$2 / 3$ yard Fluffy Solid - White (B) Fluffy Solid-White
$1 / 2$ yard Fluffy Solid - Blue (C) Fluffy Solid-Blue
$3 / 8$ yard Tossed Animal Allover - White/Blue (D) F9717-1
$3 / 8$ yard Turtle, Owl, Birdie Allover - Blue (E) F9718-11
$3 / 8$ yard Tossed Giraffe - Green (F) F9715-66
$13 / 4$ yards Novelty Stripe Animals - Blue (G) F9719-11
$1 / 2$ yard Tiny Monotone Animal Line Work - Blue (H)
F9714-11*
$33 / 4$ yards Small Blocks Peeking Animals - Blue (Backing)
F9720-11

## Cutting Instructions

Please note: All strips are cut across the width of fabric (WOF) from selvage to selvage edge unless otherwise noted.

From the 5" Animal Blocks - Multi (A):

- Fussy cut (6) 6 " squares, each centered on a block.

From the Fluffy Solid - White (B), cut:

- (2) $31 / 2 " \times$ WOF strips. Sub-cut (12) $31 / 2 " \times 6$ " strips.
- (4) $31 / 2 " \times$ WOF strips. Sub-cut (12) $31 / 2 " \times 12 "$ strips.


## From the Fluffy Solid - Blue (C), cut:

-(3) $41 / 2$ " x WOF strips. Sub-cut (24) $41 / 2 "$ squares.
From the Tossed Animal Allover - White/Blue (D), cut: - (1) $111 / 4 " \times$ WOF strip. Sub-cut (3) $111 / 4 "$ squares. Cut the squares both diagonals to make (12) $111 / 4 "$ triangles.

From the Turtle, Owl, Birdie Allover - Blue (E), cut:

- (1) $111 / 4 " \times$ WOF strip. Sub-cut (3) $111 / 4 "$ squares. Cut the squares both diagonals to make (12) $111 / 4 "$ triangles.

From the Tossed Giraffe - Green (F), cut:
-(2) $21 / 2 " \times 401 / 2 "$ WOF strips.

- (2) $21 / 2 " \times 341 / 2 "$ WOF strips.

From the Novelty Stripe Animals - Blue (G), cut:

- (2) $61 / 2 " \times 60$ " Length of Fabric (LOF) strips.
-(2) $6 \frac{1}{2}$ " $\times 50$ " LOF strips.
From the Tiny Monotone Animal Line Work - Blue (H), cut: - (6) $21 / 2$ " $\times$ WOF strips for the binding.

From the Small Blocks Peeking Animals - Blue (Backing), cut:

- (2) 64 " x WOF strips for the backing. Sew the strips together and trim to make the 54 " x 64 " back.

Block Assembly
Note: The arrows in figures represent the fabric print direction. Pay attention to the fabric and unit orientations when assembling the various components. Use a $1 / 4$ " seam allowance with right sides together (RST) unless otherwise noted.

1. Sew (1) $31 / 2 " \times 6 "$ Fabric B strip to each side of (1) 6 " Fabric A square. Sew (1) $31 / 2 " \times 12$ " Fabric B strip to the top and to the bottom of the Fabric A square to make (1) Unit 1 square (Fig. 1). Trim the unit to measure $101 / 2 " \times 101 / 2 "$. Repeat to make (6) Unit 1 squares total.

2. Place (1) $41 / 2 "$ Fabric C square on the top left corner of (1) Unit 1 square, right sides together (Fig. 2). Sew across the diagonal of the smaller square from the upper right corner to the lower left corner (Fig. 2). Flip open the triangle formed and press. Trim away the excess fabric from behind the triangle $1 / 4$ " away from the sewn seam (Fig. 3).

3. Follow Figure 4 for the seam direction to add a $41 / 2 "$ Fabric C square to each of the remaining corners of the Unit 1 square to make (1) Block One square (Fig. 5).
4. Repeat Steps 2-3 to make (6) Block One squares total.

5. Sew together (2) $11 \frac{1}{4} / "$ Fabric E triangles and (2) $111 / 4 / 3$ Fabric D triangles to make (1) Block Two square (Fig. 6). The block should measure $101 / 2 "$ square. Repeat to make (6) Block Two squares total.

## Quilt Top Assembly

(Follow the Quilt Layout while assembling the quilt top.) 6. Sew (1) Block One square to each side of (1) Block Two square to make Row One. Repeat to make Row Three.
7. Sew (1) Block Two square to each side of (1) Block One square to make Row Two. Repeat to make Row Four.
8. Sew together the (4) Rows lengthwise to make the Center Block.
9. Sew (1) $21 / 2 " \times 401 / 2 "$ Fabric F strip to each side of the Center Block. Sew (1) $21 / 2 " \times 341 / 2 "$ Fabric F strip to the top and to the bottom of the Center Block.
10. Center (1) $61 / 2 " \times 60 "$ Fabric G strip on (1) side of the Center Block and pin in place. Start sewing the strip a $1 / 4 "$ from the top edge of the block and stop a $1 / 4 "$ from the bottom edge. DO NOT TRIM THE EXCESS. Repeat with the opposite side.
11. Repeat Step 10 to sew (1) $6^{1 / 2 "} \times 50 "$ Fabric G strip to the top and to the bottom of the Center Block, making sure to stop and start $1 / 4$ " away from each end of the block. To miter each corner, fold the Center Block on a diagonal, wrong side together. This should line up the strips from adjacent sides (Fig. 7).
12. Starting at the sewn seam (represented by the arrow in Figure 7), draw a 45 -degree line to the edge of the fabric. Sew on the drawn line. Trim the excess fabric leaving a $1 / 4$ " seam. Repeat this step with the remaining corners to make the quilt top.

13. Layer and quilt as desired.
14. Sew the (6) $21 / 2 " \times$ WOF Fabric H strips together, end to end with 45 -degree seams, to make the binding. Fold this long strip in half lengthwise with wrong sides together and press.
15. Bind as desired.
