



3/8 yard	Diagonal Hearts - Pink (E)	479-28
1 yard	Tossed Small Hearts - Red (F)	478-82
¹ / ₂ yard	Tossed Mini Hearts - Pink (G)	481-28
⁵⁄∗ yard	Twinkle - Pink (H)	135-22
3 yards	Packed Hearts - Red (I)	476-82*
5/8 yard	Flowers and Birds - Multi (J)	474-28
8 yards	Tossed Envelopes and Hearts - Multi	(Backing)

Cutting Instructions

Please note: All strips are cut across the width of fabric (WOF) from selvage to selvage edge unless otherwise noted.

From the 9" x 9" Blocks - Multi (A):

• Fussy cut (8) 8 ¹/₂" squares, each centered on a block.

From the Stitched Hearts - Red (B), cut:

- (4) 2 ³/₄" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (52) 2 ³/₄" squares.
- (4) 1 ¹/₂" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (16) 1 ¹/₂" x 8 ¹/₂" strips.
- (4) 1 ¹/₂" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (16) 1 ¹/₂" x 10 ¹/₂" strips.
- (3) 1" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (10) 1" x 8 ¹/₂" strips.
- (3) 1" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (10) 1" x 9 ¹/₂" strips.

From the Tossed Bees - Multi (C), cut:

• (14) 2 ³/₄" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (208) 2 ³/₄" squares.

From the Twinkle - Cream (D), cut:

- (19) 2 ³/₄" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (152) 2 ³/₄" x 5" strips.
- (7) 2 ³/₄" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (96) 2 ³/₄" squares.
- (4) 2" x WOF strips. Sew the strips together end to end with diagonal seams and cut (2) 2" x 71 ½" strips.
- (4) 2" x WOF strips. Sew the strips together end to end with diagonal seams and cut (2) 2" x 74 ¹/₂" strips

From the Diagonal Hearts - Pink (E), cut:

• (2) 5" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (12) 5" squares.

From the Tossed Small Hearts - Red (F), cut:

- (6) 2 ³/₄" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (48) 2 ³/₄" x 5" strips.
- (4) 2 ³/₄" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (48) 2 ³/₄" squares.

From the Tossed Mini Hearts - Pink (G), cut:

• (4) 2 ³/₄" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (48) 2 ³/₄" squares.

From the Twinkle - Pink (H), cut:

- (4) 2 ¹/₄" x WOF strips. Sew the strips together end to end with diagonal seams and cut (2) 2 ¹/₄" x 68" strips.
- (4) 2 ¹/₄" x WOF strips. Sew the strips together end to end with diagonal seams and cut (2) 2 ¹/₄" x 71 ¹/₂" strips.

From the Packed Hearts - Red (I), cut:

- (2) 6 ¹/₂" x 74 ¹/₂" Length of Fabric (LOF) strips.
- From the remaining fabric, cut (2) 6 ¹/₂" x 86 ¹/₂" WOF strips, piece as needed.
- (9) $\hat{2}$ $\frac{1}{2}$ x WOF strips for the binding.

From the Flowers and Birds - Multi (J), cut:

• (2) 8 ¹/₂" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (5) 8 ¹/₂" squares.

From the Tossed Envelopes and Hearts - Multi (Backing), cut:


• (3) 94" x WOF strips for the backing. Sew the strips together and trim to make the 94" x 94" back.

Block Assembly


Note: The arrows in figures represent the fabric print direction. Pay attention to the fabric and unit orientations when assembling the various components. Use a ¼" seam allowance with right sides together (RST) unless otherwise noted.

Block Assembly

1. Sew (1) 1 $\frac{1}{2}$ " x 8 $\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric B strip to each side (1) 8 $\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric A square. Sew (1) 1 $\frac{1}{2}$ " x 10 $\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric B strip to the top and to the bottom of the Fabric A square to make (1) Unit 1 square (Fig. 1). **Trim the unit to measure 9** $\frac{1}{2}$ " x 9 $\frac{1}{2}$ ". Repeat to make (8) Unit 1 squares total.



2. Sew (1) 1" x 8 ½" Fabric B strip to each side of (1) 8 ½" Fabric J square. Sew (1) 1" x 9 ½" Fabric B strip to the top and to the bottom of the Fabric J square to make (1) 9 ½" Unit 2 square (Fig. 2). Repeat to make (5) Unit 2 squares total.



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3. Place (1) 2 ³/₄" Fabric C square on the left side of (1) 2 ³/₄" x 5" Fabric D strip, right sides together (Fig. 3). Sew across the diagonal of the square from the upper right corner to the lower left corner (Fig. 3). Flip open the triangle formed and press. Trim away the excess fabric from behind the triangle, leaving a ¹/₄" seam allowance (Fig. 4).




4. Place another 2 $\frac{3}{4}$ " Fabric C square on the right side of the 2 $\frac{3}{4}$ " x 5" Fabric D strip, right sides together (Fig. 5). Sew across the diagonal of the square from the upper left corner to the lower right corner (Fig. 5). Flip open the triangle formed and press. Trim away the excess fabric from behind the triangle, leaving a $\frac{1}{4}$ " seam allowance to make (1) Unit 3 strip (Fig. 6).



5. Repeat Steps 3-4 to make


(104) Unit 3 strips total.




6. Sew (2) Unit 3 strips together end to end to make (1) Unit 4 strip (Fig. 7). Repeat to make (52) Unit 4 strips total.




7. Sew (1) 2 ³/₄" Fabric B
square to each end of (1) Unit 4
strip to make the top row.
Repeat to make the bottom row.
Sew (1) Unit 4 strip to each side of (1) Unit 1 square to make the middle row. Sew together the (3) rows lengthwise to make (1) 14" Block One square (Fig. 8).
Repeat to make (8) Block One squares total.



8. Sew (1) 2 ³/₄" Fabric B square to each end of (1) Unit 4 strip to make the top row. Repeat to make the bottom row. Sew (1) Unit 4 strip to each side of (1) Unit 2 square to make the middle row. Sew together the (3) rows lengthwise to make (1) 14" Block Two square (Fig. 9). Repeat to make (5) Block Two squares total.



9. Sew (1) $2\frac{3}{4}$ " Fabric G square to the left side of (1) $2\frac{3}{4}$ " Fabric D square to make the top row. Sew (1) $2\frac{3}{4}$ " Fabric D square to the left side of (1) $2\frac{3}{4}$ " Fabric F square to make the bottom row. Sew together the (2) rows lengthwise to make (1) 5" Unit 5 square (Fig. 10). Repeat to make (48) Unit 5 squares total.



10. Sew (1) $2\frac{3}{4}$ " x 5" Fabric F strip to the top of (1) $2\frac{3}{4}$ " x 5" Fabric D strip lengthwise to make (1) 5" Unit 5 square (Fig. 11). Repeat to make (48) Unit 6 squares total.

11. Sew (1) Unit 5 square to each side of (1) Unit 6 square to make the top row. Repeat to make the bottom row. Sew (1) Unit 6 square to each side of (1) 5" Fabric E square to make the middle row. Sew together the (3) rows lengthwise to make (1) 14" Block Three square (Fig. 12). Repeat to make (12) Block Three squares total.




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12. Sew together (1) Block One square, (1) Block Three square, (1) Block Two square, (1) Block Three square and (1) Block One square, in that order from left to right, to make Row One (Fig. 13).

13. Repeat Step 12 and refer to Figure 13 for component identification, placement and orientation to make Row Two through Row Five.

14. Sew together the (5) Rows from Steps 12-13, lengthwise and in numerical order from top to bottom, to make 68" x 68" Center Block (Fig. 13).



Quilt Top Assembly

(Follow the Quilt Layout while assembling the quilt top.) 15. Sew (1) 2 $\frac{1}{4}$ " x 68" Fabric H strip to each side of the Center Block. Sew (1) 2 $\frac{1}{4}$ " x 71 $\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric H strip to the top and to the bottom of the Center Block.

16. Sew (1) 2" x 71 $\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric D strip to each side of the Center Block. Sew (1) 2" x 74 $\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric D strip to the top and to the bottom of the Center Block.

17. Sew (1) $6\frac{1}{2}$ " x 74 $\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric I strip to each side of the Center Block. Sew (1) $6\frac{1}{2}$ " x 86 $\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric I strip to the top and to the bottom of the Center Block to make the quilt top.


18. Layer and quilt as desired.

19. Sew the (9) $2\frac{1}{2}$ x WOF Fabric I strips together, end to end with 45-degree seams, to make the binding. Fold this long strip in half lengthwise with wrong sides together and press.

20. Bind as desired.
