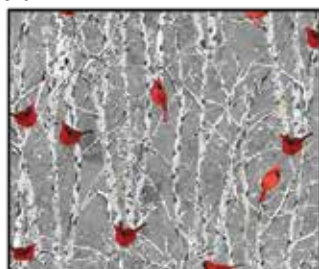

½ yard	Cars, Campers and Cabins - Multi (C)	9090-11
½ yard	Pinecones - Green/Brown (D)	9088-69
⅞ yard	Snowflake - Gray (E)	9094-90
½ yard	Plaid - Aqua/Brown (F)	9089-19
⅜ yard	Cardinals in Birch Trees - Gray (G)	9091-90
¼ yard	Forest - Green (H)	9086-6
½ yard	Snowflake - Aqua (I)	9094-11
2 ⅞ yards	Novelty Scenic Stripe - Multi (J)	9093-19
3 ¾ yards	Sleds and Skis - Gray (Backing)	9087-90

Cutting Instructions

Please note: all strips are cut across the width of fabric (WOF) from selvage to selvage edge unless otherwise noted.

From the Scenic Panel - Multi (A):

- Fussy cut (1) 21 ¾" x 34 ¾" strip centered on the panel.

From the Folio Basic - Brown Bag (B), cut:

- (1) 4 ¼" x WOF strip. Sub-cut (9) 4 ¼" squares. Cut the squares across both diagonals to make (36) 4 ¼" triangles.
- (7) 2 ½" x WOF strips for the binding.
- (2) 2 ½" x 34 ¾" WOF strips.
- (2) 2" x 25 ¾" WOF strips.
- (3) 1 ½" x WOF strips. Sew the strips together end to end with diagonal seams and cut (2) 1 ½" x 54 ½" strips.
- (3) 1 ½" x WOF strips. Sew the strips together end to end with diagonal seams and cut (2) 1 ½" x 47 ½" strips.

From the Cars, Campers and Cabins - Multi (C):

- Fussy cut (9) 3 ½" squares each centered on car, camper or cabin.

From the Pinecones - Green/Brown (D), cut:

- (2) 3 ⅞" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (18) 3 ⅞" squares. Cut the squares across (1) diagonal to make (36) 3 ⅞" triangles.

From the Snowflake - Gray (E), cut:

- (1) 4 ¼" x WOF strip. Sub-cut (9) 4 ¼" squares. Cut the squares across both diagonals to make (36) 4 ¼" triangles.
- (2) 3 ⅞" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (18) 3 ⅞" squares.
- (3) 3 ½" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (36) 3 ½" squares.
- (2) 2" x 36 ½" WOF strips.

From the Plaid - Aqua/Brown (F), cut:

- (2) 3 ⅞" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (18) 3 ⅞" squares.

From the Cardinals in Birch Trees - Gray (G), cut:

- (3) 3 ½" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (36) 3 ½" squares.

From the Forest - Green (H), cut:

- (1) 3 ½" x WOF strip. Sub-cut (9) 3 ½" squares.

From the Snowflake - Aqua (I), cut:

- (4) 2" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (72) 2" squares.

From the Novelty Scenic Stripe - Multi (J), cut:

- (2) 6" x 71" Length of Fabric (LOF) strips.
- (2) 6" x 62" LOF strips.

From the Sleds and Skis - Gray (Back), cut:

- (2) 66" x WOF strips for the backing. Sew the strips together and trim to make the 66" x 75" back.

Block Assembly

Note: The arrows in figures represent the fabric print direction. Pay attention to the fabric and unit orientations when assembling the various components.

- Sew (1) 2 ½" x 34 ¾" Fabric B strip to each side of the 21 ¾" x 34 ¾" Fabric A panel. Sew (1) 2" x 25 ¾" Fabric B strip to the top and to the bottom of the Fabric A panel. Trim the block to measure 24 ½" x 36 ½" to make the Center Block (Fig. 1).

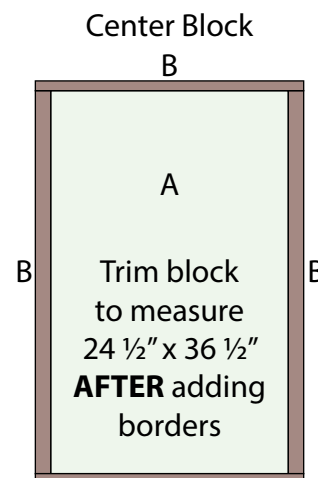


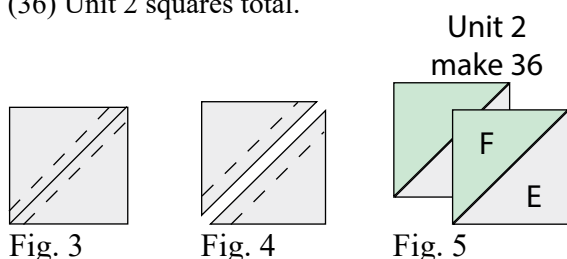

- Sew (1) 4 ¼" Fabric E triangle and (1) 4 ¼" Fabric B triangle together along a short side. Sew (1) 3 ⅞" Fabric D triangle to the long side of the newly sewn triangle to make (1) Unit 1 square (Fig. 2). The block should measure 3 ½" square. Repeat to make (36) Unit 1 squares total.

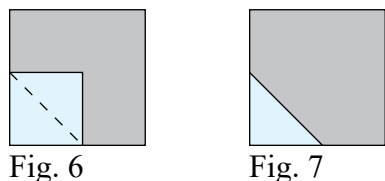

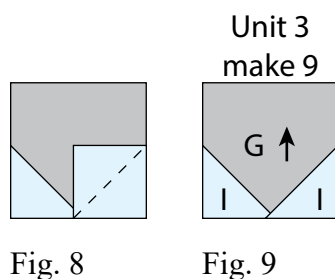
3. Place (1) $3\frac{7}{8}$ " Fabric E square on top of (1) $3\frac{7}{8}$ " Fabric F square, right sides together. Draw a line across the diagonal of the top square (Fig. 3). Sew $\frac{1}{4}$ " away from each side of the drawn diagonal line (Fig. 3). Cut the (2) squares apart on the drawn diagonal line (Fig. 4) to make (2) half-square triangles. Trim the half-square triangles to measure $3\frac{1}{2}$ " square to make (2) Unit 2 squares (Fig. 5). Repeat to make (36) Unit 2 squares total.



4. Place (1) 2" Fabric I square on the bottom left corner of (1) $3\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric G square, right sides together (Fig. 6). Sew across the diagonal of the smaller square from the upper left corner to the lower right corner (Fig. 6). Flip open the triangle formed and press (Fig. 7). Trim away the excess fabric from behind the triangle $\frac{1}{4}$ " away from the sewn seam.

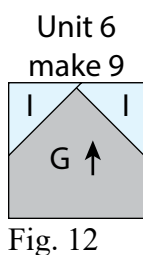
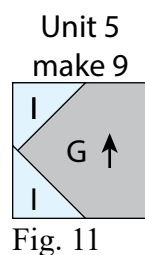
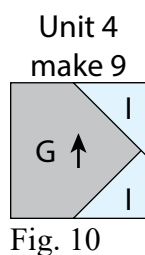


5. Follow Figure 8 for the seam direction to add a 2" Fabric I square to the lower right corner of the $3\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric G square to make (1) Unit 3 square (Fig. 9).



6. Repeat Steps 4-5 to make (9) Unit 3 squares total.

7. Repeat Steps 4-5 and refer to Figures 10-12 for fabric identification, placement and seam direction to make (9) of each unit for Unit 4 through Unit 6.



8. Sew (1) $3\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric E square to each side of (1) Unit 1 square to make the top row. Repeat to make the bottom row. Sew (1) Unit 1 square to each side of (1) $3\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric C square to make the middle row. Sew the (3) rows together lengthwise to make (1) Block One square (Fig. 13). Repeat to make (9) Block One squares total.

9. Sew (1) Unit 2 square to each side of (1) Unit 3 square to make the top row. Sew (1) Unit 2 square to each side of (1) Unit 6 square to make the bottom row. Sew (1) Unit 4 square to the left side of (1) $3\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric H square. Sew (1) Unit 5 square to the right side of the Fabric H square to make the middle row. Sew the (3) rows together lengthwise to make (1) Block Two square (Fig. 14). Repeat to make (9) Block Two squares total.

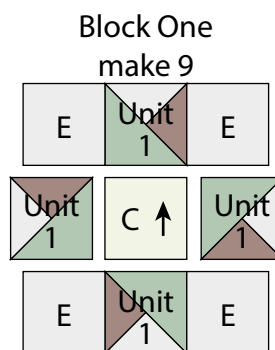

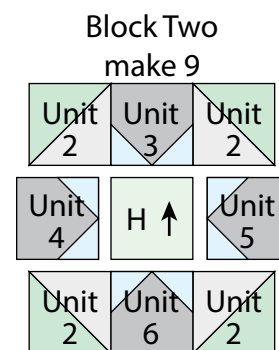

Quilt Top Assembly

(Follow the Quilt Layout while assembling the quilt top.)

10. Sew (1) 2" x $36\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric E strip to each side of the Center Block.

11. Sew (2) Block Two squares and (2) Block One squares together, alternating them. Repeat to make a second strip. Sew (1) strip to each side of the Center Block.

12. Sew (3) Block One squares and (2) Block Two squares together, alternating them. Sew the new strip to the top of the Center Block.

13. Sew (3) Block Two squares and (2) Block One squares together, alternating them. Sew the new strip to the bottom of the Center Block.

14. Sew (1) $1\frac{1}{2}$ " x $54\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric B strip to each side of the Center Block. Sew (1) $1\frac{1}{2}$ " x $47\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric B strip to the top and to the bottom of the Center Block.

15. Center (1) 6" x 71" Fabric J strip on (1) side of the Center Block and pin in place. Start sewing the strip a $\frac{1}{4}$ " from the top edge of the block and stop a $\frac{1}{4}$ " from the bottom edge. **DO NOT TRIM THE EXCESS.** Repeat with the opposite side.

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16. Repeat Step 15 to sew (1) 6" x 62" Fabric J strip to the top and to the bottom of the Center Block, making sure to stop and start ¼" away from each end of the block. To miter each corner, fold the Center Block on a diagonal, wrong side together. This should line up the strips from adjacent sides (Fig. 15).

17. Starting at the sewn seam (represented by the arrow in Figure 15), draw a 45-degree line to the edge of the fabric. Sew on the drawn line. Trim the excess fabric leaving a ¼" seam. Repeat this step with the remaining corners to make the quilt top.

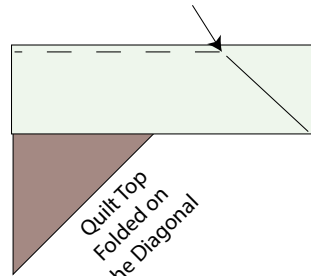
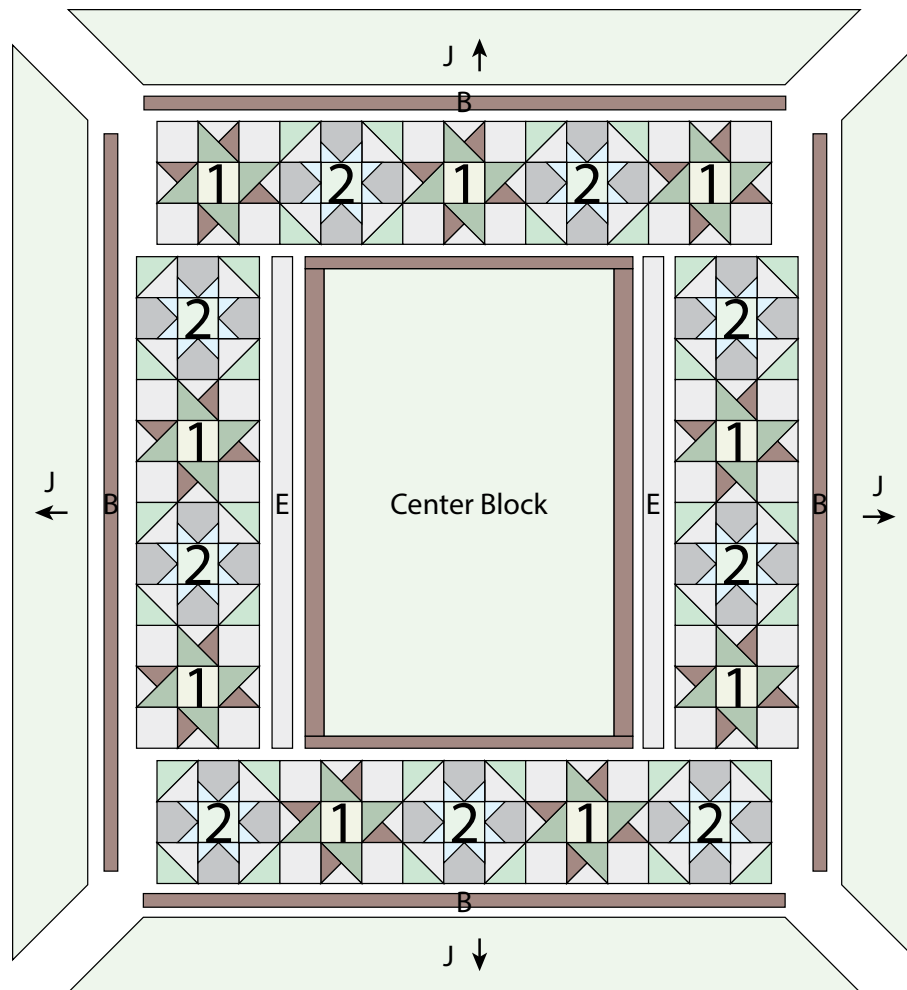

18. Layer and quilt as desired.

19. Sew the (7) 2 ½" x WOF Fabric B strips together, end to end with 45-degree seams, to make the binding. Fold this long strip in half lengthwise with wrong sides together and press.

20. Bind as desired.
