Materials

1 panel	24 Inch Beach Panel - Multi (A)	610P-41
1 ½ yards	Pastel Stripe - Multi (B)	606-14*
1/4 yard	Bicycles - Blue (C)	604-11
⅓ yard	Folio Basics - Chamois (D)	7755-31
1 ½ yards	Seagulls - Blue (E)	608-11
1/4 yard	Daisy Allover - Beige (F)	603-44
1/4 yard	Folio Basics - White on White (G)	7755-01W
3/8 yard	Beach Motifs on Wood Grain - Multi (H	605-41
½ yard	Coral - Aqua (I)	607-60
3 ¹ / ₄ yards	Tossed Seashells - Beige (Backing)	602-44

Cutting Instructions

Please note: All strips are cut across the width of fabric (WOF) from selvage to selvage edge unless otherwise noted.

From the 24 Inch Beach Panel - Multi (A):

• Fussy cut (1) 22 ½" x 43" rectangle, centered on the panel.

From the Pastel Stripe - Multi (B), cut:

- (3) 2 ½" x WOF strips. Sew the strips together end to end with diagonal seams and cut (2) 2 ½" x 43" strips.
- (2) 2 ½" x 26 ½" WOF strips.
- (3) 2" x WOF strips. Sew the strips together end to end with diagonal seams and cut (2) 2" x 55 ½" strips.
- (2) 2" x 38 ½" WOF strips.
- (6) 2 ½" x WOF strips for the binding.

From the Bicycles - Blue (C), cut:

• (1) 4" x WOF strip. Sub-cut (8) 4" squares.

From the Folio Basics - Chamois (D), cut:

- (2) 1 1/4" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (16) 1 1/4" x 4" strips.
- (3) 1 1/4" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (16) 1 1/4" x 5 1/2" strips.

From the Seagulls - Blue (E), cut:

- (1) 3" x WOF strip. Sub-cut (12) 3" squares.
- (3) 5 ½" x WOF strips. Sew the strips together end to end with diagonal seams and cut (2) 5 ½" x 58 ½" strips.
- (3) 5 ½" x WOF strips. Sew the strips together end to end with diagonal seams and cut (2) 5 ½" x 48 ½" strips.

From the Daisy Allover - Beige (F), cut:

• (1) 3" x WOF strip. Sub-cut (12) 3" squares.

From the Folio Basics - White on White (G), cut:

• (2) 3" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (24) 3" squares.

From the Beach Motifs on Wood Grain - Multi (H), cut:

• (2) 5 ½" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (12) 5 ½" squares.

From the Coral - Aqua (I), cut:

• (4) 3" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (48) 3" squares.

From the Tossed Seashells - Beige (Backing), cut:

• (2) 56" x WOF strips for the backing. Sew the strips together and trim to make the 56" x 76" back.

Block Assembly

Note: The arrows in figures represent the fabric print direction. Pay attention to the fabric and unit orientations when assembling the various components. Use a 1/4" seam allowance with right sides together (RST) unless otherwise noted.

1. Sew (1) 2 ½" x 43" Fabric B strip to each side of the 22 ½" x 43" Fabric A rectangle. Sew (1) 2 ½" x 26 ½" Fabric B strip to the top and to the bottom of the Fabric A rectangle to make the Center Block (Fig. 1). Trim the block to measure 25 ½" x 45 ½".



2. Sew (1) 3" Fabric G square to the left side of (1) 3" Fabric E square to make the top row. Sew (1) 3" Fabric F square to the left side of (1) 3" Fabric G square to make the bottom row. Sew together the (2) rows lengthwise to make (1) 5 ½" Block One square (Fig. 2). Repeat to make (12) Block One squares total.



3. Place (1) 3" Fabric I square on the top left corner of (1) 5 ½" Fabric H square, right sides together (Fig. 3). Sew across the diagonal of the smaller square from the upper right corner to the lower left corner (Fig. 3). Flip open the triangle formed and press. Trim away the excess fabric from behind the triangle 1/4" away from the sewn seam (Fig. 4).

- 4. Follow Figure 5 for the seam direction to add a 3" Fabric I square to each of the remaining corners of the 5 ½" Fabric H square to make (1) Block Two square (Fig. 6).
- 5. Repeat Steps 3-4 to make (12) Block Two squares total.




6. Sew (1) 1 1/4" x 4" Fabric D strip to each side of (1) 4" Fabric C square. Sew (1) 1 1/4" x 5 1/2" Fabric D strip to the top and to the bottom of the Fabric C square to make (1) 5 1/2" Block Three square (Fig. 7). Repeat to make (8) Block Three squares total.




7. Follow Figure 8 and sew together (4) Block One squares, (4) Block Two squares and (1) Block Three square to make the Left Side Border.



8. Repeat Step 7 and refer to Figures 9-11 for component identification, placement and orientation to make the Right Side Border, the Top Border and the Bottom Border.



Quilt Top Assembly

(Follow the Quilt Layout while assembling the quilt top.)

- 9. Sew the Left Side and Right Side Borders to the left and right sides of the Center Block.
- 10. Sew the Top Border and the Bottom Border to the top and to the bottom of the Center Block.
- 11. Sew (1) 2" x 55 ½" Fabric B strip to each side of the Center Block. Sew (1) 2" x 38 ½" Fabric B strip to the top and to the bottom of the Center Block.
- 12. Sew (1) $5\frac{1}{2}$ " x $58\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric E strip to each side of the Center Block. Sew (1) $5\frac{1}{2}$ " x $48\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric E strip to the top and to the bottom of the Center Block to make the quilt top.

- 13. Layer and quilt as desired.
- 14. Sew the (6) 2 ½" x WOF Fabric B strips together, end to end with 45-degree seams, to make the binding. Fold this long strip in half lengthwise with wrong sides together and press.
- 15. Bind as desired.
