Cutting Instructions

Please note: All strips are cut across the width of fabric (WOF) from selvage to selvage edge unless otherwise noted.

From the Tossed Truck - White Multi (A), cut:

• (1) 4 ½" x WOF strip. Sub-cut (6) 4 ½" squares.

From the Folio Basics - Red Hot (B), cut:

- (1) 2 1/8" x WOF strip. Sub-cut (12) 2 1/8" squares. Cut the squares from the upper left corner to the lower right corner to make (24) 2 1/8" left to right triangles.
- (1) 2 1/8" x WOF strip. Sub-cut (12) 2 1/8" squares. Cut the squares from the upper right corner to the lower left corner to make (24) 2 1/8" right to left triangles.
- (2) 2 ½" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (12) 2 ½" x 4 ½" strips.
- (2) 2 ½" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (24) 2 ½" squares.
- (1) 4 ½" x WOF strip. Sub-cut (12) 4 ½" x 2 ½" strips.
- (7) 2 ½" x WOF strips for the binding.

From the Small Tossed Leaves and Flowers - White Multi (C), cut:

- (1) 3 ½" x WOF strip. Sub-cut (12) 3 ½" squares. Cut the squares across both diagonals to make (48) 3 ½" triangles.
- (4) 2 1/8" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (48) 2 1/8" squares.
- (8) 2 ½" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (120) 2 ½" squares.
- (3) 2" x WOF strips. Sew the strips together end to end with diagonal seams and cut (2) 2" x 48 ½" strips.
- (2) 2" x 39 ½" WOF strips.

From the Tossed Flowers - Black Multi (D), cut:

- (1) 3 ½" x WOF strip. Sub-cut (12) 3 ½" squares. Cut the squares across both diagonals to make (48) 3 ½" triangles.
- (3) 2 ½" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (24) 2 ½" x 4 ½" strips.

From the Folio Basics - Red (E), cut:

- (2) 2 \%" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (24) 2 \%" squares.
- (2) 2 ½" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (24) 2 ½" squares.

From the Folio Basics - Butter (F), cut:

- (2) 2 ½" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (24) 2 ½" squares.
- (3) 1 ½" x WOF strips. Sew the strips together end to end with diagonal seams and cut (2) 1 ½" x 55 ½" strips.
- (3) 1 ½" x WOF strips. Sew the strips together end to end with diagonal seams and cut (2) 1 ½" x 45 ½" strips.

From the Small Flower Packed - Black Multi (G), cut:

• (2) 8 ½" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (6) 8 ½" squares.

From the Folio Basics - Black (H), cut:

• (2) 2 1/8" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (24) 2 1/8" squares.

From the Small Bicycle Tossed - Red (I), cut:

- (2) 2 ½" x 51 ½" Length of Fabric (LOF) strips.
- From the remaining fabric, cut (2) 2 ½" x 43 ½" WOF strips, piece as needed.

From the Packed Flowers - Red (J), cut:

- (2) 6 ½" x 57 ½" LOF strips.
- From the remaining fabric, cut (2) 6 ½" x 57 ½" WOF strips, piece as needed.


From the Tossed Large Bicycles - White Multi (Backing), cut:

• (2) 65" x WOF strips for the backing. Sew the strips together and trim to make the 65" x 77" back.

Block Assembly


Note: The arrows in figures represent the fabric print direction. Pay attention to the fabric and unit orientations when assembling the various components. Use a ¼" seam allowance with right sides together (RST) unless otherwise noted.

- 1. Place (1) 2 %" Fabric E square on top of (1) 2 %" Fabric C square, right sides together. Draw a line across the diagonal of the top square (Fig. 1). Sew $\frac{1}{4}$ " away from each side of the drawn diagonal line (Fig. 1). Cut the (2) squares apart on the drawn diagonal line (Fig. 2) to make (2) half-square triangles. Trim the half-square triangles to measure 2 $\frac{1}{2}$ " square to make (2) Unit 1 squares (Fig. 3). Repeat to make (48) Unit 1 squares total.
- 2. Repeat Step 1 and refer to Figure 4 for fabric identification and placement to make (48) Unit 2 squares.




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
3. Place (1) 2 ½" Fabric C square on the left side of (1) 2 ½" x 4 ½" Fabric D strip, right sides together (Fig. 5). Sew across the diagonal of the square from the upper right corner to the lower left corner (Fig. 5). Flip open the triangle formed and press. Trim away the excess fabric from behind the triangle, leaving a ½" seam allowance (Fig. 6).







- 4. Place another 2 ½" Fabric C square on the right side of the 2 ½" x 4 ½" Fabric D strip, right sides together (Fig. 7). Sew across the diagonal of the square from the upper left corner to the lower right corner (Fig. 7). Flip open the triangle formed and press. Trim away the excess fabric from behind the triangle, leaving a ¼" seam allowance to make (1) Unit 3 strip (Fig. 8).
- 5. Repeat Steps 3-4 to make (24) Unit 3 strips total.





6. Repeat Steps 3-4 and refer to Figures 9-10 for fabric identification, placement, seam direction and orientation to make (12) Unit 4 strips and (12) Unit 5 strips.






7. Sew (1) 3 ¼" Fabric D triangle and (1) 3 ¼" Fabric C triangle together along short sides. Sew (1) 2 ½" Fabric B triangle to the long side of the newly sewn triangle to make (1) 2 ½" Unit 6 square (Fig. 11). Repeat to make (24) Unit 6 squares total.



8. Repeat Step 7 and refer to Figure 12 for fabric identification, placement and orientation to make (24) Unit 7 squares.



9. Sew (1) Unit 6 square to the left side of (1) Unit 7 square along the Fabric C sides. Sew (1) Unit 3 strip to the top of the newly sewn strip to make (1) 4 ½" Unit 8 square (Fig. 13). Repeat to make (24) Unit 8 squares total.



10. Sew (1) 2 ½" Fabric F square to the left side of (1) Unit 1 square to make the top row. Sew (1) Unit 1 square to the left side of (1) 2 ½" Fabric C square to make the bottom row. Sew the (2) rows together lengthwise to make (1) 4 ½" Unit 9 square (Fig. 14). Repeat to make (24) Unit 9 squares total.






11. Sew (1) Unit 2 square to each end of (1) Unit 4 strip to make (1) Unit 10 strip (Fig. 15). Repeat to make (12) Unit 10 strips total.



12. Sew (1) Unit 2 square to each end of (1) Unit 5 strip to make (1) Unit 11 strip (Fig. 16). Repeat to make (12) Unit 11 strips total.



13. Place (1) 2 ½" Fabric B square on the top left corner of (1) 8 ½" Fabric G square, right sides together (Fig. 17). Sew across the diagonal of the smaller square from the upper right corner to the lower left corner (Fig. 17). Flip open the triangle formed and press. Trim away the excess fabric from behind the triangle ¼" away from the sewn seam (Fig. 18).






- 14. Follow Figure 19 for the seam direction to add a 2 ½" Fabric B square to each of the remaining corners of the 8 ½" Fabric G square to make (1) Unit 12 square (Fig. 20).
- 15. Repeat Steps 13-14 to make (6) Unit 12 squares total.








16. Sew (1) Unit 9 square to each side of (1) Unit 8 square to make the top row. Repeat to make the bottom row. Sew (1) Unit 8 square to each side of (1) 4 ½" Fabric A square to make the middle row. Sew together the (3) rows lengthwise to make (1) 12 ½" Block One square (Fig. 21). Repeat to make (6) Block One squares total.




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17. Sew (1) 2 ½" Fabric E square to each end of (1) Unit 10 square to make the top row. Repeat to make the bottom row. Sew (1) Unit 11 strip to each side of (1) Unit 12 square lengthwise to make the middle row. Sew together the (3) rows lengthwise to make (1) 12 ½" Block Two square (Fig. 22). Repeat to make (6) Block Two squares total.



- 18. Sew (1) Block One square to each side of (1) Block Two square to make Row One (Fig. 23). Repeat to make Row Three.
- 19. Sew (1) Block Two square to each side of (1) Block One square to make Row Two (Fig. 23). Repeat to make Row Four.
- 20. Sew together the (4) rows from Steps 18-19, lengthwise and in numerical order from top to bottom, to the $36 \frac{1}{2}$ " x $48 \frac{1}{2}$ " Center Block (Fig. 23).




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Quilt Top Assembly

(Follow the Quilt Layout while assembling the quilt top.) 21. Sew (1) 2" x 48 ½" Fabric C strip to each side of the Center Block. Sew (1) 2" x 39 ½" Fabric C strip to the top and to the bottom of the Center Block.

- 22. Sew (1) 2 ½" x 51 ½" Fabric I strip to each side of the Center Block. Sew (1) 2 ½" x 43 ½" Fabric I strip to the top and to the bottom of the Center Block.
- 23. Sew (1) 1 ½" x 55 ½" Fabric F strip to each side of the Center Block. Sew (1) 1 ½" x 45 ½" Fabric I strip to the top and to the bottom of the Center Block.

- 24. Sew (1) 57 ½" x 6 ½" Fabric J strip to each side of the Center Block. Sew (1) 6 ½" x 57 ½" Fabric J strip to the top and to the bottom of the Center Block to make the quilt top.
- 25. Layer and quilt as desired.
- 26. Sew the (7) 2 ½" x WOF Fabric B strips together, end to end with 45-degree seams, to make the binding. Fold this long strip in half lengthwise with wrong sides together and press.
- 27. Bind as desired.
