Cutting Instructions

Please note: All strips are cut across the width of fabric (WOF) from selvage to selvage edge unless otherwise noted.

From the 10" x 10" Blocks 24" x 44- Multi (A):

• Fussy cut (6) 10 ½" squares, each centered on a block.

From the Diagonal Plaid - Multi (B), cut:

- (3) 2" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (12) 2" x 10 ½" strips.
- (4) 2" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (12) 2" x 13 ½" strips.
- (1) 2 ½" x WOF strip. Sub-cut (24) 2 ½" squares.
- (7) 2 ½" x WOF strips for the binding.

From the Jungle Scenic - Green (C), cut:

• (3) 4 ½" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (24) 4 ½" squares.

From the Modern Melody Basics - Black (D), cut:

- (2) 2 ½" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (24) 2 ½" squares.
- (3) 1 ½" x WOF strips. Sew the strips together end to end with diagonal seams and cut (2) 1 ½" x 54 ½" strips.
- (3) 1 ½" x WOF strips. Sew the strips together end to end with diagonal seams and cut (2) 1 ½" x 44 ½" strips.

From the Tossed Faces - Cream (E), cut:

• (1) 4 ½" x WOF strip. Sub-cut (6) 4 ½" squares.

From the Tiger Skin - Tan (F), cut:

• (3) 5 ½" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (24) 5 ½" squares. Cut the squares across both diagonals to make (96) 5 ½" triangles. *Note: You will only use (24) 5 ½" triangles.*

From the Folio Basics - Off White (G), cut:

- (2) 5 ½" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (12) 5 ½" squares. Cut the squares across both diagonals to make (48) 5 ½" triangles.
- (3) 2 1/4" x WOF strips. Sew the strips together end to end with diagonal seams and cut (2) 2 1/4" x 51" strips.
- (2) 2 1/4" x 42 1/2" WOF strips, piece as needed.

From the Leopard Skin - Cream (H), cut:

- (1) 5 ½" x WOF strip. Sub-cut (6) 5 ½" squares. Cut the squares across both diagonals to make (24) 5 ½" triangles.
- (3) 1 ³/₄" x WOF strips. Sew the strips together end to end with diagonal seams and cut (2) 1 ³/₄" x 48 ¹/₂" strips.
- (2) 1 ³/₄" x 39" WOF strips.

From the Border Stripe - Multi (I), cut:

- (2) 6" x 71" Length of Fabric (LOF) strips.
- (2) 6" x 59" LOF strips.

From the Leaves - Multi (Backing), cut:

• (2) 63" x WOF strips for the backing. Sew the strips together and trim to make the 63" x 75" back.

Block Assembly

Note: The arrows in figures represent the fabric print direction. Pay attention to the fabric and unit orientations when assembling the various components. Use a ¼" seam allowance with right sides together (RST) unless otherwise noted.

1. Place (1) 2 ½" Fabric B square on the top left corner of (1) 4 ½" Fabric C square, right sides together (Fig. 1). Sew across the diagonal of the smaller square from the upper right corner to the lower left corner (Fig. 1). Flip open the triangle formed and press. Trim away the excess fabric from behind the triangle ¼" away from the sewn seam (Fig. 2).

- 2. Follow Figure 3 for the seam direction to add (1) 2 ½" Fabric D square to the lower right corner of the 4 ½" Fabric C square to make (1) Unit 1 square (Fig. 4).
- 3. Repeat Steps 1-2 to make (6) Unit 1 squares total.


4. Repeat Steps 1-2 and refer to Figures 5-7 for fabric identification, placement, seam direction and orientation to make (6) of each unit square for Unit 2 through Unit 4.








5. Follow Figure 8 and sew together (2) 5 ¼" Fabric G triangles, (1) 5 ¼" Fabric H triangle and (1) 5 ¼" Fabric F triangle to make (1) 4 ½" Unit 5 square. Repeat to make (24) Unit 5 squares total.



- 6. Sew together (1) Unit 1 square, (1) Unit 5 square and (1) Unit 2 square, in that order from left to right, to make the top row (Fig. 9).
- 7. Sew (1) Unit 5 square to each side of (1) 4 ½" Fabric E square to make the middle row (Fig. 9).
- 8. Sew together (1) Unit 3 square, (1) Unit 5 square and (1) Unit 4 square, in that order from left to right, to make the bottom row (Fig. 9).
- 9. Sew together the (3) rows from Steps 6-8 lengthwise to make (1) 12 ½" Block One square (Fig. 9).
- 10. Repeat Steps 6-9 to make (6) Block One squares total.



11. Sew (1) 2" x 10 ½"
Fabric B strip to each side of (1) 10 ½" Fabric A square.
Sew (1) 2" x 13 ½" Fabric B strip to the top and to the bottom of the Fabric A square to make (1) Block Two square (Fig. 10). Trim the block to measure 12 ½" x 12 ½".
Repeat to make (6) Block Two squares total.




- 12. Sew (1) Block One square to each side of (1) Block Two square to make Row One (Fig. 11). Repeat to make Row Three.
- 13. Sew (1) Block Two square to each side of (1) Block One square to make Row Two (Fig. 11). Repeat to make Row Four.
- 14. Sew together the (4) Rows from Steps 12-13 lengthwise and in numerical order from top to bottom to make the 36 ½" x 48 ½" Center Block (Fig. 11).






Quilt Top Assembly

(Follow the Quilt Layout while assembling the quilt top.) 15. Sew (1) 1 3/4" x 48 1/2" Fabric H strip to each side of the Center Block. Sew (1) 1 3/4" x 39" Fabric H strip to the top and to the bottom of the Center Block.

- 16. Sew (1) 2 ½" x 51" Fabric G strip to each side of the Center Block. Sew (1) 2 ½" x 42 ½" Fabric G strip to the top and to the bottom of the Center Block.
- 17. Sew (1) 1 ½" x 54 ½" Fabric D strip to each side of the Center Block. Sew (1) 1 ½" x 44 ½" Fabric D strip to the top and to the bottom of the Center Block.
- 18. Center (1) 6" x 71" Fabric I strip on (1) side of the Center Block and pin in place. Start sewing the strip a ½" from the top edge of the block and stop a ½" from the bottom edge. **DO NOT TRIM THE EXCESS.** Repeat with the opposite side.
- 19. Repeat Step 18 to sew (1) 6" x 59" Fabric I strip to the top and to the bottom of the Center Block, making sure to stop and start 1/4" away from each end of the block. To miter each corner, fold the Center Block on a diagonal, wrong side together. This should line up the strips from adjacent sides (Fig. 12).
- 20. Starting at the sewn seam (represented by the arrow in Figure 12), draw a 45-degree line to the edge of the fabric. Sew on the drawn line. Trim the excess fabric leaving a ¼" seam. Repeat this step with the remaining corners to make the quilt top.



- 21. Layer and quilt as desired.
- 22. Sew the (7) 2 ½" x WOF Fabric B strips together, end to end with 45-degree seams, to make the binding. Fold this long strip in half lengthwise with wrong sides together and press.
- 23. Bind as desired.
