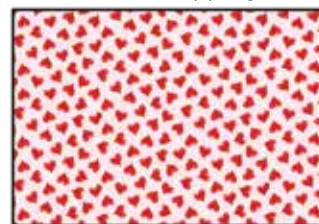

3/8 yard	Tossed Small Hearts - Red (B)	478-82
3/4 yard	Twinkle - Red (C)	135-88*
3/8 yard	Stitched Hearts - Red (D)	484-88
1/2 yard	Tossed Mini Hearts - Pink (E)	481-28
1/2 yard	Tossed Hearts and Flowers - Multi (F)	477-28
1/4 yard	Twinkle - Blue (G)	135-70
1 yard	Flowers and Birds - Multi (H)	474-28
2 3/4 yards	Tossed Large Hearts - Red (Backing)	475-82

### Table Topper Cutting Instructions

Please note: All strips are cut across the width of fabric (WOF) from selvage to selvage edge unless otherwise noted.

#### From the 9" x 9" Blocks - Multi (A):

- Fussy cut (4) 8 1/2" squares, each centered on a block.

#### From the Tossed Small Hearts - Red (B), cut:

- (2) 2" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (8) 2" x 8 1/2" strips.
- (3) 2" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (8) 2" x 11 1/2" strips.

#### From the Twinkle - Red (C), cut:

- (1) 3 3/8" x WOF strip. Sub-cut (10) 3 3/8" squares.
- (2) 3" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (16) 3" squares.
- (5) 2 1/2" x WOF strips for the binding.

#### From the Stitched Hearts - Red (D), cut:

- (1) 3 3/8" x WOF strip. Sub-cut (10) 3 3/8" squares.
- (3) 1 1/2" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (80) 1 1/2" squares.

#### From the Tossed Mini Hearts - Pink (E), cut:

- (1) 6 1/4" x WOF strip. Sub-cut (3) 6 1/4" squares. Cut the squares across both diagonals to make (12) 6 1/4" triangles.
- Note: You will use (10) 6 1/4" triangles.
- (2) 3" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (20) 3" squares.

#### From the Tossed Hearts and Flowers - Multi (F), cut:

- (1) 6 1/4" x WOF strip. Sub-cut (3) 6 1/4" squares. Cut the squares across both diagonals to make (12) 6 1/4" triangles.
- Note: You will use (10) 6 1/4" triangles.
- (2) 3" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (20) 3" squares.

#### From the Twinkle - Blue (G), cut:

- (2) 1 1/2" x 30 1/2" WOF strips.
- (2) 1 1/2" x 32 1/2" WOF strips.

#### From the Flowers and Birds - Multi (H), cut:

- (2) 4 1/2" x 32 1/2" Length of Fabric (LOF) strips.
- From the remaining fabric cut (2) 4 1/2" x 40 1/2" WOF strips, piece as needed.

### From the Tossed Large Hearts - Red (Backing), cut:

- (2) 48" x WOF strips for the backing. Sew the strips together and trim to make the 48" x 48" back.

### Table Topper Block Assembly

Note: The arrows in figures represent the fabric print direction. Pay attention to the fabric and unit orientations when assembling the various components. Use a 1/4" seam allowance with right sides together (RST) unless otherwise noted.

1. Sew (1) 6 1/4" Fabric F triangle and (1) 6 1/4" Fabric E triangle together along short sides to make (1) FE triangle. Repeat to make a second FE triangle. Sew together the (2) FE triangles along their long sides to make (1) 5 1/2" Unit 1 square (Fig. 1). Repeat to make (5) Unit 1 squares total.

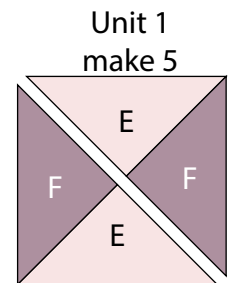

2. Place (1) 3 3/8" Fabric D square on top of (1) 3 3/8" Fabric C square, right sides together. Draw a line across the diagonal of the top square (Fig. 2). Sew 1/4" away from each side of the drawn diagonal line (Fig. 2). Cut the (2) squares apart on the drawn diagonal line (Fig. 3) to make (2) half-square triangles. Trim the half-square triangles to measure 3" square to make (2) Unit 2 squares (Fig. 4). Repeat to make (20) Unit 2 squares total.

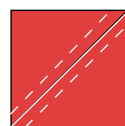

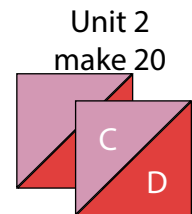

3. Place (1) 1 1/2" Fabric D square on the top left corner of (1) 3" Fabric E square, right sides together (Fig. 5). Sew across the diagonal of the smaller square from the upper right corner to the lower left corner (Fig. 5). Flip open the triangle formed and press. Trim away the excess fabric from behind the triangle 1/4" away from the sewn seam (Fig. 6).

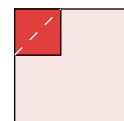

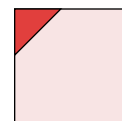

## Table Set

4. Follow Figure 7 for the seam direction to add a 1 1/2" Fabric D square to the upper right corner of the 3" Fabric E square to make (1) Unit 3 square (Fig. 8).

5. Repeat Steps 3-4 to make (20) Unit 3 squares total.

6. Repeat Steps 3-4 and refer to Figure 9 for fabric identification, placement and seam direction to make (20) Unit 4 squares.

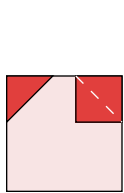

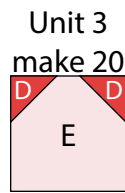

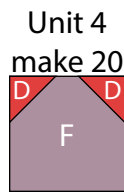

7. Sew (1) Unit 3 square to the left side of a second Unit 3 square to make (1) Unit 5 strip (Fig. 10). Repeat to make (10) Unit 5 strips total.

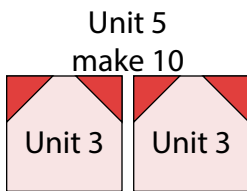

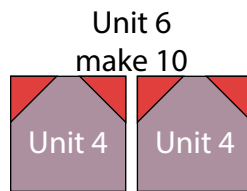

9. Sew (1) Unit 2 square to each end of (1) Unit 5 strip to make the top row. Repeat to make the bottom row. Sew (1) Unit 6 strip to each side of (1) Unit 1 square to make the middle row. Sew together the (3) rows lengthwise to make (1) 10 1/2" Block One square (Fig. 12). Repeat to make (5) Block One squares total.

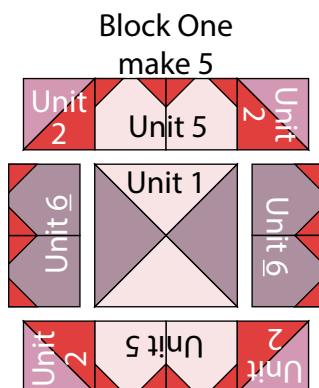

10. Sew (1) 2" x 8 1/2" Fabric B strip to each side of (1) 8 1/2" Fabric A square. Sew (1) 2" x 11 1/2" Fabric B strip to the top and to the bottom of the Fabric A square to make (1) Unit 7 square (Fig. 13). **Trim the unit to measure 10 1/2" x 10 1/2".** Repeat to make (4) Unit 7 squares total.

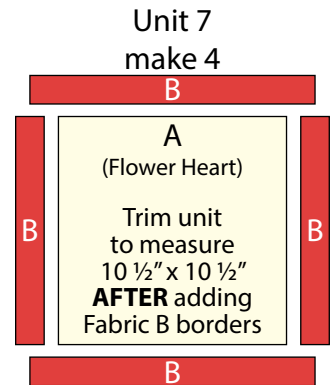

11. Place (1) 3" Fabric C square on the top left corner of (1) Unit 7 square, right sides together (Fig. 14). Sew across the diagonal of the smaller square from the upper right corner to the lower left corner (Fig. 14). Flip open the triangle formed and press. Trim away the excess fabric from behind the triangle 1/4" away from the sewn seam (Fig. 15).

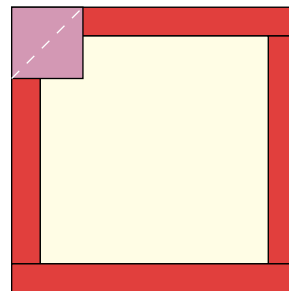

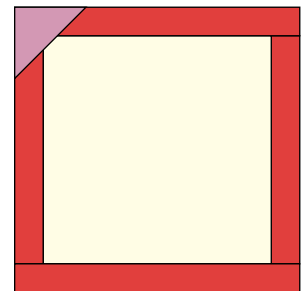

12. Follow Figure 16 for the seam direction to add a 3" Fabric C square to each of the remaining corners of the Unit 7 square to make (1) 10 1/2" Block Two square (Fig. 17).

13. Repeat Steps 11-12 to make (4) Block Two squares total.

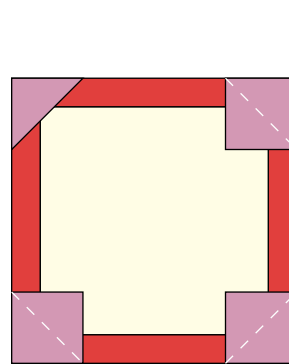

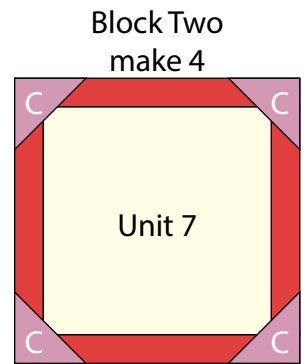

14. Sew (1) Block One square to each side of (1) Block Two square to make Row One (Fig. 18). Repeat to make Row Three.

15. Sew (1) Block Two square to each side of (1) Block One square to make Row Two (Fig. 18).

16. Sew together the (3) rows from Steps 14-15 lengthwise and in numerical order from top to bottom to make 30 ½" x 30 ½" Center Block (Fig. 18).

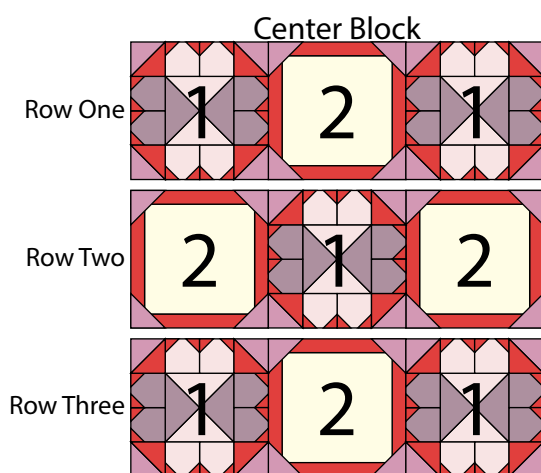

### Table Topper Assembly

*(Follow the Table Topper Layout in Figure 19 while assembling the Table Topper top.)*

17. Sew (1) 1 ½" x 30 ½" Fabric G strip to each side of the Center Block. Sew (1) 1 ½" x 32 ½" Fabric G strip to the top and to the bottom of the Center Block.

18. Sew (1) 4 ½" x 32 ½" Fabric H strip to each side of the Center Block. Sew (1) 4 ½" x 40 ½" Fabric H strip to the top and to the bottom of the Center Block to make the Table Topper top.

19. Layer and quilt as desired.

20. Sew the (5) 2 ½" x WOF Fabric C strips together, end to end with 45-degree seams, to make the binding. Fold this long strip in half lengthwise with wrong sides together and press.

21. Bind as desired.

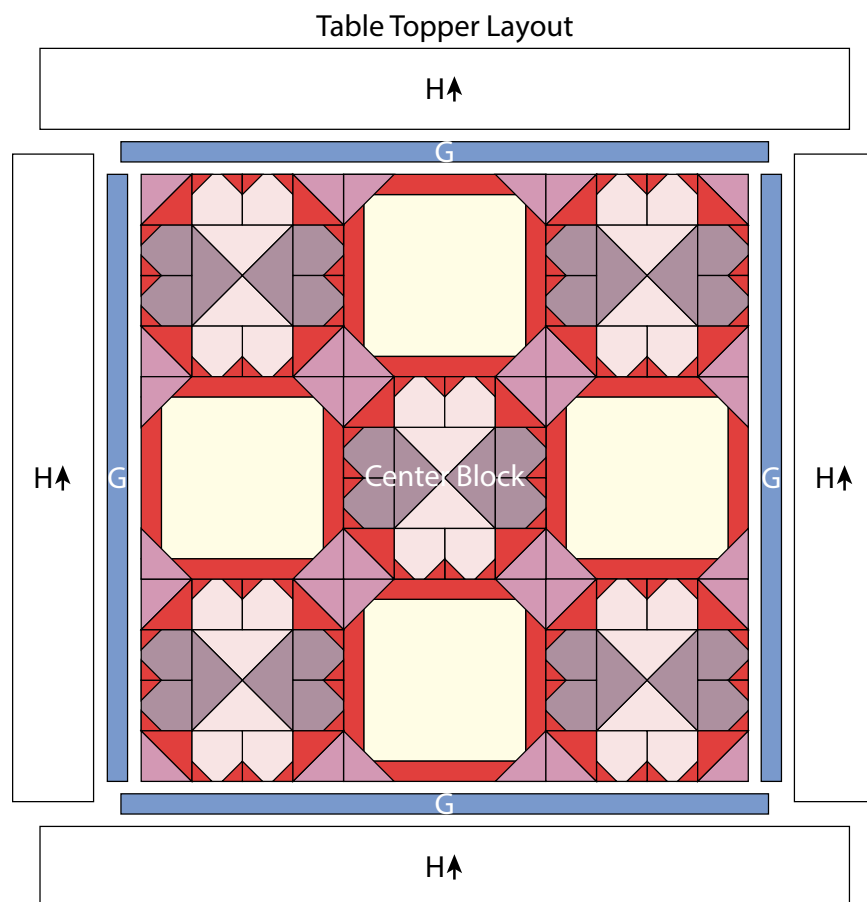

### Place Mat Cutting Instructions

Please note: All strips are cut across the width of fabric (WOF) from selvage to selvage edge unless otherwise noted.

#### From the 9" x 9" Blocks - Multi (A):

- Fussy cut (4) 8 1/2" squares, each centered on a block.

#### From the Tossed Small Hearts - Red (B), cut:

- (2) 2" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (8) 2" x 8 1/2" strips.
- (3) 2" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (8) 2" x 11 1/2" strips.
- (7) 2 1/2" x WOF strips for the binding.

#### From the Diagonal Hearts - Pink (C), cut:

- (4) 1 3/4" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (16) 1 3/4" x 10" strips.

#### From the Tossed Hearts and Flowers - Multi (D), cut:

- (1) 1 3/4" x WOF strip. Sub-cut (16) 1 3/4" squares.

#### From the Tossed Mini Hearts - Pink (E), cut:

- (1) 2 1/2" x WOF strip. Sub-cut (4) 2 1/2" x 4 1/2" strips.
- (1) 2 1/2" x WOF strip. Sub-cut (8) 2 1/2" squares.

#### From the Tossed Envelopes and Hearts - Multi (F), cut:

- (1) 2 1/2" x WOF strip. Sub-cut (4) 2 1/2" x 4 1/2" strips.
- (1) 2 1/2" x WOF strip. Sub-cut (8) 2 1/2" squares.

#### From the Tossed Bees - Multi (G), cut:

- (1) 2 1/2" x WOF strip. Sub-cut (4) 2 1/2" x 4 1/2" strips.
- (1) 2 1/2" x WOF strip. Sub-cut (8) 2 1/2" squares.

#### From the Stitched Hearts - Red (H), cut:

- (2) 2 1/2" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (24) 2 1/2" squares.
- (2) 1 1/4" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (48) 1 1/4" squares.

#### From the Tossed Large Hearts - Red (Backing), cut:

- (2) 16" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (4) 16" x 20" rectangles for the backs.

### Place Mat Block Assembly

Note: The arrows in figures represent the fabric print direction. Pay attention to the fabric and unit orientations when assembling the various components. Use a 1/4" seam allowance with right sides together (RST) unless otherwise noted.

22. Sew (1) 2" x 8 1/2"

Fabric B strip to each side of (1) 8 1/2" Fabric A square. Sew (1) 2" x 11 1/2" Fabric B strip to the top and to the bottom of the Fabric A square to make (1) Unit 8 square (Fig. 20). Trim the unit to measure 10" x 10". Repeat to make (4) Unit 8 squares total.

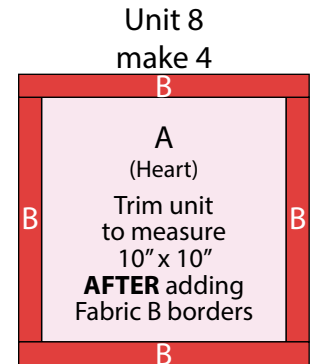

23. Sew (1) 1 3/4" x 10" Fabric C strip to each side of (1) Unit 8 square. Sew (1) 1 3/4" Fabric D square to each end of (1) 1 3/4" x 10" Fabric C strip. Repeat to make a second strip. Sew the strips to the top and to the bottom of the Unit 8 square to make (1) 12 1/2" Block Three square (Fig. 21). Repeat to make (4) Block Three squares total.

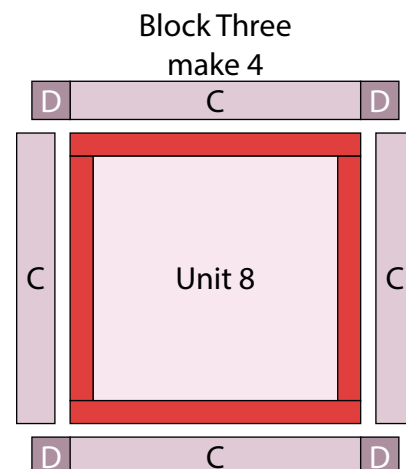

24. Place (1) 2 ½" Fabric H square on the left side of (1) 2 ½" x 4 ½" Fabric E strip, right sides together (Fig. 22). Sew across the diagonal of the square from the upper left corner to the lower right corner (Fig. 22). Flip open the triangle formed and press. Trim away the excess fabric from behind the triangle, leaving a ¼" seam allowance (Fig. 23).

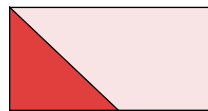

25. Place another 2 ½" Fabric H square on the right side of the 2 ½" x 4 ½" Fabric E strip, right sides together (Fig. 24). Sew across the diagonal of the square from the upper right corner to the lower left corner (Fig. 24). Flip open the triangle formed and press. Trim away the excess fabric from behind the triangle, leaving a ¼" seam allowance to make (1) Unit 9 strip (Fig. 25).

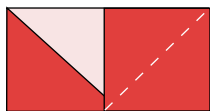

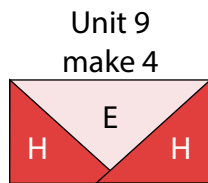

26. Repeat Steps 24-25 to make (4) Unit 9 strips total.

27. Repeat Steps 24-25 and refer to Figures 26-27 for fabric identification, placement and seam direction to make (4) Unit 10 strips and (4) Unit 11) strips.

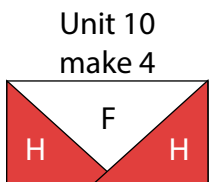

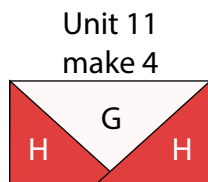

28. Place (1) 1 ¼" Fabric H square on the top left corner of (1) 2 ½" Fabric E square, right sides together (Fig. 28). Sew across the diagonal of the smaller square from the upper right corner to the lower left corner (Fig. 28). Flip open the triangle formed and press (Fig. 29). Trim away the excess fabric from behind the triangle 1/4" away from the sewn seam.

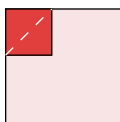

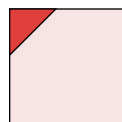

29. Follow Figure 30 for the seam direction to add a 1 ¼" Fabric H square to the upper right corner of the 2 ½" Fabric E square to make (1) Unit 12 square (Fig. 31).

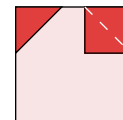

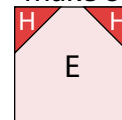

31. Repeat Steps 28-29 and refer to Figures 32-33 for fabric identification, placement and seam direction to make (8) Unit 13 squares and (8) Unit 14 squares.

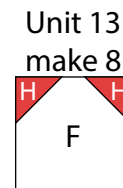

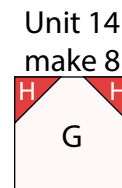

32. Sew (1) Unit 12 square to the left side of a second Unit 12 square to make (1) Unit 15 strip (Fig. 34). Repeat to make (4) Unit 15 strips total.

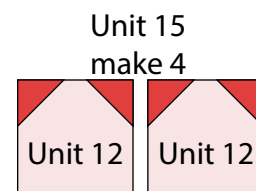

33. Repeat Step 32 and refer to Figures 35-36 for component identification, placement and orientation to make (4) Unit 16 strips and (4) Unit 17 strips.

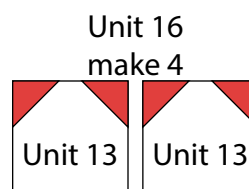

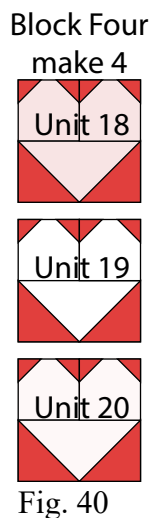
34. Sew (1) Unit 15 strip to the top of (1) Unit 9 strip lengthwise along the Fabric E sides to make (1) 4 ½" Unit 18 square (Fig. 37). Repeat to make (4) Unit 18 squares total.



35. Repeat Step 34 and refer to Figures 38-39 for component identification, placement and orientation to make (4) Unit 19 squares and (4) Unit 20 squares.



36. Sew (1) Unit 18 square, (1) Unit 19 square and (1) Unit 20 square together in that order from top to bottom to make (1) Block Four strip (Fig. 40). Repeat to make (4) Block Four strips total.



### Place Mat Assembly

*(Follow the Place Mat Layout in Figure 41 while assembling the Place Mat tops.)*

37. Sew (1) Block Four strip to the right side of (1) Block Three square to make (1) Place Mat top (Fig. 41). Repeat to make (4) Place Mat tops total.

38. Layer and quilt as desired.

39. Sew the (7) 2 ½" x WOF Fabric B strips together, end to end with 45-degree seams, to make the binding. Fold this long strip in half lengthwise with wrong sides together and press. Cut the strip into (4) equal pieces for the bindings.

40. Bind as desired.
