5/8 yard	Trailing Vines - Spa Blue (C)	2972-17
1 yard	Dots and Leaves - Pink (D)	2973-22
5/8 yard	Checks - Spa Blue (E)	2975-17
4 1/2 yards	Folio - White on White (F)	7755-01
3/8 yard	Dots and Leaves - Green (G)	2973-66
1 yards	Checks - Green (H)	2975-66*
3/8 yard	Folio - Blush (I)	7755-02
1/4 yard	Paisley - Green (J)	2976-66
1/4 yard	Paisley - Pink (K)	2976-22
3/8 yard	Trailing Vines - Pink (L)	2972-22
3/8 yard	Dots and Leaves - Spa Blue (M)	2973-17

Cutting Instructions

Please note: All strips are cut across the width of fabric (WOF) from selvage to selvage edge unless otherwise noted.

Main Floral Allover - Spa Blue (A), cut:

- (2) 6 1/2" x 72 1/2" Length of Fabric (LOF) strips.
- From the remaining fabric, cut (2) 6 1/2" x 84 1/2" WOF strips, piece as needed.

From the Main Floral Allover - Cream (B), cut:

- (1) 4 1/2" x WOF strip. Sub-cut (5) 4 1/2" squares.

From the Trailing Vines - Spa Blue (C), cut:

- (1) 4 7/8" x WOF strip. Sub-cut (4) 4 7/8" squares.
- (1) 4 1/2" x WOF strip. Sub-cut (4) 4 1/2" squares.
- (3) 2 1/2" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (20) 2 1/2" x 4 1/2" strips.

From the Dots and Leaves - Pink (D), cut:

- (2) 2 7/8" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (16) 2 7/8" squares.
- (4) 2 1/2" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (56) 2 1/2" squares.
- (5) 2 1/2" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (45) 2 1/2" x 4 1/2" strips.

From the Checks - Spa Blue (E), cut:

- (2) 2 7/8" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (20) 2 7/8" squares.
- (2) 2 1/2" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (20) 2 1/2" squares.
- (2) 2 1/2" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (14) 2 1/2" x 4 1/2" strips.

From the Folio - White on White (F), cut:

- (7) 4 7/8" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (54) 4 7/8" squares.
- (1) 4 1/2" x WOF strip. Sub-cut (4) 4 1/2" squares.
- (3) 2 7/8" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (36) 2 7/8" squares.
- (28) 2 1/2" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (436) 2 1/2" squares.
- (8) 2 1/2" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (72) 2 1/2" x 4 1/2" strips.
- (3) 2 1/2" x WOF strips. Sew the strips together end to end with diagonal seams and cut (2) 2 1/2" x 60 1/2" strips.
- (4) 2 1/2" x WOF strips. Sew the strips together end to end with diagonal seams and cut (2) 2 1/2" x 64 1/2" strips.

From the Dots and Leaves - Green (G), cut:

- (2) 2 1/2" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (32) 2 1/2" squares.
- (2) 2 1/2" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (15) 2 1/2" x 4 1/2" strips.

From the Checks - Green (H), cut:

- (4) 2 1/2" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (30) 2 1/2" x 4 1/2" strips.
- (9) 2 1/2" x WOF strips for the binding.

From the Folio - Blush (I), cut:

- (4) 2 1/2" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (34) 2 1/2" x 4 1/2" strips.

From the Paisley - Green (J), cut:

- (1) 4 7/8" x WOF strip. Sub-cut (5) 4 7/8" squares.

From the Paisley - Pink (K), cut:

- (1) 4 7/8" x WOF strip. Sub-cut (4) 4 7/8" squares.

From the Trailing Vines - Pink (L), cut:

- (2) 4 7/8" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (16) 4 7/8" squares.

From the Dots and Leaves - Spa Blue (M) cut:

- (4) 2 1/2" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (28) 2 1/2" x 4 1/2" strips.

From the Folio - Celery (N), cut:

- (3) 4 7/8" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (20) 4 7/8" squares.
- (2) 2 1/2" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (14) 2 1/2" x 4 1/2" strips.

From the Jacobean - Spa Blue (O), cut:

- (1) 4 7/8" x WOF strip. Sub-cut (5) 4 7/8" squares.

From the Main Floral Allover - Pink (Backing), cut:

- (3) 92" x WOF strips for the backing. Sew the strips together and trim to make the 92" x 92" back.

Block Assembly

Note: The arrows in figures represent the fabric print direction. Pay attention to the fabric and unit orientations when assembling the various components. Use a 1/4" seam allowance with right sides together (RST) unless otherwise noted.

1. Place (1) 4 7/8" Fabric J square on top of (1) 4 7/8" Fabric F square, right sides together. Draw a line across the diagonal of the top square (Fig. 1). Sew 1/4" away from each side of the drawn diagonal line (Fig. 1). Cut the (2) squares apart on the drawn diagonal line (Fig. 2) to make (2) half-square triangles. Trim the half-square triangles to measure 4 1/2" square to make (2) Unit 1 squares (Fig. 3). Repeat to make (10) Unit 1 squares total.

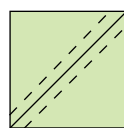

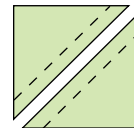

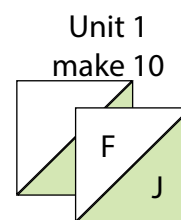

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Quilt 1

2. Repeat Step 1 and refer to Figures 4-8 for fabric identification and placement to make (40) Unit 2 squares, (10) Unit 3 squares, (8) Unit 4 squares, (32) Unit 5 squares and (8) Unit 6 squares.

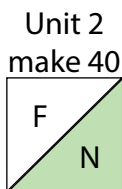

3. Place (1) 2 1/2" Fabric F square on the left side of (1) 2 1/2" x 4 1/2" Fabric C strip, right sides together (Fig. 9). Sew across the diagonal of the square from the upper right corner to the lower left corner (Fig. 9). Flip open the triangle formed and press. Trim away the excess fabric from behind the triangle, leaving a 1/4" seam allowance (Fig. 10).

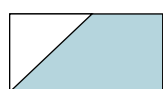

4. Place another 2 1/2" Fabric F square on the right side of the 2 1/2" x 4 1/2" Fabric C strip, right sides together (Fig. 11). Sew across the diagonal of the square from the upper left corner to the lower right corner (Fig. 11). Flip open the triangle formed and press. Trim away the excess fabric from behind the triangle, leaving a 1/4" seam allowance to make (1) Unit 7 strip (Fig. 12).

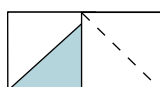

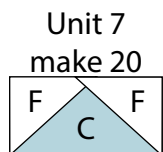

5. Repeat Steps 3-4 to make (20) Unit 7 strips total.

6. Repeat Steps 3-4 and refer to Figures 13-17 for fabric identification, placement and seam direction to make (20) Unit 8 strips, (20) Unit 9 strips, (45) Unit 10 strips, (30) Unit 11 strips and (16) Unit 12 strips.

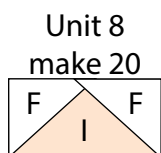

7. Sew (1) 2 1/2" x 4 1/2" Fabric F strip to the top of (1) Unit 7 strip lengthwise to make (1) 4 1/2" Unit 13 square (Fig. 18). Repeat to make (20) Unit 13 squares total.

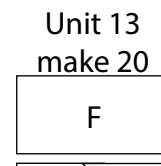

8. Sew (1) Unit 9 strip to the top of (1) Unit 8 strip lengthwise along the Fabric F sides to make (1) 4 1/2" Unit 14 square (Fig. 19). Repeat to make (20) Unit 14 squares total.

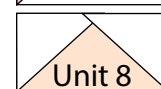
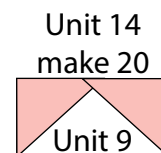

9. Sew (1) 2 1/2" x 4 1/2" Fabric F strip to the top of (1) Unit 10 strip lengthwise to make (1) 4 1/2" Unit 15 square (Fig. 20). Repeat to make (16) Unit 15 squares total.

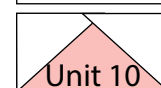
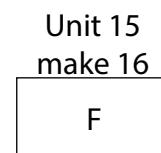

10. Sew (1) Unit 12 strip to the top of (1) Unit 11 strip lengthwise along the Fabric F sides to make (1) 4 1/2" Unit 16 square (Fig. 21). Repeat to make (16) Unit 16 squares total.

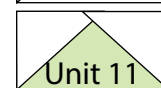
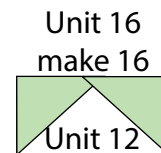

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Quilt 1

11. Place (1) $2\frac{7}{8}$ " Fabric E square on top of (1) $2\frac{7}{8}$ " Fabric F square, right sides together. Draw a line across the diagonal of the top square (Fig. 22). Sew $\frac{1}{4}$ " away from each side of the drawn diagonal line (Fig. 22). Cut the (2) squares apart on the drawn diagonal line (Fig. 23) to make (2) half-square triangles. Trim the half-square triangles to measure $2\frac{1}{2}$ " square to make (2) Unit 17 squares (Fig. 24). Repeat to make (40) Unit 17 squares total.

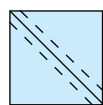

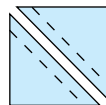

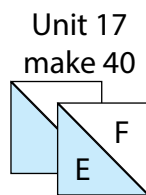

12. Repeat Step 11 and refer to Figure 25 for fabric identification and placement to make (32) Unit 18 squares.

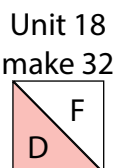

13. Sew (1) $2\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric E square to the left side of (1) Unit 17 square to make the top row. Sew (1) Unit 17 square to the left side of (1) $2\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric F square to make the bottom row. Sew together the (2) rows lengthwise to make (1) $4\frac{1}{2}$ " Unit 19 square (Fig. 26). Repeat to make (20) Unit 19 squares total.

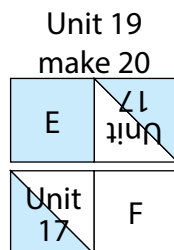

14. Repeat Step 13 and refer to Figure 27 for component identification, placement and orientation to make (16) Unit 20 squares.

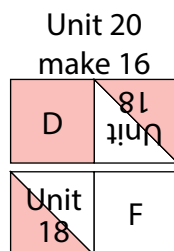

15. Follow Figure 28 and sew together (24) assorted $4\frac{1}{2}$ " unit squares and (1) $4\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric B square into a 5×5 matrix to make (1) $20\frac{1}{2}$ " Block One square. Repeat to make (5) Block One squares total.

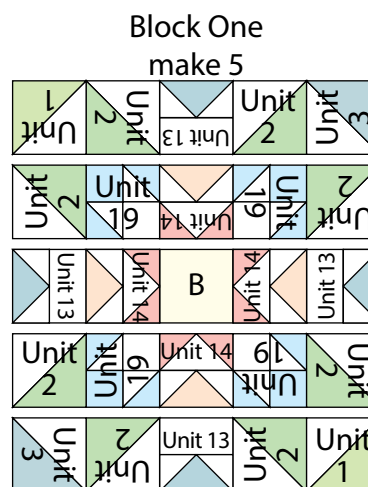

16. Follow Figure 29 and sew together (24) assorted $4\frac{1}{2}$ " unit squares and (1) $4\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric C square into a 5×5 matrix to make (1) $20\frac{1}{2}$ " Block Two square. Repeat to make (4) Block Two squares total.

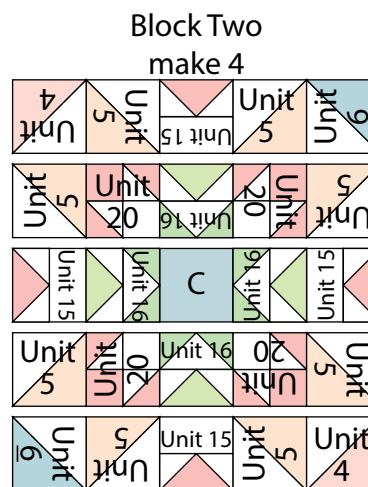
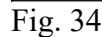
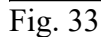
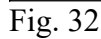
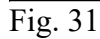
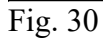

17. Repeat Steps 3-4 and refer to Figure 30 for fabric identification, placement and seam direction to make (15) Unit 21 strips, (28) Unit 22 strips, (14) Unit 23 strips, (14) Unit 24 strips and (14) Unit 25 strips.



18. Follow Figure 35 and sew together (32) assorted unit strips lengthwise to make the Left Side Border.

19. Follow Figure 36 and sew together (32) assorted unit strips lengthwise to make the Right Side Border.

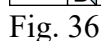
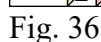

20. Follow Figure 37 below and sew together (32) assorted unit strips lengthwise. Sew (1) 4 ½" Fabric F square to each end of the newly sewn strip to make the Top Border.

21. Follow Figure 38 below and sew together (32) assorted unit strips lengthwise. Sew (1) 4 ½" Fabric F square to each end of the newly sewn strip to make the Bottom Border.

Quilt Top Assembly

(Follow the Quilt Layout while assembling the quilt top.)

22. Sew (1) Block One square to each side of (1) Block Two square to make the top row. Repeat to make the bottom row.

23. Sew (1) Block Two square to each side of (1) Block One square to make the middle row.

24. Sew the (3) rows from Steps 22-23 together lengthwise to make the 60 ½" x 60 ½" Center Block.

25. Sew (1) 2 ½" x 60 ½" Fabric F strip to each side of the Center Block. Sew (1) 2 ½" x 64 ½" Fabric F strip to the top and to the bottom of the Center Block.

26. Sew the Left Side Border and the Right Side Border to the left and to the right sides of the Center Block.

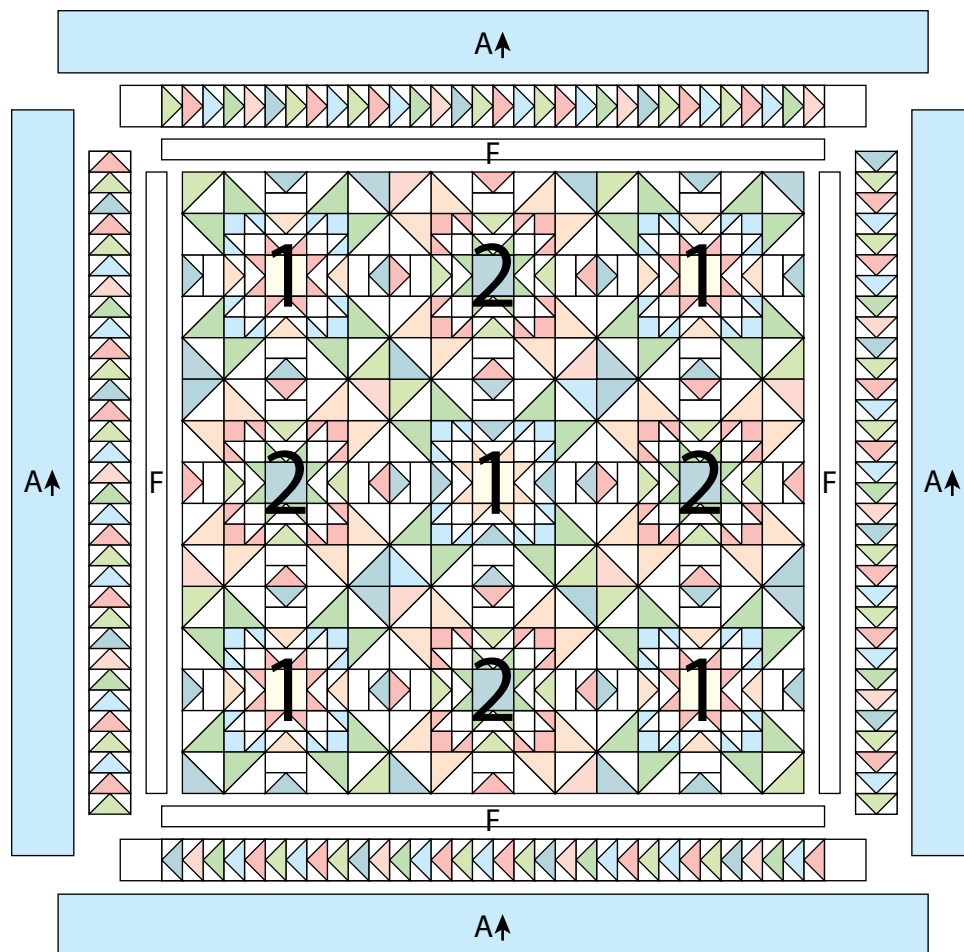
27. Sew the Top and Bottom Borders to the top and to the bottom of the Center Block.

28. Sew (1) 6 ½" x 72 ½" Fabric A strip to each side of the Center Block. Sew (1) 6 ½" x 84 ½" Fabric A strip to the top and to the bottom of the Center Block to make the quilt top.

29. Layer and quilt as desired.

30. Sew the (9) 2 ½" x WOF Fabric H strips together, end to end with 45-degree seams, to make the binding. Fold this long strip in half lengthwise with wrong sides together and press.

31. Bind as desired.
