



1 ¼ yards	Modern Melody Basics - Camel (C)	1063-31
⅓ yard	TV Remote Controls - Black (D)	700-99
5⁄8 yard	Bottle Cap Opener - White (E)	701-01
⅓ yard	Pretzels and Peanuts - Black (F)	702-99
⅓ yard	Tossed Beer and Snacks - White (G)	704-01
⅓ yard	Darts Allover - Black (H)	705-99
⅓ yard	Tossed Domino Set - Black (I)	708-99
⅓ yard	Chess Set - White (J)	707-01
½ yard	Twinkle Basics - Black (K)	135-99

Cutting Instructions

Please note: All strips are cut across the width of fabric (WOF) from selvage to selvage edge unless otherwise noted.

From the Bullseye and Darts - Black (A):

• (2) 4" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (20) 4" squares.

From the Modern Melody Basics - Brown (B), cut:

• (18) 2 1/4" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (320) 2 1/4" squares.

From the Modern Melody Basics - Camel (C), cut:

• (18) 2 1/4" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (320) 2 1/4" squares.

From the TV Remote Controls - Black (D), cut:

• (2) 4" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (20) 4" squares.

From the Bottle Cap Opener - White (E), cut:

• (4) 4" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (40) 4" squares.

From the Pretzels and Peanuts - Black (F), cut:

• (2) 4" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (20) 4" squares.

From the Tossed Beer and Snacks - White (G), cut:

• (2) 4" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (20) 4" squares.

From the Darts Allover - Black (H), cut:

• (2) 4" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (20) 4" squares.

From the Tossed Domino Set - Black (I), cut:

• (2) 4" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (20) 4" squares.

From the Chess Set - White (J), cut:

• (2) 4" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (20) 4" squares.

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From the Twinkle Basics - Black (K), cut:

- (3) 2" x WOF strips. Sew the strips together end to end with diagonal seams and cut (2) 2" x 53" strips.
- (3) 2" x WOF strips. Sew the strips together end to end with diagonal seams and cut (2) 2" x 45 ½" strips.

From the Patchwork - Tan (L), cut:

- (2) 5 ½" x 56" Length of Fabric (LOF) strips.
- From the remaining fabric, cut (2) 5 ½" x 55 ½" WOF strips, piece as needed.

From the Modern Melody Basics - Black (M), cut:

• (7) 2 ½" x WOF strips for the binding.

From the Bullseye and Throw Dart - Black (Backing), cut:

• (2) 74" x WOF strips for the backing. Sew the strips together and trim to make the 63" x 74" back.

Block Assembly

Note: The arrows in figures represent the fabric print direction. Pay attention to the fabric and unit orientations when assembling the various components. Use a ¼" seam allowance with right sides together (RST) unless otherwise noted.


1. Place (1) 2 ¼" Fabric C square on the top left corner of (1) 4" Fabric E square, right sides together (Fig. 1). Sew across the diagonal of the smaller square from the upper right corner to the lower left corner (Fig. 1). Flip open the triangle formed and press. Trim away the excess fabric from behind the triangle ¼" away from the sewn seam (Fig. 2).



- 2. Follow Figure 3 for the seam direction to add a 2 ¼" Fabric C square to each of the remaining corners of the 4" Fabric E square to make (1) Unit 1 square (Fig. 4).
- 3. Repeat Steps 1-2 to make (20) Unit 1 squares total.

4. Repeat Steps 1-2 and refer to Figures 5-17 for fabric identification, placement and seam direction to make the indicated number of unit squares for Unit 2 through Unit 14.




- 5. Sew together (1) Unit 7 square, (1) Unit 1 square and (1) Unit 8 square, in that order from left to right, to make the top row (Fig. 18).
- 6. Sew (1) Unit 2 square to each side of (1) Unit 3 square to make the middle row (Fig. 18).

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- 7. Sew together (1) Unit 9 square, (1) Unit 1 square and (1) Unit 10 square, in that order from left to right, to make the bottom row (Fig. 18).
- 8. Sew together the (3) rows from Steps 5-7 lengthwise to make (1) 11" Block One square (Fig. 18).
- 9. Repeat Steps 5-8 to make (10) Block One squares total.



10. Repeat Steps 5-8 and refer to Figure 19 for component identification, placement and orientation to make (10) Block Two squares.




- 11. Sew together (2) Block One squares and (2) Block Two squares, alternating them from left to right, to make Row One (Fig. 20). Repeat to make Row Three and Row Five.
- 12. Sew together (2) Block Two squares and (2) Block One squares, alternating them from left to right, to make Row Two (Fig. 20). Repeat to make Row Four and Row Six.
- 13. Sew together the (5) Rows from Steps 11-12, lengthwise and in numerical order from the top to the bottom, to the 42 ½" x 53" Center Block (Fig. 20).


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Quilt Top Assembly

(Follow the Quilt Layout while assembling the quilt top.) 14. Sew (1) 2" x 53" Fabric K strip to each side of the Center Block. Sew (1) 2" x 45 ½" Fabric K strip to the top and to the bottom of the Center Block.

- 15. Sew (1) 5 ½" x 56" Fabric L strip to each side of the Center Block. Sew (1) 5 ½" x 55 ½" Fabric L strip to the top and to the bottom of the Center Block to make the quilt top.
- 16. Layer and quilt as desired.
- 17. Sew the (7) 2 ½" x WOF Fabric M strips together, end to end with 45-degree seams, to make the binding. Fold this long strip in half lengthwise with wrong sides together and press.
- 18. Bind as desired.
