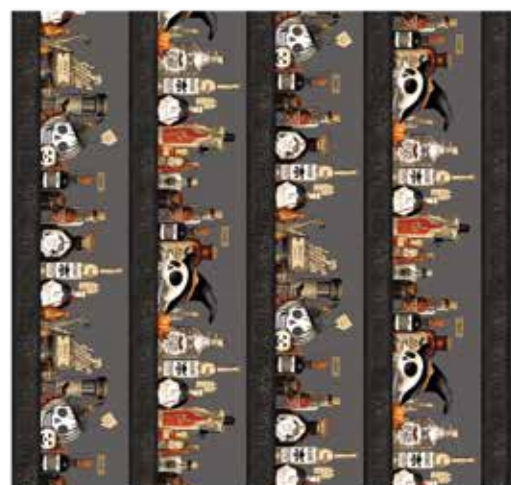

1 ½ yards	Folio - Orange (B)	7755-36*
1 ¾ yards	Witch Symbols Stripe - Black (C)	2802-99
1 ¾ yards	Potion Shelves - Black (D)	2806-99
1 yard	Pumpkin Foulard - Cream (E)	2800-33
⅞ yard	Village Toss - Black (F)	2799-99
¼ yard	Jack O Lantern - Black (G)	2803-99
½ yard	Folio - Black (H)	7755-99
⅔ yard	Jack O Lantern - Pumpkin (I)	2803-35
⅔ yard	Haunted Words - Cream (J)	2801-33
5 yards	Pumpkin Foulard - Pumpkin (Backing)	2800-35

Cutting Instructions

Please note: All strips are cut across the width of fabric (WOF) from selvage to selvage edge unless otherwise noted.

From the Village Border Stripe - Black (A):

- Fussy cut (1) 10 ½" x 60 ½" LOF strip, centered on a stripe.

From the Folio - Orange (B), cut:

- (12) 1 ⅝" x WOF strips. Sew the strips together end to end with diagonal seams and cut (8) 1 ⅝" x 60 ½" strips.
- (3) 1 ½" x WOF strips. Sew the strips together end to end with diagonal seams and cut (2) 1 ½" x 60 ½" strips.
- (7) 2 ½" x WOF strips for the binding.

From the Witch Symbols Stripe - Black (C), fussy cut:

- (2) 3 ¼" x 60 ½" LOF strips, each centered on a black stripe.
- (2) 3 ¼" x 60 ½" LOF strips, each centered on an orange stripe.

From the Potion Shelves - Black (D):

- Fussy cut (2) 7 ½" x 60 ½" LOF strips, each centered on a stripe.

From the Pumpkin Foulard - Cream (E), cut:

- (3) 4 ½" x WOF strips. Sew the strips together end to end with diagonal seams and cut (2) 4 ½" x 60 ½" strips.
- (6) 2 ½" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (48) 2 ½" x 4 ½" strips.

From the Village Toss - Black (F), cut:

- (2) 12 ½" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (4) 12 ½" squares.

From the Jack O Lantern - Black (G), cut:

- (1) 4 ½" x WOF strip. Sub-cut (6) 4 ½" squares.

From the Folio - Black (H), cut:

- (6) 2 ½" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (96) 2 ½" squares.

From the Jack O Lantern - Pumpkin (I), cut:

- (2) 4 ⅞" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (12) 4 ⅞" squares.

From the Haunted Words - Cream (J), cut:

- (2) 4 ⅞" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (12) 4 ⅞" squares.

From the Pumpkin Foulard - Pumpkin (Backing), cut:

- (2) 86" x WOF strips for the backing. Sew the strips together and trim to make the 68" x 86" back.

Block Assembly

Note: The arrows in figures represent the fabric print direction. Pay attention to the fabric and unit orientations when assembling the various components. Use a ¼" seam allowance with right sides together (RST) unless otherwise noted.

- Sew (1) 1 ⅝" x 60 ½" Fabric B strip to the top and to the bottom of (1) 3 ¼" x 60 ½" black Fabric C strip lengthwise to make (1) Block One strip (Fig. 1). Repeat to make a second Block One strip.

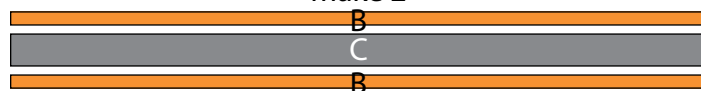

- Sew (1) 1 ⅝" x 60 ½" Fabric B strip to the top and to the bottom of (1) 3 ¼" x 60 ½" orange Fabric C strip lengthwise to make (1) Block Two strip (Fig. 2). Repeat to make a second Block Two strip.

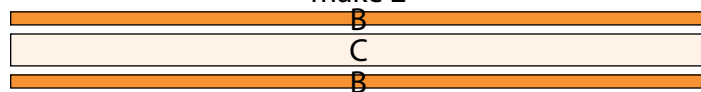

- Place (1) 4 ⅞" Fabric I square on top of (1) 4 ⅞" Fabric J square, right sides together. Draw a line across the diagonal of the top square from the upper right corner to the lower left corner (Fig. 3). Sew ¼" away from each side of the drawn diagonal line (Fig. 3). Cut the (2) squares apart on the drawn diagonal line (Fig. 4) to make (2) half-square triangles. Trim the half-square triangles to measure 4 ½" square to make (1) Unit 1A square and (1) Unit 1B square (Fig. 5). Repeat to make (6) sets total.

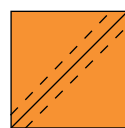

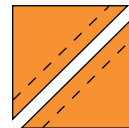

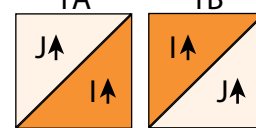

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4. Place (1) $4\frac{7}{8}$ " Fabric I square on top of (1) $4\frac{7}{8}$ " Fabric J square, right sides together. Draw a line across the diagonal of the top square from the upper left corner to the lower right corner (Fig. 6). Sew $\frac{1}{4}$ " away from each side of the drawn diagonal line (Fig. 6). Cut the (2) squares apart on the drawn diagonal line (Fig. 7) to make (2) half-square triangles. Trim the half-square triangles to measure $4\frac{1}{2}$ " square to make (1) Unit 2A square and (1) Unit 2B square (Fig. 8). Repeat to make (6) sets total.

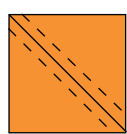

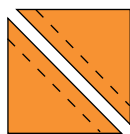

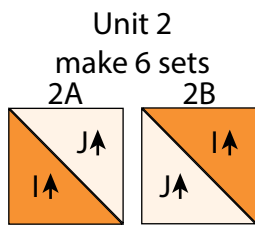

5. Place (1) $2\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric H square on the left side of (1) $2\frac{1}{2}$ " x $4\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric E strip, right sides together (Fig. 9). Sew across the diagonal of the square from the upper right corner to the lower left corner (Fig. 9). Flip open the triangle formed and press (Fig. 10). Trim away the excess fabric from behind the triangle, leaving a $\frac{1}{4}$ " seam allowance.

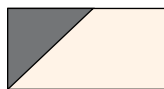

6. Place another $2\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric H square on the right side of the $2\frac{1}{2}$ " x $4\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric E strip, right sides together (Fig. 11). Sew across the diagonal of the square from the upper left corner to the lower right corner (Fig. 11). Flip open the triangle formed and press. Trim away the excess fabric from behind the triangle, leaving a $\frac{1}{4}$ " seam allowance to make (1) Unit 3 strip (Fig. 12).

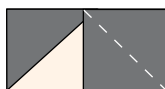

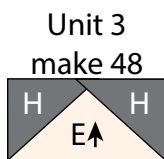

7. Repeat Steps 5-6 to make (48) Unit 3 strips total.

8. Sew together (2) Unit 3 strips lengthwise to make (1) $4\frac{1}{2}$ " Unit 4 square (Fig. 13). Repeat to make (24) Unit 4 squares total.

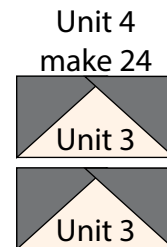

9. Sew together (1) Unit 1A square, (1) Unit 4 square and (1) Unit 2A square, in that order from left to right, to make the top row (Fig. 14).

10. Sew (1) Unit 4 square to each side of (1) $4\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric G square to make the middle row (Fig. 14).

11. Sew together (1) Unit 2B square, (1) Unit 4 square and (1) Unit 1B square, in that order left to right, to make the bottom row (Fig. 14).

12. Sew together the (3) rows from Steps 9-11 lengthwise to make (1) $12\frac{1}{2}$ " Unit 5 square (Fig. 14). Repeat to make (6) Unit 5 squares total.

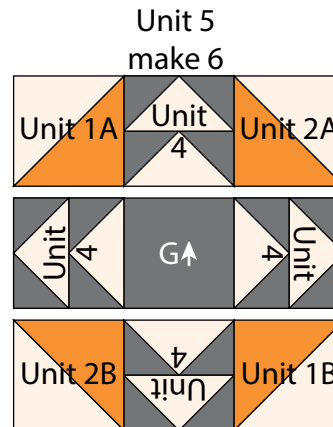

13. Sew together (3) Unit 5 squares and (2) $12\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric F squares, alternating them from left to right, to make (1) Block Three strip (Fig. 15). Repeat to make a second Block Three strip.

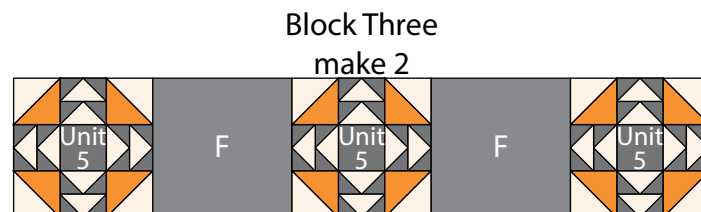

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Quilt Top Assembly

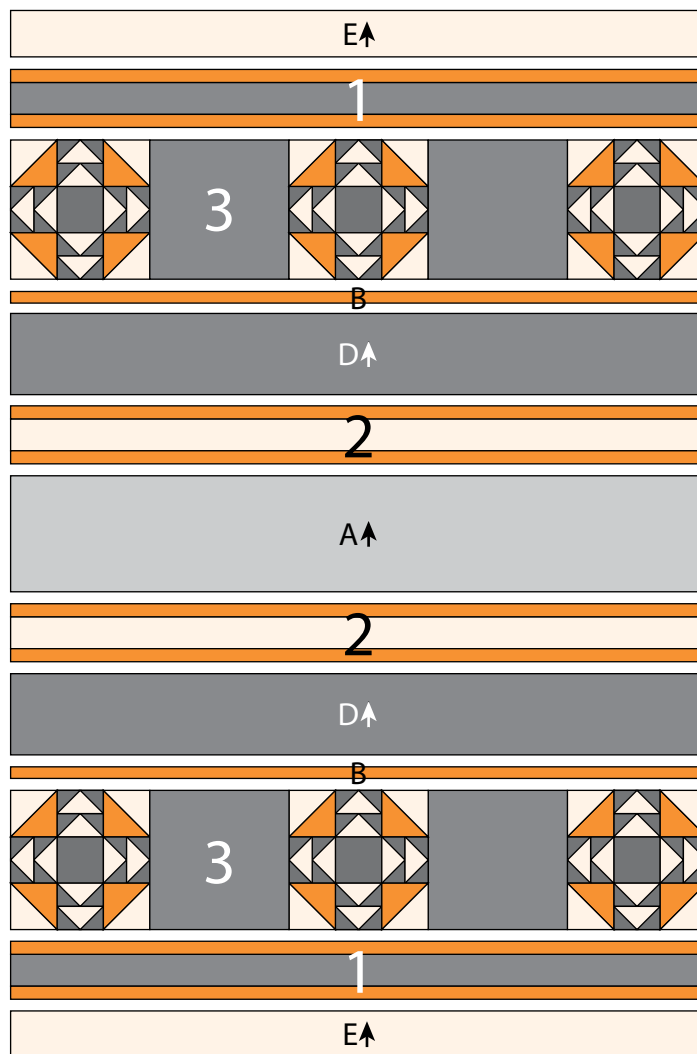
(Follow the Quilt Layout while assembling the quilt top.)

14. Sew together (1) 4 ½" x 60 ½" Fabric E strip, (1) Block One strip, (1) Block Three strip, (1) 1 ½" x 60 ½" Fabric B strip, (1) 7 ½" x 60 ½" Fabric D strip, (1) Block Two strip, (1) 10 ½" x 60 ½" Fabric A strip, (1) Block Two strip, (1) 7 ½" x 60 ½" Fabric D strip, (1) 1 ½" x 60 ½" Fabric B strip, (1) Block Three strip, (1) Block One strip and (1) 4 ½" x 60 ½" Fabric E strip, lengthwise and in that order from top to bottom, to make the quilt top.

15. Layer and quilt as desired.

16. Sew the (7) 2 ½" x WOF Fabric B strips together, end to end with 45-degree seams, to make the binding. Fold this long strip in half lengthwise with wrong sides together and press.

17. Bind as desired.
