1 panel	36 Inch Spring Panel - Multi (A) 1177P-14
½ yard (0.46m)	Timeless Linens Basics - Slate Blue (B) 1027-75*
⅓ yard (0.31m)	Ditsy - Blue (C) 1173-11
½ yard (0.46m)	Tiny Geometric - Pink (D) 1174-22
1 yard (0.92m)	Timeless Linens Basics - Cream (E) 1027-44
¼ yard (0.23m)	Geometric - Green (F) 1172-06
⅓ yard (0.31m)	Tossed Tiny Bunnies - Pink (G) 1168-22
¼ yard (0.23m)	Daisy - Multi (H) 1175-42
¼ yard (0.23m)	Small Flower Buds - Lilac (I) 1169-55
⅓ yard (0.31m)	Medium Floral - Pink (J) 1170-22
¼ yard (0.23m)	Tossed Tiny Bunnies - Yellow (K) 1168-44
⅓ yard (0.31m)	Tiny Geometric - Blue (L) 1174-11
½ yard (0.46m)	Ditsy - Green (M) 1173-66
⅔ yard (0.61m)	Buttermilk Blenders Basics - Cream (N) 2944-36

Cutting Instructions

Please note: All strips are cut across the width of fabric (WOF) from selvage to selvage edge unless otherwise noted.

From the 36 Inch Spring Panel - Multi (A), cut:

- Fussy cut (1) 35" x 33 ½" rectangle, centered on the panel.

From the Timeless Linens Basics - Slate Blue (B), cut:

- (6) 2 ½" x WOF strips for the binding.

From the Ditsy - Blue (C), cut:

- (4) 2" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (64) 2" squares.

From the Tiny Geometric - Pink (D), cut:

- (2) 5 ¾" x 35" WOF strips.

From the Timeless Linens Basics - Cream (E), cut:

- (2) 3 ¼" x 36 ½" WOF strips.
- (6) 2" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (64) 2" x 3 ½" strips.
- (4) 2" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (64) 2" squares.
- (3) 1 ¼" x WOF strips. Sew the strips together end to end with diagonal seams and cut (2) 1 ¼" x 43" strips.

From the Geometric - Green (F), cut:

- (1) 3 ½" x WOF strip. Sub-cut (8) 3 ½" squares.

From the Tossed Tiny Bunnies - Pink (G), cut:

- (4) 2" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (64) 2" squares.

From the Daisy - Multi (H), cut:

- (1) 3 ½" x WOF strip. Sub-cut (8) 3 ½" squares.

From the Small Flower Buds - Lilac (I), cut:

- (1) 3 ½" x WOF strip. Sub-cut (8) 3 ½" squares.

From the Medium Floral - Pink (J), cut:

- (4) 2" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (64) 2" squares.

From the Tossed Tiny Bunnies - Yellow (K), cut:

- (1) 3 ½" x WOF strip. Sub-cut (8) 3 ½" squares.

From the Tiny Geometric - Blue (L), cut:

- (4) 2" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (64) 2" squares.

From the Ditsy - Green (M), cut:

- (3) 2" x WOF strips. Sew the strips together end to end with diagonal seams and cut (2) 2" x 60 ½" strips.
- (3) 2" x WOF strips. Sew the strips together end to end with diagonal seams and cut (2) 2" x 51 ½" strips.

From the Buttermilk Blenders Basics - Cream (N), cut:

- (6) 2" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (64) 2" x 3 ½" strips.
- (4) 2" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (64) 2" squares.

From the Small Blocks - Multi (Backing), cut:

- (2) 71" x WOF strips for the backing. Sew the strips together and trim to make the 59" x 71" back.

Block Assembly

Note: The arrows in figures represent the fabric print direction. Pay attention to the fabric and unit orientations when assembling the various components. Use a ¼" seam allowance with right sides together (RST) unless otherwise noted.

1. Sew (1) 5 ¾" x 35" Fabric D strip to the top and to the bottom of the 35" x 33 ½" lengthwise to make the Center Block (Fig. 1). **Trim the block to measure 35" x 43".**

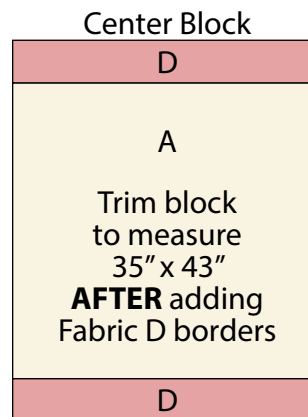

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2. Place (1) 2" Fabric L square on the left side of (1) 2" x 3 1/2" Fabric E strip, right sides together (Fig. 2). Sew across the diagonal of the square from the upper right corner to the lower left corner (Fig. 2). Flip open the triangle formed and press. Trim away the excess fabric from behind the triangle, leaving a 1/4" seam allowance (Fig. 3).

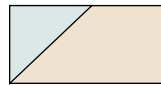

3. Place another 2" Fabric L square on the right side of the 2" x 3 1/2" Fabric E strip, right sides together (Fig. 4). Sew across the diagonal of the square from the upper left corner to the lower right corner (Fig. 4). Flip open the triangle formed and press. Trim away the excess fabric from behind the triangle, leaving a 1/4" seam allowance to make (1) Unit 1 strip (Fig. 5).

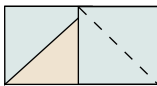

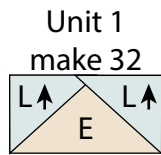

5. Repeat Steps 2-3 and refer to Figures 6-8 for fabric identification, placement, seam direction and orientation to make (32) of each unit strip for Unit 2 through Unit 4.

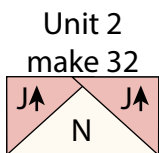

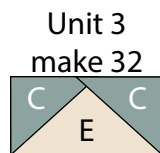

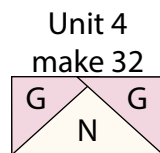

6. Sew (1) 2" Fabric E square to each end of (1) Unit 1 strip to make the top row. Repeat to make the bottom row. Sew (1) Unit 1 strip to each side of (1) 3 1/2" Fabric K square to make the middle row. Sew together the (3) rows lengthwise to make (1) 6 1/2" Block One square (Fig. 9). Repeat to make (8) Block One squares total.

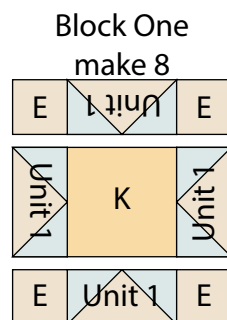

7. Repeat Step 6 and refer to Figures 10-12 for component identification, placement and orientation to make (8) of each block square for Block Two through Block Four.

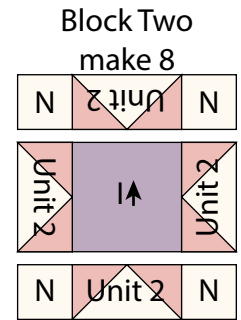

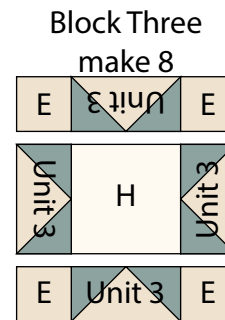

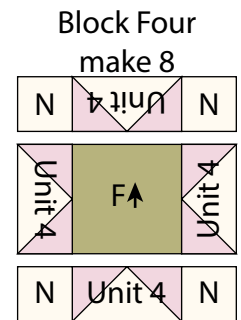

8. Follow Figure 13 and sew together (2) Block One squares, (2) Block Two squares, (2) Block Three squares and (2) Block Four squares to make the Left Side Border.

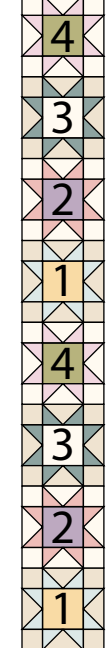

9. Repeat Step 8 and refer to Figures 14-16 for component identification, placement and orientation to make the Right Side Border, the Top Border and the Bottom Border.

Top Border

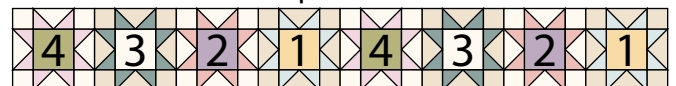

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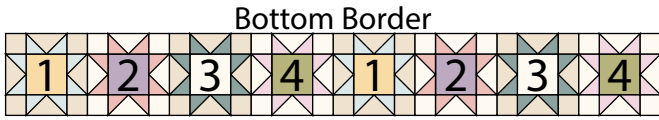
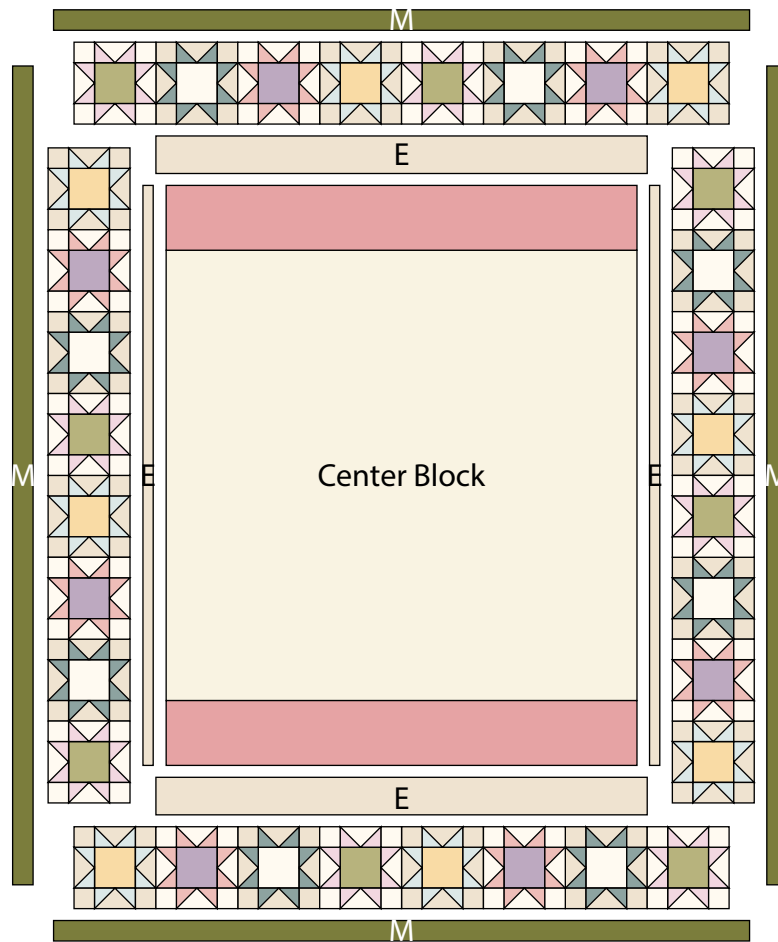

Quilt Top Assembly

(Follow the Quilt Layout while assembling the quilt top.)

10. Sew (1) 1 ¼" x 43" Fabric E strip to each side of the Center Block.
11. Sew (1) 3 ¼" x 36 ½" Fabric E strip to the top and to the bottom of the Center Block.
12. Sew the Left Side Border and Right Side Border to the left and to the right sides of the Center Block.
