1/2" strips.

From the Snails - Green (F), cut:

- (2) 2 1/2" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (5) 2 1/2" x 8 1/2" strips.
- (1) 2 1/2" x WOF strip. Sub-cut (7) 2 1/2" x 4 1/2" strips.

From the Snails - Navy (G), cut:

- (2) 2 1/2" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (5) 2 1/2" x 8 1/2" strips.
- (1) 2 1/2" x WOF strip. Sub-cut (7) 2 1/2" x 4 1/2" strips.

From the Flower Pots - Cream (H), cut:

- (1) 2 1/2" x WOF strip. Sub-cut (4) 2 1/2" x 8 1/2" strips.
- (1) 2 1/2" x WOF strip. Sub-cut (6) 2 1/2" x 4 1/2" strips.

From the Gail Flower Basic - Cream (I), cut:

- (1) 4 1/2" x WOF strip. Sub-cut (4) 4 1/2" squares.
- (1) 2 1/2" x WOF strip. Sub-cut (4) 2 1/2" x 4 1/2" strips.

From the Gail Flower Basic - Green (J), cut:

- (3) 2 1/2" x WOF strips. Sew the strips together end to end with diagonal seams and cut (2) 2 1/2" x 50 1/2" strips.
- (2) 2 1/2" x 34 1/2" WOF strips.
- (6) 2 1/2" x WOF strips for the binding.

From the Gail Flower Basic - Red (K), cut:

- (3) 4 1/2" x WOF strips. Sew the strips together end to end with diagonal seams and cut (2) 4 1/2" x 50 1/2" strips.
- (4) 4 1/2" x WOF strips. Sew the strips together end to end with diagonal seams and cut (2) 4 1/2" x 62 1/2" strips.

From the Chicken - Light Blue (L), cut:

- (2) 2 1/2" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (5) 2 1/2" x 8 1/2" strips.
- (1) 2 1/2" x WOF strip. Sub-cut (7) 2 1/2" x 4 1/2" strips.

From the Chicken - Green (M), cut:

- (2) 2 1/2" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (5) 2 1/2" x 8 1/2" strips.
- (1) 2 1/2" x WOF strip. Sub-cut (7) 2 1/2" x 4 1/2" strips.

From the Watering Can - Cream (N), cut:

- (2) 2 1/2" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (6) 2 1/2" x 8 1/2" strips.
- (1) 2 1/2" x WOF strip. Sub-cut (8) 2 1/2" x 4 1/2" strips.

From the Watering Can - Yellow (O), cut:

- (2) 2 1/2" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (5) 2 1/2" x 8 1/2" strips.
- (1) 2 1/2" x WOF strip. Sub-cut (7) 2 1/2" x 4 1/2" strips.

From the Panel - Cream (P):

- Fussy cut (15) 6 1/2" squares, each centered on a block.


From the Allover Novelty - Cream (Backing), cut:

- (2) 58" x WOF strips for the backing. Sew the strips together and trim to make the 58" x 78" back.


Block Assembly

Note: Pay attention to the unit orientations when assembling the various components.

1. Align (1) 2 1/2" x 8 1/2" Fabric E strip with the upper left corner of (1) 6 1/2" Fabric P square. Sew the strip to the square stopping halfway as shown to make Unit 1 (Fig. 1).



2. Sew (1) 2 1/2" x 8 1/2" Fabric B strip to the left side of the Unit 1 block to make Unit 2 (Fig. 2).



3. Sew (1) 2 1/2" x 8 1/2" Fabric H strip the bottom of the Unit 2 block to make Unit 3 (Fig. 3).



4. Sew (1) 2 1/2" x 8 1/2" Fabric D strip to the right side of the Unit 3 block. Finish sewing Fabric E strip from Step 1 to make (1) Block One square. The block should measure 10" square.



5. Repeat Steps 1-4 and follow Figures 5-18 for fabric placement to make Blocks Two through Block Fifteen.





























6. Follow Figure 19 for block placement to sew the (15) pieced blocks into a 3 x 5 matrix to make the Center Block.



7. Follow Figure 20 for fabric placement to sew together (27) 2 1/2" x 4 1/2" assorted strips to make the Left Side Border.



8. Follow Figure 21 for fabric placement to sew together (27) 2 1/2" x 4 1/2" assorted strips to make the Right Side Border.



9. Follow Figure 22 for fabric placement to sew together (17) 2 1/2" x 4 1/2" assorted strips. Sew (1) 4 1/2" Fabric I square to each end of the newly sewn strip to make the Top Border.

10. Follow Figure 23 for fabric placement to sew together (17) 2 1/2" x 4 1/2" assorted strips. Sew (1) 4 1/2" Fabric I square to each end of the newly sewn strip to make the Bottom Border.

Quilt Top Assembly

(Follow the Quilt Layout while assembling the quilt top.)

11. Sew (1) 2 ½" x 50 ½" Fabric J strip to each side of the Center Block. Sew (1) 2 ½" x 34 ½" Fabric J strip to the top and to the bottom of the Center Block.


12. Sew the Left Side Border and Right Side Border to the left and to the right of the Center Block. Sew the Top Border and Bottom Border to the top and to the bottom of the Center Block.

13. Sew (1) 4 ½" x 62 ½" Fabric K strip to each side of the Center Block. Sew (1) 4 ½" x 50 ½" Fabric K strip to the top and to the bottom of the Center Block to make the quilt top.

14. Layer and quilt as desired.

15. Sew the (6) 2 ½" x WOF Fabric J strips together, end to end with 45-degree seams, to make the binding. Fold this long strip in half lengthwise with wrong sides together and press.

16. Bind as desired.
