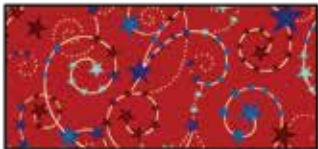

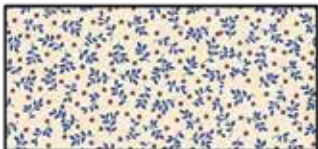

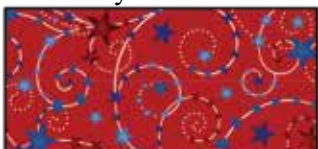

## Cutting Instructions

*Please note: All strips are cut across the width of fabric (WOF) from selvage to selvage edge unless otherwise noted.*

### From the Flag Panel - Cream (A):

- Fussy cut (1) 22 1/2" x 15 1/2" rectangle, centered on the flag.
- Fussy cut (8) 6 1/2" squares, centered on blocks.

### From the Folio Basics - Off White (B), cut:

- (1) 2 1/2" x WOF strip. Sub-cut (2) 2 1/2" x 15 1/2" strips.
- (4) 2 1/2" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (32) 2 1/2" x 4 1/2" strips.
- (1) 2 1/2" x WOF strip. Sub-cut (4) 2 1/2" x 3 1/2" strips.
- (1) 2 1/2" x WOF strip. Sub-cut (4) 2 1/2" x 7 1/2" strips.
- (3) 2 1/2" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (36) 2 1/2" squares.
- (2) 2" x 26 1/2" WOF strips.
- (3) 2" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (16) 2" x 6 1/2" strips.
- (4) 2" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (16) 2" x 9 1/2" strips.
- (3) 2" x WOF strips. Sew the strips together end to end with diagonal seams and cut (2) 2" x 54 1/2" strips.
- (3) 2" x WOF strips. Sew the strips together end to end with diagonal seams and cut (2) 2" x 49 1/2" strips.

### From the Sprigs - Navy (C), cut:

- (1) 1 1/2" x WOF strip. Sub-cut (2) 2 1/2" x 17 1/2" strips.
- (2) 1 1/2" x 27 1/2" WOF strips.
- (6) 2 1/2" x WOF strips for the binding.

### From the Swirling Stars - Cream (D), cut:

- (1) 2" x WOF strip. Sub-cut (2) 2" x 19 1/2" strips.
- (2) 2" x 30 1/2" WOF strips.

### From the Liberty Hill Scenic - Green (E), cut:

- (1) 8 1/2" x WOF strip. Sub-cut (2) 8 1/2" x 14 1/2" strips.

### From the Paisleys - Navy (F), cut:

- (2) 2 7/8" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (16) 2 7/8" squares.
- (2) 2 1/2" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (32) 2 1/2" squares.

### From the Paisleys - Red (G), cut:

- (2) 2 7/8" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (16) 2 7/8" squares.
- (2) 2 1/2" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (32) 2 1/2" squares.

### From the Stars - Navy (H), cut:

- (1) 2 1/2" x WOF strip. Sub-cut (4) 2 1/2" x 6 1/2" strips.
- (1) 2 1/2" x WOF strip. Sub-cut (4) 2 1/2" x 8 1/2" strips.
- (1) 2 1/2" x WOF strip. Sub-cut (4) 2 1/2" x 7 1/2" strips.
- (1) 2 1/2" x WOF strip. Sub-cut (4) 2 1/2" x 3 1/2" strips.

### From the Stripes - Red (I), cut:

- (2) 4 1/2" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (8) 4 1/2" x 10 1/2" strips.
- (1) 4 1/2" x WOF strip. Sub-cut (4) 4 1/2" x 3 1/2" strips.
- (1) 4 1/2" x WOF strip. Sub-cut (4) 4 1/2" x 7 1/2" strips.

### From the Star Spangled 108 inch - Red (Backing), cut:

- (1) 57" x 65" WOF strip for the backing.

## Block Assembly

*Note: The arrows in figures represent the fabric print direction. Pay attention to the fabric and unit orientations when assembling the various components. Use a 1/4" seam allowance with right sides together (RST) unless otherwise noted.*

1. Sew (1) 2 1/2" x 15 1/2" Fabric B strip to each side of the 22 1/2" x 15 1/2" Fabric A rectangle. Sew (1) 2" x 26 1/2" Fabric B strip to the top and to the bottom of the Fabric A rectangle to make the Center Block (Fig. 1). **Trim the block to measure 25 1/2" x 17 1/2"**.

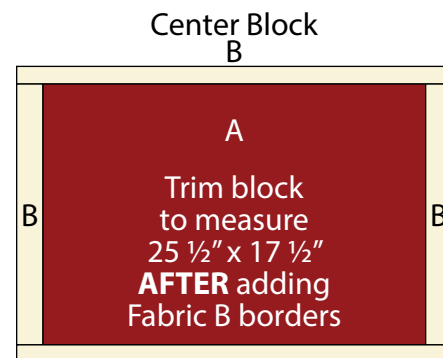

2. Sew (1) 2" x 6 1/2" Fabric B strip to each side of (1) 6 1/2" Fabric A square. Sew (1) 2" x 9 1/2" Fabric B strip to the top and to the bottom of the Fabric A square to make (1) Block One square (Fig. 2). **Trim the block to measure 8 1/2" x 8 1/2"**. Repeat to make (8) Block One squares total.

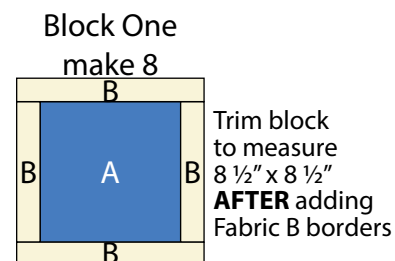
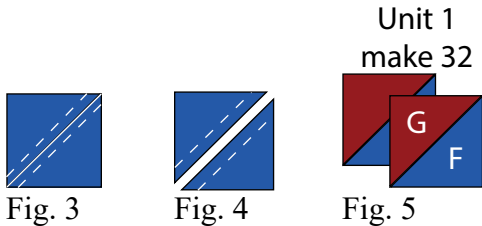
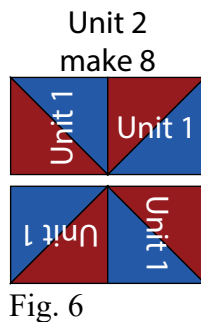

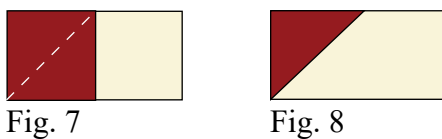
3. Place (1)  $2\frac{7}{8}$ " Fabric F square on top of (1)  $2\frac{7}{8}$ " Fabric G square, right sides together. Draw a line across the diagonal of the top square (Fig. 1). Sew  $\frac{1}{4}$ " away from each side of the drawn diagonal line (Fig. 3). Cut the (2) squares apart on the drawn diagonal line (Fig. 4) to make (2) half-square triangles. Trim the half-square triangles to measure  $2\frac{1}{2}$ " square to make (2) Unit 1 squares (Fig. 5). Repeat to make (32) Unit 1 squares total.



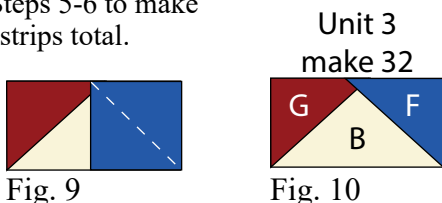
4. Sew together (4) Unit 1 squares into a  $2 \times 2$  matrix to make (1)  $4\frac{1}{2}$ " Unit 2 square (Fig. 6). Repeat to make (8) Unit 2 squares total.



5. Place (1)  $2\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric G square on the left side of (1)  $2\frac{1}{2}$ " x  $4\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric B strip, right sides together (Fig. 7). Sew across the diagonal of the square from the upper right corner to the lower left corner (Fig. 7). Flip open the triangle formed and press. Trim away the excess fabric from behind the triangle, leaving a  $\frac{1}{4}$ " seam allowance (Fig. 8).



6. Place (1)  $2\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric F square on the right side of the  $2\frac{1}{2}$ " x  $4\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric B strip, right sides together (Fig. 9). Sew across the diagonal of the square from the upper left corner to the lower right corner (Fig. 9). Flip open the triangle formed and press. Trim away the excess fabric from behind the triangle, leaving a  $\frac{1}{4}$ " seam allowance to make (1) Unit 3 strip (Fig. 10).



7. Repeat Steps 5-6 to make (32) Unit 3 strips total.

8. Sew (1)  $2\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric B square to each end of (1) Unit 3 strip to make the top row. Repeat to make the bottom row. Sew (1) Unit 3 strip to each side of (1) Unit 2 square to make the middle row. Sew together the (3) rows lengthwise to make (1)  $8\frac{1}{2}$ " Block Two square (Fig. 11). Repeat to make (8) Block Two squares total.

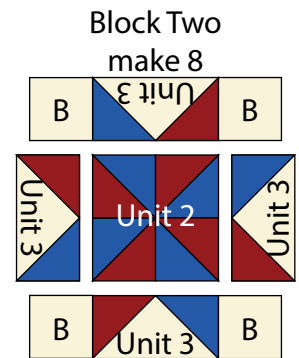
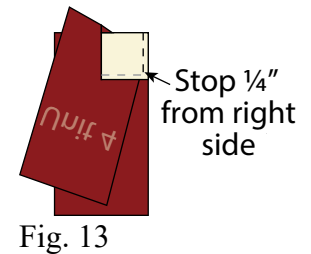
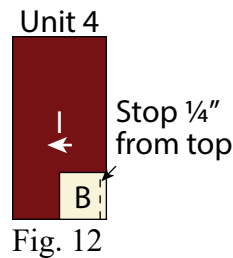

9. Place (1)  $2\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric B square on the lower right corner of (1)  $4\frac{1}{2}$ " x  $10\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric I strip. Sew up from the bottoms of the fabrics, stopping  $\frac{1}{4}$ " from the top of the Fabric B square to make (1) Unit 4 strip (Fig. 12).

10. Place (1)  $4\frac{1}{2}$ " x  $10\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric I strip on top of the strip from Step 9, aligning the upper left corner of the Fabric I strip with right side of the Fabric B square. **Flip over the stacked fabrics** and sew along the joined sides, stopping  $\frac{1}{4}$ " from the right side (Fig. 13).



11. Fold the Fabric B square across the diagonal wrong sides together. This should align the Fabric I strips along the sewn seams wrong sides together. Refer to the dot in Figure 14 to draw a 45-degree line. Sew on this line to create the mitered seam. Trim  $\frac{1}{4}$ " from the sewn seam. Press open to make (1)  $6\frac{1}{2}$ " Unit 5 square.

12. Repeat Steps 9-11 to make (4) Unit 5 squares total.

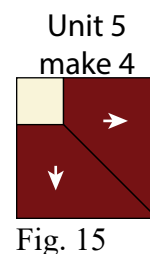
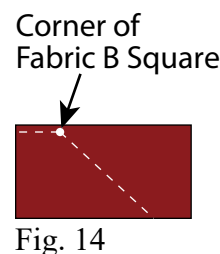

13. Sew (1) 2 ½" x 6 ½" Fabric H strip to the top of (1) Unit 5 square. Sew (1) 2 ½" x 8 ½" Fabric H strip to the right side of the Unit 5 square to make (1) 8 ½" Block Three square (Fig. 16).

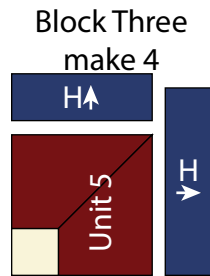

14. Sew together (1) 2 ½" x 3 ½" Fabric H strip, (1) 3 ½" x 4 ½" Fabric I strip and (1) 2 ½" x 3 ½" Fabric B strip, in that order from top to bottom, to make (1) 3 ½" x 8 ½" Block Four Strip (Fig. 17). Repeat to make (4) Block Four strips total.

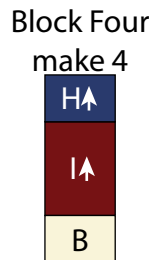

15. Sew together (1) 2 ½" x 7 ½" Fabric H strip, (1) 4 ½" x 7 ½" Fabric I strip and (1) 2 ½" x 7 ½" Fabric B strip, lengthwise and in that order from top to bottom, to make (1) 7 ½" x 8 ½" Block Five rectangle (Fig. 18). Repeat to make (4) Block Five rectangles total.

16. Sew (1) Block Five rectangle to the top and to the bottom of (1) Block Two square to make the Left Side Border (Fig. 19).

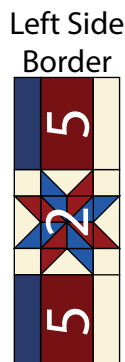

17. Sew (1) Block Five rectangle to the top and to the bottom of (1) Block Two square to make the Right Side Border (Fig. 20).

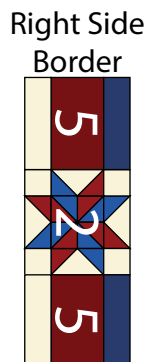

18. Sew together (1) Block One square, (1) Block Two square, (1) 8 ½" x 14 ½" Fabric E strip, (1) Block Two square and (1) Block One square, in that order from left to right, to make the Inner Top Border (Fig. 21). Repeat to make the Inner Bottom Border.

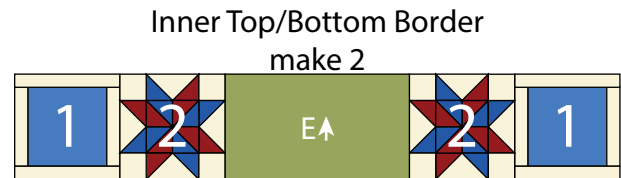

19. Sew together (1) Block Three square, (1) Block One square, (1) Block Four strip, (1) Block Two square, (1) Block Four strip, (1) Block One square and (1) Block Three square, in that order from left to right, to make the Outer Top Border (Fig. 22).

20. Repeat Step 19 and refer to Figure 23 for component identification, placement and orientation to make the Outer Bottom Border.

## Quilt 1

### Quilt Top Assembly

*(Follow the Quilt Layout while assembling the quilt top.)*

21. Sew (1) 1 1/2" x 17 1/2" Fabric C strip to each side of the Center Block. Sew (1) 1 1/2" x 27 1/2" Fabric C strip to the top and to the bottom of the Center Block.

22. Sew (1) 2" x 19 1/2" Fabric D strip to each side of the Center Block. Sew (1) 2" x 30 1/2" Fabric D strip to the top and to the bottom of the Center Block.

23. Sew the Left Side Border and the Right Side Border to the left and to the right sides of the Center Block.

24. Sew the Inner Top Border and Inner Bottom Borders to the top and to the bottom of the Center Block.

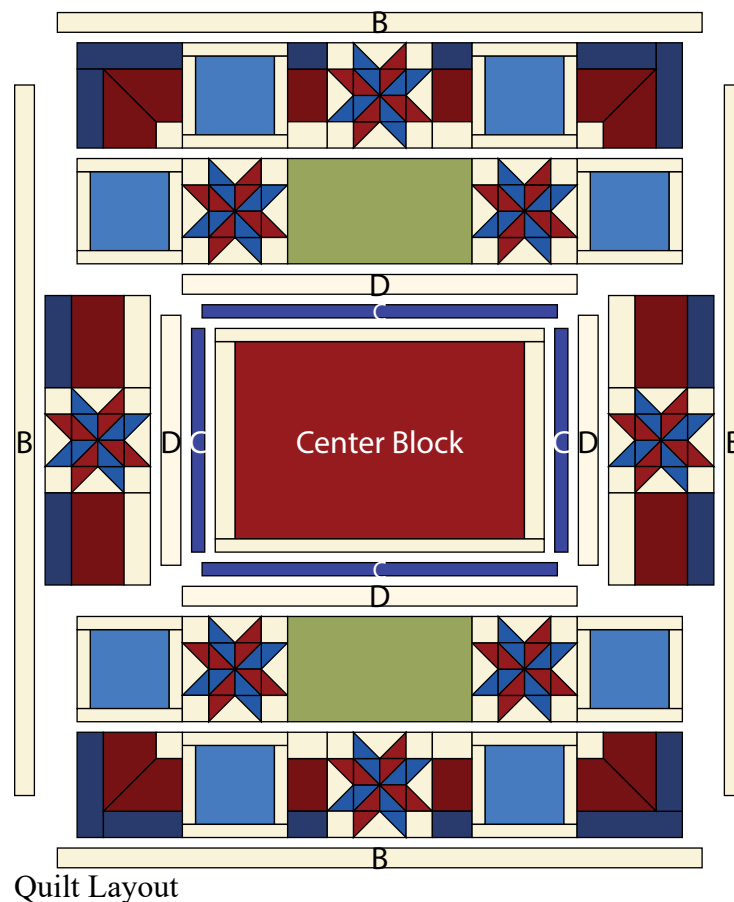
25. Sew the Outer Top Border and the Outer Bottom Border to the top and to the bottom of the Center Block.

26. Sew (1) 2" x 54 1/2" Fabric B strip to each side of the Center Block. Sew (1) 2" x 49 1/2" Fabric B strip to the top and to the bottom of the Center Block to make the quilt top.

27. Layer and quilt as desired.

28. Sew the (6) 2 1/2" x WOF Fabric C strips together, end to end with 45-degree seams, to make the binding. Fold this long strip in half lengthwise with wrong sides together and press.

29. Bind as desired.
