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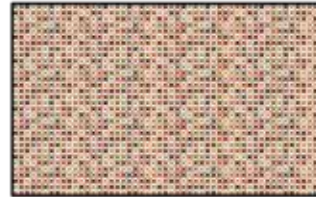

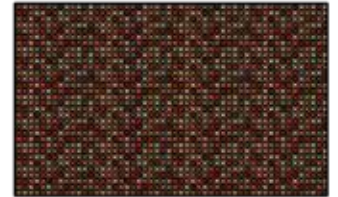

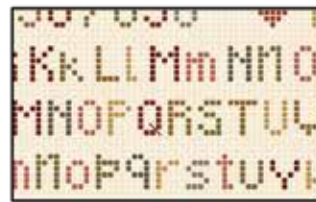

Cutting Instructions

Please note: All strips are cut across the width of fabric (WOF) from selvage to selvage unless otherwise noted.

From the Home Sweet Home Panel 24 Inch x 44 Inch - Cream (A):

- Fussy cut (2) 11 ½" x 9 ½" rectangles centered on a house and words.

From the Cross Stitch Texture - Black (B), cut:

- (1) 2 ½" x WOF strip. Sub-cut (9) 2 ½" squares.
- (1) 2" x WOF strip. Sub-cut (2) 2" x 18 ½" strips.
- (1) 1 ½" x WOF strip. Sub-cut (2) 1 ½" x 14 ½" strips.

From the HSH - Cross Stitch Hearts - Black (C), cut:

- (1) 2 ½" x WOF strip. Sub-cut (2) 2 ½" x 20 ½" strips.
- (1) 2 ½" x WOF strip. Sub-cut (2) 2 ½" x 18 ½" strips.

From the Folio Basics - Off White (D), cut:

- (1) 4 ⅛" x WOF strip. Sub-cut (4) 4 ⅛" squares. Cut the squares across both diagonals to make (16) 4 ⅛" triangles.
- (4) 3 ⅞" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (36) 3 ⅞" squares. Cut the squares across (1) diagonal to make (72) 3 ⅞" triangles.
- (1) 3 ¾" x WOF strip. Sub-cut (8) 3 ¾" squares. Cut the squares across (1) diagonal to make (16) 3 ¾" triangles.

From the Cross Stitch Texture - Cream (E), cut:

- (1) 2 ½" x WOF strip. Sub-cut (9) 2 ½" squares.

From the Folio Basics - Light Green (F), cut:

- (2) 2 ¾" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (18) 2 ¾" squares. Cut the squares across both diagonals to make (72) 2 ¾" triangles.
- (3) 2 ⅝" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (36) 2 ⅝" squares. Cut the squares across (1) diagonal to make (72) 2 ⅝" triangles.

From the Folio Basics - Wine (G), cut:

- (2) 2 ½" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (16) 2 ½" x 4 ½" strips.
- (5) 1 ½" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (72) 1 ½" x 2 ½" strips.
- (7) 2 ½" x WOF strips for the binding.

From the Alphabet - Black (H), cut:

- (2) 2 ½" x 36 ½" WOF strips.
- (2) 2 ½" x 34 ½" WOF strips.

From the Border Stripe - Cream (I), cut:

- (2) 9 ½" x 46 ½" Length of Fabric (LOF) strips.
- (2) 9 ½" x 40 ½" LOF strips.
- (2) 3 ½" x 50" LOF strips.
- (2) 3 ½" x 44" LOF strips.

From the Folio Basics - Dark Green (J), cut:

- (3) 1 ½" x WOF strips. Sew the strips together end to end with diagonal seams and cut (2) 1 ½" x 46 ½" strips.
- (2) 1 ½" x 40 ½" WOF strips.

From the Small Applique Flowers - Black (K), cut:

- (2) 2 ½" x 46 ½" LOF strips.
- From the remaining fabric, cut (2) 2 ½" x 40 ½" WOF strips, piece as needed and (8) 9 ⅜" squares. Cut the 9 ⅜" squares across (1) diagonal to make (16) 9 ⅜" triangles.

From the Small Applique Flowers - Cream (L), cut:

- (1) 4 ½" x WOF strip. Sub-cut (4) 4 ½" squares.

From the Mini Patch - Cream (Backing), cut:

- (2) 78" x WOF strips for the backing. Sew the strips together and trim to make the 72" x 78" back.

Block Assembly

Note: The arrows in figures represent the fabric print direction. Pay attention to the fabric and unit orientations when assembling the various components. Use a ¼" seam allowance with right sides together (RST) unless otherwise noted.

1. Sew together (2) 11 ½" x 9 ½" Fabric A rectangles to make (1) 11 ½" x 18 ½" Unit 1 rectangle (Fig. 1).

2. Sew (1) 2" x 18 ½" Fabric B strip to each side of the Unit 1 rectangle. Sew (1) 1 ½" x 14 ½" Fabric B strip to the top and to the bottom of the Unit 1 rectangle to make the 14 ½" x 20 ½" Center Block (Fig. 2).

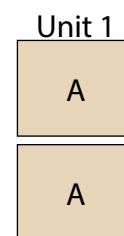

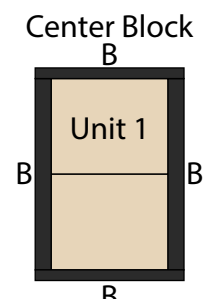

3. Sew together (1) $2\frac{3}{8}$ " Fabric F triangle, (1) $1\frac{1}{2}$ " x $2\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric G strip, (1) $2\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric E square, (1) $1\frac{1}{2}$ " x $2\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric G strip and (1) $2\frac{3}{8}$ " Fabric F triangle, in that order from left to right, to make the middle row. Sew (1) $2\frac{3}{8}$ " Fabric F triangle to each end of (1) $1\frac{1}{2}$ " x $2\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric G strip. Sew (1) $2\frac{3}{8}$ " Fabric F triangle to the top of the Fabric G strip to make the top row. Repeat to make the bottom row. Sew together the rows to make (1) Unit 2 square (Fig. 3). The unit should measure $4\frac{3}{4}$ " square. Repeat to make (9) Unit 2 squares total.

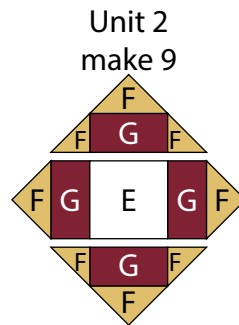

4. Repeat Step 3 and refer to Figure 4 for fabric identification, placement and orientation to make (9) Unit 3 squares.

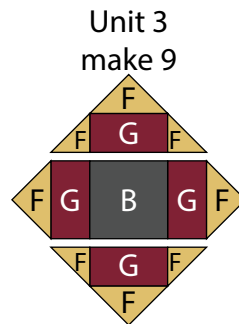

5. Sew (1) $3\frac{7}{8}$ " Fabric D triangle to each of the (4) sides of (1) Unit 2 square to make (1) Block One square (Fig. 5). The block should measure $6\frac{1}{2}$ " square. Repeat to make (9) Block One squares total.

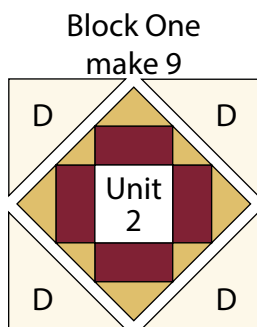

6. Repeat Step 5 and refer to Figure 6 for component identification, placement and orientation to make (9) Block Two squares.

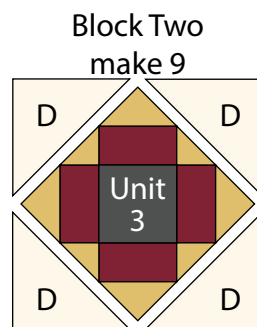

7. Sew together (2) Block One squares and (2) Block Two squares, alternating them from top to bottom, to make (1) Inner Side Border (Fig. 7). Repeat to make a second Inner Side Border.

8. Sew together (3) Block Two squares and (2) Block One squares, alternating them from left to right, to make the Inner Top Border (Fig. 8).

9. Sew together (3) Block One squares and (2) Block Two squares, alternating them from left to right, to make the Inner Bottom Border (Fig. 9).

3. Sew together (1) $3\frac{3}{4}$ " Fabric D triangle, (1) $2\frac{1}{2}$ " x $4\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric G strip, (1) $4\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric L square, (1) $2\frac{1}{2}$ " x $4\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric G strip and (1) $3\frac{3}{4}$ " Fabric D triangle, in that order from left to right, to make the middle row. Sew (1) $4\frac{1}{8}$ " Fabric D triangle to each end of (1) $2\frac{1}{2}$ " x $4\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric G strip. Sew (1) $3\frac{3}{4}$ " Fabric D triangle to the top of the Fabric G strip to make the top row. Repeat to make the bottom row. Sew together the rows to make (1) Unit 4 square (Fig. 10). The unit should measure 9" square. Repeat to make (4) Unit 4 squares total.

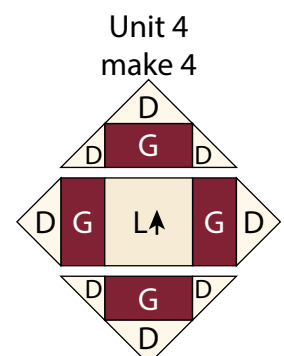

11. Sew (1) $9\frac{3}{8}$ " Fabric K triangle to each of the (4) sides of (1) Unit 4 square to make (1) Block Three square (Fig. 11). The block should measure $12\frac{1}{2}$ " square. Repeat to make (4) Block Three squares total.

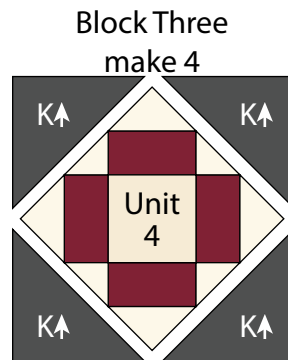

12. Sew together (1) $9\frac{1}{2}$ " x $46\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric I strip, (1) $2\frac{1}{2}$ " x $46\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric K strip and (1) $1\frac{1}{2}$ " x $46\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric J strip, lengthwise and in that order from left to right, to make (1) Block Four strip (Fig. 12). Repeat to make a second Block Four strip.

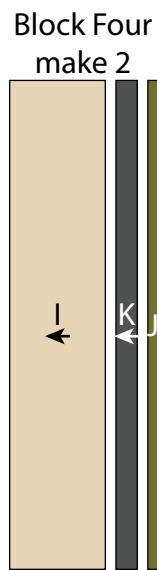

13. Sew together (1) $9\frac{1}{2}$ " x $40\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric I strip, (1) $2\frac{1}{2}$ " x $40\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric K strip and (1) $1\frac{1}{2}$ " x $4\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric J strip lengthwise and in that order from top to bottom to make (1) Block Five strip (Fig. 13). Repeat to make a second Block Five strip.

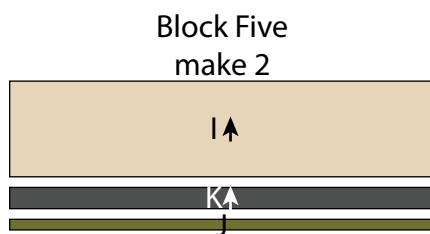

14. Sew (1) Block Three square to each end of (1) Block Five strip to make the Outer Top Border (Fig. 14).

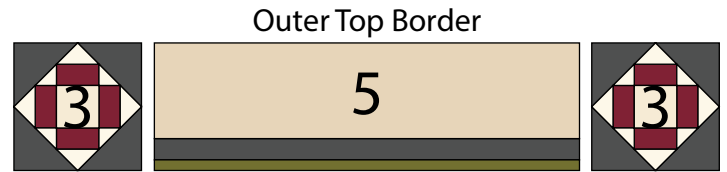

15. Sew (1) Block Three square to each end of (1) Block Five strip to make the Outer Bottom Border (Fig. 15).

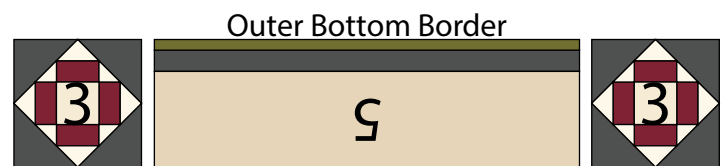

Quilt Top Assembly

(Follow the Quilt Layout while assembling the quilt top.)

16. Sew (1) $2\frac{1}{2}$ " x $20\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric C strip to each side of the Center Block. Sew (1) $2\frac{1}{2}$ " x $18\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric C strip to the top and to the bottom of the Center Block.

17. Sew (1) Inner Side Border to each side of the Center Block.

18. Sew the Inner Top and Bottom Borders to the top and to the bottom of the Center Block.

19. Sew (1) $2\frac{1}{2}$ " x $36\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric H strip to each side of the Center Block. Sew (1) $2\frac{1}{2}$ " x $34\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric H strip to the top and to the bottom of the Center Block.

20. Center (1) $3\frac{1}{2}$ " x 50 " Fabric I strip on (1) side of the Center Block and pin in place. Start sewing the strip a $\frac{1}{4}$ " from the top edge of the block and stop a $\frac{1}{4}$ " from the bottom edge. **DO NOT TRIM THE EXCESS.** Repeat with the opposite side.

21. Repeat Step 20 to sew (1) 3 1/2" x 44" Fabric I strip to the top and to the bottom of the Center Block, making sure to stop and start 1/4" away from each end of the block. To miter each corner, fold the Center Block on a diagonal, wrong side together. This should line up the strips from adjacent sides (Fig. 16).

22. Starting at the sewn seam (represented by the arrow in Figure 16), draw a 45-degree line to the edge of the fabric. Sew on the drawn line. Trim the excess fabric leaving a 1/4" seam. Repeat this step with the remaining corners.

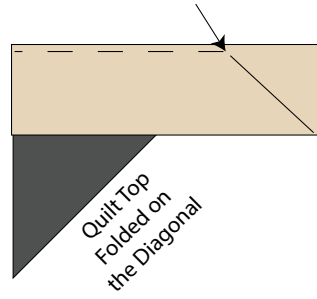

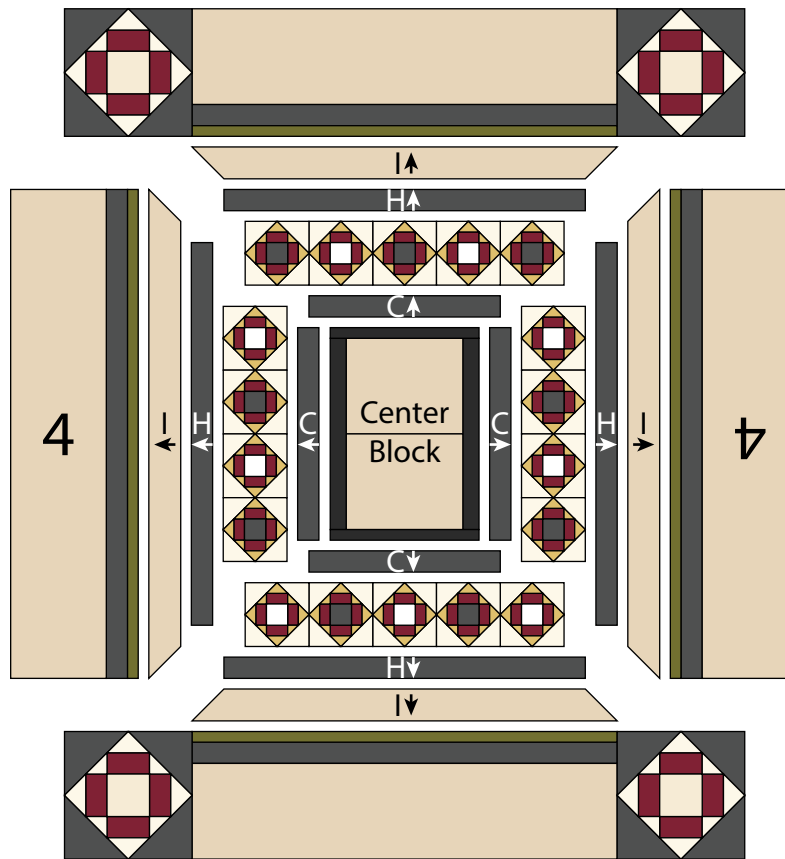
23. Sew (1) Block Four strip to each side of the Center Block.

24. Sew the Outer Top Border and the Outer Bottom Border to the top and to the bottom of the Center Block to make the quilt top.

25. Layer and quilt as desired.

26. Sew the (7) 2 1/2" x WOF Fabric G strips together, end to end with 45-degree seams, to make the binding. Fold this long strip in half lengthwise with wrong sides together and press.

27. Bind as desired.
