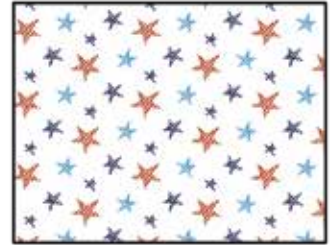

½ yard	Tossed Small Poppy - Red/White (C)	652-81
⅔ yard	Modern Melody Basics - Navy (D)	1063-77
⅓ yard	Poppy Flowers & Flag - Red (E)	647-81
¼ yard	Patriotic Ribbon - Multi (F)	653-78
¼ yard	Packed Poppy Flower - Red (G)	648-86
⅔ yard	Fireworks - Blue (H)	649-78*
½ yard	Folio Basics - White on White (I)	7755-01W
2 ⅛ yards	Border Stripe - Red/Blue (J)	657-87
⅓ yard	Set Star - Red/White (K)	656-81
4 ¼ yards	Flag and Words - Blue (Backing)	651-78

Cutting Instructions

Please note: All strips are cut across the width of fabric (WOF) from selvage to selvage edge unless otherwise noted.

From the 24 In x 44 In Panel - Blue/Red (A):

- Fussy cut (1) 22 ½" x 36 ½" rectangle, centered on the panel

From the Small Paisley - Red (B), cut:

- (2) 3" x 25 ½" WOF strips.
- (2) 2" x 36 ½" WOF strips.
- (3) 2" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (48) 2" squares.

From the Tossed Small Poppy - Red/White (C), cut:

- (2) 6 ½" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (8) 6 ½" squares.

From the Modern Melody Basics - Navy (D), cut:

- (3) 3 ½" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (32) 3 ½" squares.
- (1) 2 ½" x WOF strip. Sub-cut (8) 2 ½" squares.
- (4) Template 1 triangles.
- (4) Template 3 triangles.

From the Poppy Flowers & Flag - Red (E), cut:

- (1) 4 ½" x WOF strip. Sub-cut (2) 4 ½" x 6 ½" rectangles.
- (2) Template 2 diamonds.

From the Patriotic Ribbon - Multi (F), cut:

- (1) 3 ½" x WOF strip. Sub-cut (6) 3 ½" squares.

From the Packed Poppy Flower - Red (G), cut:

- (1) 3 ½" x WOF strip. Sub-cut (6) 3 ½" squares.

From the Fireworks - Blue (H), cut:

- (3) 2" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (48) 2" squares.
- (6) 2 ½" x WOF strips for the binding.

From the Folio Basics - White on White (I), cut:

- (3) 2" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (48) 2" squares.
- (4) 2" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (48) 2" x 3 ½" strips.

From the Border Stripe - Red/Blue (J), cut:

- (2) 7 ½" x 72" Length of Fabric (LOF) strips.
- (2) 7 ½" x 56" LOF strips.

From the Set Star - Red/White (K), cut:

- (3) 1 ½" x WOF strips. Sew the strips together with diagonal seams and cut (2) 1 ½" x 52 ½" strips.
- (2) 1 ½" x 38 ½" WOF strips.

From the Flag and Words - Blue (Backing), cut:

- (2) 76" x WOF strips for the backing. Sew the strips together and trim to make the 60" x 76" back.

Block Assembly

Note: The arrows in figures represent the fabric print direction. Pay attention to the fabric and unit orientations when assembling the various components. Use a ¼" seam allowance with right sides together (RST) unless otherwise noted.

1. Sew (1) 2" x 36 ½" Fabric B strip to each side of the 22 ½" x 36 ½" Fabric A rectangle. Sew (1) 3" x 25 ½" Fabric B strip to the top and to the bottom of the Fabric A rectangle to make the Center Block (Fig. 1). **Trim the block to measure 24 ½" x 40 ½"**.

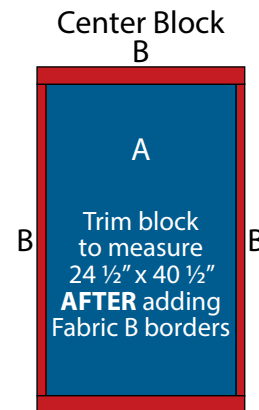

2. Place (1) 2" Fabric B square on the left side of (1) 2" x 3 ½" Fabric I strip, right sides together (Fig. 2). Sew across the diagonal of the square from the upper right corner to the lower left corner (Fig. 2). Flip open the triangle formed and press. Trim away the excess fabric from behind the triangle, leaving a ¼" seam allowance (Fig. 3).

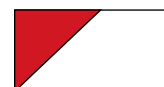

3. Place another 2" Fabric B square on the right side of the 2" x 3 1/2" Fabric I strip, right sides together (Fig. 4). Sew across the diagonal of the square from the upper left corner to the lower right corner (Fig. 4). Flip open the triangle formed and press. Trim away the excess fabric from behind the triangle, leaving a 1/4" seam allowance to make (1) Unit 1 strip (Fig. 5).

4. Repeat Steps 2-3 to make (24) Unit 1 strips total.

5. Repeat Steps 2-3 and refer to Figure 6 for fabric identification, placement and seam direction to make (24) Unit 2 strips.

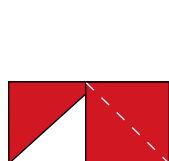

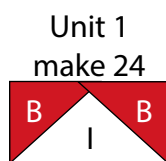

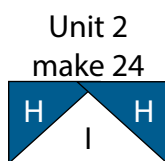

6. Sew (1) 2" Fabric I square to each end of (1) Unit 1 strip to make the top row. Repeat to make the bottom row. Sew (1) Unit 1 strip to each side of (1) 3 1/2" Fabric F square to make the middle row. Sew together the (3) rows lengthwise to make (1) 6 1/2" Block One square (Fig. 7). Repeat to make (6) Block One squares total.

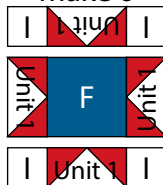

7. Repeat Step 6 and refer to Figure 8 for component identification, placement and orientation to make (6) Block Two squares.

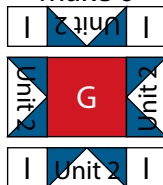

8. Place (1) 3 1/2" Fabric D square on the top left corner of (1) 6 1/2" Fabric C square, right sides together (Fig. 9). Sew across the diagonal of the smaller square from the upper right corner to the lower left corner (Fig. 9). Flip open the triangle formed and press. Trim away the excess fabric from behind the triangle 1/4" away from the sewn seam (Fig. 10).

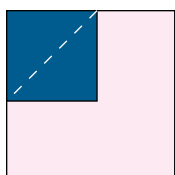

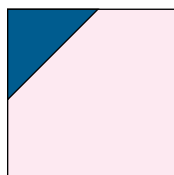

9. Follow Figure 11 for the seam direction to add a 3 1/2" Fabric D square to each of the remaining corners of the 6 1/2" Fabric C square to make (1) Block Three square (Fig. 12).

10. Repeat Steps 8-9 to make (8) Block Three squares total.

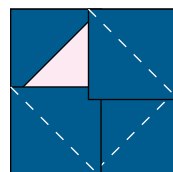

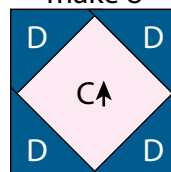

11. Place (1) 2 1/2" Fabric D square on the top left corner of (1) 4 1/2" x 6 1/2" Fabric E rectangle, right sides together (Fig. 13). Sew across the diagonal of the small square from the upper right corner to the lower left corner (Fig. 13). Flip open the triangle formed and press. Trim away the excess fabric from behind the triangle 1/4" away from the sewn seam (Fig. 14).

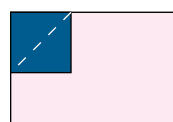

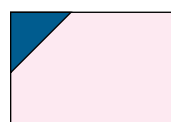

12. Follow Figure 15 for the seam direction to add a 2 1/2" Fabric D square to each of the remaining corners of the 4 1/2" x 6 1/2" Fabric E rectangle to make (1) Block Four rectangle (Fig. 16).

13. Repeat Steps 11-12 to make a second Block Four rectangle.

14. Follow Figure 17 and sew (1) Fabric D Template 1 triangle to the upper right and lower left sides of (1) Fabric E Template 2 diamond.

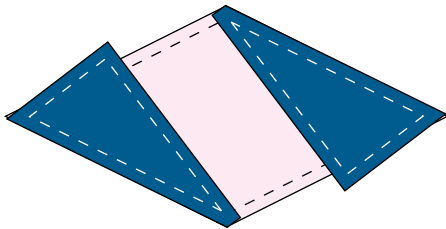

15. Follow Figure 18 and sew (1) Fabric D Template 3 triangle to the upper left and lower right sides of the Fabric E Template 2 diamond to make (1) Block Five rectangle (Fig. 19). The rectangle should measure 6 1/2" x 12 1/2".

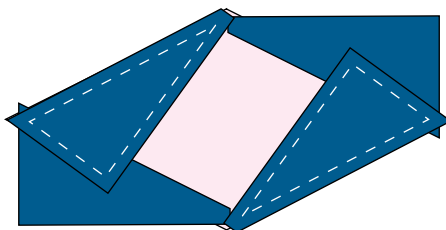

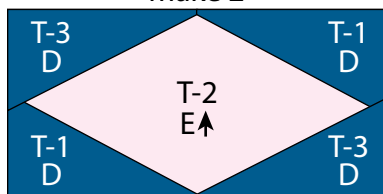

16. Follow Figure 20 and sew together (2) Block One squares, (2) Block Three squares, (2) Block Two squares and (1) Block Four rectangle to make the Left Side Border.

17. Repeat Step 16 and refer to Figure 21 for component identification, placement and orientation to make the Right Side Border.

18. Sew together (1) Block Three square, (1) Block Two square, (1) Block Five rectangle, (1) Block One square and (1) Block Three square, in that order from left to right, to make the Top Border (Fig. 22).

19. Sew together (1) Block Three square, (1) Block One square, (1) Block Five rectangle, (1) Block Two square and (1) Block Three square, in that order from left to right, to make the Bottom Border (Fig. 23).

Quilt Top Assembly

(Follow the *Quilt Layout* while assembling the quilt top.)

20. Sew the Left Side Border and Right Side Border to the left and to the right sides of the Center Block.

21. Sew the Top Border and the Bottom Border to the top and to the bottom of the Center Block.

22. Sew (1) 1 1/2" x 52 1/2" Fabric K strip to each side of the Center Block. Sew (1) 1 1/2" x 38 1/2" Fabric K strip to the top and to the bottom of the Center Block.

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23. Center (1) 7 ½" x 72" Fabric J strip on (1) side of the Center Block and pin in place. Start sewing the strip a ¼" from the top edge of the block and stop a ¼" from the bottom edge. **DO NOT TRIM THE EXCESS.** Repeat with the opposite side.

24. Repeat Step 23 to sew (1) 7 ½" x 56" Fabric J strip to the top and to the bottom of the Center Block, making sure to stop and start ¼" away from each end of the block. To miter each corner, fold the Center Block on a diagonal, wrong side together. This should line up the strips from adjacent sides (Fig. 24).

25. Starting at the sewn seam (represented by the arrow in Figure 24), draw a 45-degree line to the edge of the fabric. Sew on the drawn line. Trim the excess fabric leaving a ¼" seam. Repeat this step with the remaining corners to make the quilt top.

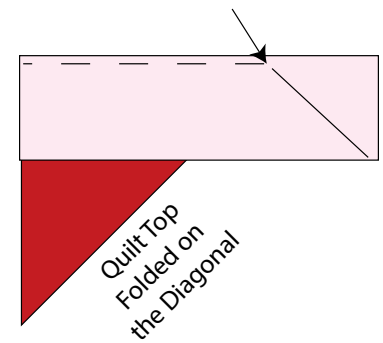
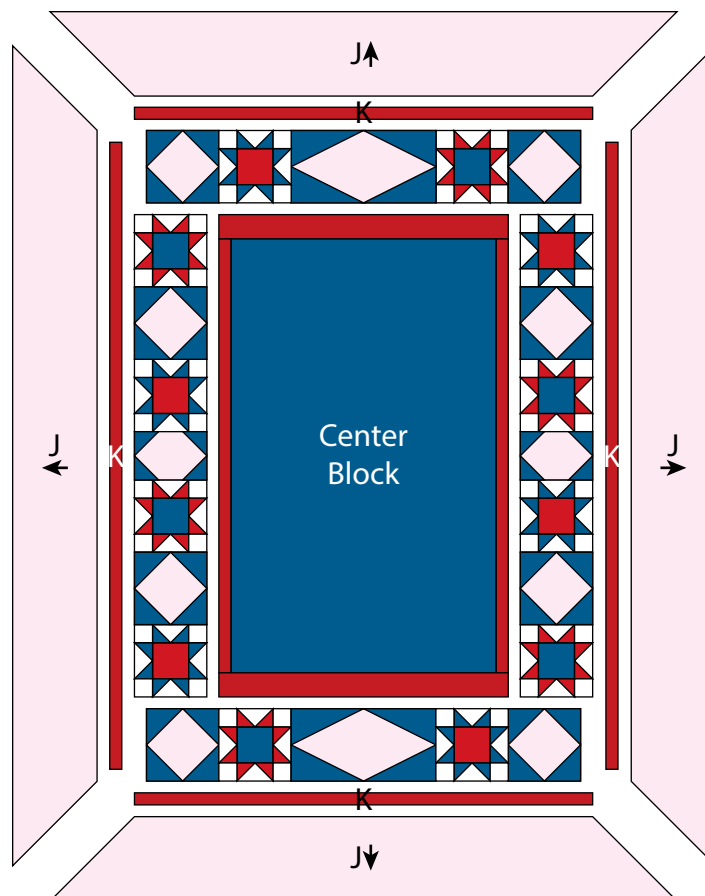

26. Layer and quilt as desired.

27. Sew the (6) 2 ½" x WOF Fabric H strips together, end to end with 45-degree seams, to make the binding. Fold this long strip in half lengthwise with wrong sides together and press.


28. Bind as desired.

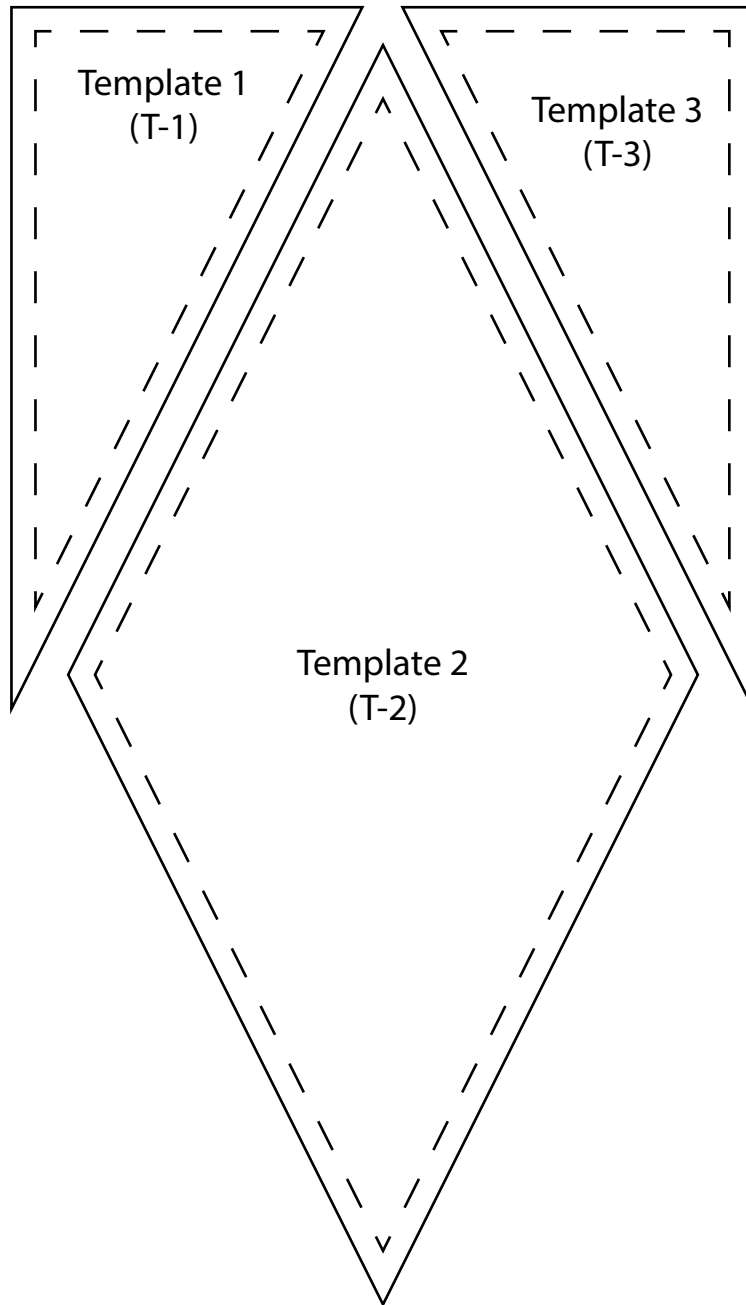


Quilt Layout
