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



½ yard	Monotone Tie-Dye Quilt Back - Red (E)	2745W-88
⅓ yard	Monotone Tie-Dye Quilt Back - Black (F)	2745W-99*
2 yards	Monotone Tie-Dye Quilt Back - Gray (Backin	ng) 2745W-17

Cutting Instructions

Please note: All strips are cut across the width of fabric (WOF) from selvage to selvage edge unless otherwise noted.

From the Monotone Tie-Dye Quilt Back - White (A), cut:

• (5) 2 ½" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (192) 2 ½" squares.

From the Monotone Tie-Dye Quilt Back - Gray (B), cut:

- (1) 8 1/8" x WOF strip. Sub-cut (6) 8 1/8" strips. Cut the squares across (1) diagonal to make (12) 8 \(\frac{7}{8} \)" triangles. *Note: Only (11) 8 %" triangles will be used.*
- (1) 2 ½" x WOF strip. Sub-cut (24) 2 ½" squares.

From the Monotone Tie-Dye Quilt Back - Tan (C), cut:

- (1) 8 1/8" x WOF strip. Sub-cut (7) 8 1/8" strips. Cut the squares across (1) diagonal to make (14) 8 %" triangles. Note: Only (13) 8 %" triangles will be used.
- (1) 2 1/8" x WOF strip. Sub-cut (35) 2 1/8" squares. Cut the squares across (1) diagonal to make (70) 2 1/8" triangles.

From the Monotone Tie-Dye Quilt Back - Royal (D), cut:

- (1) 8 \%" x WOF strip. Sub-cut (6) 8 \%" strips and (13) 2 ½" squares. Cut the 8 ¾" squares across (1) diagonal to make (12) 8 %" triangles. *Note: Only (11) 8 %*" triangles will be used.
- (1) 2 7/8" x WOF strip. Sub-cut (26) 2 7/8" squares. Cut the squares across (1) diagonal to make (52) 2 1/8" triangles.

From the Monotone Tie-Dye Quilt Back - Red (E), cut:

- (1) 8 1/8" x WOF strip. Sub-cut (7) 8 1/8" strips. Cut the squares across (1) diagonal to make (14) $8\frac{1}{8}$ " triangles. Note: Only (13) 8 %" triangles will be used.
- (1) 2 ½" x WOF strip. Sub-cut (35) 2 ½" squares.

From the Monotone Tie-Dye Quilt Back - Black (F), cut:

- (2) 3 ½" x 64 ½" WOF strips. (2) 3 ½" x 54 ½" WOF strips.
- (1) 2 1/8" x WOF strip. Sub-cut (35) 2 1/8" squares. Cut the squares across (1) diagonal to make (70) 2 \(\frac{7}{8} \)" triangles.
- (1) 2 ½" x WOF strip. Sub-cut (24) 2 ½" squares.
- (3) 2 ½" x WOF strips for the binding.

From the Monotone Tie-Dye Quilt Back - Gray (Backing), cut:

• (1) 62" x 78" rectangle for the back.

Block Assembly


Note: Pay attention to the unit orientations when assembling the various components. Use a 1/4" seam allowance with right sides together (RST) unless otherwise noted.

1. Follow Figure 1 and sew together (2) 2 1/8" Fabric F triangles, (2) 2 1/8" Fabric C triangles, (4) 2 ½" Fabric A squares, (1) 2 ½" Fabric E square and (1) 2 ½" Fabric B square to make (1) Unit 1 triangle. Repeat to make (11) Unit 1 triangles total.




2. Repeat Step 1 and refer to Figures 2-4 for fabric identification, placement and orientation to make (13) Unit 2 triangles, (13) Unit 3 triangles and (11) Unit 4 triangles.




3. Sew (1) 8 %" Fabric B triangle to the long side of (1) Unit 1 triangle to make (1) Block One square (Fig. 5). The block should measure 8 ½" square. Repeat to make (11) Block One squares total.



4. Repeat Step 3 and refer to Figures 6-8 for component identification, placement and orientation to make (13) Block Two squares, (13) Block Three squares and (11) Block Four squares.





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
5. Follow Figure 9 and sew the (48) Block squares into a 6 x 8 matrix to make the Center Block. The block should measure $48 \frac{1}{2}$ " x $64 \frac{1}{2}$ ".



Quilt Top Assembly

(Follow the Quilt Layout while assembling the quilt top.)
6. Sew (1) 3 ½" x 64 ½" Fabric F strip to each side of the Center Block. Sew (1) 3 ½" x 54 ½" Fabric F strip to the top and to the bottom of the Center Block to make the quilt top.

- 7. Layer and quilt as desired.
- 8. Sew the (3) 2 ½" x WOF Fabric F strips together, end to end with 45-degree seams, to make the binding. Fold this long strip in half lengthwise with wrong sides together and press.
- 9. Bind as desired.
