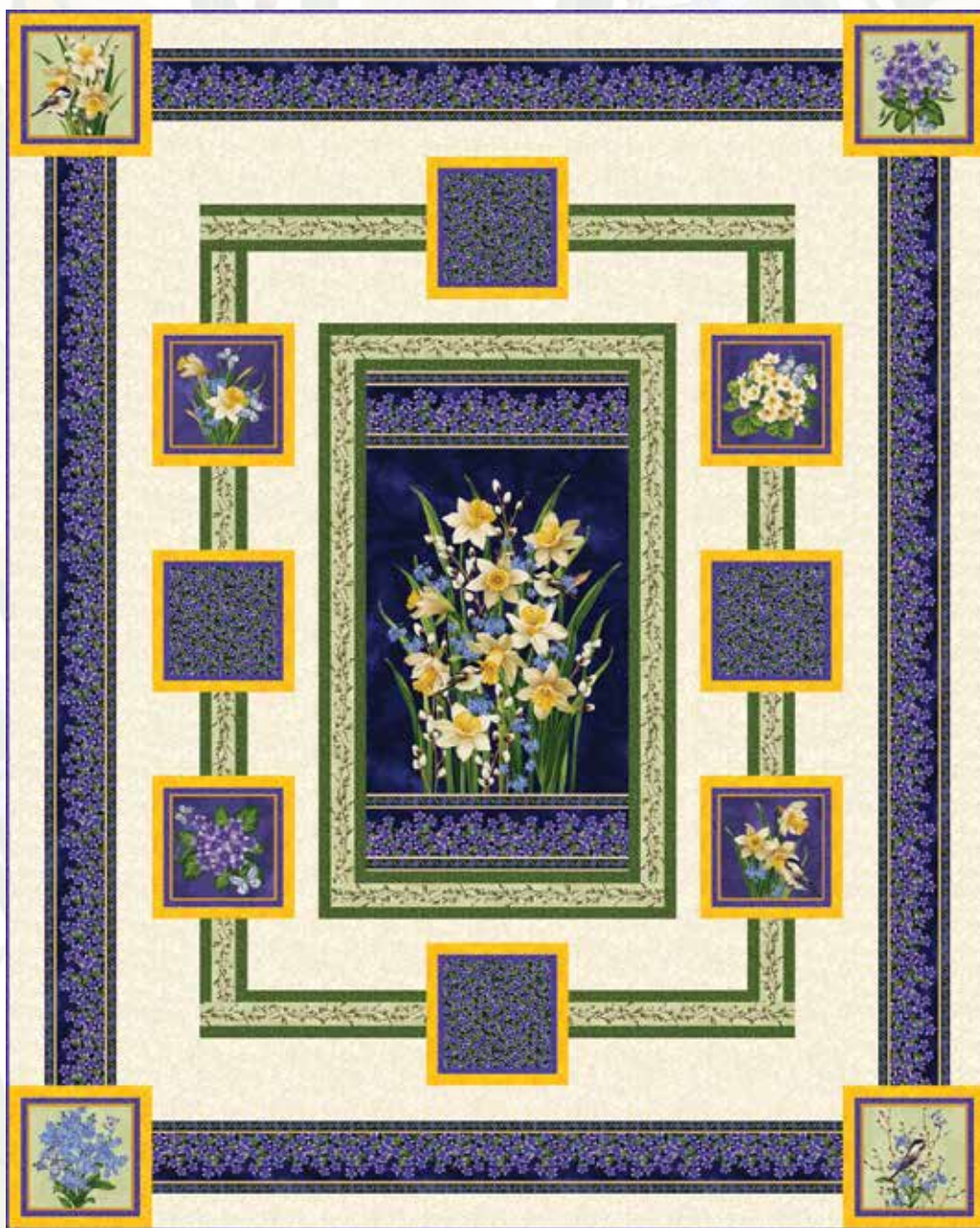

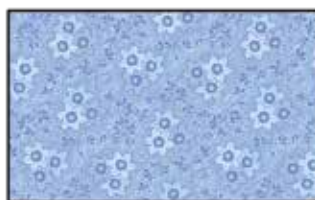

3/8 yard (0.35m)	Violets Allover - Indigo (E)	3159-77
1 3/8 yards (1.26m)	Rosemary Basics - Blue/Violet (F)	3160-75*
2/3 yard (0.61m)	Folio Basics - Yellow (G)	7755-34
2/3 yard (0.61m)	Blocks - Indigo (H)	3161-77
7 1/2 yards (6.86m)	Daffodil Monotones - Yellow (Backing)	3157-33

Cutting Instructions

Please note: All strips are cut across the width of fabric (WOF) from selvage to selvage edge unless otherwise noted.

From the Panel 24 x 44 - Indigo (A):

- Fussy cut (1) 22 1/2" x 42 1/2" rectangle, centered on the panel.

From the Rosemary Basics - Dark Green (B), cut:

- (2) 2" x 42 1/2" WOF strips, piece as needed.
- (2) 2" x 25 1/2" WOF strips.
- (2) 1 1/2" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (8) 1 1/2" x 7 1/2" strips.
- (4) 1 1/2" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (8) 1 1/2" x 19 1/2" strips.
- (3) 1 1/2" x WOF strips. Sew the strips together end to end with diagonal seams and cut (2) 1 1/2" x 48 1/2" strips.
- (2) 1 1/2" x 30 1/2" WOF strips.
- (2) 1 1/2" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (8) 1 1/2" x 6 1/2" strips.

From the Border Stripe - Indigo (C), fussy cut:

- (2) 6 1/2" x 78 1/2" strips, each centered on a purple stripe.
- (2) 6 1/2" x 58 1/2" strips, each centered on a purple stripe.
- (2) 2 1/2" x 44 1/2" strips, each centered a green stripe.
- (2) 2 1/2" x 28 1/2" strips, each centered in a green stripe.
- (4) 2 1/2" x 19 1/2" strips, each centered on a green stripe.
- (4) 2 1/2" x 7 1/2" strips, each centered on a green stripe.
- (4) 2 1/2" x 6 1/2" strips, each centered on a green stripe.

From the Folio Basics - Off White (D), cut:

- (2) 6 1/2" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (4) 6 1/2" x 15 1/2" strips.
- (2) 4 1/2" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (8) 4 1/2" x 7 1/2" strips.
- (4) 4 1/2" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (4) 4 1/2" x 23 1/2" strips and (4) 4 1/2" x 10 1/2" strips, (1) of each from each strip.
- (8) 3 1/2" x WOF strips. Sew the strips together end to end with diagonal seams and cut (4) 3 1/2" x 78 1/2" strips.
- (6) 3 1/2" x WOF strips. Sew the strips together end to end with diagonal seams and cut (4) 3 1/2" x 58 1/2" strips.
- (1) 2 1/2" x WOF strip. Sub-cut (2) 2 1/2" x 12 1/2" strips.

From the Violets Allover - Indigo (E), cut:

- (1) 9 1/2" x WOF strip. Sub-cut (4) 9 1/2" squares.

From the Rosemary Basics - Blue/Violet (F), cut:

- (4) 1 1/2" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (16) 1 1/2" x 9 1/2" strips.
- (6) 1 1/2" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (16) 1 1/2" x 11 1/2" strips.
- (2) 1" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (8) 1" x 9 1/2" strips.
- (2) 1" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (8) 1" x 10 1/2" strips.
- (10) 2 1/2" x WOF strips for the binding.

From the Folio Basics - Yellow (G), cut:

- (6) 1 1/2" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (24) 1 1/2" x 10 1/2" strips.
- (8) 1 1/2" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (24) 1 1/2" x 12 1/2" strips.

From the Blocks - Indigo (H), fussy cut:

- (4) 9 1/2" squares, centered on purple blocks.
- (4) 9 1/2" squares, centered on green blocks.

From the Daffodil Montones - Yellow (Backing), cut:

- (3) 90" x WOF strips for the backing. Sew the strips together and trim to make the 90" x 110" back.

Block Assembly

Note: The arrows in figures represent the fabric print direction. Pay attention to the fabric and unit orientations when assembling the various components. Use a 1/4" seam allowance with right sides together (RST) unless otherwise noted.

1. Sew (1) 2" x 42 1/2" Fabric B strip to each side of the 22 1/2" x 42 1/2" Fabric A rectangle. Sew (1) 2" x 25 1/2" Fabric B strip to the top and to the bottom of the Fabric A rectangle to make (1) Unit 1 rectangle (Fig. 1). **Trim the block to measure 24 1/2" x 44 1/2"**.

2. Sew (1) 2 1/2" x 44 1/2" Fabric C strip to each side of the Unit 1 rectangle. Sew (1) 2 1/2" x 28 1/2" Fabric C strip to the top and to the bottom of the Unit 1 rectangle to make (1) Unit 2 rectangle (Fig. 2).

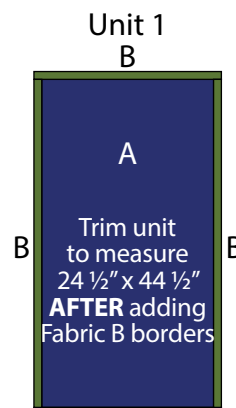

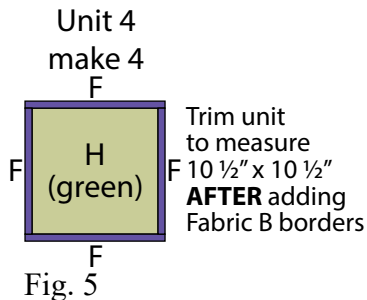
3. Sew (1) $1\frac{1}{2}$ " x $48\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric B strip to each side of the Unit 2 rectangle. Sew (1) $1\frac{1}{2}$ " x $30\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric B strip to the top and to the bottom of the Unit 2 rectangle to make the $30\frac{1}{2}$ " x $50\frac{1}{2}$ " Center Block (Fig. 3).



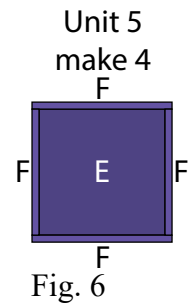
4. Sew (1) $1\frac{1}{2}$ " x $9\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric F strip to each side of (1) $9\frac{1}{2}$ " purple Fabric H square. Sew (1) $1\frac{1}{2}$ " x $11\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric F strip to the top and to the bottom of the Fabric H square to make (1) Unit 3 square (Fig. 4). **Trim the unit to measure $10\frac{1}{2}$ " x $10\frac{1}{2}$ ".** Repeat to make (4) Unit 3 squares total.



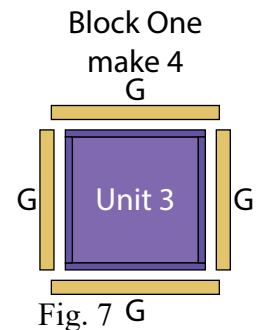
5. Sew (1) $1\frac{1}{2}$ " x $9\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric F strip to each side of (1) $9\frac{1}{2}$ " green Fabric H square. Sew (1) $1\frac{1}{2}$ " x $11\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric F strip to the top and to the bottom of the Fabric H square to make (1) Unit 4 square (Fig. 5). **Trim the unit to measure $10\frac{1}{2}$ " x $10\frac{1}{2}$ ".** Repeat to make (4) Unit 4 squares total.



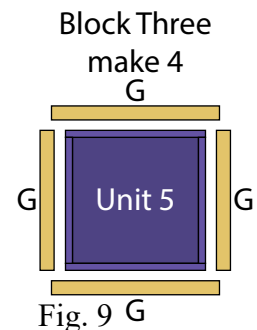
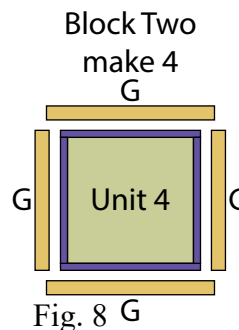
6. Sew (1) 1 " x $9\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric F strip to each side of (1) $9\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric E square. Sew (1) 1 " x $10\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric F strip to the top and to the bottom of the Fabric E square to make (1) $10\frac{1}{2}$ " Unit 5 square (Fig. 6). Repeat to make (4) Unit 5 squares total.



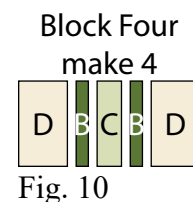
7. Sew (1) $1\frac{1}{2}$ " x $10\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric G strip to each side of (1) Unit 3 square. Sew (1) $1\frac{1}{2}$ " x $12\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric G strip to the top and to the bottom of the Unit 3 square to make (1) $12\frac{1}{2}$ " Block One square (Fig. 7). Repeat to make (4) Block One squares total.



8. Repeat Step 7 and refer to Figures 8-9 for component identification and placement to make (4) Block Two squares and (4) Block Three squares.



9. Sew together (1) $4\frac{1}{2}$ " x $7\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric D strip, (1) $1\frac{1}{2}$ " x $7\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric B strip, (1) $2\frac{1}{2}$ " x $7\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric C strip, (1) $1\frac{1}{2}$ " x $7\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric B strip and (1) $4\frac{1}{2}$ " x $7\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric D strip, lengthwise and in that order from left to right, to make (1) Block Four strip (Fig. 10). Repeat to make (4) Block Four strips total.



10. Sew together (1) Block One square, (1) Block Four strip, (1) Block Three square, (1) Block Four strip and (1) Block One square, in that order from top to bottom, to make (1) Inner Side Border (Fig. 11). Repeat to make a second Inner Side Border.

11. Sew (1) $1\frac{1}{2}$ " x $6\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric B strip to each side of (1) $2\frac{1}{2}$ " x $6\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric C strip lengthwise to make (1) Unit 6 rectangle (Fig. 12). Repeat to make (4) Unit 6 rectangles total.

12. Sew (1) $1\frac{1}{2}$ " x $19\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric B strip to the top and to the bottom of (1) $2\frac{1}{2}$ " x $19\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric C strip to make (1) Unit 7 strip (Fig. 13). Repeat to make (4) Unit 7 strips total.

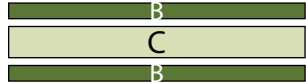

13. Sew (1) Unit 6 rectangle to the left end of (1) $6\frac{1}{2}$ " x $15\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric D strip. Sew (1) Unit 7 strip to the top of the newly sewn strip lengthwise to make (1) Unit 8 rectangle (Fig. 14). Repeat to make a second Unit 8 rectangle.

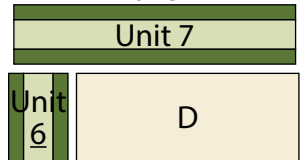

14. Sew (1) Unit 6 rectangle to the right end of (1) $6\frac{1}{2}$ " x $15\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric D strip. Sew (1) Unit 7 strip to the top of the newly sewn strip lengthwise to make (1) Unit 9 rectangle (Fig. 15). Repeat to make a second Unit 9 rectangle.

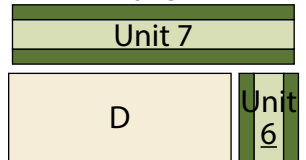

15. Sew (1) $4\frac{1}{2}$ " x $10\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric D strip to the left end of (1) Unit 8 rectangle. Sew (1) $4\frac{1}{2}$ " x $23\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric D strip to the top of the newly sewn strip lengthwise to make (1) Unit 10 rectangle (Fig. 16). Repeat to make a second Unit 10 rectangle.

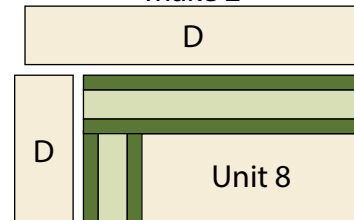

16. Sew (1) $4\frac{1}{2}$ " x $10\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric D strip to the right end of (1) Unit 9 rectangle. Sew (1) $4\frac{1}{2}$ " x $23\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric D strip to the top of the newly sewn strip lengthwise to make (1) Unit 11 rectangle (Fig. 17). Repeat to make a second Unit 11 rectangle.

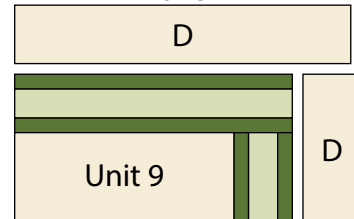

17. Sew (1) $2\frac{1}{2}$ " x $12\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric D strip to the bottom of (1) Unit 3 square lengthwise. Sew (1) Unit 10 rectangle to the left side of the newly sewn block and (1) Unit 11 rectangle to the right side to make the Inner Top Border (Fig. 18).

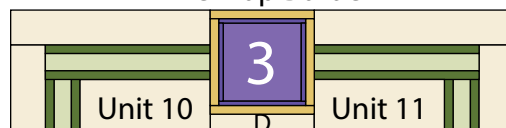

18. Repeat Step 17 and refer to Figure 19 for component identification, placement and orientation to make the Inner Bottom Border.

Inner Bottom Border

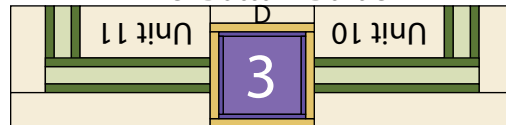

19. Sew (1) $3\frac{1}{2}$ " x $78\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric D strip to each side of (1) $6\frac{1}{2}$ " x $78\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric C strip lengthwise to make the Outer Left Side Border (Fig. 21).

20. Repeat Step 19 and refer to Figure 21 for fabric identification, placement and orientation to make the Outer Right Side Border.

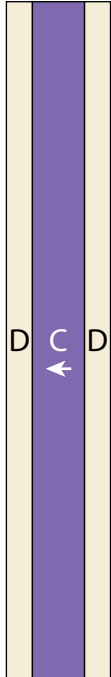

Side Border

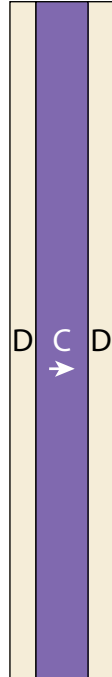

21. Sew (1) $3\frac{1}{2}$ " x $58\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric D strip to the top and to bottom of (1) $6\frac{1}{2}$ " x $58\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric C strip lengthwise. Sew (1) Block Two square to each end of the newly sewn strip to make the Outer Top Border (Fig. 22).

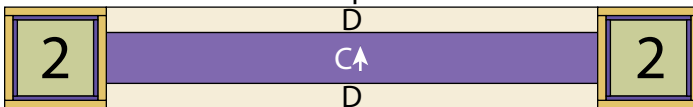

22. Repeat Step 21 and refer to Figure 23 for component identification, placement and orientation to make the Outer Bottom Border.

Outer Bottom Border

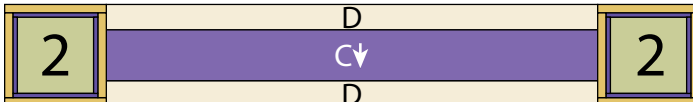

Quilt Top Assembly

(Follow the Quilt Layout while assembling the quilt top.)

23. Sew (1) $2\frac{1}{2}$ " x $50\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric D strip to each side of the Center Block.

24. Sew the Inner Left Side Border and Inner Right Side Borders to the left and to the right sides of the Center Block.

25. Sew the Inner Top Border and Inner Bottom Border to the top and to the bottom of the Center Block.

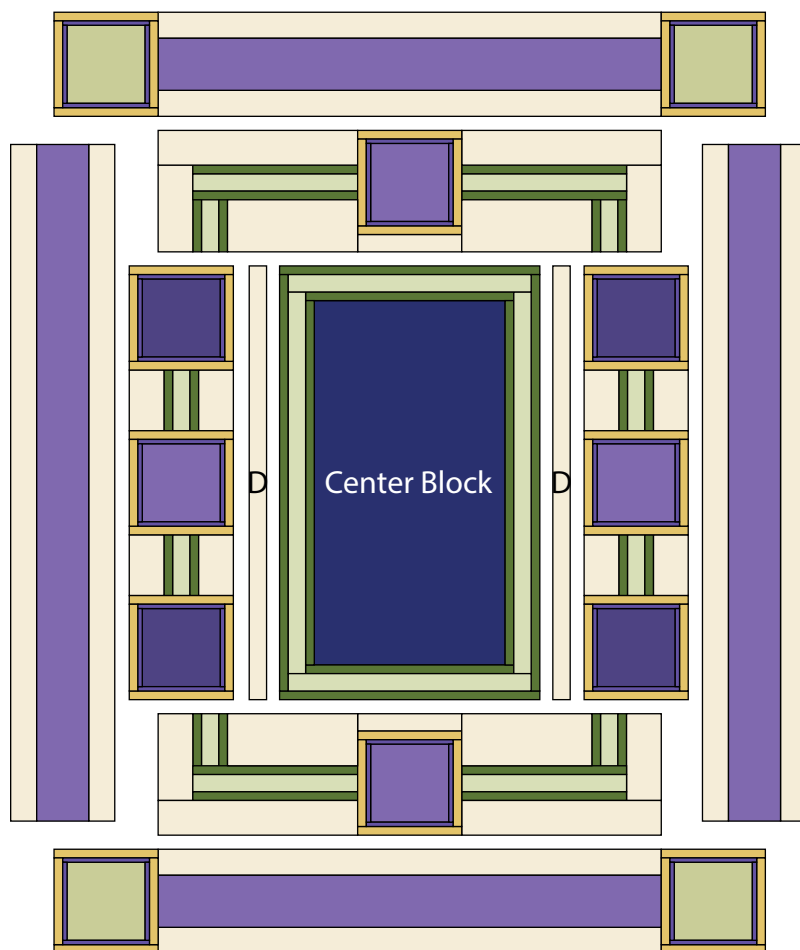
26. Sew the Outer Left Side Border and Outer Right Side Borders to the left and to the right sides of the Center Block.

27. Sew the Outer Top Border and the Outer Bottom Border to the top and to the bottom of the Center Block to make the quilt top.

28. Layer and quilt as desired.

29. Sew the (10) $2\frac{1}{2}$ " x WOF Fabric F strips together, end to end with 45-degree seams, to make the binding. Fold this long strip in half lengthwise with wrong sides together and press.

30. Bind as desired.
