7/8 yard	Fluffy Solid - Off White (D)	Fluffy Solid-Off White
1/4 yard	Pinecones - Beige (E)	F9254-43
1/4 yard	Mittens and Gloves Allover - Blue (F)	F9258-11
1/4 yard	Skiers - Beige (G)	F9257-44
1/4 yard	Ice Skates and Snowshoes Allover - Brown (H)	F9259-33
1 2/3 yards	Novelty Winter Stripe - Beige/Brown (I)	F9261-33
5 yards	Words and Winter Motifs - Multi (Backing)	F9255-16

## Cutting Instructions

Please note: all strips are cut across the width of fabric (WOF) from selvage to selvage unless otherwise noted.

### From the Blocks - Multi (A):

- Fussy cut (8) 7 1/2" x 10 1/2" blocks.

### From the Moose, Bears, Deer on Woodgrain - Brown (B), cut:

- (1) 10 1/2" x 7 1/2" WOF strip.

### From the Stars on Woodgrain - Blue (C), cut:

- (1) 10 1/2" x WOF strip. Sub-cut (16) 10 1/2" x 2 1/2" strips.
- (1) 10 1/2" x WOF strip. Sub-cut (2) 10 1/2" x 2" strips and (2) 2" x 10 1/2" WOF strips.
- (4) 3 1/2" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (48) 3 1/2" squares.
- (6) 2 1/2" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (16) 2 1/2" x 11 1/2" strips.
- (7) 2 1/2" x WOF strips for the binding.

### From the Fluffy Solid - Off White (D), cut:

- (4) 4" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (24) 4" x 6 1/2" strips.
- (3) 4" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (24) 4" squares.

### From the Pinecones - Beige (E), cut:

- (1) 6 1/2" x WOF strip. Sub-cut (2) 6 1/2" squares.

### From the Mittens and Gloves Allover - Blue (F), cut:

- (1) 6 1/2" x WOF strip. Sub-cut (2) 6 1/2" squares.

### From the Skiers - Beige (G), cut:

- (1) 6 1/2" square.

### From the Ice Skates and Snowshoes Allover - Brown (H), cut:

- (1) 6 1/2" square.

### From the Novelty Winter Stripe - Beige/Brown (I):

- Fussy cut (4) 10 1/2" x 56 1/2" Length of Fabric (LOF) strips, each centered on a column of skiers from the words to the snowflakes.

## From the Words and Winter Motifs - Multi (Backing), cut:

- (2) 87" x WOF strips for the backing. Sew the strips together and trim to make the 64" x 87" back.

## Block Assembly

**Note:** The arrows in figures represent the fabric print direction. Pay attention to the fabric and unit orientations when assembling the various components.

- Sew (1) 2 1/2" x 10 1/2" Fabric C strip to each side of (1) 7 1/2" x 10 1/2" Fabric A block. Sew (1) 2 1/2" x 11 1/2" Fabric C strip to the top and to the bottom of the Fabric A block. Trim the block to measure 10 1/2" x 13 1/2" to make (1) Block One rectangle (Fig. 1). Repeat to make (8) Block One rectangles total.

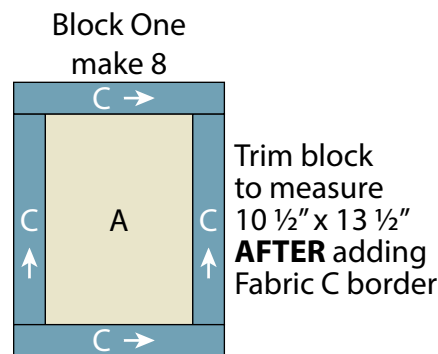

- Sew (1) 2" x 10 1/2" Fabric C strip to each side of (1) 7 1/2" x 10 1/2" Fabric B strip. Sew (1) 2" x 10 1/2" Fabric C strip to the top and to the bottom of the Fabric B strip to make (1) Block Two rectangle.

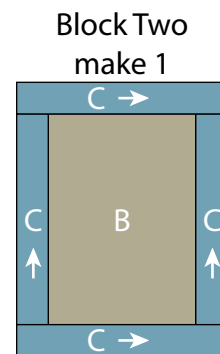

- Place (1) 3 1/2" Fabric C square on the top left corner of (1) 4" x 6 1/2" strip, right sides together (Fig. 3). Sew across the diagonal of the smaller square from the upper right corner to the lower left corner (Fig. 3). Flip open the triangle formed and press (Fig. 4). Trim away the excess fabric from behind the triangle 1/4" away from the sewn seam.

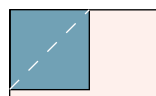

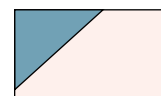

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4. Follow Figure 5 for the seam direction to add a 3 ½" Fabric C square to the upper right corner of the 4" x 6 ½" Fabric D strip to make (1) Unit 1 strip (Fig. 6).

5. Repeat Steps 3-4 to make (24) Unit 1 strips total.

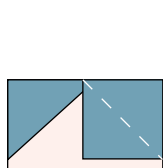

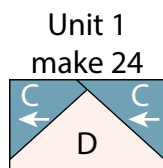

6. Sew 4" Fabric D square to each end of (1) Unit 1 strip to make the top row. Repeat to make the bottom row. Sew (1) Unit 1 strip to each side of (1) 6 ½" Fabric E square to make the middle row. Sew the (3) rows together lengthwise to make (1) Block Three square (Fig. 7). Repeat to make a second Block Three square.

7. Repeat Step 6 and refer to Figures 8-10 for fabric identification, placement and orientation to make (2) Block Four squares, (1) Block Five square and (1) Block Six square.

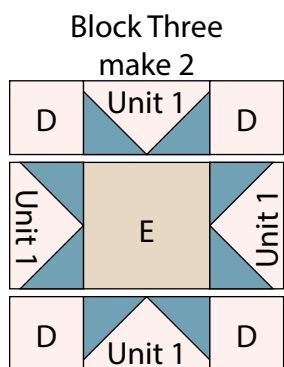

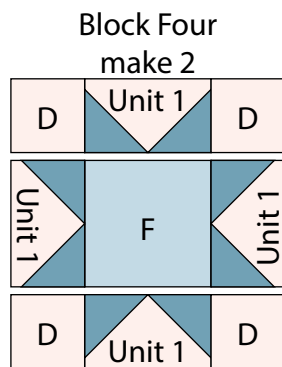

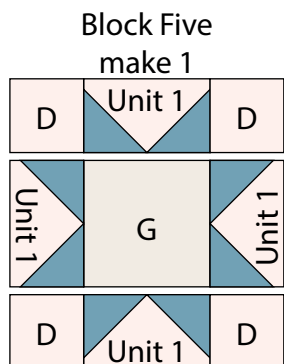

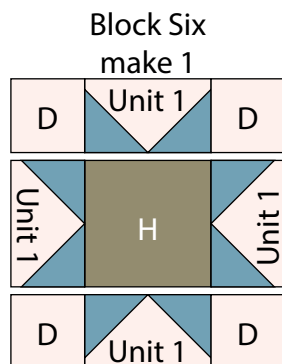

## Quilt Top Assembly

*(Follow the Quilt Layout while assembling the quilt top.)*

8. Sew together (1) Block One rectangle, (1) Block Three square, (1) Block One rectangle, (1) Block Four square and (1) Block One rectangle, in that order from left to right, to make Pieced Row One.

9. Sew together (1) Block One rectangle, (1) Block Five square, (1) Block Two rectangle, (1) Block Six square and (1) Block One rectangle, in that order from left to right, to make Pieced Row Two.

10. Sew together (1) Block One rectangle, (1) Block Four square, (1) Block One rectangle, (1) Block Three square and (1) Block One rectangle, in that order from left to right, to make Pieced Row Three.

11. Sew (4) 10 ½" x 56 ½" Fabric I strips and the (3) Pieced Rows, in numerical order, together and alternating them, to make the quilt top.

12. Layer and quilt as desired.

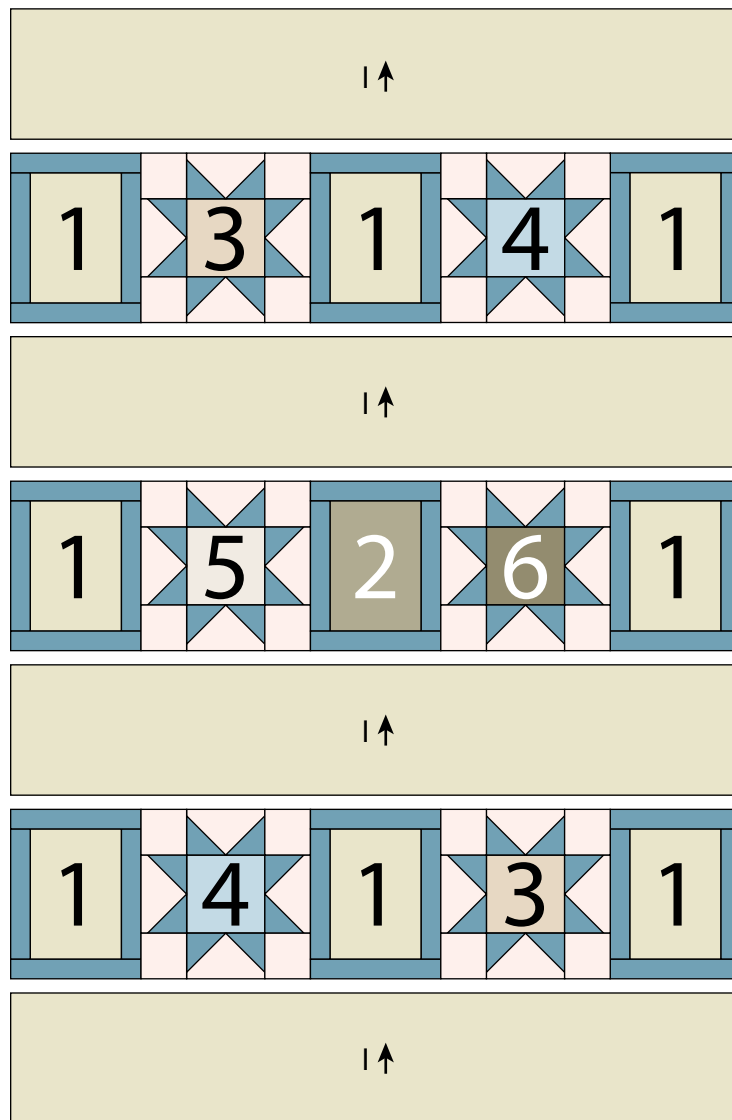
13. Sew the (7) 2 ½" x WOF Fabric C strips together, end to end with 45-degree seams, to make the binding. Fold this long strip in half lengthwise with wrong sides together and press.

14. Bind as desired.
