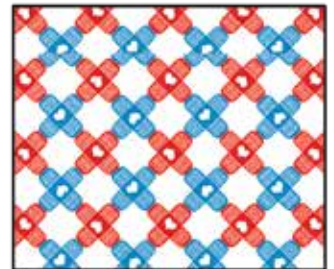

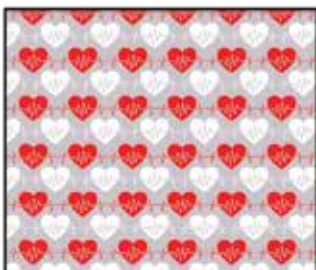

1/2 yard	Nurse Mouse - Red (D)	9327-88
3/8 yard	Heart Beat - Gray (E)	9329-90
1/2 yard	Tossed Allover Cat - Teal (F)	9325-77
1/2 yard	Mini Patchwork - Multi (G)	9326-76
3/8 yard	Tossed Allover First Aid Kit - Gray (H)	9322-90
2 1/8 yard	Border Stripe - Multi (I)	9323-76
4 yards	Tossed Allover Characters - White (Backing)	9324-1

*Includes binding

Cutting Instructions

Please note: All strips are cut across the width of fabric (WOF) from selvage to selvage edge unless otherwise noted.

From the Get Well Banner Panel - Red (A):

- Fussy cut (1) 32" x 39 1/2" rectangle, centered on the panel.

From the Modern Melody Basics - Crimson Red (B), cut:

- (2) 2" x 39 1/2" WOF strips.
- (2) 2" x 35" WOF strips.
- (3) 1 1/4" x WOF strips. Sew the strips together end to end with diagonal seams and cut (2) 1 1/4" x 58" strips.
- (3) 1 1/4" x WOF strips. Sew the strips together end to end with diagonal seams and cut (2) 1 1/4" x 52 1/2" strips.
- (7) 2 1/2" x WOF strips for the binding.

From the Modern Melody Basics - Pigment White (C), cut:

- (12) 2 1/4" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (208) 2 1/4" squares.
- (2) 1 1/2" x 41" WOF strips.
- (3) 1 1/4" x WOF strips. Sew the strips together end to end with diagonal seams and cut (2) 1 1/4" x 56 1/2" strips.
- (3) 1 1/4" x WOF strips. Sew the strips together end to end with diagonal seams and cut (2) 1 1/4" x 51" strips.
- (2) 1 1/4" x 35 1/2" WOF strips.

From the Nurse Mouse - Red (D), cut:

- (3) 4" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (24) 4" squares.

From the Heart Beat - Gray (E), cut:

- (2) 4" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (16) 4" squares.

From the Tossed Allover Cat - Teal (F), cut:

- (3) 4" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (24) 4" squares.

From the Mini Patchwork - Multi (G), cut:

- (3) 4" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (24) 4" squares.

From the Tossed Allover First Aid Kit - Gray (H), cut:

- (2) 4" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (16) 4" squares.

From the Border Stripe - Multi (I), cut:

- (2) 5" x 72" Length of Fabric (LOF) strips.
- (2) 5" x 65" LOF strips.

From the Tossed Allover Characters - White (Backing), cut:

- (2) 69" x WOF strips for the backing. Sew the strips together and trim to make the 69" x 76" back.

Block Assembly

Note: The arrows in figures represent the fabric print direction. Pay attention to the fabric and unit orientations when assembling the various components.

- Sew (1) 2" x 39 1/2" Fabric B strip to each side of (1) 32" x 39 1/2" Fabric A panel. Sew (1) 2" x 35" Fabric B strip to the top and bottom of the Fabric A panel to make the Center Block (Fig. 1). **Trim the Center Block to measure 33 1/2" x 41".**

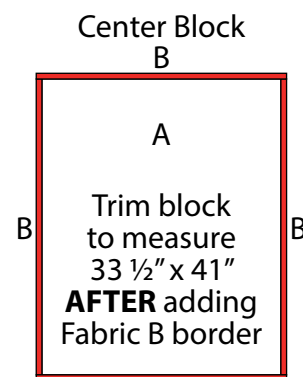

- Place one 2 1/4" Fabric C square on the lower left corner of one 4" Fabric D square, right sides together (Fig. 2). Sew across the diagonal of the smaller square from the upper left corner to the lower right corner (Fig. 3). Flip open the triangle formed and press (Fig. 3). Trim away the excess fabric from behind the triangle 1/4" away from the sewn seam.
- Follow Figure 4 for the seam direction to add a second 2 1/4" Fabric C square to the upper right corner of the Fabric D square to make (1) Unit 1 square (Fig. 5).
- Repeat Steps 2-3 to make (24) Unit 1 squares total.

5. Sew together (4) Unit 1 squares as shown in Figure 6 to make (1) Block One square. Repeat to make (4) Block One squares total.

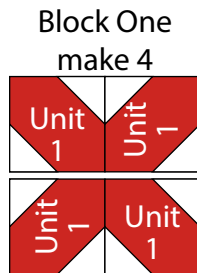

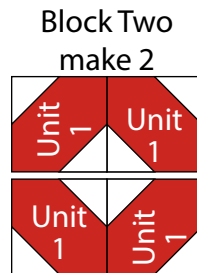

6. Sew together (4) Unit 1 squares as shown in Figure 7 to make (1) Block Two square. Repeat to make (2) Block Two squares total.

7. Repeat Steps 2-5 and follow Figure 8 for seam and fabric direction to make (2) Block Three squares.

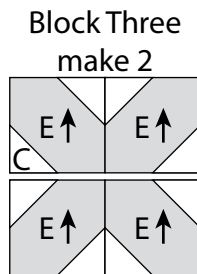

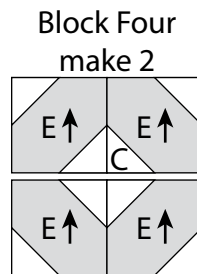

8. Repeat Steps 2-4 and Step 6, referring to Figure 9 for seam and fabric direction and identification to make (2) Block Four squares.

9. Repeat Steps 2-5 and follow Figure 10 for seam and fabric identification to make (3) Block Five squares.

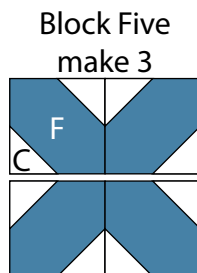

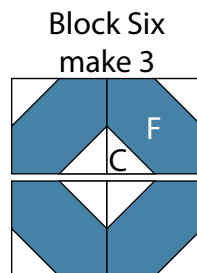

10. Repeat Steps 2-4 and Step 6, referring to Figure 11 for seam direction and fabric identification to make (3) Block Six squares.

11. Repeat Steps 2-5 and follow Figure 12 for seam and fabric direction to make (3) Block Seven squares.

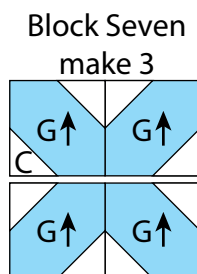

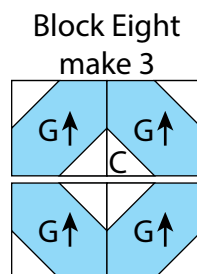

12. Repeat Steps 2-4 and Step 6, referring to Figure 13 for seam and fabric direction, and fabric identification to make (3) Block Eight squares.

13. Repeat Steps 2-5 and follow Figure 14 for seam and fabric identification to make (1) Block Nine square.

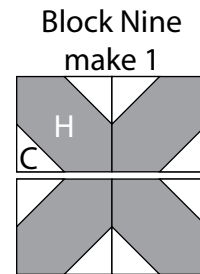

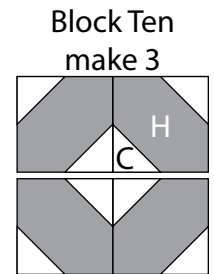

14. Repeat Steps 2-4 and Step 6, referring to Figure 15 for seam direction and fabric identification to make (3) Block Ten squares.

Quilt Top Assembly

(Follow the Quilt Layout while assembling the quilt top.)

15. Sew (1) 1 1/2" x 41" Fabric C strip to each side of the Center Block. Sew (1) 1 1/4" x 35 1/2" Fabric C strip to the top and to the bottom of the Center Block.

16. Sew together (1) Block Ten square, (1) Block Seven square, (1) Block Four square, (1) Block Five square, (1) Block Ten square and (1) Block Seven square, in that order from top to bottom, to make the Left Side Border. Sew the Left Side Border to the Center Block.

17. Sew together (1) Block Eight square, (1) Block One square, (1) Block Six square, (1) Block Three square, (1) Block Eight square and (1) Block Nine square, in that order from top to bottom, to make the Right Side Border. Sew the Right Side Border to the Center Block.

18. Sew together (1) Block One square, (1) Block Four square, (1) Block Five square, (1) Block Eight square, (1) Block One square, (1) Block Six square and (1) Block One square, in that order from left to right, to make the Top Border. Sew the Top Border to the Center Block.

19. Sew together (1) Block Two square, (1) Block Five square, (1) Block Ten square, (1) Block Seven square, (1) Block Six square, (1) Block Three square and (1) Block Two square, in that order from left to right, to make the Bottom Border. Sew the Bottom Border to the Center Block.

20. Sew (1) 1 1/4" x 56 1/2" Fabric C strip to each side of the Center Block. Sew (1) 1 1/4" x 51" Fabric C strip to the top and to the bottom of the Center Block.

21. Sew (1) 1 1/4" x 58" Fabric B strip to each side of the Center Block. Sew (1) 1 1/4" x 52 1/2" Fabric B strip to the top and to the bottom of the Center Block.

22. Center (1) 5" x 72" Fabric I strip on (1) side of the Center Block and pin in place. Start sewing the strip a 1/4" from the top edge of the block and stop a 1/4" from the bottom edge. **DO NOT TRIM THE EXCESS.** Repeat with the opposite side.

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23. Repeat Step 22 to sew (1) 5" x 72" Fabric I strip to the top and to the bottom of the quilt top, making sure to stop and start ¼" away from each end of the block. To miter each corner, fold the quilt top on a diagonal, wrong side together. This should line up the strips from adjacent sides (Fig. 16).

24. Starting at the sewn seam (represented by the arrow in Figure 16), draw a 45-degree line to the edge of the fabric. Sew on the drawn line. Trim the excess fabric leaving a ¼" seam. Repeat this step with the remaining corners.

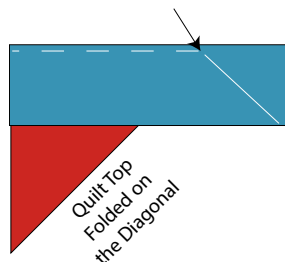
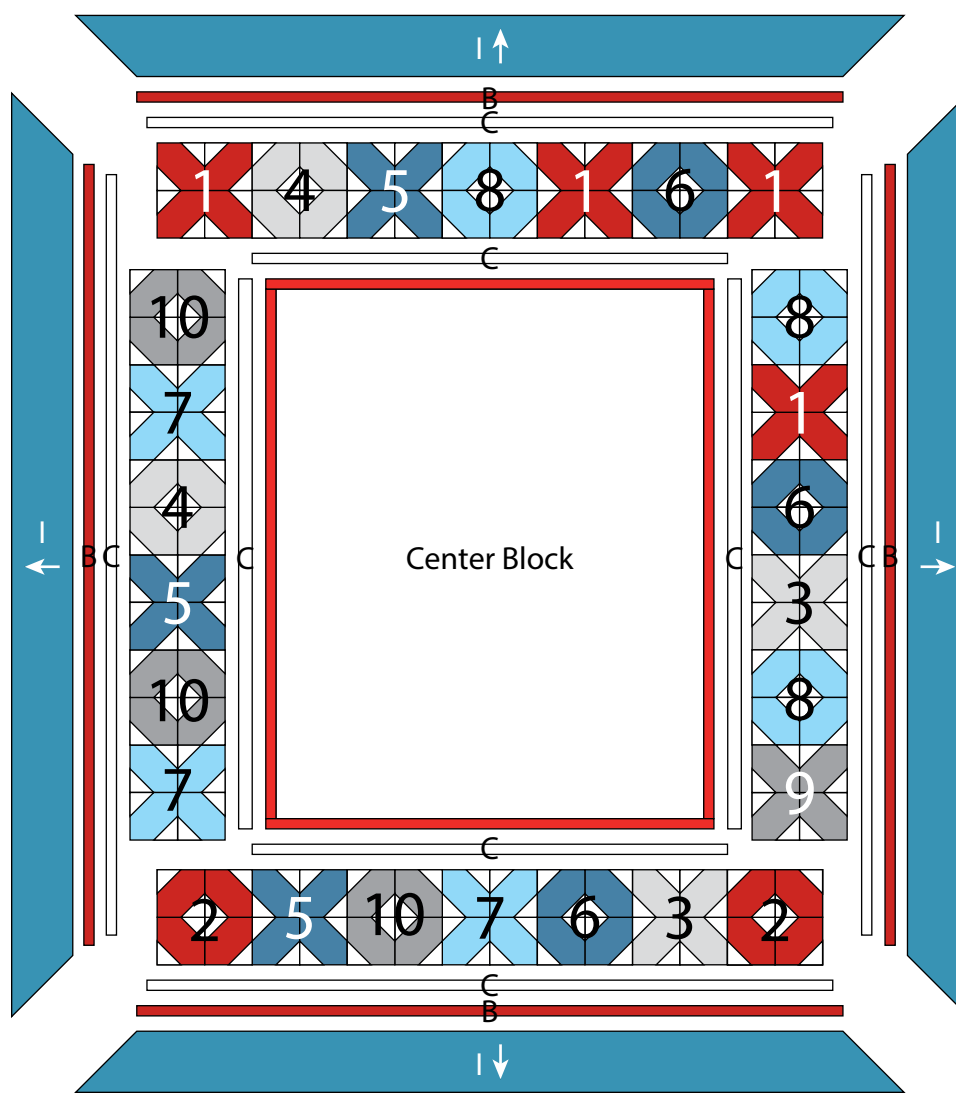

25. Layer and quilt as desired.

26. Sew the (7) 2 ½" x WOF Fabric B strips together, end to end with 45-degree seams, to make the binding. Fold this long strip in half lengthwise with wrong sides together and press.

27. Bind as desired.
