From the Tiny Flowers - Black (G), cut:

- (1) $31 / 4 " x$ WOF strip. Sub-cut (10) $31 / 4 "$ squares. Cut the squares across both diagonals to make (40) $31 / 4$ " triangles.
-(5) $21 / 2 " \times$ WOF strips. Sub-cut (80) $21 / 2 "$ squares.
-(8) $21 / 2 " \times$ WOF strips for the binding.
From the Honeycomb \& Flower - Gray (H), cut:
- (2) $61 / 2 " \times$ WOF strips. Sub-cut (10) $61 / 2 "$ squares.

From the Honeycomb Texture - Yellow (I), cut:

- (3) $27 / 8 " \times$ WOF strips. Sub-cut (40) $27 / 8 "$ squares.

From the Tiny Flowers - Gray (J), cut:

- (6) $27 / 8 " x$ WOF strips. Sub-cut (80) $27 / 8 "$ squares.
-(5) $21 / 2 " x$ WOF strips. Sub-cut (80) $21 / 2 "$ squares.
From the Tiny Flowers - Gold (Backing), cut:
- (2) 91 " x WOF strips for the backing. Sew the strips together and trim to make the 71 " x 91 " back.


## Block Assembly

Note: The arrows in figures represent the fabric print direction. Pay attention to the fabric and unit orientations when assembling the various components. Use a $1 / 4$ " seam allowance with right sides together (RST) unless otherwise noted.

1. Sew (1) $21 / 2 " \times 421 / 2 "$ Fabric B strip to each side of the $221 / 2 " \times 421 / 2$ " Fabric A panel. Sew (1) $21 / 2 " \times 261 / 2 "$ Fabric B strip to the top and to the bottom of the Fabric A panel to make the Center Block (Fig. 1).
Trim the block to measure
$251 / 2 "$ x $451 / 2 "$.

2. Place (1) $27 / 8 "$ Fabric I square on top of (1) $27 / 8 "$ Fabric J square, right sides together. Draw a line across the diagonal of the top square (Fig. 2). Sew $1 / 4$ " away from each side of the drawn diagonal line (Fig. 2). Cut the (2) squares apart on the drawn diagonal line (Fig. 3) to make (2) half-square triangles. Trim the half-square triangles to measure $21 / 2$ " square to make (2) Unit 1 squares (Fig. 4). Repeat to make (80) Unit 1 squares total.

3. Repeat Step 2 and refer to Figure 5 for fabric identification and placement to make (80) $21 / 2$ " Unit 2 squares.
4. Sew (1) Unit 1 square to each side of (1) $21 / 2 "$ Fabric G square to make (1) Unit 3 strip (Fig. 6). Repeat to make (40) Unit 3 strips total.

5. Sew (1) Unit 2 square to each side of (1) $21 / 2 "$ Fabric G square to make (1) Unit 4 strip (Fig. 7). Repeat to make (40) Unit 4 strips total.

6. Sew together (1) $31 / 4$ " Fabric E triangle and (1) $31 / 4 "$ Fabric B triangle to make (1) EB triangle. Sew together (1) $31 / 4$ " Fabric G triangle and (1) $31 / 4 "$ Fabric E triangle to make (1) GE triangle. Sew the EB and GE triangles together along their long sides to make (1) $21 / 2 "$ Unit 5 square (Fig. 8).
Repeat to make (40) Unit 5 squares total.

7. Sew (1) $21 / 2$ " Fabric E square to each side of (1) Unit 5 square to make the top row. Repeat to make the bottom row. Sew (1) Unit 5 square to each side of (1) $21 / 2 "$ Fabric D square to make the middle row. Sew the (3) rows together lengthwise to make (1) $61 / 2 "$ Unit 6 square (Fig. 9). Repeat to make (10) Unit 6 squares total.
8. Sew (1) $2^{1 / 2 "}$ Fabric J square to each end of (1) Unit 3 strip to make the top row. Repeat to make the bottom row. Sew (1) Unit 3 strip to each side of (1) $61 / 2 "$ Fabric H square to make the middle row. Sew the (3) rows together lengthwise to make (1) $101 / 2 "$ Block One square (Fig. 10). Repeat to make (10) Block One squares total.

9. Sew (1) $21 / 2 "$ Fabric J square to each end of (1) Unit 4 strip to make the top row. Repeat to make the bottom row. Sew (1) Unit 4 strip to each side of (1) Unit 6 square to make the middle row. Sew the (3) rows together lengthwise to make (1) $101 / 2$ " Block Two square (Fig. 11). Repeat to make (10) Block Two squares total.

10. Sew together (3) Block One squares and (2) Block Two squares, alternating them from top to bottom, to make (1) Side Border (Fig. 12). Repeat to make a second Side Border.

11. Sew together (3) Block Two squares and (2) Block One squares, alternating them from left to right, to make the Top Border (Fig. 13). Repeat to make the Bottom Border.

Quilt Top Assembly (Follow the Quilt Layout while assembling the quilt top.) 12. Sew (1) $3 " \times 451 / 2 "$ Fabric C strip to each side of the Center Block. Sew (1) 3 " x $301 / 2 "$ Fabric C strip to the top and to the bottom of the Center Block.
13. Sew (1) Side Border to each side of the Center Block. Sew the Top Border and Bottom Border to the top and to the bottom of the Center Block.
14. Sew (1) $2 " \times 701 / 2 "$ Fabric B strip to each side of the Center Block. Sew (1) $2 " \times 531 / 2 "$ Fabric B strip to the top and to the bottom of the Center Block.

## Quilt 1

15. Sew (1) $5 \frac{1}{2} " \times 731 / 2 "$ Fabric E strip to each side of the Center Block. Sew (1) $5 \frac{1}{2 \prime \prime} \times 631 / 2 "$ Fabric E strip to the top and to the bottom of the Center Block to make the quilt top.
16. Layer and quilt as desired.
17. Sew the (8) $21 / 2 " x$ WOF Fabric G strips together, end to end with 45 -degree seams, to make the binding. Fold this long strip in half lengthwise with wrong sides together and press.
18. Bind as desired.
