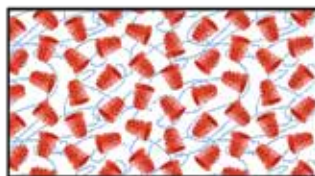

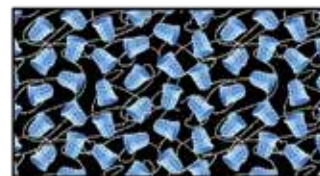

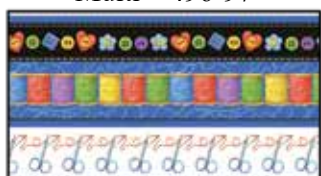

1 1/3 yards	Quilter's Ruler - Light Blue (B)	494-71
1 1/4 yards	Stitch and Needle - Red (C)	488-82*
1/4 yard	Stitch and Needle - Blue (D)	488-77
1/4 yard	Set Square Buttons - Red (E)	495-89
1/4 yard	Set Square Buttons - Blue (F)	495-79
5/8 yard	Twinkle - Black (G)	135-99
3/4 yard	Large Sewing Accessories - Multi (H)	486-87
1/3 yard	Packed Buttons - Multi (I)	490-78
1/4 yard	Tossed Scissors and Needles - Multi (J)	496-97
2 1/4 yards	Border Stripe - Multi (K)	497-71
4 yards	Tossed Spools and Buttons - Multi (Backing)	489-38

### Cutting Instructions

Please note: All strips are cut across the width of fabric (WOF) from selvage to selvage edge unless otherwise noted.

#### From the 10" x 10" Blocks - Multi (A):

- Fussy cut (6) 10" squares, each centered on a block.

#### From the Quilter's Ruler - Light Blue (B), cut:

- (3) 2" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (12) 2" x 10" strips.
- (4) 2" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (12) 2" x 13" strips.
- (5) 2" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (96) 2" squares.
- (4) 2" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (48) 2" x 3 1/2" strips.
- (3) 2" x WOF strips. Sew the strips together end to end with diagonal seams and cut (2) 2" x 57 1/2" strips.
- (3) 2" x WOF strips. Sew the strips together end to end with diagonal seams and cut (2) 2" x 45 1/2" strips.

#### From the Stitch and Needle - Red (C), cut:

- (1) 3 1/2" x WOF strip. Sub-cut (6) 3 1/2" squares.
- (3) 1 1/2" x WOF strips. Sew the strips together end to end with diagonal seams and cut (2) 1 1/2" x 60 1/2" strips.
- (3) 1 1/2" x WOF strips. Sew the strips together end to end with diagonal seams and cut (2) 1 1/2" x 47 1/2" strips.
- (4) 1" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (12) 1" x 11 1/2" strips.
- (4) 1" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (12) 1" x 12 1/2" strips.
- (7) 2 1/2" x WOF strips for the binding.

#### From the Stitch and Needle - Blue (D), cut:

- (1) 3 1/2" x WOF strip. Sub-cut (6) 3 1/2" squares.

#### From the Set Square Buttons - Red (E), cut:

- (1) 3 1/2" x WOF strip. Sub-cut (6) 3 1/2" squares.

#### From the Set Square Buttons - Blue (F), cut:

- (1) 3 1/2" x WOF strip. Sub-cut (6) 3 1/2" squares.

#### From the Twinkle - Black (G), cut:

- (8) 2" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (48) 2" x 6 1/2" strips.

#### From the Large Sewing Accessories - Multi (H), cut:

- (1) 12 1/2" x WOF strip. Sub-cut (8) 12 1/2" x 3 1/2" strips.
- (3) 3 1/2" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (9) 3 1/2" x 12 1/2" strips.

#### From the Packed Buttons - Multi (I), cut:

- (4) 2" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (68) 2" squares.

#### From the Tossed Scissors and Needles - Multi (J), cut:

- (1) 3 1/2" x WOF strip. Sub-cut (6) 3 1/2" squares.

#### From the Border Stripe - Multi (K), cut:

- (2) 6 1/2" x 78" Length of Fabric (LOF) strips.
- (2) 6 1/2" x 63" LOF strips.

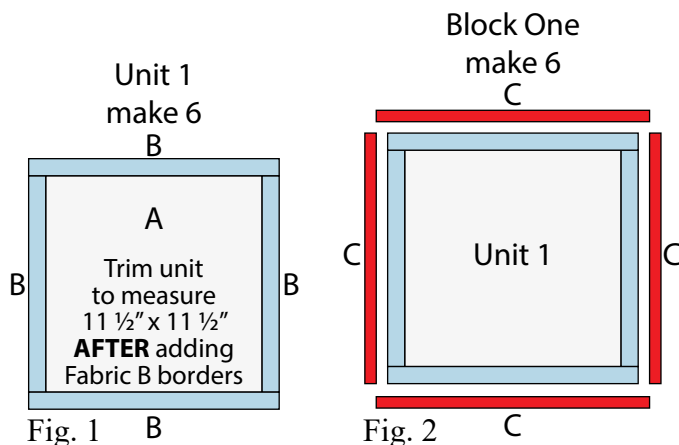
#### From the Tossed Spools and Buttons - Multi (Backing), cut:

- (2) 67" x WOF strips for the backing. Sew the strips together and trim to make the 67" x 82" back.

### Block Assembly

Note: The arrows in figures represent the fabric print direction. Pay attention to the fabric and unit orientations when assembling the various components. Use a 1/4" seam allowance with right sides together (RST) unless otherwise noted.

- Sew (1) 2" x 10" Fabric B strip to each side of (1) 10" Fabric A square. Sew (1) 2" x 13" Fabric B strip to the top and to the bottom of the Fabric A square to make (1) Unit 1 square (Fig. 1). **Trim the unit to measure 11 1/2" x 11 1/2"**. Repeat to make (6) Unit 1 squares total.
- Sew (1) 1" x 11 1/2" Fabric C strip to each side of (1) Unit 1 square. Sew (1) 1" x 12 1/2" Fabric C strip to the top and to the bottom of the Unit 1 square to make (1) 12 1/2" Block One square (Fig. 2). Repeat to make (6) Block One squares total.



3. Place (1) 2" Fabric B square on the left side of (1) 2" x 6 1/2" Fabric G strip, right sides together (Fig. 3). Sew across the diagonal of the square from the upper left corner to the lower right corner (Fig. 3). Flip open the triangle formed and press. Trim away the excess fabric from behind the triangle, leaving a 1/4" seam allowance (Fig. 4).

4. Place another 2" Fabric B square on the right side of the 3" x 6 1/2" Fabric G strip, right sides together (Fig. 5). Sew across the diagonal of the square from the upper right corner to the lower left corner (Fig. 5). Flip open the triangle formed and press. Trim away the excess fabric from behind the triangle, leaving a 1/4" seam allowance to make (1) Unit 2 strip (Fig. 6).

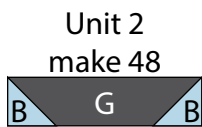

6. Sew (1) 2" x 3 1/2" Fabric B strip to each side of (1) 3 1/2" Fabric D square. Sew (1) Unit 2 strip to the top and to the bottom of the newly sewn block lengthwise to make (1) 6 1/2" Unit 3 square (Fig. 7). Repeat to make (6) Unit 3 squares total.

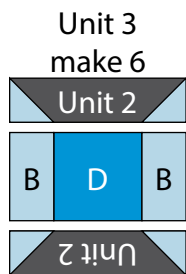

7. Repeat Step 6 and refer to Figures 8-10 for component identification, placement and orientation to make (6) of each unit square for Unit 4 through Unit 6.

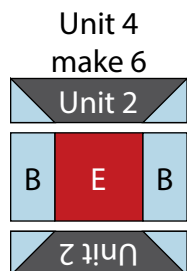

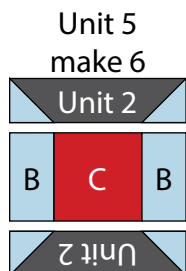

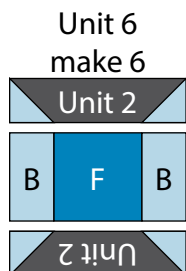

8. Sew (1) Unit 3 square to the left side of (1) Unit 4 square to make the top row. Sew (1) Unit 5 square to the left side of (1) Unit 6 square to make the bottom row. Sew together the (2) rows lengthwise to make (1) 12 1/2" Block Two square (Fig. 11). Repeat to make (6) Block Two squares total.

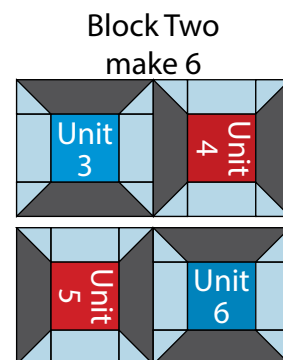

9. Place (1) 2" Fabric I square on the top left corner of (1) 3 1/2" x 12 1/2" Fabric H strip, right sides together (Fig. 12). Sew across the diagonal of the smaller square from the upper right corner to the lower left corner (Fig. 12). Flip open the triangle formed and press. Trim away the excess fabric from behind the triangle 1/4" away from the sewn seam (Fig. 13).

10. Follow Figure 14 for the seam direction to add a 2" Fabric I square to each of the remaining corners of the 3 1/2" x 12 1/2" Fabric H strip to make (1) Block Three strip (Fig. 15).

11. Repeat Steps 9-10 to make (8) Block Three strips total.

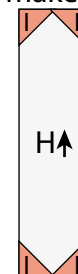

12. Repeat Steps 9-10 and refer to Figure 16 for fabric identification, placement, seam direction and orientation to make (9) Block Four strips.

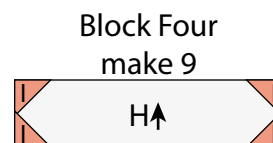

13. Sew together (1) Block One square (1) Block Three strip, (1) Block Two square, (1) Block Three strip and (1) Block One square, in that order from left to right, to make Row One (Fig. 17).

14. Sew together (3) Block Four strips and (2) 3 ½" Fabric J squares, end to end and alternating them from left to right, to make Row Two.

15. Repeat Steps 13-14 and refer to Figure 17 for component identification, placement and orientation to make Row Three through Row Seven.

16. Sew together the (7) Rows from Steps 13-15, lengthwise and in numerical order from top to bottom, to make the 42 ½" x 57 ½" Center Block (Fig. 17).

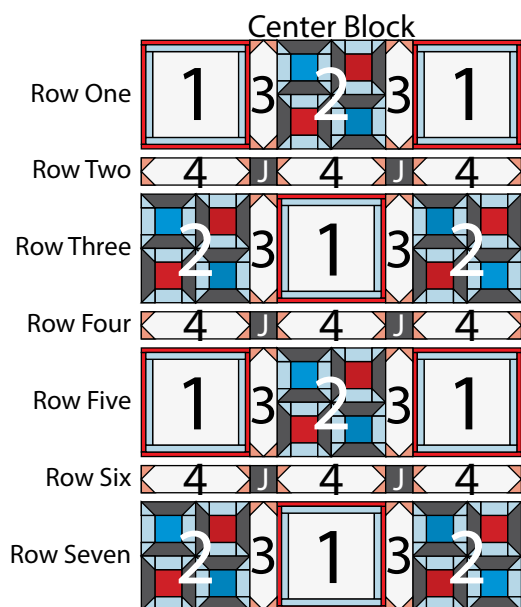

### Quilt Top Assembly

*(Follow the Quilt Layout while assembling the quilt top.)*

17. Sew (1) 2" x 57 ½" Fabric B strip to each side of the Center Block. Sew (1) 2" x 45 ½" Fabric B strip to the top and to the bottom of the Center Block.

18. Sew (1) 1 ½" x 60 ½" Fabric C strip to each side of the Center Block. Sew (1) 1 ½" x 47 ½" Fabric C strip to the top and to the bottom of the Center Block.

19. Center (1) 6 ½" x 78" Fabric K strip on (1) side of the Center Block and pin in place. Start sewing the strip a ¼" from the top edge of the block and stop a ¼" from the bottom edge. **DO NOT TRIM THE EXCESS.** Repeat with the opposite side.

20. Repeat Step 19 to sew (1) 6 ½" x 63" Fabric K strip to the top and to the bottom of the Center Block, making sure to stop and start ¼" away from each end of the block. To miter each corner, fold the Center Block on a diagonal, wrong side together. This should line up the strips from adjacent sides (Fig. 18).

21. Starting at the sewn seam (represented by the arrow in Figure 18), draw a 45-degree line to the edge of the fabric. Sew on the drawn line. Trim the excess fabric leaving a ¼" seam. Repeat this step with the remaining corners to make the quilt top.

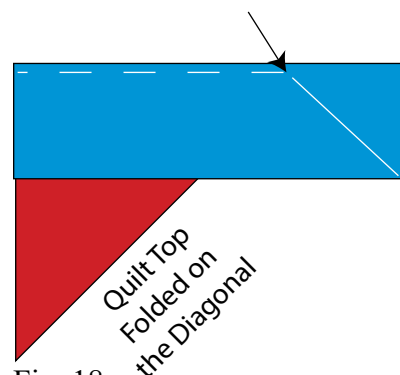
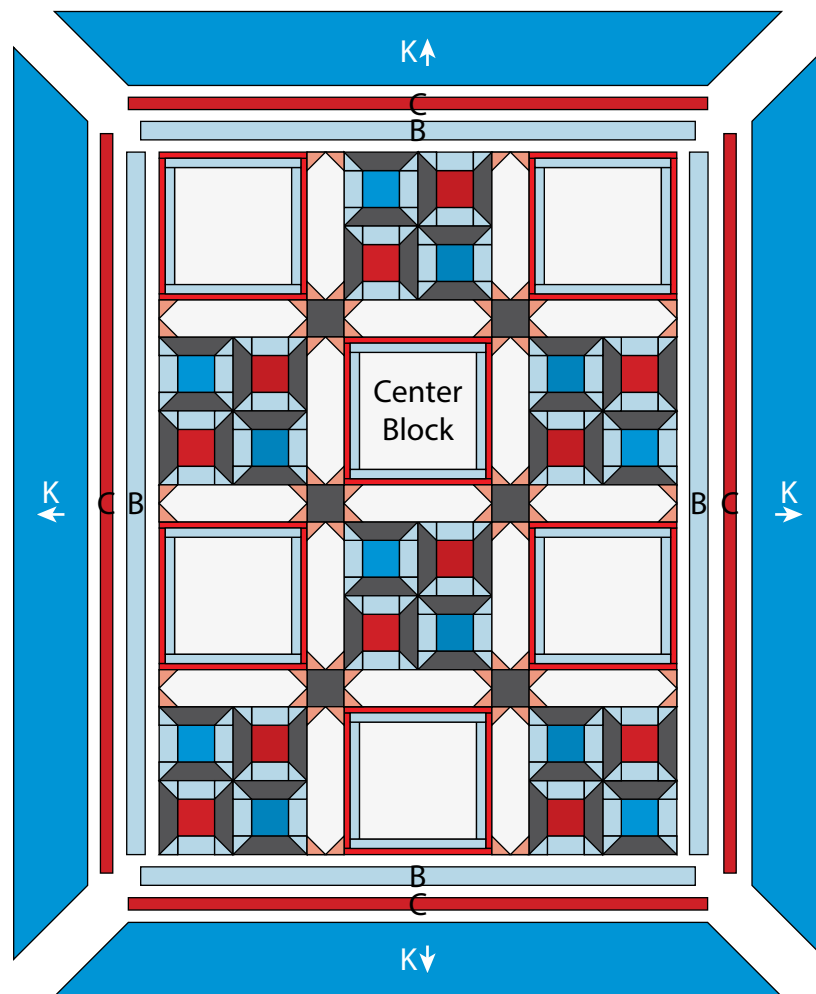

22. Layer and quilt as desired.

23. Sew the (7) 2 ½" x WOF Fabric C strips together, end to end with 45-degree seams, to make the binding. Fold this long strip in half lengthwise with wrong sides together and press.

24. Bind as desired.
