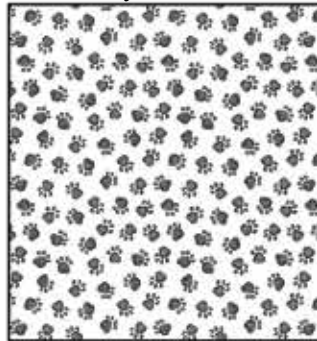

Cutting Instructions

Please note: All strips are cut across the width of fabric (WOF) from selvage to selvage unless otherwise noted.

From the Yarn Allover - Black (A), cut:

- (1) 4 ½" x WOF strip. Sub-cut (6) 4 ½" squares.

From the Cat Toss - Gray (B), cut:

- (3) 4 ½" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (24) 4 ½" squares.

From the Paw Toss - Red (C), cut:

- (3) 2 ½" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (48) 2 ½" squares.
- (3) 2" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (12) 2" x 10" strips.
- (4) 2" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (12) 2" x 13" strips.
- (4) 1 ½" x WOF strips. Sew the strips together end to end with diagonal seams and cut (2) 1 ½" x 66 ½" strips.
- (3) 1 ½" x WOF strips. Sew the strips together end to end with diagonal seams and cut (2) 1 ½" x 53 ½" strips.
- (8) 2 ½" x WOF strips for the binding.

From the Folio Basics - Chamois (D), cut:

- (2) 3 ½" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (20) 3 ½" squares.
- (3) 2 ½" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (48) 2 ½" squares.

From the Hearts Allover - White (E), cut:

- (6) 2 ½" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (62) 2 ½" x 3 ½" strips.

From the Mice Toss - Charcoal (F), cut:

- (8) 3 ½" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (31) 3 ½" x 8 ½" strips.

From the 9.5 Inch Blocks - Red (G):

- Fussy cut (6) 10" squares, each centered on a block.

From the Paw Toss - Charcoal (H), cut:

- (4) 2" x WOF strips. Sew the strips together end to end with diagonal seams and cut (2) 2" x 63 ½" strips.
- (3) 2" x WOF strips. Sew the strips together end to end with diagonal seams and cut (2) 2" x 51 ½" strips.

From the Cat Stripe - Multi (I), cut:

- (2) 8" x 87" Length of Fabric (LOF) strips.
- (2) 8" x 72" LOF strips.

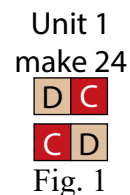
From the Cat Patch Work - Multi (Backing), cut:

- (2) 91" x WOF strips for the backing. Sew the strips together and trim to make the 76" x 91" back.

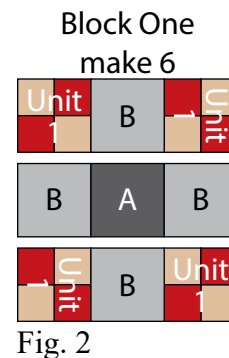
Block Assembly

Note: The arrows in figures represent the fabric print direction. Pay attention to the fabric and unit orientations when assembling the various components. Use a ¼" seam allowance with right sides together (RST) unless otherwise noted.

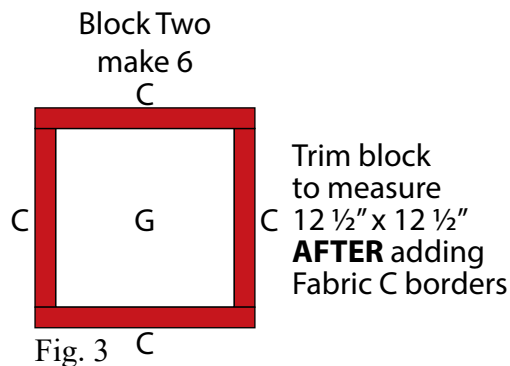
1. (1) 2 ½" Fabric D square to the left side of (1) 2 ½" Fabric C square to make the top row. Sew (1) 2 ½" Fabric C square to the left side of (1) 2 ½" Fabric D square to make the bottom row. Sew together the (2) rows lengthwise to make (1) 4 ½" Unit 1 square (Fig. 1). Repeat to make (24) Unit 1 squares total.



2. Sew (1) Unit 1 square to each side of (1) 4 ½" Fabric B square to make the top row. Repeat to make the bottom row. Sew (1) 4 ½" Fabric B square to each side of (1) 4 ½" Fabric A square to make the middle row. Sew together the (3) rows lengthwise to make (1) 12 ½" Block One square (Fig. 2). Repeat to make (6) Block One squares total.



3. Sew (1) 2" x 10" Fabric C strip to each side of (1) 10" Fabric G square. Sew (1) 2" x 13" Fabric C strip to the top and to the bottom of the Fabric G square to make (1) Block Two square (Fig. 3). Trim the block to measure 12 ½" x 12 ½". Repeat to make (6) Block Two squares total.



4. Sew (1) 2 ½" x 3 ½" Fabric E strip to each end of (1) 3 ½" x 8 ½" Fabric F strip to make (1) Unit 2 strip (Fig. 4). Repeat to make (31) Unit 2 strips total.

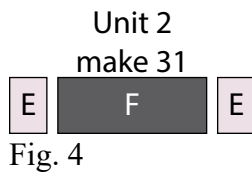

5. Sew (4) 3 ½" Fabric D squares and (3) Unit 2 strips together end to end and alternating them from left to right to make Row One (Fig. 5). Repeat to make Row Three, Row Five, Row Seven and Row Nine.

6. Sew (1) Unit 2 strip, (1) Block One square, (1) Unit 2 strip, (1) Block Two square, (1) Unit 2 strip, (1) Block One square and (1) Unit 2 strip together, alternating them from left to right, to make Row Two (Fig. 5). Repeat to make Row Six.

7. Sew (1) Unit 2 strip, (1) Block Two square, (1) Unit 2 strip, (1) Block One square, (1) Unit 2 strip, (1) Block Two square and (1) Unit 2 strip together, alternating them from left to right, to make Row Four (Fig. 5). Repeat to make Row Eight.

8. Sew the (9) rows from Steps 5-7 together lengthwise and in numerical order from top to bottom to make the 48 ½" x 63 ½" Center Block (Fig. 5).

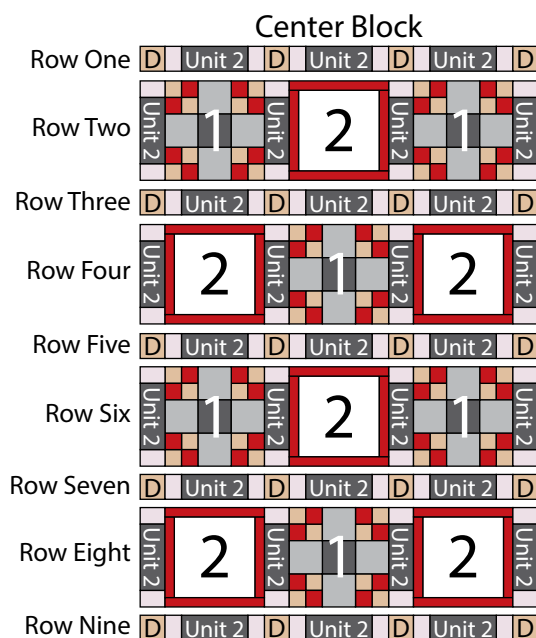

Quilt Top Assembly

(Follow the Quilt Layout while assembling the quilt top.)

9. Sew (1) 2" x 63 ½" Fabric H strip to each side of the Center Block. Sew (1) 2" x 51 ½" Fabric H strip to the top and to the bottom of the Center Block.

10. Sew (1) 1 ½" x 66 ½" Fabric C strip to each side of the Center Block. Sew (1) 1 ½" x 53 ½" Fabric C strip to the top and to the bottom of the Center Block.

11. Center (1) 8" x 87" Fabric I strip on (1) side of the Center Block and pin in place. Start sewing the strip a ¼" from the top edge of the block and stop a ¼" from the bottom edge. **DO NOT TRIM THE EXCESS.** Repeat with the opposite side.

12. Repeat Step 11 to sew (1) 8" x 72" Fabric I strip to the top and to the bottom of the Center Block, making sure to stop and start ¼" away from each end of the block. To miter each corner, fold the Center Block on a diagonal, wrong side together. This should line up the strips from adjacent sides (Fig. 6).

13. Starting at the sewn seam (represented by the arrow in Figure 6), draw a 45-degree line to the edge of the fabric. Sew on the drawn line. Trim the excess fabric leaving a ¼" seam. Repeat this step with the remaining corners to make the quilt top.

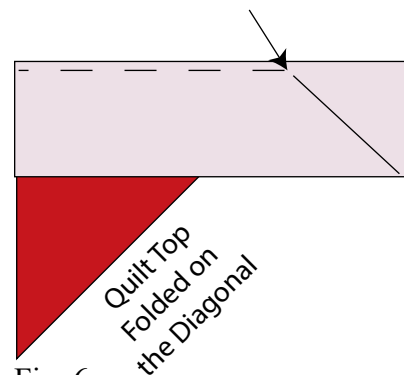
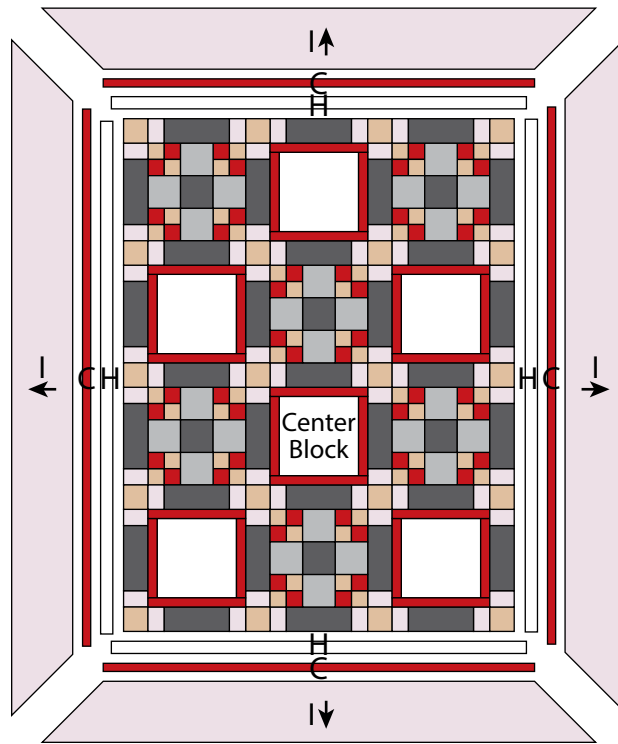

14. Layer and quilt as desired.

15. Sew the (8) 2 ½" x WOF Fabric C strips together, end to end with 45-degree seams, to make the binding. Fold this long strip in half lengthwise with wrong sides together and press.

16. Bind as desired.
