2 ⅓ yards	Holly Leaves - Cream (B)	258-44
1 ¾ yards	Damask - Red (C)	257-88
½ yard	Folio Basics - Christmas Green (D)	7755-66
½ yard	Santa and Poinsettia - Cream (E)	262-44
½ yard	Folio Basics - Wine (F)	7755-89
½ yard	Small Poinsettia - Black (G)	260-99
1 ¼ yards	Plaid - Red (H)	259-88
1 ⅜ yards	Floral and Ornament - Black(I)	263-99
⅔ yard	Snow Flakes - Black (J)	256-99*
7 ½ yards	Santa and Poinsettia - Cream (Backing)	262-44

## Cutting Instructions

Please note: All strips are cut across the width of fabric (WOF) from selvage to selvage edge unless otherwise noted.

### From the Ornaments - Black (A):

- (1) 6 ½" x WOF strip. Sub-cut (5) 6 ½" squares.

### From the Holly Leaves - Cream (B), cut:

- (5) 3 ⅞" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (50) 3 ⅞" squares.
- (9) 3 ½" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (52) 3 ½" x 6 ½" strips.
- (8) 3 ½" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (96) 3 ½" squares.

### From the Damask - Red (C), cut:

- (9) 3 ½" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (104) 3 ½" squares.
- (8) 3 ½" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (48) 3 ½" x 6 ½" strips.

### From the Folio Basics - Christmas Green (D), cut:

- (3) 3 ⅞" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (26) 3 ⅞" squares.

### From the Santa and Poinsettia - Cream (E), cut:

- (2) 6 ½" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (12) 6 ½" squares.

### From the Folio Basics - Wine (F), cut:

- (3) 3 ⅞" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (24) 3 ⅞" squares.

### From the Small Poinsettia - Black (G), cut:

- (2) 6 ½" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (8) 6 ½" squares.

### From the Plaid - Red (H), cut:

- (3) 2 ½" x WOF strips. Sew the strips together end to end with diagonal seams and cut (2) 2 ½" x 60 ½" strips.
- (4) 2 ½" x WOF strips. Sew the strips together end to end with diagonal seams and cut (2) 2 ½" x 64 ½" strips.
- (4) 2 ½" x WOF strips. Sew the strips together end to end with diagonal seams and cut (2) 2 ½" x 76 ½" strips.
- (4) 2 ½" x WOF strips. Sew the strips together end to end with diagonal seams and cut (2) 2 ½" x 80 ½" strips.

### From the Floral and Ornament - Black (I), cut:

- (4) 6 ½" x WOF strips. Sew the strips together end to end with diagonal seams and cut (2) 6 ½" x 64 ½" strips.
- (4) 6 ½" x WOF strips. Sew the strips together end to end with diagonal seams and cut (2) 6 ½" x 76 ½" strips.

### From the Snow Flakes - Black (J), cut:

- (8) 2 ½" x WOF strips for the binding.

### From the Santa and Poinsettia - Cream (Backing), cut:

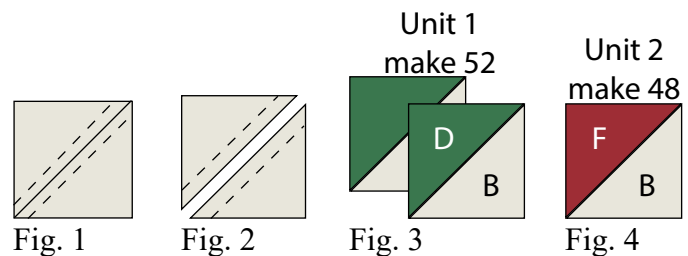
- (3) 88" x WOF strips for the backing. Sew the strips together and trim to make the 88" x 88" back.

## Block Assembly

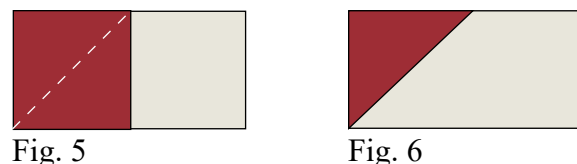
*Note: The arrows in figures represent the fabric print direction. Pay attention to the fabric and unit orientations when assembling the various components. Use a ¼" seam allowance with right sides together (RST) unless otherwise noted.*

1. Place (1) 3 ⅞" Fabric B square on top of 3 ⅞" Fabric D square, right sides together. Draw a line across the diagonal of the top square (Fig. 1). Sew ¼" away from each side of the drawn diagonal line (Fig. 1). Cut the (2) squares apart on the drawn diagonal line (Fig. 2) to make (2) half-square triangles. Trim the half-square triangles to measure 3 ½" square to make (2) Unit 1 squares (Fig. 3). Repeat to make (52) Unit 1 squares total.

2. Repeat Step 1 and refer to Figure 4 for fabric identification and placement to make (48) Unit 2 squares.



3. Place (1) 3 ½" Fabric C square on the left side of (1) 3 ½" x 6 ½" Fabric B strip, right sides together (Fig. 5). Sew across the diagonal of the square from the upper right corner to the lower left corner (Fig. 5). Flip open the triangle formed and press. Trim away the excess fabric from behind the triangle, leaving a ¼" seam allowance (Fig. 6).



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4. Place another 3 1/2" Fabric C square on the right side of the 3 1/2" x 6 1/2" Fabric B strip, right sides together (Fig. 7). Sew across the diagonal of the square from the upper left corner to the lower right corner (Fig. 7). Flip open the triangle formed and press. Trim away the excess fabric from behind the triangle, leaving a 1/4" seam allowance to make (1) Unit 3 strip (Fig. 8).

5. Repeat Steps 3-4 to make (52) Unit 3 strips total.

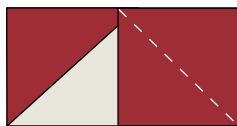

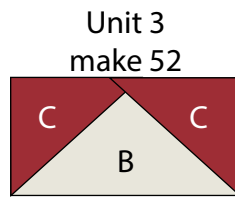

6. Repeat Steps 3-4 and refer to Figure 9 for fabric identification, placement and seam direction to make (48) Unit 4 strips.

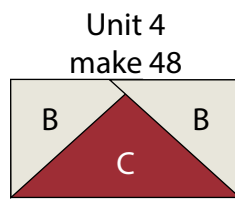

7. Sew (1) Unit 1 strip to each end of (1) Unit 3 strip to make the top row. Repeat to make the bottom row. Sew (1) Unit 3 strip to each side of (1) 6 1/2" Fabric A square to make the middle row. Sew together the (3) rows lengthwise to make (1) 12 1/2" Block One square (Fig. 10). Repeat to make (5) Block One squares total.

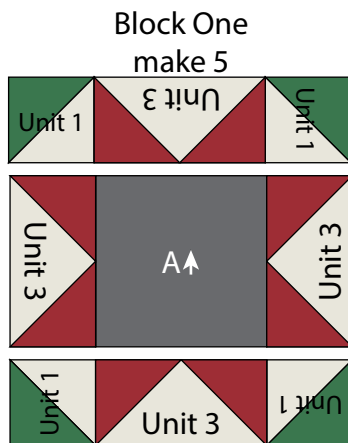

8. Sew (1) Unit 1 strip to each end of (1) Unit 3 strip to make the top row. Repeat to make the bottom row. Sew (1) Unit 3 strip to each side of (1) 6 1/2" Fabric G square to make the middle row. Sew together the (3) rows lengthwise to make (1) 12 1/2" Block Two square (Fig. 11). Repeat to make (8) Block One squares total.

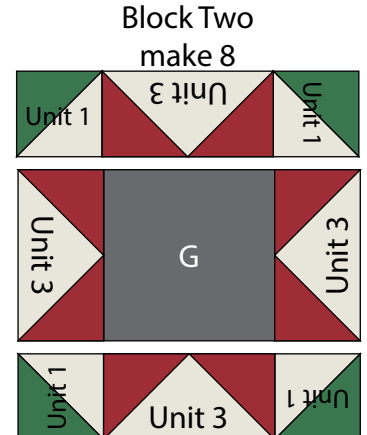

9. Sew (1) Unit 2 strip to each end of (1) Unit 4 strip to make the top row. Repeat to make the bottom row. Sew (1) Unit 4 strip to each side of (1) 6 1/2" Fabric E square to make the middle row. Sew together the (3) rows lengthwise to make (1) 12 1/2" Block Three square (Fig. 12). Repeat to make (12) Block Three squares total.

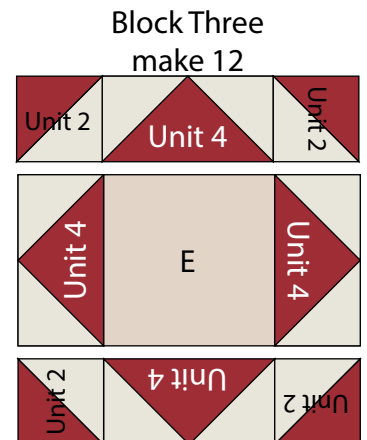

10. Sew together (1) Block One square, (1) Block Three square, (1) Block Two square, (1) Block Three square and (1) Block One square, in that order from left to right, to make Row One (Fig. 13). Repeat to make Row Five.

11. Sew together (3) Block Three squares and (2) Block Two squares, alternating them from left to right, to make Row Two (Fig. 13). Repeat to make Row Four.

12. Sew together (1) Block Two square, (1) Block Three square, (1) Block One square, (1) Block Three square and (1) Block Two square, in that order from left to right, to make Row Three (Fig. 13).

13. Sew together the (5) Rows from Steps 10-12, lengthwise and in numerical order from top to bottom, to make the 60 1/2" x 60 1/2" Center Block (Fig. 13).



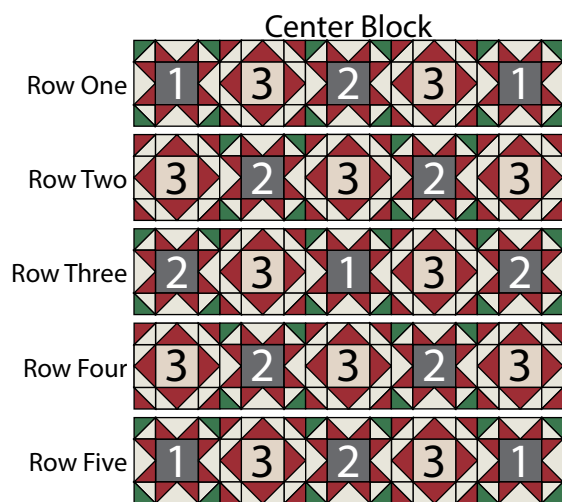

### Quilt Top Assembly

*(Follow the Quilt Layout while assembling the quilt top.)*

14. Sew (1) 2 ½" x 60 ½" Fabric H strip to each side of the Center Block. Sew (1) 2 ½" x 64 ½" Fabric H strip to the top and to the bottom of the Center Block.

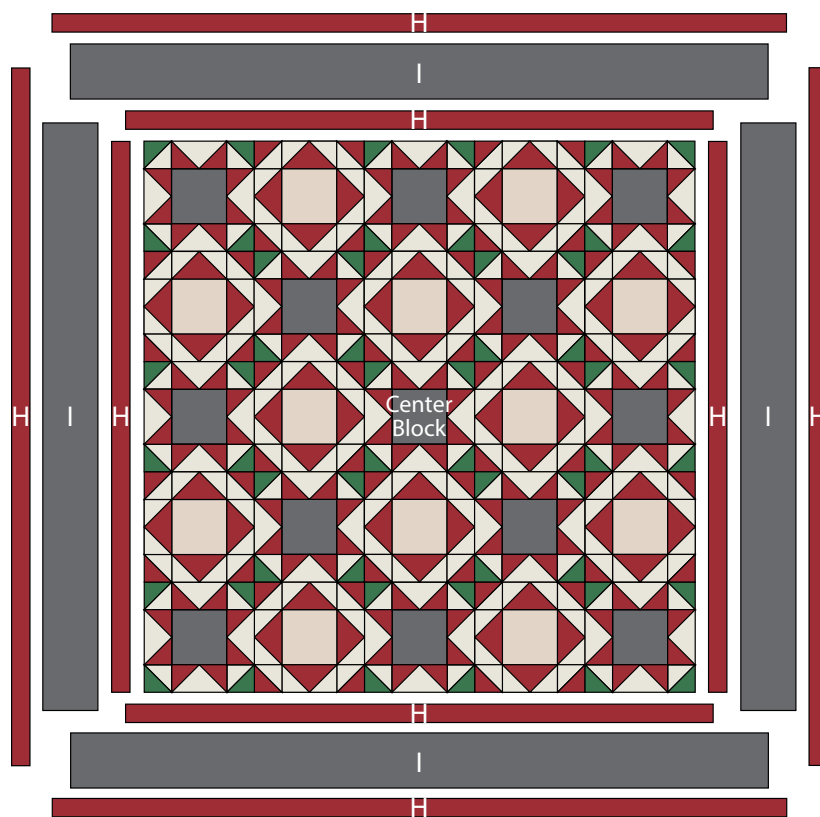
15. Sew (1) 6 ½" x 64 ½" Fabric I strip to each side of the Center Block. Sew (1) 6 ½" x 76 ½" Fabric I strip to the top and to the bottom of the Center Block.

16. Sew (1) 2 ½" x 76 ½" Fabric H strip to each side of the Center Block. Sew (1) 2 ½" x 80 ½" Fabric H strip to the top and to the bottom of the Center Block to make the quilt top.

17. Layer and quilt as desired.

18. Sew the (8) 2 ½" x WOF Fabric J strips together, end to end with 45-degree seams, to make the binding. Fold this long strip in half lengthwise with wrong sides together and press.

19. Bind as desired.
