$2 / 3$ yard 24 Inch Blocks Repeat - Multi (A) 688-12
$2 / 3$ yard Small Monotone Rainbows - Green (B) 691-66
$1 / 2$ yard Tiny Tossed Hearts - Multi (C) 690-12
$3 / 8$ yard Wavy Geometric - Blue (D) 694-11
$1 / 3$ yard Wavy Geometric - Pink (E) 694-22
$5 / 8$ yard Tiny Rainbows - Multi (F) 692-12
$1 / 4$ yard Tossed Flower - Pink (G) 696-22
$3 / 8$ yard Clouds and Rain - Blue (H) 689-11
$1 / 3$ yard Folio Basics - White on White (I) 7755-01
$11 / 3$ yards Suns, Rainbows and Butterflies - Lavender (J)

$1 / 2$ yard Folio Basics - Peony Pink (K) 7755-52*
$31 / 4$ yards Tossed Butterflies - Pink (Backing) 697-22

## Cutting Instructions

Please note: All strips are cut across the width of fabric (WOF) from selvage to selvage edge unless otherwise noted.

From the 24 Inch Blocks Repeat - Multi (A):

- Fussy cut (9) $6 \frac{1}{2} / 2 \times 83 / 4$ " rectangles, each centered on a block.

From the Small Monotone Rainbows - Green (B), cut:

- (5) $13 / 4 "$ x WOF strips. Sub-cut (18) $13 / 4 " \times 83 / 4 "$ strips.
-(5) $13 / 4 " x$ WOF strips. Sub-cut (18) $13 / 4 " x 9 "$ strips.
From the Tiny Tossed Hearts - Multi (C), cut:
- (1) $23 / 8 " x$ WOF strip. Sub-cut (2) $23 / 8 "$ squares.
- (2) $2 "$ x WOF strips. Sub-cut (6) $2 " \times 10 \frac{1}{4} "$ strips.
- (2) $2 " x$ WOF strips. Sub-cut (6) $2 " \times 8 "$ strips.
-(1) $2 "$ x WOF strip. Sub-cut (8) $2 " \times 31 / 2 "$ strips.
From the Wavy Geometric - Blue (D), cut:
- (1) $23 / 8 " \times$ WOF strip. Sub-cut (2) $23 / 8 "$ squares.
-(4) $2 " x$ WOF strips. Sub-cut (68) $2 "$ squares.


## From the Wavy Geometric - Pink (E), cut:

-(4) $2 " x$ WOF strips. Sub-cut (72) 2" squares.

## From the Tiny Rainbows - Multi (F), cut:

- (1) $101 / 4 " \times$ WOF strip. Sub-cut (6) $101 / 4 " \times 31 / 2 "$ strips.
- (2) $31 / 2 " \times$ WOF strips. Sub-cut (6) $31 / 2 " \times 101 / 4 "$ strips.

From the Tossed Flower - Pink (G), cut:

- (1) $31 / 2 " \times$ WOF strip. Sub-cut (4) $31 / 2 "$ squares.

From the Clouds and Rain - Blue (H), cut:

- (2) $23 / 8 " \times 351 / 2 "$ WOF strips.
- (2) $21 / 4 \times 38 \times 3 / 4$ " WOF strips.

From the Folio Basics - White on White (I), cut:

- (2) $1 \frac{1}{2} " \times 421 / 2 "$ WOF strips, piece as needed.
- (2) $1 \frac{112 "}{2 \prime} \times 371 / 2 "$ WOF strips.

From the Suns, Rainbows and Butterflies - Lavender (J), cut:

- (2) $51 / 2 " \times 441 / 2 "$ Length of Fabric (LOF) strips.
- From the remaining fabric, cut (2) $51 / 2 " \times 47^{1 / 2 "}$ strips, piece as needed.

From the Folio Basics - Peony Pink (K), cut:
-(6) $21 / 2 " \times$ WOF strips for the binding.
From the Tossed Butterflies - Pink (Backing), cut:

- (2) 55 " x WOF strips for the backing. Sew the strips together and trim to make the 55 " $\times 62$ " back.


## Block Assembly

Note: The arrows in figures represent the fabric print direction. Pay attention to the fabric and unit orientations when assembling the various components. Use a $1 / 4$ " seam allowance with right sides together (RST) unless otherwise noted.

1. Sew (1) $13 / 4 " \times 83 / 4 "$ Fabric B strip to each side of (1) $61 / 2 " \times 83 / 4 "$ Fabric A rectangle. Sew (1) $13 / 4 " \times 9 "$ Fabric B strip to the top and to the bottom of the Fabric A rectangle to make (1) Unit 1 rectangle (Fig. 1).

Trim the unit to measure
$\mathbf{8 "} \times 101 / 4 "$. Repeat to make (9) Unit 1 rectangles total.

2. Place (1) 2" Fabric D square on the top left corner of (1) Unit 1 rectangle, right sides together (Fig. 2). Sew across the diagonal of the small square from the upper right corner to the lower left corner (Fig. 2). Flip open the triangle formed and press. Trim away the excess fabric from behind the triangle $1 / 4$ " away from the sewn seam (Fig. 3).

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3. Follow Figure 4 for the seam direction to add a 2 " Fabric D square to each of the remaining corners of the Unit 1 rectangle to make (1) Block One rectangle (Fig. 5).
4. Repeat Steps 2-3 to make
(9) Block One rectangles total.

5. Place (1) 2" Fabric E square on the top left corner of (1) $101 / 4 " \times 31 / 2 "$ Fabric F strip, right sides together (Fig. 6). Sew across the diagonal of the small square from the upper right corner to the lower left corner (Fig. 6). Flip open the triangle formed and press. Trim away the excess fabric from behind the triangle $1 / 4$ " away from the sewn seam (Fig. 7).
6. Follow Figure 8 for the seam direction to add a 2 " Fabric E square to each of the remaining corners of the Fabric F strip to make (1) Block Two strip (Fig. 9).
7. Repeat Steps 5-6 to make (6) Block Two strips total.
8. Repeat Steps 5-6 and refer to Figure 10 for fabric identification, placement, seam direction and orientation to make (6) Block Three strips.

9. Place (1) 2" Fabric D square on the top left corner of (1) $31 / 2$ " Fabric G square, right sides together (Fig. 11). Sew across the diagonal of the smaller square from the upper right corner to the lower left corner (Fig. 11). Flip open the triangle formed and press. Trim away the excess fabric from behind the triangle $1 / 4 "$ away from the sewn seam (Fig. 12).
10. Follow Figure 13 for the seam direction to add a 2 " Fabric D square to each of the remaining corners of the Fabric G square to make (1) Block Four square (Fig. 14).
11. Repeat steps 9-10 to make (4) Block Four squares total.

12. Sew together (3) Block One rectangles and (2) Block Two strips, lengthwise and alternating them from left to right, to make Row One (Fig. 15). Repeat to make Row Three and Row Five.
13. Sew together (3) Block Three strips and (2) Block Four squares, end to end and alternating them from left to right, to make Row Two (Fig. 15). Repeat to make Row Four.
14. Sew together the (5) Rows from Steps 12-13, lengthwise and in numerical order from top to bottom, to make the $29 " \times 353 / 4$ " Center Block (Fig. 15).

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15. Place (1) $2 "$ Fabric E square on the left side of (1) 2" $\times 101 / 4$ " Fabric C strip, right sides together (Fig. 16). Sew across the diagonal of the square from the upper right corner to the lower left corner (Fig. 16). Flip open the triangle formed and press (Fig. 17). Trim away the excess fabric from behind the triangle, leaving a $1 / 4$ " seam allowance.

16. Place another 2" Fabric E square on the right side of the 2 " $\times 101 / 4$ " Fabric C strip, right sides together (Fig. 18). Sew across the diagonal of the square from the upper left corner to the lower right corner (Fig. 18). Flip open the triangle formed and press. Trim away the excess fabric from behind the triangle, leaving a $1 / 4$ " seam allowance to make (1) Unit 2 strip (Fig. 19).
17. Repeat Steps 15-16 to make (6) Unit 2 strips total.

18. Repeat Steps $15-16$ and refer to Figure 20 for fabric identification, placement and seam direction while using (6) $2 " \times 8 "$ Fabric C strips and (12) $2 "$ Fabric E squares to make (6) Unit 3 strips.

19. Place (1) $2 "$ Fabric D square on the left side of (1) $2 " \times 31 / 2 "$ Fabric C strip, right sides together (Fig. 21). Sew across the diagonal of the square from the upper right corner to the lower left corner (Fig. 21). Flip open the triangle formed and press (Fig. 22). Trim away the excess fabric from behind the triangle, leaving a $1 / 4$ " seam allowance.

20. Place another 2" Fabric D square on the right side of the $2 " \times 31 / 2 "$ Fabric C strip, right sides together (Fig. 23). Sew across the diagonal of the square from the upper left corner to the lower right corner (Fig. 23). Flip open the triangle formed and press. Trim away the excess fabric from behind the triangle, leaving a $1 / 4$ " seam allowance to make (1) Unit 4 strip (Fig. 24).
21. Repeat Steps 19-20 to make (8) Unit 4 strips total.

22. Place (1) $23 / 8$ " Fabric D square on top of (1) $23 / 8$ " Fabric C square, right sides together. Draw a line across the diagonal of the top square (Fig. 25). Sew $1 / 4$ " away from each side of the drawn diagonal line (Fig. 25). Cut the (2) squares apart on the drawn diagonal line (Fig. 26) to make (2) halfsquare triangles. Trim the half-square
triangles to measure 2 " square to make
(2) Unit 5 squares
(Fig. 27). Repeat to make (4) Unit 5 squares total.

23. Sew together (3) Unit 2 strips and (2) Unit 4 strips, end to end and alternating them from top to bottom, to make the Left Side Border (Fig. 28).
24. Sew together (3) Unit 2 strips and (2) Unit 4 strips, end to end and alternating them from top to bottom, to make the Right Side Border (Fig. 29).

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25. Sew (3) Unit 3 strips and (2) Unit 4 strips together end to end and alternating them from left to right. Sew (1) Unit 5 square to each end of the newly sewn strip to make the Top Border (Fig. 30).

26. Sew (3) Unit 3 strips and (2) Unit 4 strips together end to end and alternating them from left to right. Sew (1) Unit 5 square to each end of the newly sewn strip to make the Bottom Border (Fig. 31).

## Quilt Top Assembly

 (Follow the Quilt Layout while assembling the quilt top.) 27. Sew the Left Side and Right Side Borders to the left and right sides of the Center Block. Sew the Top Border and the Bottom Border to the top and to the bottom of the Center Block.28. Sew (1) $21 / 4 " \times 383 / 4 "$ Fabric H strip to each side of the Center Block. Sew (1) $23 / 8 " \times 351 / 2 "$ Fabric H strip to the top and to the bottom of the Center Block.
29. Sew (1) $1 \frac{1}{2 \prime \prime} \times 421 / 2 "$ Fabric I strip to each side of the Center Block. Sew (1) $11 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 371 / 2 "$ Fabric I strip to the top and to the bottom of the Center Block.
30. Sew (1) $5 \frac{1}{2 \prime} \times 441 / 2 "$ Fabric J strip to each side of the Center Block. Sew (1) $51 / 2 " \times 471 / 2 "$ Fabric J strip to the top and to the bottom of the Center Block to make the quilt top.
31. Layer and quilt as desired.
32. Sew the (6) $21 / 2 " \times$ WOF Fabric K strips together, end to end with 45 -degree seams, to make the binding. Fold this long strip in half lengthwise with wrong sides together and press.
33. Bind as desired.
