Cutting Instructions

Please note: all strips are cut across the width of fabric (WOF) from selvage to selvage edge unless otherwise noted.

From the Border Stripe - Ochre (A), fussy cut:

- (5) 8 ½" squares each centered on a scene from the top row (A1).
- (3) 8 ½" squares each centered on a scene from the second row (A2).
- (4) 8 ½" squares each centered on a scene from the third row (A3).
- (3) 8 ½" squares each centered on a scene from the fourth row (A4).

From the Wheat Star Calico - Black (B), cut:

- (4) 2 ½" x WOF strips. Sew the strips together end to end with diagonal seams and cut (2) 2 ½" x 80 ½" strips.
- (4) 2 ½" x WOF strips. Sew the strips together end to end with diagonal seams and cut (2) 2 ½" x 74 ½" strips.
- (8) 2" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (30) 2" x 8 ½" strips.
- (10) 2" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (30) 2" x 11 ½" strips.
- (8) 2 ½" WOF strips for the binding.

From the Pinwheel Ombre - Cream/Gold (C), cut:

- (1) 3" x WOF strip. Sub-cut (4) 3" squares.
- (1) 2 ½" x WOF strip. Sub-cut (9) 2 ½" squares.
- (2) 1 ³/₄" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (32) 1 ³/₄" squares.
- (1) 1 ½" x WOF strip. Sub-cut (12) 1 ½" x 2 ½" strips.
- (2) 1 ½" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (12) 1 ½" x 4 ½" strips.

From the Winding Vines - Rust (D), cut:

- (1) 3" x WOF strip. Sub-cut (4) 3" squares.
- (2) 1 ³/₄" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (32) 1 ³/₄" squares.
- (2) 1 ½" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (18) 1 ½" x 2 ½" strips.
- (2) 1 ½" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (18) 1 ½" x 4 ½" strips.

From the Winding Vines - Blue (E), cut:

- (1) 3" x WOF strip. Sub-cut (4) 3" squares.
- (3) 2 3/4" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (36) 2 3/4" squares.
- (2) 1 ³/₄" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (32) 1 ³/₄" squares.
- (2) 1 ½" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (18) 1 ½" x 4 ½" strips.
- (3) 1 ½" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (18) 1 ½" x 6 ½" strips.
- (3) 1 ½" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (12) 1 ½" x 8 ½" strips.
- (3) 1 ½" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (12) 1 ½" x 10 ½" strips.

From the Pinwheel Ombre - Red (F), cut:

- (2) 2 3/4" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (24) 2 3/4" squares.
- (1) 2 ½" x WOF strip. Sub-cut (6) 2 ½" squares.
- (3) 1 ½" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (18) 1 ½" x 6 ½" strips.
- (5) 1 ½" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (18) 1 ½" x 8 ½" strips.

From the Wheat Star Calico - Green (G), cut:

- (1) 3" x WOF strip. Sub-cut (3) 3" squares.
- (4) 2" x WOF strips. Sew the strips together end to end with diagonal seams and cut (2) 2" x 62 ½" strips.
- (3) 2" x WOF strips. Sew the strips together end to end with diagonal seams and cut (2) 2" x 55 ½" strips.
- (2) 1 ³/₄" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (24) 1 ³/₄" squares.
- (5) 1 ½" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (18) 1 ½" x 8 ½" strips.
- (5) 1 ½" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (18) 1 ½" x 10 ½" strips.

From the Folio - Chamois (H), cut:

- (6) 3 %" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (60) 3 %" squares.
- (1) 3" x WOF strip. Sub-cut (3) 3" squares.
- (4) 2 ½" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (60) 2 ½" squares.
- (2) 1 ³/₄" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (24) 1 ³/₄" squares.

From the Folio - Off White (I), cut:

- (6) 4 1/8" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (60) 4 1/8" squares.
- (5) 3 1/8" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (60) 3 1/8" squares.
- (8) 2" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (52) 2" x 5 ½" strips.
- (1) 2" x WOF strip. Sub-cut (4) 2" x 7" strips.
- (15) 1 ³/₄" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (208) 1 ³/₄" x 3" strips.
- (9) 1 ³/₄" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (208) 1 ³/₄" squares.
- (4) 1 ½" x WOF strips. Sew the strips together end to end with diagonal seams and cut (2) 1 ½" x 60 ½" strips.
- (3) 1 ½" x WOF strips. Sew the strips together end to end with diagonal seams and cut (2) 1 ½" x 52 ½" strips.
- (4) 1 ½" x WOF strips. Sew the strips together end to end with diagonal seams and cut (2) 1 ½" x 78 ½" strips.
- (4) 1 ½" x WOF strips. Sew the strips together end to end with diagonal seams and cut (2) 1 ½" x 70 ½" strips.

- (1) 3" x WOF strip. Sub-cut (2) 3" squares.
- (1) 1 ³/₄" x WOF strip. Sub-cut (16) 1 ³/₄" squares.
- (2) 1 ½" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (12) 1 ½" x 4 ½" strips.
- (2) 1 ½" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (12) 1 ½" x 6 ½" strips.

From the Winding Vines - Green (K), cut:

- (1) 3" x WOF strip. Sub-cut (5) 3" squares.
- (2) 1 ³/₄" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (40) 1 ³/₄" squares.
- (2) 1 ½" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (12) 1 ½" x 6 ½" strips.
- (3) 1 ½" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (12) 1 ½" x 8 ½" strips.

From the Small Novelty-Fall - Black (L), cut:

• (1) 3" x WOF strip. Sub-cut (1) 3" square and (8) 1 3/4" squares.

From the Small Novelty-Winter - Red (M), cut:

• (1) 3" x WOF strip. Sub-cut (1) 3" square and (8) 1 3/4" squares.

From the Small Novelty-Spring - Green (N), cut:

• (1) 3" x WOF strip. Sub-cut (1) 3" square and (8) 1 3/4" squares.

From the Small Novelty-Summer - Dark Blue (O), cut:

• (1) 3" x WOF strip. Sub-cut (1) 3" square and (8) 1 3/4" squares.

From the Folio - Wine (P), cut:

- (1) 3" x WOF strip. Sub-cut (3) 3" squares.
- (1) 1 ³/₄" x WOF strip. Sub-cut (24) 1 ³/₄" squares.

From the Folio - Forest (Q), cut:

- (1) 3" x WOF strip. Sub-cut (3) 3" squares.
- (2) 1 ³/₄" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (24) 1 ³/₄" squares.

From the Folio - Red (R), cut:

- (1) 3" x WOF strip. Sub-cut (2) 3" squares.
- (1) 1 ³/₄" x WOF strip. Sub-cut (16) 1 ³/₄" squares.

From the Pinwheel Ombre - Green (S), cut:

- (1) 3" x WOF strip. Sub-cut (3) 3" squares.
- (1) 1 3/4" x WOF strip. Sub-cut (24) 1 3/4" squares.

From the Folio - Spruce (T), cut:

- (1) 3" x WOF strip. Sub-cut (3) 3" squares.
- (1) 1 ³/₄" x WOF strip. Sub-cut (24) 1 ³/₄" squares.

From the Folio - Christmas Green (U), cut:

- (1) 3" x WOF strip. Sub-cut (2) 3" squares.
- (1) 1 3/4" x WOF strip. Sub-cut (16) 1 3/4" squares.

From the Folio - Gold (V), cut:

- (1) 3" x WOF strip. Sub-cut (3) 3" squares.
- (1) 1 ³/₄" x WOF strip. Sub-cut (24) 1 ³/₄" squares.

From the Folio - Ochre (W), cut:

- (1) 3" x WOF strip. Sub-cut (4) 3" squares.
- (2) 1 ³/₄" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (32) 1 ³/₄" squares.


From the Pinwheel Ombre - Cream/Gold (Backing), cut:

• (2) 92" x WOF strips for the backing. Sew the strips together and trim to make the 82" x 92" back.


Block Assembly

Note: Pay attention to the unit orientations when assembling the various components.

1. Sew (1) 2" x 8 $\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric B strip to each side of (1) 8 $\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric A1 block. Sew (1) 2" x 11 $\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric B strip to the top and to the bottom of the Fabric A1 block. Trim the block to measure 10 $\frac{1}{2}$ " square to make (1) Block One square (Fig. 1). Repeat to make (5) Block One squares total.



2. Repeat Step 1 and refer to Figures 2-4 for fabric identification and placement to make (3) Block Two squares, (4) Block Three squares and (3) Block Four squares.








3. Sew (1) 1 ½" x 2 ½" Fabric D strip to each side of (1) 2 ½" Fabric C square. Sew (1) 1 ½" x 4 ½" Fabric D strip to the top and to the bottom of the Fabric C square to make (1) Unit 1 square (Fig. 5). Repeat to make (9) Unit 1 squares total.




Fig. 7 Fig. 6

4. Place (1) 2 ½" Fabric H square on the top left corner of (1) Unit 1 square, right sides together (Fig. 6). Sew across the diagonal of the small square from the upper right corner to the lower left corner (Fig. 6). Trim away the excess fabric from behind the triangle 1/4" away from the sewn seam. Flip open the triangle formed and press (Fig. 7).

- 5. Follow Figure 8 for the seam direction to a 2 ½" Fabric H square to each of the remaining corners of the Unit 1 square to make (1) Unit 2 square (Fig. 9).
- 6. Repeat Steps 4-5 to make (9) Unit 2 squares total.

7. Sew (1) $1\frac{1}{2}$ " x $4\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric E strip to each side of (1) Unit 2 block. Sew (1) 1 ½" x 6 ½" Fabric E strip to the top and to the bottom of the Unit 2 block to make (1) Unit 3 block (Fig. 10). Repeat to make (9) Unit 3 blocks total.






8. Repeat Steps 4-5 and refer to Figure 11 for fabric identification, placement and seam direction to add a 3 1/8" Fabric I square to each corner of (1) Unit 3 square to make (1) Unit 4 square. Repeat to make (9) Unit 4 squares total.



- 9. Sew (1) 1 ½" x 6 ½" Fabric F strip to each side of (1) Unit 4 square. Sew (1) 1 ½" x 8 ½" Fabric F strip to the top and to the bottom of the Unit 4 square to make (1) Unit 5 square (Fig. 12). Repeat to make (9) Unit 5 squares total.
- 10. Repeat Steps 4-5 and refer to Figure 13 for fabric identification, placement and seam direction to add a 3 %" Fabric H square to each corner of (1) Unit 5 square to make (1) Unit 6 square. Repeat to make (9) Unit 6 squares total.




- 11. Sew (1) 1 ½" x 8 ½" Fabric G strip to each side of (1) Unit 6 square. Sew (1) 1 ½" x 10 ½" Fabric G strip to the top and to the bottom of the Unit 6 square to make (1) Unit 7 square (Fig. 14). Repeat to make (9) Unit 7 squares total.
- 12. Repeat Steps 4-5 and refer to Figure 15 for fabric identification, placement and seam direction to add a 4 1/8" Fabric I square to each corner of (1) Unit 7 square to make (1) Unit 8 square. Repeat to make (9) Unit 8 squares total.

- 13. Repeat Steps 4-5 and refer to Figure 16 for fabric identification, placement and seam direction to add a 2 ¾" Fabric E square to each corner of (1) Unit 8 square to make (1) Block Five squares. Repeat to make (9) Block Five squares total.
- 14. Repeat Steps 3-13 and refer to Figure 17 for fabric identification, placement and seam direction to make (6) Block Six squares.



15. Follow Figure 18 and sew (9) Block Five squares, (3) Block Two squares, (3) Block Four squares, (5) Block One squares and (4) Block Three squares and (6) Block Six squares together into a 5 x 6 matrix to make the Center Block. The Center Block should measure 50 ½" x 60 ½".





16. Place (1) 1 ¾" Fabric W square on the left side of (1) 1 ¾" x 3" Fabric I strip, right sides together (Fig. 19). Sew across the diagonal of the square from the upper right corner to the lower left corner (Fig. 19). Trim away the excess fabric from behind the triangle, leaving a ¼" seam allowance. Flip open the triangle formed and press (Fig. 20).



- 17. Place another 1 ³/₄" Fabric W square on the right side of the 1 ³/₄" x 3" Fabric I strip, right sides together (Fig. 21). Sew across the diagonal of the square from the upper left corner to the lower right corner (Fig. 21). Trim away the excess fabric from behind the triangle, leaving a ¹/₄" seam allowance. Flip open the triangle formed and press to make (1) Unit 9 strip (Fig. 22).
- 18. Repeat Steps 16-17 to make (16) Unit 9 strips total.





- 19. Sew (1) 1 ¾" Fabric I square to each end of (1) Unit 9 strip to make the top row. Repeat to make the bottom row. Sew (1) Unit 9 strip to each side of (1) 3" Fabric W square to make the middle row. Sew the (3) rows together to make (1) Unit 10 square (Fig. 23). Repeat to make (4) Unit 10 squares total.
- 20. Sew (1) 2" x 5 ½" Fabric I strip to the left side of (1) Unit 10 square to make (1) Unit 11 rectangle (Fig. 24). Repeat to make (4) Unit 11 rectangles total.


21. Repeat Steps 16-20 and refer to Figures 25-42 for fabric identification, placement, seam direction and orientation to make the designated number of units for Unit 12 through Unit 29. The units should measure 5 ½" x 7" and there should be a total of (52) rectangles.

- 22. Follow Figure 43 and sew together (13) assorted 5 ½" x 7" units to make the Left Side Border. Repeat to make the Right Side Border (Fig. 44).
- 23. Refer to Figure 45 below to sew (12) assorted 5 ½" x 7" units together. Sew (1) 2" x 7" Fabric I strip to each end of the newly sewn strip. Sew (1) Unit 19 rectangle to the left end of the newly sewn strip to make the Top Border.
- 24. Refer to Figure 46 below to sew (12) assorted 5 ½" x 7" units together. Sew (1) 2" x 7" Fabric I strip to each end of the newly sewn strip. Sew (1) Unit 25 rectangle to the left end of the newly sewn strip to make the Bottom Border.



Quilt Top Assembly

(Follow the Quilt Layout while assembling the quilt top.) 25. Sew (1) 1 ½" x 60 ½" Fabric I strip to each side of the Center Block. Sew (1) 1 ½" x 52 ½" Fabric I strip to the top and to the bottom of the Center Block.

- 26. Sew (1) 2" x 62 ½" Fabric G strip to each side of the Center Block. Sew (1) 2" x 55 ½" Fabric G strip to the top and to the bottom of the Center Block.
- 27. Sew the Left Side Border and the Right Side Border to the left and to the right of the Center Block. Sew the Top Border and the Bottom Border to the top and to the bottom of the Center Block.
- 28. Sew (1) 1 ½" x 78 ½" Fabric I strip to each side of the Center Block. Sew (1) 1 ½" x 70 ½" Fabric I strip to the top and to the bottom of the Center Block.
- 29. Sew (1) 2 ½" x 80 ½" Fabric B strip to each side of the Center Block. Sew (1) 2 ½" x 74 ½" Fabric B strip to the top and to the bottom of the Center Block to make the quilt top.
- 30. Layer and quilt as desired.
- 31. Sew the (8) 2 ½" x WOF Fabric B strips together, end to end with 45-degree seams, to make the binding. Fold this long strip in half lengthwise with wrong sides together and press.
- 32. Bind as desired.


