





Cutting Instructions

Please note: All strips are cut across the width of fabric (WOF) from selvage to selvage edge unless otherwise noted.

From the Barn Panel - Green (A):

• Fussy cut (1) 22 ½" x 38 ½" rectangle, centered on the panel.

From the Folio Basic - Black (B), cut:

- (2) 2" x 38 ½" WOF strips.
- (2) 2" x 25 ½" WOF strips.
- (4) 2" x WOF strips. Sew the strips together end to end with diagonal seams and cut (2) 2" x 64 ½" strips.
- (3) 2" x WOF strips. Sew the strips together end to end with diagonal seams and cut (2) 2" x 51 ½" strips.
- (3) 1 ½" x WOF strips. Sew the strips together end to end with diagonal seams and cut (2) 1 ½" x 46 ½" strips.
- (2) 1 ½" x 32 ½" WOF strips.
- (7) 2 ½" x WOF strips for the binding.

From the Border Stripe - Ecru (C), cut:

- (2) 6" x 82" Length of Fabric (LOF) strips.
- (2) 6" x 66" LOF strips.
- (2) 3 ½" x 50" LOF strips.
- (2) 3 ½" x 34" LOF strips.

From the Polish Hen Allover - Black (D), cut:

• (2) 4 ½" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (12) 4 ½" squares.

From the Calico - Red (E), cut:

• (6) 2 ½" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (96) 2 ½" squares.

From the Folio Basic - Off White (F), cut:

- (2) 2 \%" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (24) 2 \%" squares.
- (6) 2 ½" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (48) 2 ½" x 4 ½" strips.

From the Calico - Navy (G), cut:

• (2) 2 \%" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (24) 2 \%" squares.

From the Sheep Allover - Ecru (H), cut:

• (2) 4 ½" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (12) 4 ½" squares.

From the Folio Basic - Charcoal (I), cut:

• (6) 2 ½" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (96) 2 ½" squares.

From the Bud Calico - Ecru (J), cut:

- (2) 2 1/8" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (24) 2 1/8" squares.
- (6) 2 ½" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (48) 2 ½" x 4 ½" strips.

From the Folio Basic - Dark Olive (K), cut:

• (2) 2 1/8" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (24) 2 1/8" squares.

From the Scenic - Green (Backing), cut:

• (2) 86" x WOF strips for the backing. Sew the strips together and trim to make the 70" x 86" back.

Block Assembly

Note: The arrows in figures represent the fabric print direction. Pay attention to the fabric and unit orientations when assembling the various components. Use a ¼" seam allowance with right sides together (RST) unless otherwise noted.

1. Sew (1) 2" x 38 ½" Fabric B strip to each side of the 22 ½" x 38 ½" panel. Sew (1) 2" x 25 ½" Fabric B strip to the top and to the bottom of the Fabric A panel to make the Center Block (Fig. 1). **Trim the block to measure 24** ½" x 40 ½".



2. Place (1) 2 ½" Fabric E square on the left side of (1) 2 ½" x 4 ½" Fabric F strip, right sides together (Fig. 2). Sew across the diagonal of the square from the upper right corner to the lower left corner (Fig. 2). Flip open the triangle formed and press. Trim away the excess fabric from behind the triangle, leaving a ¼" seam allowance (Fig. 3).





- 3. Place another 2 1/2" Fabric E square on the right side of the 2 ½" x 4 ½" Fabric F strip, right sides together (Fig. 4). Sew across the diagonal of the square from the upper left corner to the lower right corner (Fig. 4). Flip open the triangle formed and press. Trim away the excess fabric from behind the triangle, leaving a 1/4" seam allowance to make (1) Unit 1 strip (Fig. 5).
- 4. Repeat Steps 2-3 to make (48) Unit 1 strips total.






5. Repeat Steps 2-3 and refer to Figure 6 for fabric identification, placement and seam direction to make (48) Unit 2 strips.




6. Place (1) 2 1/8" Fabric F square on top of (1) 2 1/8" Fabric G square, right sides together. Draw a line across the diagonal of the top square (Fig. 7). Sew 1/4" away from each side of the drawn diagonal line (Fig. 7). Cut the (2) squares apart on the drawn diagonal line (Fig. 8) to make (2) halfsquare triangles. Trim the half-square triangles to measure 2 ½" square to make (2) Unit 3 squares (Fig. 9). Repeat to make (48) Unit 3 squares total.








7. Repeat Step 6 and refer to Figure 10 for fabric identification and placement to make (48) Unit 4 squares.



8. Sew (1) Unit 3 square to each end of (1) Unit 1 strip to make the top row. Repeat to make the bottom row. Sew (1) Unit 1 strip to each side of (1) 4 ½" Fabric D square to make the middle row. Sew the (3) rows together lengthwise to make (1) Block One square (Fig. 11). Repeat to make (12) Block One squares total.



9. Repeat Step 8 and refer to Figure 12 for component identification, placement and orientation to make (12) Block Two squares.



Quilt Top Assembly

(Follow the Quilt Layout while assembling the quilt top.) 10. Center (1) 3 ½" x 50" Fabric C strip on (1) side of the Center Block and pin in place. Start sewing the strip a 1/4" from the top edge of the block and stop a 1/4" from the bottom edge. DO NOT TRIM THE EXCESS. Repeat with the opposite side.

- 11. Repeat Step 10 to sew (1) 3 ½" x 34" Fabric C strip to the top and to the bottom of the Center Block, making sure to stop and start 1/4" away from each end of the block. To miter each corner, fold the Center Block on a diagonal, wrong side together. This should line up the strips from adjacent sides (Fig. 13).
- 12. Starting at the sewn seam (represented by the arrow in Figure 13), draw a 45-degree line to the edge of the fabric. Sew on the drawn line. Trim the excess fabric leaving a 1/4" seam. Repeat this step with the remaining corners.






22. Laver and o

- 13. Sew (1) 1 ½" x 46 ½" Fabric B strip to each side of the Center Block. Sew (1) 1 ½" x 32 ½" Fabric B strip to the top and to the bottom of the Center Block.
- 14. Sew (3) Block Two squares and (3) Block One squares together, alternating them from the top to the bottom. Sew the newly sewn strip to the left side of the Center Block.
- 15. Sew (3) Block One squares and (3) Block Two squares together, alternating them from the top to the bottom. Sew the newly sewn strip to the right side of the Center Block.
- 16. Sew (3) Block One squares and (3) Block Two squares together, alternating them from left to right. Sew the newly sewn strip to the top of the Center Block.
- 17. Sew (3) Block Two squares and (3) Block One squares together, alternating them from left to right. Sew the newly sewn strip to the bottom of the Center Block.
- 18. Sew (1) 2" x 64 ½" Fabric B strip to each side of the Center Block. Sew (1) 2" x 51 ½" Fabric B strip to the top and to the bottom of the Center Block.
- 19. Center (1) 6" x 82" Fabric C strip on (1) side of the Center Block and pin in place. Start sewing the strip a 1/4" from the top edge of the block and stop a 1/4" from the bottom edge. **DO NOT TRIM THE EXCESS.** Repeat with the opposite side.
- 20. Repeat Step 19 to sew (1) 6" x 66" Fabric C strip to the top and to the bottom of the Center Block, making sure to stop and start 1/4" away from each end of the block. To miter each corner, fold the Center Block on a diagonal, wrong side together. This should line up the strips from adjacent sides (Fig. 13).
- 21. Starting at the sewn seam (represented by the arrow in Figure 13), draw a 45-degree line to the edge of the fabric. Sew on the drawn line. Trim the excess fabric leaving a ¼" seam. Repeat this step with the remaining corners to make the quilt top.

- 22. Layer and quilt as desired.
- 23. Sew the (7) 2 ½" x WOF Fabric B strips together, end to end with 45-degree seams, to make the binding. Fold this long strip in half lengthwise with wrong sides together and press.
- 24. Bind as desired.
