

½ yard	Dots - Light Beige (B)	444-30
½ yard	Check - Gray (C)	456-90
1/4 yard	Tossed Hedgehog - Beige (D)	449-33
3/8 yard	Tossed Bunnies - Gray (E)	448-90
½ yard	Medium Floral Sprays - Gray (F)	450-90
1/4 yard	Small Floral Bouquets - Light Beige (G))443-30
¾ yard	Bricks Allover - Brick Red (H)	445-83*
1 ¼ yards	Doe & Bunny Toss - Beige (I)	441-33
3 1/4 yards	Mushroom Toss - Multi (Backing)	447-3

Cutting Instructions

Please note: All strips are cut across the width of fabric (WOF) from selvage to selvage edge unless otherwise noted.

From the 24 Inch Panel - Multi (A):

• Fussy cut (1) 22 ½" x 42 ½" rectangle, centered on the panel.

From the Dots - Light Beige (B), cut:

- (2) 2 ½" x 42 ½" WOF strips, piece as needed.
- (2) 2 ½" x 26 ½" WOF strips.

From the Check - Gray (C), cut:

- (4) 3" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (56) 3" squares
- (1) 3" x WOF strip. Sub-cut (4) 3" x 5 ½" strips.

From the Tossed Hedgehog - Beige (D), cut:

• (1) 5 ½" x WOF strip. Sub-cut (4) 5 ½" squares.

From the Tossed Bunnies - Gray (E), cut:

• (2) 5 ½" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (12) 5 ½" squares.

From the Medium Floral Sprays - Gray (F), cut:

- (2) 5 ½" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (8) 5 ½" squares.
- (1) 3" x WOF strip. Sub-cut (4) 3" x 5 ½" strips.

From the Small Floral Bouquets - Light Beige (G), cut:

• (1) 5 ½" x WOF strip. Sub-cut (4) 5 ½" squares.

From the Bricks Allover - Brick Red (H), cut:

- (3) 1 ½" x WOF strips. Sew the strips together end to end with diagonal seams and cut (2) 1 ½" x 55 ½" strips.
- (2) 1 ½" x 37 ½" WOF strips.
- (6) 2 ½" x WOF strips for the binding.

From the Doe & Bunny Toss - Beige (I), cut:

- (3) 6 ½" x WOF strips. Sew the strips together end to end with diagonal seams and cut (2) 6 ½" x 57 ½" strips.
- (3) 6 ½" x WOF strips. Sew the strips together end to end with diagonal seams and cut (2) 6 ½" x 49 ½" strips.


From the Mushroom Toss - Multi (Backing), cut:

• (2) 57" x WOF strips for the backing. Sew the strips together and trim to make the 57" x 77" back.

Block Assembly

Note: Pay attention to the unit orientations when assembling the various components. Use a 1/4" seam allowance with right sides together (RST) unless otherwise noted.

1. Sew (1) 2 ½' x 42 ½" Fabric B strip to each side of the 22 ½" x 42 ½" Fabric A rectangle. Sew (1) 2 ½" x 26 ½" Fabric B strip to the top and to the bottom of the Fabric A rectangle to make the Center Block (Fig. 1). Trim the block to measure 25 ½" x 45 ½".



2. Place (1) 3" Fabric C square on the top left corner of (1) 5 ½" Fabric E square, right sides together (Fig. 2). Sew across the diagonal of the smaller square from the upper right corner to the lower left corner (Fig. 2). Flip open the triangle formed and press. Trim away the excess fabric from behind the triangle 1/4" away from the sewn seam (Fig. 3).







- 3. Follow Figure 4 for the seam direction to add a 3" Fabric C square to the lower right corner of the 5 ½" Fabric E square to make (1) Unit 1 square (Fig. 5).
- 4. Repeat Steps 2-3 to make (12) Unit 1 squares total.




Unit 1 make 12


5. Repeat Steps 2-3 and refer to Figures 6-8 for fabric identification, placement and seam direction to make (4) Unit 2 squares, (8) Unit 3 squares and (4) Unit 4 squares.









6. Sew (1) 3" x 5 ½" Fabric F strip to the left side of (1) 3" x 5 ½" Fabric C strip lengthwise to make (1) 5 ½" Unit 5 square (Fig. 9). Repeat to make (4) Unit 5 squares total.




- 7. Refer to Figure 10 and sew together (9) assorted 5 1/2" Blocks to make the Left Side Border.
- 8. Repeat Step 7 and refer to Figures 11-13 for component identification, placement and orientation to make the Right Side Border, Top Border and Bottom Border.






Quilt Top Assembly

(Follow the Quilt Layout while assembling the quilt top.) 9. Sew the Left Side Border and Right Side Border to the left and to the right sides of the Center Block.

- 10. Sew the Top Border and the Bottom Border to the top and to the bottom of the Center Block.
- 11. Sew (1) 1 ½" x 55 ½" Fabric H strip to each side of the Center Block. Sew (1) 1 ½" x 37 ½" Fabric H strip to the top and to the bottom of the Center Block.
- 12. Sew (1) 6 ½" x 57 ½" Fabric I strip to each side of the Center Block. Sew (1) 6 ½" x 49 ½" Fabric I strip to the top and to the bottom of the Center Block to make the quilt top.
- 13. Layer and quilt as desired.
- 14. Sew the (6) 2 ½" x WOF Fabric H strips together, end to end with 45-degree seams, to make the binding. Fold this long strip in half lengthwise with wrong sides together and press.
- 15. Bind as desired.
