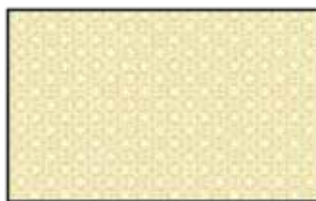

### Materials

2/3 yard	Dream Catchers 6 Blocks - Cream (A)	9750-14
1 1/8 yards	Set Dots - Blue (B)	9749-71*
5/8 yard	Modern Melody Basics - Brown (C)	1063-33
5/8 yard	Modern Melody Basics - Cream (D)	1063-40
1/3 yard	Tossed Feathers - Multi (E)	9747-73
1/3 yard	Packed Desert Rose - Green (F)	9743-66
1/4 yard	Yellow Cactus Flowers - Yellow (G)	9745-64
1/2 yard	Tossed Dreamcatchers - Multi (H)	9742-46
1/2 yard	Watercolor Stripe - Multi (I)	9748-48
1 2/3 yards	Packed Succulents - Multi (J)	9741-68
4 1/4 yards	Succulents & Sayings - Multi (Backing)	9746-46

### Cutting Instructions

*Please note: All strips are cut across the width of fabric (WOF) from selvage to selvage unless otherwise noted.*

#### From the Dream Catchers 6 Blocks - Cream (A):

- Fussy cut (5) 9 1/2" x 12" rectangles, each centered on a block.

#### From the Set Dots - Blue (B), cut:

- (4) 2" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (10) 2" x 11 1/2" strips.
- (4) 1 1/2" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (10) 1 1/2" x 12" strips.
- (3) 1" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (8) 1" x 12" strips.
- (2) 1" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (8) 1 1/4" x 10 1/2" strips.
- (7) 2 1/2" x WOF strips for the binding.

#### From the Modern Melody Basics - Brown (C), cut:

- (6) 1 1/2" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (18) 1 1/2" x 13 1/2" strips.
- (6) 1 1/2" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (18) 1 1/2" x 12 1/2" strips.

#### From the Modern Melody Basics - Cream (D), cut:

- (2) 4 1/4" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (15) 4 1/4" squares. Cut the squares across both diagonals to make (60) 4 1/4" triangles.
- (3) 1 1/2" x WOF strips. Sew the strips together end to end with diagonal seams and cut (2) 1 1/2" x 54 1/2" strips.
- (3) 1 1/2" x WOF strips. Sew the strips together end to end with diagonal seams and cut (2) 1 1/2" x 47 1/2" strips.

#### From the Tossed Feathers - Multi (E), cut:

- (2) 4 1/4" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (15) 4 1/4" squares. Cut the squares across both diagonals to make (60) 4 1/4" triangles.

#### From the Packed Desert Rose - Green (F), cut:

- (1) 3 1/2" x WOF strip. Sub-cut (6) 3 1/2" x 6 1/2" strips.
- (1) 3 1/2" x WOF strip. Sub-cut (12) 3 1/2" squares.

#### From the Yellow Cactus Flowers - Yellow (G), cut:

- (1) 3 1/2" x WOF strip. Sub-cut (4) 3 1/2" squares.

#### From the Tossed Dreamcatchers - Multi (H), cut:

- (1) 12" x WOF strip. Sub-cut (4) 12" x 9 1/2" rectangles.

#### From the Watercolor Stripe - Multi (I), cut:

- (3) 2" x WOF strips. Sew the strips together end to end with diagonal seams and cut (2) 2" x 51 1/2" strips.
- (3) 2" x WOF strips. Sew the strips together end to end with diagonal seams and cut (2) 2" x 45 1/2" strips.

#### From the Packed Succulents - Multi (J), cut:

- (2) 5 1/2" x 56 1/2" Length of Fabric (LOF) strips.
- From the remaining fabric, cut (2) 5 1/2" x 57 1/2" WOF strips, piece as needed.

#### From the Succulents & Sayings - Multi (Backing), cut:

- (2) 74" x WOF strips for the backing. Sew the strips together and trim to make the 65" x 74" back.

### Block Assembly

*Note: Pay attention to the unit orientations when assembling the various components. Use a 1/4" seam allowance with right sides together (RST) unless otherwise noted.*

1. Sew (1) 1 1/2" x 12" Fabric B strip to each side of (1) 9 1/2" x 12" Fabric A rectangle. Sew (1) 2" x 11 1/2" Fabric B strip to the top and to the bottom of the Fabric A rectangle to make (1) Unit 1 rectangle (Fig. 1). Trim the block to measure 10 1/2" x 13 1/2" Repeat to make (5) Unit 1 rectangles total.
2. Sew (1) 1 1/2" x 13 1/2" Fabric C strip to each side of (1) Unit 1 rectangle. Sew (1) 1 1/2" x 12 1/2" Fabric C strip to the top and to the bottom of the Unit 1 rectangle to make (1) 12 1/2" x 15 1/2" Block One rectangle (Fig. 2). Repeat to make (5) Block One rectangles total.

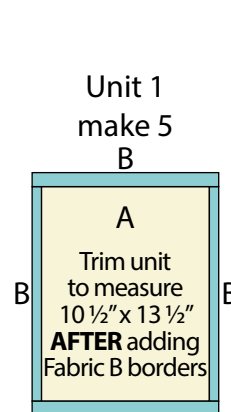

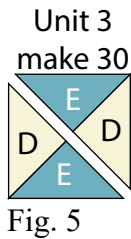
## Quilt 1

3. Sew (1) 1" x 12" Fabric B strip to each side of (1) 9 1/2" x 12" Fabric H rectangle. Sew (1) 1 1/4" x 10 1/2" Fabric B strip to the top and to the bottom of the Fabric H rectangle to make (1) Unit 2 rectangle (Fig. 3). Repeat to make (4) Unit 2 rectangles total.

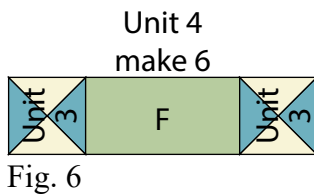
4. Sew (1) 1 1/2" x 13 1/2" Fabric C strip to each side of (1) Unit 2 rectangle. Sew (1) 1 1/2" x 12 1/2" Fabric C strip to the top and to the bottom of the Unit 2 rectangle to make (1) 12 1/2" x 15 1/2" Block Two rectangle (Fig. 4). Repeat to make (4) Block Two rectangles total.



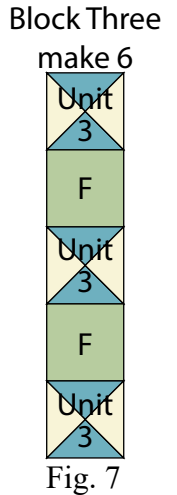
5. Sew together (1) 4 1/4" Fabric D triangle and (1) 4 1/4" Fabric E triangle along a short side to make (1) DE triangle. Sew together (1) 4 1/4" Fabric E triangle and (1) 4 1/4" Fabric D triangle along a short side to make (1) ED triangle. Sew the DE and ED triangles together along their long sides to make (1) Unit 3 square (Fig. 5). The unit should measure 3 1/2" square. Repeat to make (30) Unit 3 squares total.



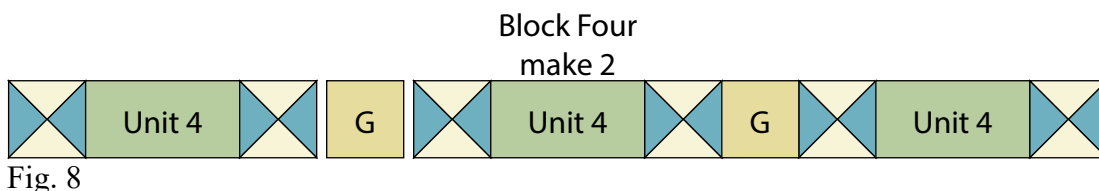
6. Sew (1) Unit 3 square to each end of (1) 3 1/2" x 6 1/2" Fabric F strip to make (1) Unit 4 strip (Fig. 6). Repeat to make (6) Unit 4 strips total.



7. Sew together (3) Unit 3 squares and (2) 3 1/2" Fabric F squares, alternating them from top to bottom, to make (1) Block Three strip (Fig. 7). Repeat to make (6) Block Three strips total.



8. Sew together (3) Unit 4 strips and (2) 3 1/2" Fabric G squares, alternating them from left to right, to make (1) Block Four strip (Fig. 8 below). Repeat to make a second Block Four strip.



9. Sew together (1) Block One rectangle, (1) Block Three strip, (1) Block Two rectangle, (1) Block Three strip and (1) Block One rectangle, in that order from left to right, to make Row One (Fig. 9). Repeat to make Row Three.

10. Sew together (1) Block Two rectangle, (1) Block Three strip, (1) Block One rectangle, (1) Block Three strip and (1) Block Two rectangle, in that order from left to right, to make Row Two (Fig. 9).

11. Sew together the (3) Pieced Rows, in numerical order, and (2) Block Four strips, lengthwise and alternating them from top to bottom, to make the Center Block (Fig. 9). The block should measure 42 1/2" x 51 1/2".

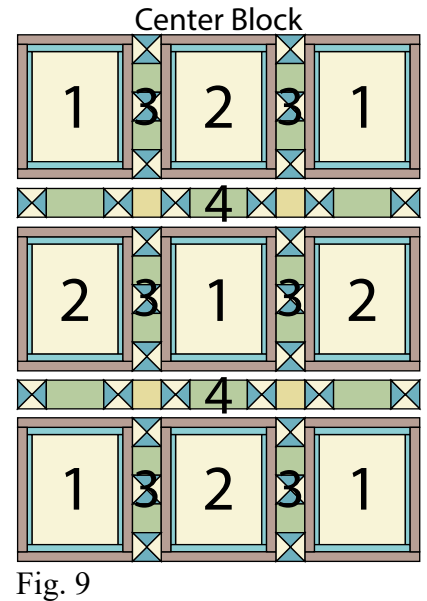

## Quilt 1

### Quilt Top Assembly

*(Follow the Quilt Layout while assembling the quilt top. The arrows in the Quilt Layout represent the fabric print direction.)*

12. Sew (1) 2" x 51 1/2" Fabric I strip to each side of the Center Block. Sew (1) 2" x 45 1/2" Fabric I strip to the top and to the bottom of the Center Block.

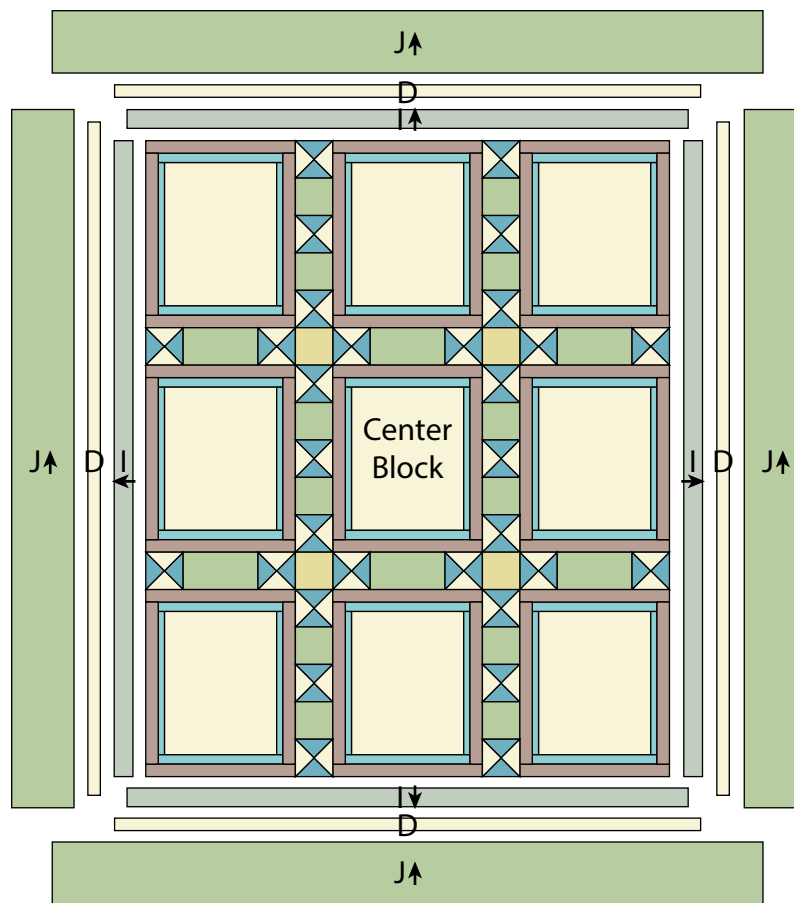
13. Sew (1) 1 1/2" x 54 1/2" Fabric D strip to each side of the Center Block. Sew (1) 1 1/2" x 47 1/2" Fabric D strip to the top and to the bottom of the Center Block.

14. Sew (1) 5 1/2" x 56 1/2" Fabric J strip to each side of the Center Block. Sew (1) 5 1/2" x 57 1/2" Fabric J strip to the top and to the bottom of the Center Block to make the quilt top.

15. Layer and quilt as desired.

16. Sew the (6) 2 1/2" x WOF Fabric B strips together, end to end with 45-degree seams, to make the binding. Fold this long strip in half lengthwise with wrong sides together and press.

17. Bind as desired.
