



¹ / ₃ yard	Winter Village - Red/Gray (C)	9624-89
¹ ⁄ ₄ yard	Snowflakes on Texture - Red (D)	9632-88
1 yard	Plaid - Gray (E)	9625-90*
² / ₃ yard	Red Flakes on White Ground - White (F)	9627-8
5/8 yard	Swirling Snow - Red (G)	9621-88
¹ ⁄ ₄ yard	Red Deer on White Ground - White (H)9630-8
2 yards	Village Novelty Stripe - Red/ Gray (I)	9633-89
4 ¹ / ₈ yards	Ornaments - Red (Backing)	9628-88

Cutting Instructions

Please note: All strips are cut across the width of fabric (WOF) from selvage to selvage edge unless otherwise noted.

From the 10" Blocks - Red/Gray (A):

• Fussy cut (6) 10" squares, each centered on a block.

From the Small Snowflakes - Red (B), cut:

(3) 2 ¹/₂" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (12) 2 ¹/₂" x 10" strips.
(4) 2 ¹/₂" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (12) 2 ¹/₂" x 14" strips.

From the Winter Village - Red/Gray (C), cut:

• (1) 6 ¹/₂" x WOF strip. Sub-cut (6) 6 ¹/₂" squares.

From the Snowflakes on Texture - Red (D), cut:

• (2) 3 ¹/₂" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (24) 3 ¹/₂" squares.

From the Plaid - Gray (E), cut:

(3) 4 ¹/₄" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (24) 4 ¹/₄" squares. Cut the squares across both diagonals to make (96) 4 ¹/₄" triangles.
(6) 2 ¹/₂" x WOF strips for the binding.

From the Red Flakes on White Ground - White (F), cut:

- (2) 4 ¹/₄" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (12) 4 ¹/₄" squares. Cut the squares across both diagonals to make (48) 4 ¹/₄" triangles.
- (3) 2" x WOF strips. Sew the strips together end to end with diagonal seams and cut (2) 2" x 48 ½" strips.
- (2) 2" x 39 ½" WOF strips.

From the Swirling Snow - Red (G), cut:

- (2) 4 ¹/₄" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (12) 4 ¹/₄" squares. Cut the squares across both diagonals to make (48) 4 ¹/₄" triangles.
- (3) 1 ¹/₂" x WOF strips. Sew the strips together end to end with diagonal seams and cut (2) 1 ¹/₂" x 51 ¹/₂" strips.
 (2) 1 ¹/₂" x 41 ¹/₂" strips.

From the Red Deer on White Ground - White (H), cut:

• (2) 3 ¹/₂" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (24) 3 ¹/₂" squares.

From the Village Novelty Stripe - Red/ Gray (I), cut:

- (2) 6 ¹/₂" x 69" Length of Fabric (LOF) strips.
- (2) 6 ¹/₂" x 57" LOF strips.


From the Ornaments - Red (Backing), cut:

• (2) 73" x WOF strips for the backing. Sew the strips together and trim to make the 61" x 73" back.


Block Assembly

Note: The arrows in figures represent the fabric print direction. Pay attention to the fabric and unit orientations when assembling the various components.

1. Sew (1) 2 $\frac{1}{2}$ " x 10" Fabric B strip to each side of (1) 10" Fabric A square. Sew (1) 2 $\frac{1}{2}$ " x 14" Fabric B strip to the top and to the bottom of the Fabric A square to make (1) Block One square (Fig. 1). **Trim the block to measure 12 \frac{1}{2}" x 12 \frac{1}{2}".** Repeat to make (6) Block One squares total.



2. Place (1) 3 $\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric D square on the top left corner of (1) 6 $\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric C square, right sides together (Fig. 2). Sew across the diagonal of the smaller square from the upper right corner to the lower left corner (Fig. 2). Flip open the triangle formed and press. Trim away the excess fabric from behind the triangle $\frac{1}{4}$ " away from the sewn seam (Fig. 3).



3. Follow Figure 4 for the seam direction to add a $3\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric D square to each of the remaining corners of the $6\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric C square to make (1) Unit 1 square (Fig. 5).

4. Repeat Steps 2-3 to make (6) Unit 1 squares total.








5. Sew (1) 4 ¹/₄" Fabric G triangle and (1) 4 ¹/₄" Fabric E triangle together to make (1) GE triangle. Sew (1) 4 ¹/₄" Fabric E triangle and (1) 4 ¹/₄" Fabric F triangle together to make (1) EF triangle. Sew the GE and EF triangles together along their long sides to make (1) Unit 2 square (Fig. 6). The unit should measure 3 ¹/₂" square. Repeat to make (48) Unit 2 squares total.



6. Sew together (2) Unit 2 squares along the Fabric F sides to make (1) Unit 3 strip (Fig. 7). Repeat to make (24) Unit 3 strips total.




7. Sew (1) 3 ¹/₂" Fabric H square to each end of (1) Unit 3 strip to make the top row. Repeat to make the bottom row. Sew (1) Unit 3 strip to each side of (1) Unit 1 square to make the middle row. Sew the (3) rows together lengthwise to make (1) Block Two square (Fig. 8). Repeat to make (6) Block Two squares total.



8. Sew (1) Block One square to each side of (1) Block Two square to make Row One (Fig. 9). Repeat to make Row Three.

9. Sew (1) Block Two square to each side of (1) Block One square to make Row Two (Fig. 9). Repeat to make Row Four.

10. Sew together the (4) Rows from Steps 8-9, in numerical order from top to bottom, to make the Center Block (Fig. 9).



Quilt Top Assembly


(Follow the Quilt Layout while assembling the quilt top.) 11. Sew (1) 2" x 48 $\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric F strip to each side of the Center Block. Sew (1) 2" x 39 $\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric F strip to the top and to the bottom of the Center Block.

12. Sew (1) $1 \frac{1}{2}$ " x 51 $\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric G strip to each side of the Center Block. Sew (1) $1 \frac{1}{2}$ " x 41 $\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric G strip to the top and to the bottom of the Center Block.

13. Center (1) $6 \frac{1}{2}$ " x 69" Fabric I strip on (1) side of the Center Block and pin in place. Start sewing the strip a $\frac{1}{4}$ " from the top edge of the block and stop a $\frac{1}{4}$ " from the bottom edge. **DO NOT TRIM THE EXCESS.** Repeat with the opposite side.

14. Repeat Step 13 to sew (1) $6\frac{1}{2}$ " x 57" Fabric I strip to the top and to the bottom of the Center Block, making sure to stop and start $\frac{1}{4}$ " away from each end of the block. To miter each corner, fold the Center Block on a diagonal, wrong side together. This should line up the strips from adjacent sides (Fig. 10).


15. Starting at the sewn seam (represented by the arrow in Figure 10), draw a 45-degree line to the edge of the fabric. Sew on the drawn line. Trim the excess fabric leaving a ¹/₄" seam. Repeat this step with the remaining corners.



16. Layer and quilt as desired.

17. Sew the (6) $2\frac{1}{2}$ x WOF Fabric E strips together, end to end with 45-degree seams, to make the binding. Fold this long strip in half lengthwise with wrong sides together and press.

18. Bind as desired.
