

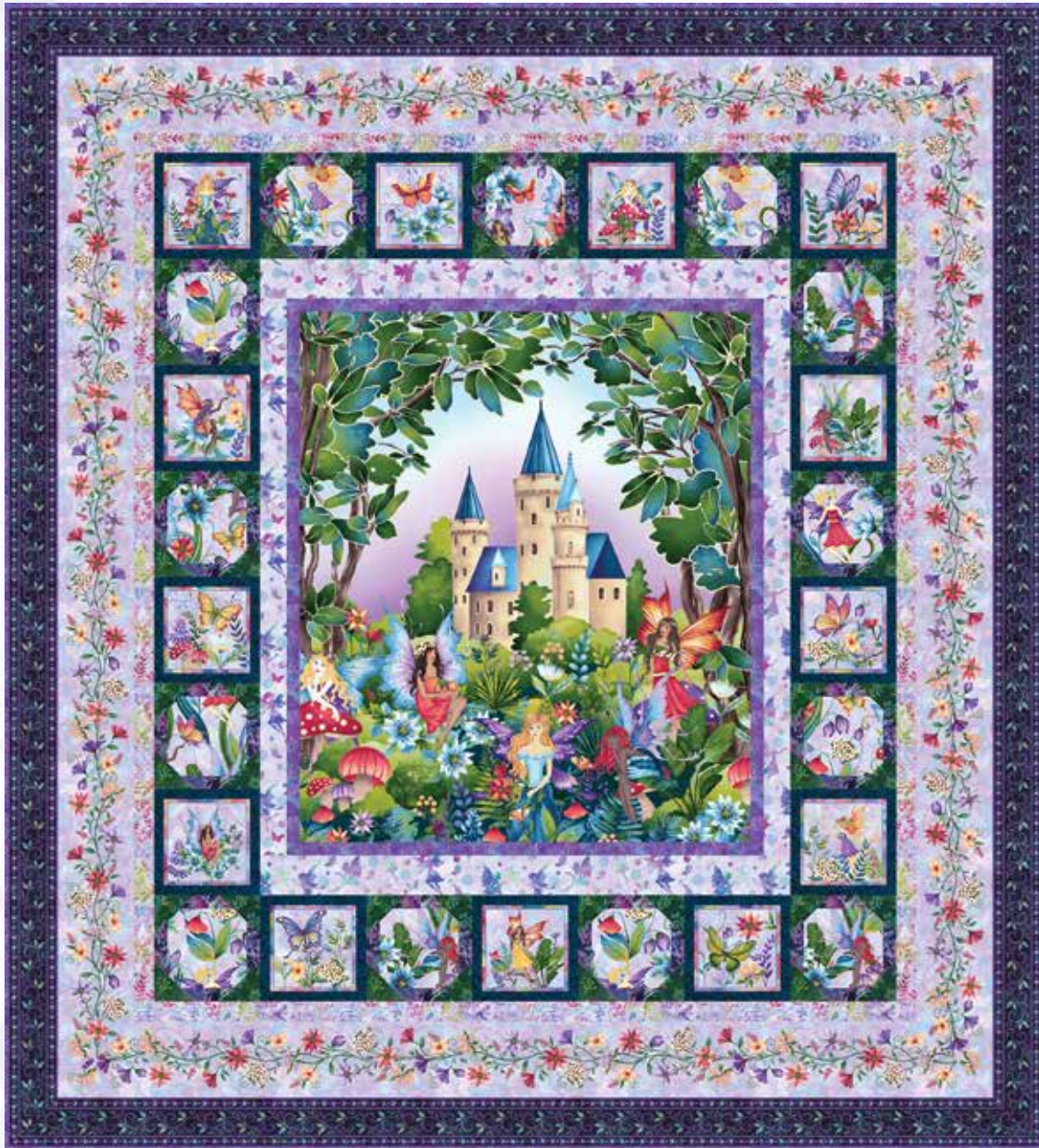

1 yard	Sprigs - Lilac (B)	3017-55*
1 ¼ yards	Fairy Silhouettes - Lilac (C)	3014-55
⅔ yard	Blocks - Royal (D)	3019-77
⅞ yard	Folio - Spruce (E)	7755-74
⅔ yard	Fairies Allover - Lilac (F)	3012-55
⅔ yard	Forest Fern - Royal (G)	3015-77
⅝ yard	Sprigs - Forest (H)	3017-66
½ yard	Rainbow Ferns - Lilac (I)	3018-55
2 ⅝ yards	Border Stripe - Lilac (J)	3020-55
7 ¼ yards	Flower Meadow - Forest (Backing)	3013-66

*Includes binding

Cutting Instructions

Please note: All strips are cut across the width of fabric (WOF) from selvage to selvage edge unless otherwise noted.

From the Panel - Forest (A):

- Fussy cut (1) 34 ½" x 40 ½" rectangle, centered on the panel.

From the Sprigs - Lilac (B), cut:

- (2) 2" x 40 ½" WOF strips.
- (2) 2" x 37 ½" WOF strips.
- (9) 2 ½" x WOF strips for the binding.

From the Fairy Silhouettes - Lilac (C), cut:

- (2) 2 ½" x 42 ½" Length of Fabric (LOF) strips.
- From the remaining fabric, cut (2) 3 ½" x 40 ½" WOF strips, piece as needed.

From the Blocks - Royal (D):

- Fussy cut (13) 7" squares, each centered on a block.

From the Folio - Spruce (E), cut:

- (5) 1 ¾" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (26) 1 ¾" x 7" strips.
- (7) 1 ¾" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (26) 1 ¾" x 9 ½" strips.

From the Fairies Allover - Lilac (F), cut:

- (3) 6 ½" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (13) 6 ½" squares.

From the Forest Fern - Royal (G), cut:

- (5) 1 ½" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (26) 1 ½" x 6 ½" squares.
- (7) 1 ½" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (26) 1 ½" x 8 ½" squares.

From the Sprigs - Forest (H), cut:

- (5) 3 ½" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (52) 3 ½" squares.

From the Rainbow Ferns - Lilac (I), cut:

- (4) 2" x WOF strips. Sew the strips together end to end with diagonal seams and cut (2) 2" x 64 ½" strips.
- (3) 2" x WOF strips. Sew the strips together end to end with diagonal seams and cut (2) 2" x 59 ½" strips.

From the Border Stripe - Lilac (J), cut:

- (2) 10" x 90" LOF strips.
- (2) 10" x 82" LOF strips.

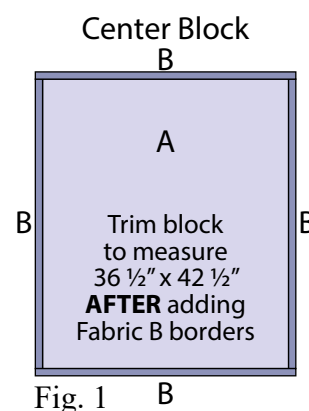
From the Flower Meadow - Forest (Backing), cut:

- (3) 86" x WOF strips for the backing. Sew the strips together and trim to make the 86" x 94" back.

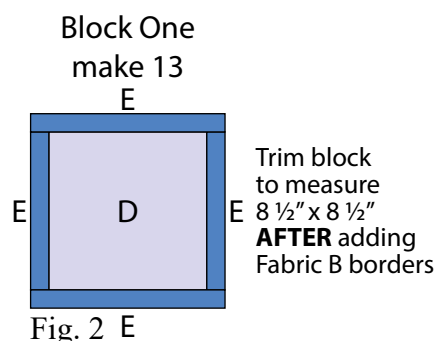
Block Assembly

Note: The arrows in figures represent the fabric print direction. Pay attention to the fabric and unit orientations when assembling the various components. Use a ¼" seam allowance with right sides together (RST) unless otherwise noted.

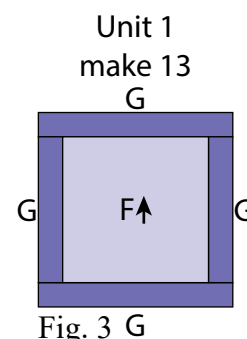
- Sew (1) 2" x 40 ½" Fabric B strip to each side of the 34 ½" x 40 ½" Fabric A rectangle. Sew (1) 2" x 37 ½" Fabric B strip to the top and to the bottom of the Fabric A rectangle to make the Center Block (Fig. 1). **Trim the block to measure 36 ½" x 42 ½"**.



- Sew (1) 1 ¾" x 7" Fabric E strip to each side of (1) 7" Fabric D square. Sew (1) 1 ¾" x 9 ½" Fabric E strip to the top and to the bottom of the Fabric D square to make (1) Block One square (Fig. 2). **Trim the block to measure 8 ½" x 8 ½"**. Repeat to make (13) Block One squares total.



- Sew (1) 1 ½" x 6 ½" Fabric G strip to each side of (1) 6 ½" Fabric F square. Sew (1) 1 ½" x 8 ½" Fabric G strip to the top and to the bottom of the Fabric F square to make (1) Unit 1 square (Fig. 3). Repeat to make (13) Unit 1 squares total.



4. Place (1) 3 ½" Fabric H square on the top left corner of (1) Unit 1 square, right sides together (Fig. 4). Sew across the diagonal of the smaller square from the upper right corner to the lower left corner (Fig. 4). Flip open the triangle formed and press. Trim away the excess fabric from behind the triangle ¼" away from the sewn seam (Fig. 5).

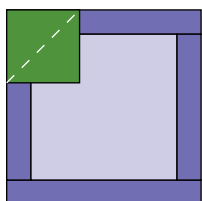

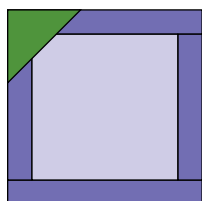

5. Follow Figure 6 for the seam direction to add a 3 ½" Fabric H square to each of the remaining corners of the Unit 1 square to make (1) Block Two square (Fig. 7).

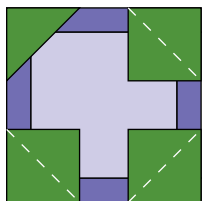

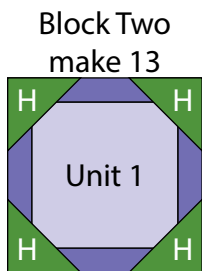

7. Sew together (3) Block Two squares and (3) Block One squares, alternating them from the top to the bottom, to make (1) Side Border (Fig. 8). Repeat to make a second Side Border.

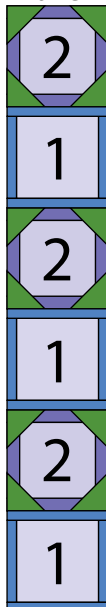

8. Sew (4) Block One squares and (3) Block Two squares together, alternating them from left to right, to make the Top Border (Fig. 9).

Top Border

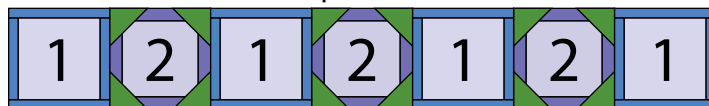

9. Sew together (4) Block Two squares and (3) Block One squares, alternating them from left to right, to make the Bottom Border (Fig. 10).

Bottom Border

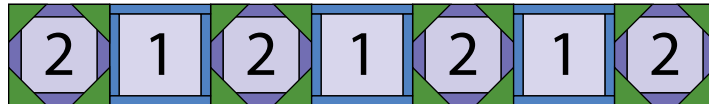

Quilt Top Assembly

(Follow the Quilt Layout while assembling the quilt top.)

10. Sew (1) 2 ½" x 42 ½" Fabric C strip to each side of the Center Block. Sew (1) 3 ½" x 40 ½" Fabric C strip to the top and to the bottom of the Center Block.

11. Sew (1) Side Border to each side of the Center Block.

12. Sew the Top Border and the Bottom Border to the top and to the bottom of the Center Block.

13. Sew (1) 2" x 64 ½" Fabric I strip to each side of the Center Block. Sew (1) 2" x 59 ½" Fabric I strip to the top and to the bottom of the Center Block.

14. Center (1) 10" x 90" Fabric J strip on (1) side of the Center Block and pin in place. Start sewing the strip a ¼" from the top edge of the block and stop a ¼" from the bottom edge. **DO NOT TRIM THE EXCESS.** Repeat with the opposite side.

15. Repeat Step 14 to sew (1) 10" x 82" Fabric J strip to the top and to the bottom of the Center Block, making sure to stop and start ¼" away from each end of the block. To miter each corner, fold the Center Block on a diagonal, wrong side together. This should line up the strips from adjacent sides (Fig. 11).

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16. Starting at the sewn seam (represented by the arrow in Figure 11), draw a 45-degree line to the edge of the fabric. Sew on the drawn line. Trim the excess fabric leaving a $\frac{1}{4}$ " seam. Repeat this step with the remaining corners to make the quilt top.

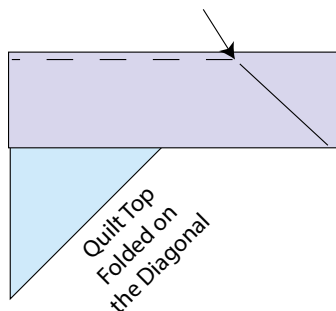
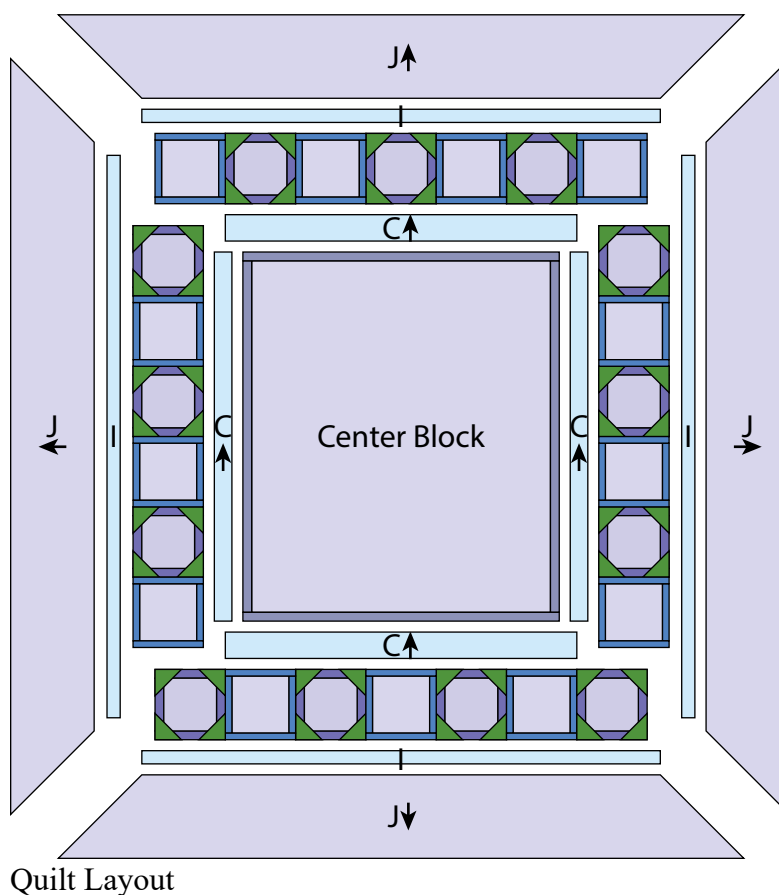

17. Layer and quilt as desired.

18. Sew the (9) $2\frac{1}{2}$ " x WOF Fabric B strips together, end to end with 45-degree seams, to make the binding. Fold this long strip in half lengthwise with wrong sides together and press.

19. Bind as desired.



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
