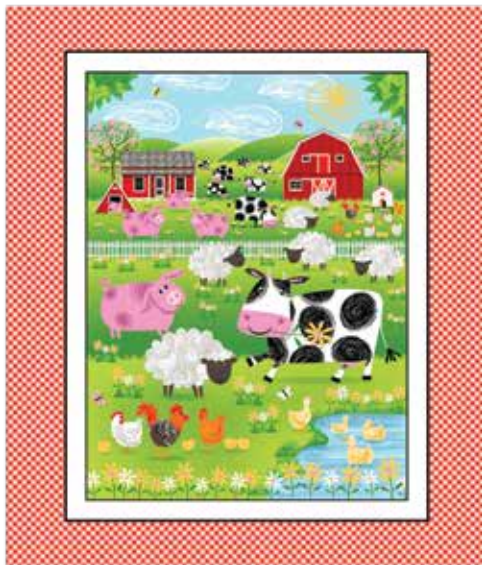

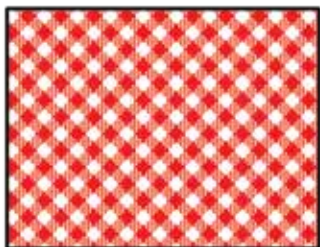

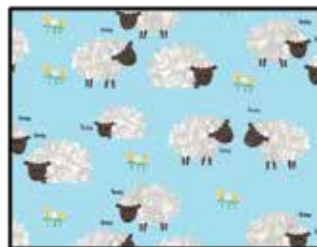

### Materials

1 panel	Farm Animal Banner Panel - Red (A)	9018P-88
3/4 yard	Gingham - Red (B)	9023-88
1/4 yard	Modern Melody Basics - Lime (C)	1063-64
1/4 yard	Farm Village Scenic - Green (D)	9020-66
3/8 yard	Allover Cows - Yellow (E)	9021-33
3/8 yard	Sheep - Light Blue (F)	9025-11
1/3 yard	Pigs - Black (G)	9026-99
1/3 yard	Allover Cows - Red (H)	9021-88
1/4 yard	Modern Melody Basics - Pigment White (I)	1063-01W
3/4 yard	Modern Melody Basics - Black (J)	1063-99*
1/4 yard	Rooster and Hens - Black (K)	9024-99
3 3/4 yards	Patchwork - White (Backing)	9022-1

\*Includes binding

### Cutting Instructions

Please note: all strips are cut across the width of fabric (WOF) from selvage to selvage edge unless otherwise noted.

#### From the Farm Animal Banner Panel - Red (A):

- Fussy cut (1) 27 1/2" x 35 1/2" panel.

#### From the Gingham - Red (B), cut:

- (2) 2 1/2" x 36 1/2" WOF strips.
- (2) 2 1/2" x 32 1/2" WOF strips.
- (3) 2" x WOF strips. Sew the strips together end to end with diagonal seams and cut (2) 2" x 54 1/2" strips.
- (3) 2" x WOF strips. Sew the strips together end to end with diagonal seams and cut (2) 2" x 49 1/2" strips.

#### From the Modern Melody Basics - Lime (C), cut:

- (2) 1 1/2" x 40 1/2" WOF strips.
- (2) 1 1/2" x 34 1/2" WOF strips.

#### From the Farm Village Scenic - Green (D), cut:

- (1) 6 1/2" x WOF strip. Sub-cut (4) 6 1/2" squares.

#### From the Allover Cows - Yellow (E), cut:

- (1) 6 1/2" x WOF strip. Sub-cut (6) 3 1/2" x 6 1/2" strips.
- (1) 3 1/2" x WOF strip. Sub-cut (6) 3 1/2" x 6 1/2" strips.

#### From the Sheep - Light Blue (F), cut:

- (1) 6 1/2" x WOF strip. Sub-cut (6) 3 1/2" x 6 1/2" strips.
- (1) 3 1/2" x WOF strip. Sub-cut (6) 3 1/2" x 6 1/2" strips.

#### From the Pigs - Black (G), cut:

- (1) 3 1/2" x WOF strip. Sub-cut (4) 3 1/2" x 4" strips.
- (1) 3 1/2" x WOF strip. Sub-cut the strip into (4) 3 1/2" squares.

#### From the Allover Cows - Red (H), cut:

- (1) 3 1/2" x WOF strip. Sub-cut (4) 3 1/2" x 4" strips.
- (1) 5" x WOF strip. Sub-cut the strip into (4) 3 1/2" x 5" strips and (4) 3 1/2" squares.

#### From the Modern Melody Basics - Pigment White (I), cut:

- (2) 3 1/2" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (24) 3 1/2" squares.

#### From the Modern Melody Basics - Black (J), cut:

- (2) 1 1/2" x 35 1/2" WOF strips.
- (2) 1 1/2" x 29 1/2" WOF strips.
- (6) 2 1/2" x WOF strips for the binding.

#### From the Rooster and Hens - Black (K), cut:

- (1) 5" x WOF strip. Sub-cut the strip into (4) 3 1/2" x 5" strips.

#### From the Patchwork - White (Backing), cut:

- (2) 65" x WOF strips for the backing. Sew the strips together and trim to make the 57" x 65" back.

### Block Assembly

Note: The arrows in figures represent the fabric print direction. Pay attention to the fabric and unit orientations when assembling the various components.

1. Sew (1) 1 1/2" x 35 1/2" Fabric J strip to each side of the 27 1/2" x 35 1/2" Fabric A panel. Sew (1) 1 1/2" x 29 1/2" Fabric J strip to the top and to the bottom of the Fabric A panel. Trim the block to measure 28 1/2" x 36 1/2" to make the Center Block (Fig. 1).

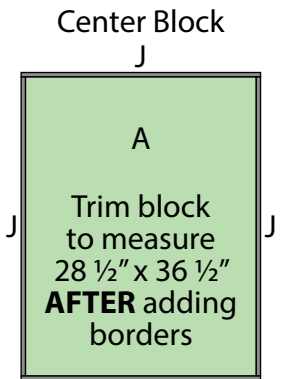

2. Sew (1) 3 1/2" x 6 1/2" Fabric E strip to the left side of (1) 3 1/2" Fabric I square to make the top row. Sew (1) 3 1/2" Fabric I square to the left end of (1) 3 1/2" x 6 1/2" Fabric F strip to make the bottom row. Sew the (2) rows together lengthwise to make (1) Unit 1 strip (Fig. 2). Repeat to make (3) Unit 1 strips total.

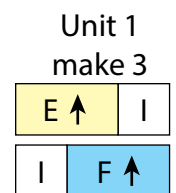

3. Repeat Step 2 and refer to Figures 3-5 for fabric identification, placement and orientation to make (3) Unit 2 strips, (3) Unit 3 strips and (3) Unit 4 strips.

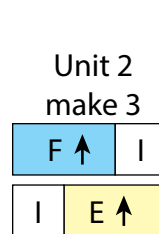

## Quilt 1

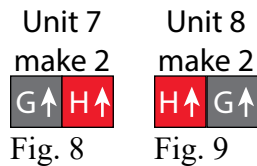
4. Sew (1) 3 1/2" x 4" Fabric G strip to the top of (1) 3 1/2" x 4" Fabric H strip to make (1) 4" x 6 1/2" Unit 5 strip (Fig. 6). Repeat to make a second Unit 5 strip.



5. Sew (1) 3 1/2" x 4" Fabric H strip to the top of (1) 3 1/2" x 4" Fabric G strip to make (1) 4" x 6 1/2" Unit 6 strip (Fig. 7). Repeat to make a second Unit 6 strip.

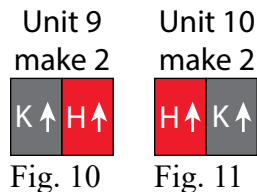
6. Sew (1) 3 1/2" Fabric G square to the left side of (1) 3 1/2" Fabric H square to make (1) Unit 7 strip (Fig. 8). Repeat to make a second Unit 7 strip.

7. Sew (1) 3 1/2" Fabric H square to the left side of (1) 3 1/2" Fabric G square to make (1) Unit 8 strip (Fig. 9). Repeat to make a second Unit 8 strip.

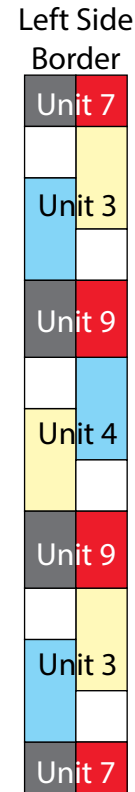


8. Sew (1) 3 1/2" x 5" Fabric K strip to the left side of (1) 3 1/2" x 5" Fabric H strip to make (1) Unit 9 strip (Fig. 10). Repeat to make a second Unit 9 strip.

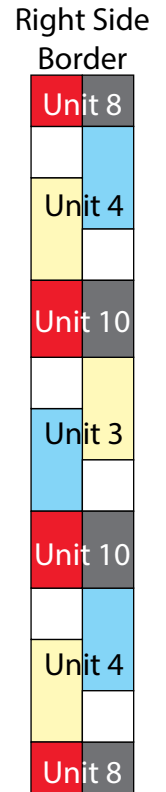
9. Sew (1) 3 1/2" x 5" Fabric H strip to the left side of (1) 3 1/2" x 5" Fabric K strip to make (1) Unit 10 strip (Fig. 11). Repeat to make a second Unit 10 strip.



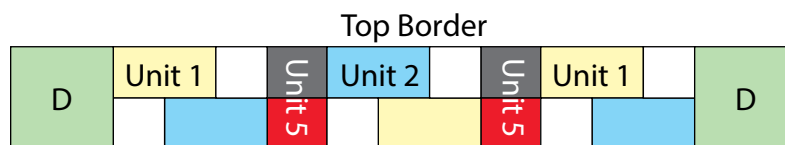
10. Sew together (1) Unit 7 strip, (1) Unit 3 strip, (1) Unit 9 strip, (1) Unit 4 strip, (1) Unit 9 strip, (1) Unit 3 strip and (1) Unit 7 strip, in that order and from top to bottom, to make the Left Side Border (Fig. 12).



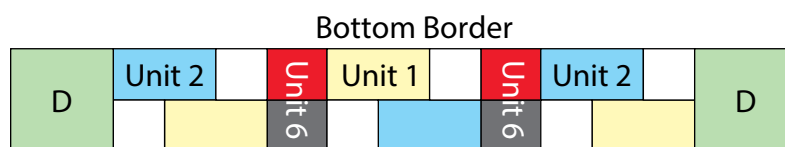
11. Sew together (1) Unit 8 strip, (1) Unit 4 strip, (1) Unit 10 strip, (1) Unit 3 strip, (1) Unit 10 strip, (1) Unit 4 strip and (1) Unit 8 strip, in that order and from top to bottom, to make the Right Side Border (Fig. 13).



12. Sew together (1) 6 1/2" Fabric D square, (1) Unit 1 strip, (1) Unit 5 strip, (1) Unit 2 strip, (1) Unit 5 strip, (1) Unit 1 strip and (1) 6 1/2" Fabric D square, in that order, to make the Top Border (Fig. 14).



13. Sew together (1) 6 1/2" Fabric D square, (1) Unit 2 strip, (1) Unit 6 strip, (1) Unit 1 strip, (1) Unit 6 strip, (1) Unit 2 strip and (1) 6 1/2" Fabric D square, in that order, to make the Bottom Border (Fig. 15).



## Quilt 1

### Quilt Top Assembly

*(Follow the Quilt Layout while assembling the quilt top.)*

14. Sew (1) 2 ½" x 36 ½" Fabric B strip to each side of the Center Block. Sew (1) 2 ½" x 32 ½" Fabric B strip to the top and to the bottom of the Center Block.

15. Sew (1) 1 ½" x 40 ½" Fabric C strip to each side of the Center Block. Sew (1) 1 ½" x 34 ½" Fabric C strip to the top and to the bottom of the Center Block.

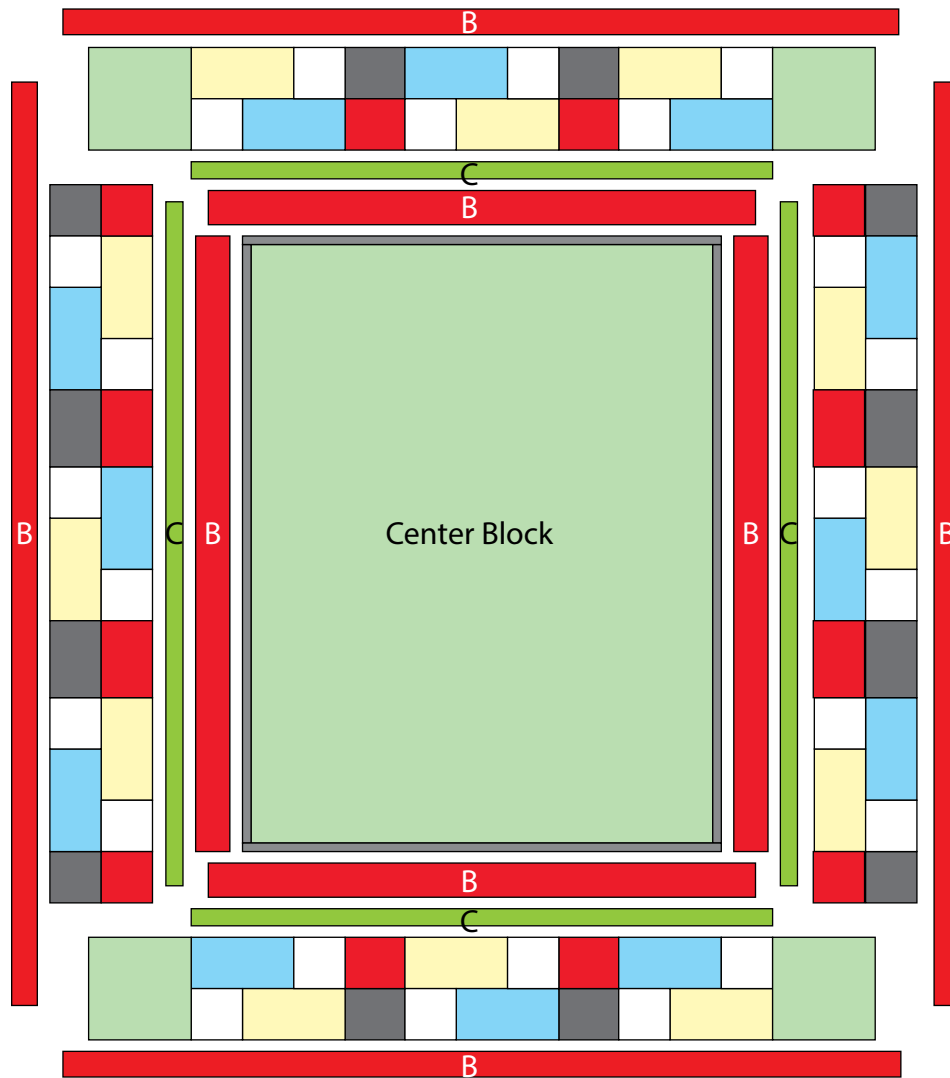
16. Sew the Left Side Border and Right Side Border to the left and to the right of the Center Block. Sew the Top Border and Bottom Borders to the top and to the bottom of the Center Block.

17. Sew (1) 2" x 54 ½" Fabric B strip to each side of the Center Block. Sew (1) 2" x 49 ½" Fabric B strip to the top and to the bottom of the Center Block to make the quilt top.

18. Layer and quilt as desired.

19. Sew the (6) 2 ½" x WOF Fabric J strips together, end to end with 45-degree seams, to make the binding. Fold this long strip in half lengthwise with wrong sides together and press.

20. Bind as desired.
