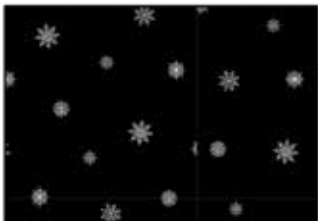

3/8 yard	Small Snowflake - Black (B)	295-99
1/2 yard	Monotone Swirl - Red (C)	290-88
1/4 yard	She Sheds with Trucks Allover - Multi (D)	289-86
1/2 yard	Monotone Swirl - Green (E)	290-66
3/8 yard	Large Snowflake - White/Red (F)	294-8
3/8 yard	Bias Plaid - Red (G)	293-88
1/3 yard	Small Motif Allover - Multi (H)	297-86
1 yard	Monotone Swirl - Light Gray (I)	290-90
3/8 yard	Folio Basic - Forest (J)	7755-68
1/4 yard	Small Snowflake - Red (K)	295-88
2/3 yard	Vertical Stripe - Multi (L)	291-86*
4 yards	She Sheds Allover - Black (Backing)	296-99

Cutting Instructions

Please note: All strips are cut across the width of fabric (WOF) from selvage to selvage edge unless otherwise noted.

From the Six 10 Inch Block Repeat - Multi (A):

- Fussy cut (6) 10 1/2" squares, each centered on a block.

From the Small Snowflake - Black (B), cut:

- (3) 1 1/2" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (12) 1 1/2" x 10 1/2" strips.
- (4) 1 1/2" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (12) 1 1/2" x 12 1/2" strips.

From the Monotone Swirl - Red (C), cut:

- (1) 4 1/2" x WOF strip. Sub-cut (8) 4 1/2" squares.
- (4) 1" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (12) 1" x 11 1/2" strips.
- (4) 1" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (12) 1" x 12 1/2" strips.

From the She Sheds with Trucks Allover - Multi (D), cut:

- (1) 4 1/2" x WOF strip. Sub-cut (6) 4 1/2" squares.

From the Monotone Swirl - Green (E), cut:

- (2) 4 1/2" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (10) 4 1/2" squares.
- (2) 1 1/2" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (12) 1 1/2" x 4 1/2" strips.
- (2) 1 1/2" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (12) 1 1/2" x 6 1/2" strips.

From the Large Snowflake - White/Red (F), cut:

- (3) 3 1/2" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (24) 3 1/2" x 4 1/2" strips.

From the Bias Plaid - Red (G), cut:

- (1) 4 1/2" x WOF strip. Sub-cut (8) 4 1/2" squares.
- (4) 1 1/2" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (48) 1 1/2" x 3 1/2" strips.

From the Small Motif Allover - Multi (H), cut:

- (2) 3 1/2" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (24) 3 1/2" squares.

From the Monotone Swirl - Light Gray (I), cut:

- (1) 2 1/2" x WOF strip. Sub-cut (16) 2 1/2" squares.
- (3) 2 1/2" x WOF strips. Sew the strips together end to end with diagonal seams and cut (2) 2 1/2" x 48 1/2" strips.
- (4) 2 1/2" x 40 1/2" WOF strips.
- (3) 2 1/2" x WOF strips. Sew the strips together end to end with diagonal seams and cut (2) 2 1/2" x 52 1/2" strips.

From the Folio Basic - Forest (J), cut:

- (2) 4 1/2" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (12) 4 1/2" squares.

From the Small Snowflake - Red (K), cut:

- (1) 4 1/2" x WOF strip. Sub-cut (8) 4 1/2" squares.

From the Vertical Stripe - Multi (L), cut:

- (1) 6 1/2" x WOF strip. Sub-cut (4) 6 1/2" squares.
- (6) 2 1/2" x WOF strips for the binding.

From the She Sheds Allover - Black (Backing), cut:

- (2) 72" x WOF strips for the backing. Sew the strips together and trim to make the 60" x 72" back.

Block Assembly

Note: The arrows in figures represent the fabric print direction. Pay attention to the fabric and unit orientations when assembling the various components. Use a 1/4" seam allowance with right sides together (RST) unless otherwise noted.

1. Sew (1) 1 1/2" x 10 1/2" Fabric B strip to each side of the (1) 10 1/2" Fabric A square. Sew (1) 1 1/2" x 12 1/2" Fabric B strip to the top and to the bottom of the Fabric A square to make (1) Unit 1 square (Fig. 1). **Trim the block to measure 11 1/2" x 11 1/2"**. Repeat to make (6) Unit 1 squares total.

2. Sew (1) 1" x 11 1/2" Fabric C strip to each side of (1) Unit 1 square. Sew (1) 1" x 12 1/2" Fabric C strip to the top and to the bottom of the Unit 1 square to make (1) 12 1/2" Block One square (Fig. 2). Repeat to make (6) Block One squares total.

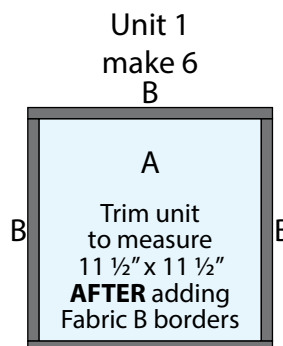

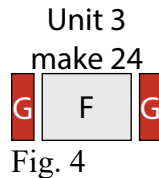
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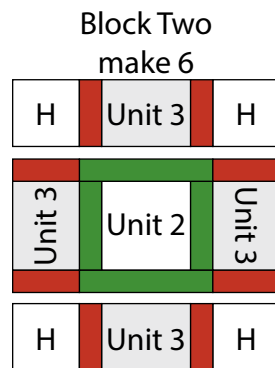
3. Sew (1) $1\frac{1}{2}$ " x $4\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric E strip to each side of (1) $4\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric D square. Sew (1) $1\frac{1}{2}$ " x $6\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric E strip to the top and to the bottom of the Fabric D square to make (1) $6\frac{1}{2}$ " Unit 2 square (Fig. 3). Repeat to make (6) Unit 2 squares total.



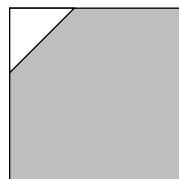
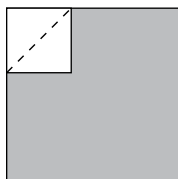
4. Sew (1) $1\frac{1}{2}$ " x $3\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric G strip to each side of (1) $3\frac{1}{2}$ " x $4\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric F strip to make (1) $6\frac{1}{2}$ " x $3\frac{1}{2}$ " Unit 3 strip (Fig. 4). Repeat to make (24) Unit 3 strips total.



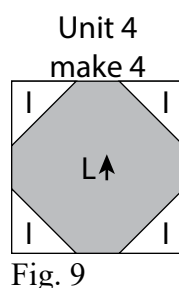
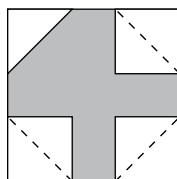
5. Sew (1) $3\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric H square to each end of (1) Unit 3 strip to make the top row. Repeat to make the bottom row. Sew (1) Unit 3 strip to each side of (1) Unit 2 square to make the middle row. Sew together the (3) Rows lengthwise to make (1) $12\frac{1}{2}$ " Block Two square (Fig. 5). Repeat to make (6) Block Two squares total.



6. Place (1) $2\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric I square on the top left corner of (1) $6\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric L square, right sides together (Fig. 6). Sew across the diagonal of the smaller square from the upper right corner to the lower left corner (Fig. 6). Flip open the triangle formed and press. Trim away the excess fabric from behind the triangle $\frac{1}{4}$ " away from the sewn seam (Fig. 7).

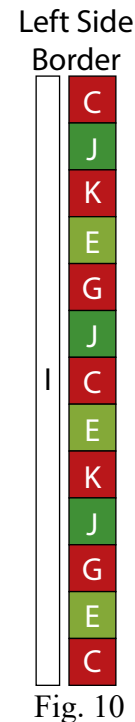


7. Follow Figure 8 for the seam direction to add a $2\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric I square to each of the remaining corners of the $6\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric L square to make (1) Unit 4 square (Fig. 9).

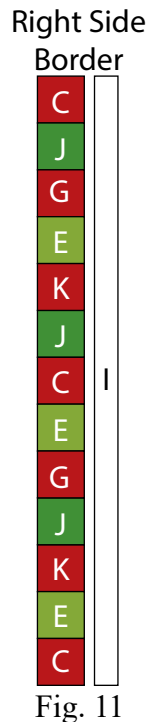


8. Repeat Steps 6-7 to make (4) Unit 4 squares total.

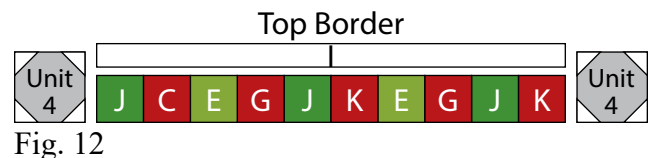
9. Follow Figure 10 and sew together (13) assorted $4\frac{1}{2}$ " squares. Sew (1) $2\frac{1}{2}$ " x $52\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric I strip to the left side of the newly sewn strip lengthwise to make the Left Side Border.



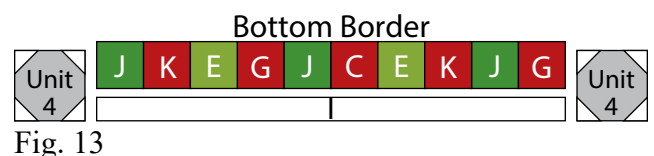
10. Follow Figure 11 and sew together (13) assorted $4\frac{1}{2}$ " squares. Sew (1) $2\frac{1}{2}$ " x $52\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric I strip to the right side of the newly sewn strip lengthwise to make the Right Side Border.



11. Follow Figure 12 and sew together (10) assorted $4\frac{1}{2}$ " squares. Sew (1) $2\frac{1}{2}$ " x $40\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric I strip to the top of the newly sewn strip lengthwise. Sew (1) Unit 4 square to each end of the newly sewn strip to make the Top Border.



12. Follow Figure 13 and sew together (10) assorted $4\frac{1}{2}$ " squares. Sew (1) $2\frac{1}{2}$ " x $40\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric I strip to the bottom of the newly sewn strip lengthwise. Sew (1) Unit 4 square to each end of the newly sewn strip to make the Bottom Border.



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13. Sew (1) Block One square to each side of (1) Block Two square to make Row One. Repeat to make Row Three.

14. Sew (1) Block Two square to each side of (1) Block One square to make Row Two. Repeat to make Row Four.

15. Sew together the (4) Rows from Steps 13-14, lengthwise and in numerical order from top to bottom, to make the 36 ½" x 48 ½" Center Block (Fig. 14).

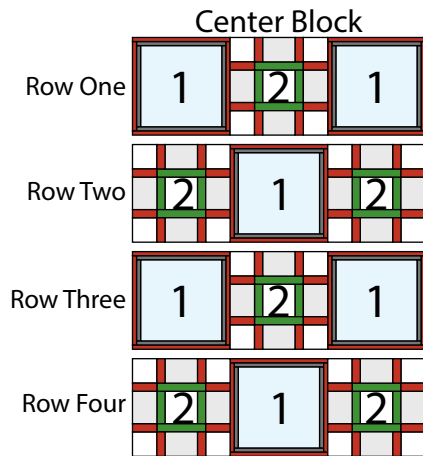

Quilt Top Assembly

(Follow the Quilt Layout while assembling the quilt top.)

16. Sew (1) 2 ½" x 48 ½" Fabric I strip to each side of the Center Block. Sew (1) 2 ½" x 40 ½" Fabric I strip to the top and to the bottom of the Center Block.

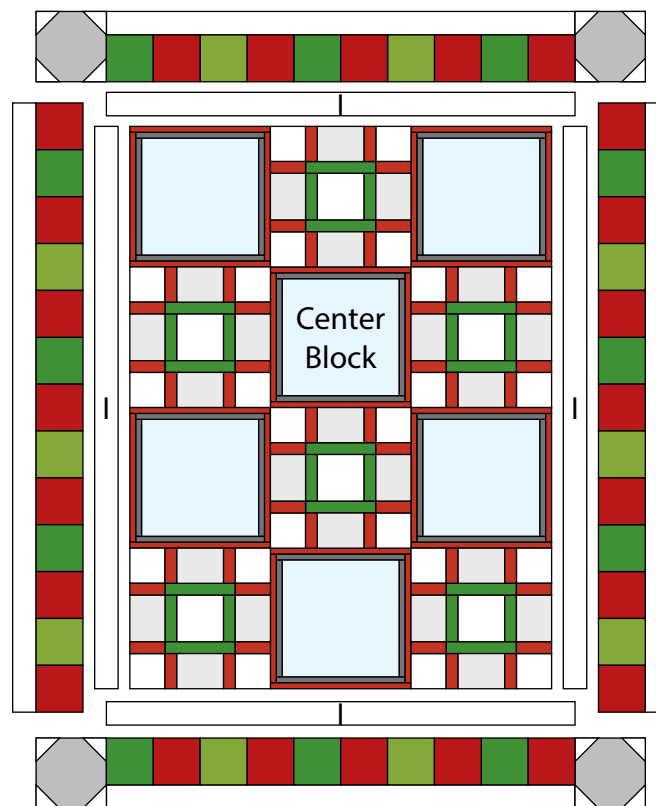
17. Sew the Left Side Border and Right Side Border to the left and right sides of the Center Block.

18. Sew the Top Border and Bottom Border to the top and to the bottom of the Center Block to make the quilt top.

19. Layer and quilt as desired.

20. Sew the (6) 2 ½" x WOF Fabric L strips together, end to end with 45-degree seams, to make the binding. Fold this long strip in half lengthwise with wrong sides together and press.

21. Bind as desired.
