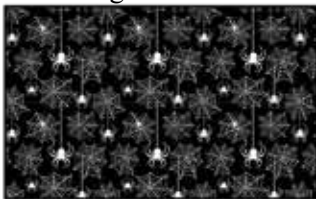

½ yard	Black Hats Glow - Orange (B)	319G-33
¼ yard	Ghosts Glow - Black (C)	317G-99
¼ yard	Spiderweb Glow - Orange (D)	323G-33
⅜ yard	Words Glow - Multi (E)	318G-90
1 ½ yards	Novelty Stripe Glow - Multi (F)	315G-39
¾ yard	Bias Plaid Glow - Multi (G)	321G-39*
1 ½ yards	Ghosts Glow - Orange (Backing)	317G-33

*Includes binding

Runner Cutting Instructions

Please note: All strips are cut across the width of fabric (WOF) from selvage to selvage edge unless otherwise noted.

From the Pumpkin Allover Glow - Black (A), cut:

- (1) 1 ¼" x WOF strip. Sub-cut (2) 1 ¼" x 9 ½" strips.
- (2) Template 2 triangles.

From the Black Hats Glow - Orange (B), cut:

- (1) 2" x WOF strip. Sub-cut (2) 2" x 9 ½" strips and (2) 1 ¼" x 9 ½" strips.
- (1) 2" x WOF strip. Sub-cut (4) 2" x 6 ½" strips.
- (2) Template 1 triangles.
- (2) Template 3 triangles.

From the Ghosts Glow - Black (C), cut:

- (1) 1 ¼" x 9 ½" WOF strip.
- (1) Template 2 triangle.

From the Spiderweb Glow - Orange (D), cut:

- (1) 2" x WOF strip. Sub-cut (1) 2" x 9 ½" strip, (2) 2" x 6 ½" strips and (1) 1 ¼" x 9 ½" strip.
- (1) Template 1 triangle.
- (1) Template 3 triangle.

From the Words Glow - Multi (E), cut:

- (1) 9 ½" x WOF strip. Sub-cut (4) 9 ½" x 1 ½" strips and (2) 1 ½" x 31 ½" WOF strips.

From the Novelty Stripe Glow - Multi (F), cut:

- (2) 6 ½" x 47" Length of Fabric (LOF) strips.
- (2) 6 ½" x 27" LOF strips.

From the Bias Plaid Glow - Multi (G), cut:

- (4) 2 ½" x WOF strips for the binding.

From the Ghost Glow - Orange (Backing), cut:

- (1) 51" x 31 strip for the back.

Runner Block Assembly

Note: The arrows in figures represent the fabric print direction. Pay attention to the fabric and unit orientations when assembling the various components. Use a ¼" seam allowance with right sides together (RST) unless otherwise noted.

1. Place (1) Fabric B Template 1 triangle on top of (1) Fabric A Template 2 triangle, right sides together, aligning the left sides (Fig. 1). Sew the (2) triangles together along the left side. Press the smaller triangle open.

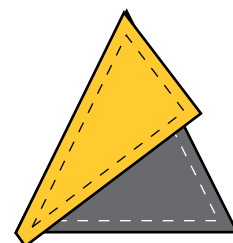

2. Place (1) Fabric B Template 3 triangle on top of the Fabric A Template 2 triangle, right sides together, aligning the right sides (Fig. 2). Sew the (2) triangles together along the right side. Press the smaller triangle open to make (1) Unit 1 square (Fig. 3). Trim to measure 6 ½" square.

3. Repeat Steps 1-2 to make a second Unit 1 square.

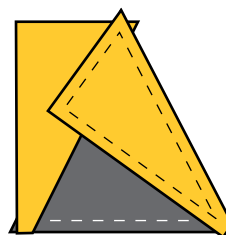

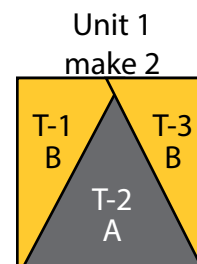

4. Repeat Steps 1-2 and refer to Figure 4 for fabric identification, placement and orientation to make (1) Unit 2 square.

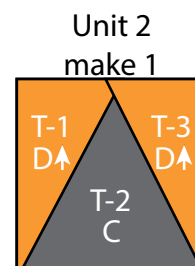

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Table Set

5. Sew (1) $1\frac{1}{4}$ " x $9\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric A strip to the top of (1) $1\frac{1}{4}$ " x $9\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric B strip lengthwise to make (1) Unit 3 strip (Fig. 5). Repeat to make a second Unit 3 strip.

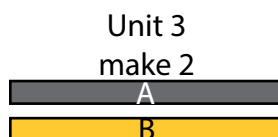

6. Sew (1) $1\frac{1}{4}$ " x $9\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric C strip to the top of (1) $1\frac{1}{4}$ " x $9\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric D strip lengthwise to make (1) Unit 4 strip (Fig. 6).

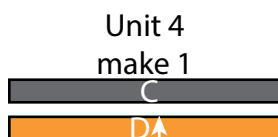

7. Sew (1) 2 " x $6\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric B strip to each side of (1) Unit 1 square. Sew (1) 2 " x $9\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric B strip to the top of the newly sewn strip. Sew (1) Unit 3 strip to the bottom of the newly sewn strip to make (1) $9\frac{1}{2}$ " Block One square (Fig. 7). Repeat to make a second Block One square.

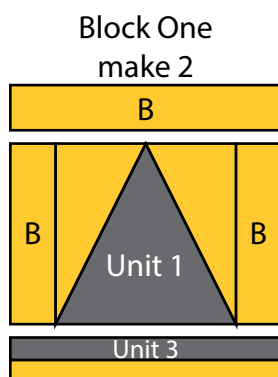

8. Sew (1) 2 " x $6\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric D strip to each side of (1) Unit 2 square. Sew (1) 2 " x $9\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric D strip to the top of the newly sewn strip. Sew (1) Unit 4 strip to the bottom of the newly sewn strip to make (1) $9\frac{1}{2}$ " Block Two square (Fig. 8).

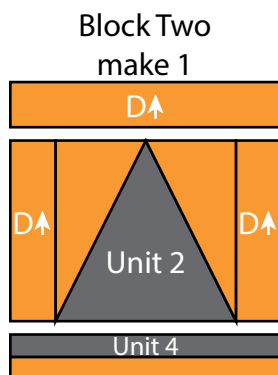

9. Sew (1) $1\frac{1}{2}$ " x $9\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric E strip to each side of (1) Block Two square. Sew (1) Block One square to each end of the newly sewn strip to make the Runner Center Block (Fig. 9).

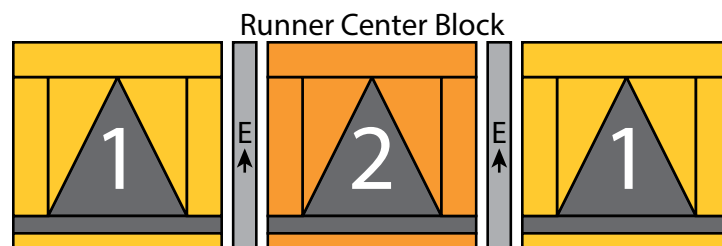

Runner Assembly

(Follow the Runner Layout while assembling the runner.)

10. Sew (1) $1\frac{1}{2}$ " x $9\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric E strip to each side of the Runner Center Block. Sew (1) $1\frac{1}{2}$ " x $31\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric E strip to the top and to the bottom of the Runner Center Block.

11. Center (1) $6\frac{1}{2}$ " x 27 " Fabric F strip on (1) side of the Runner Center Block and pin in place. Start sewing the strip a $\frac{1}{4}$ " from the top edge of the block and stop a $\frac{1}{4}$ " from the bottom edge. **DO NOT TRIM THE EXCESS.** Repeat with the opposite side.

12. Repeat Step 11 to sew (1) $6\frac{1}{2}$ " x 47 " Fabric F strip to the top and to the bottom of the Runner Center Block, making sure to stop and start $\frac{1}{4}$ " away from each end of the block. To miter each corner, fold the Center Block on a diagonal, wrong side together. This should line up the strips from adjacent sides (Fig. 10).

13. Starting at the sewn seam (represented by the arrow in Figure 10), draw a 45-degree line to the edge of the fabric. Sew on the drawn line. Trim the excess fabric leaving a $\frac{1}{4}$ " seam. Repeat this step with the remaining corners to make the Runner Top.

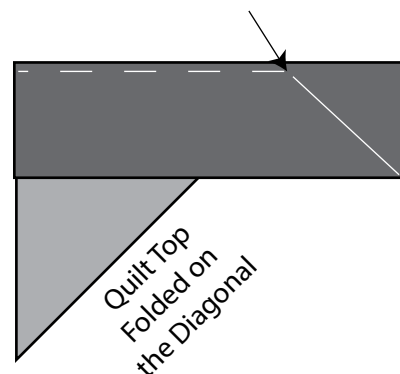

14. Layer and quilt as desired.

15. Sew the (4) 2 ½" x WOF Fabric G strips together, end to end with 45-degree seams, to make the binding. Fold this long strip in half lengthwise with wrong sides together and press.

16. Bind as desired.

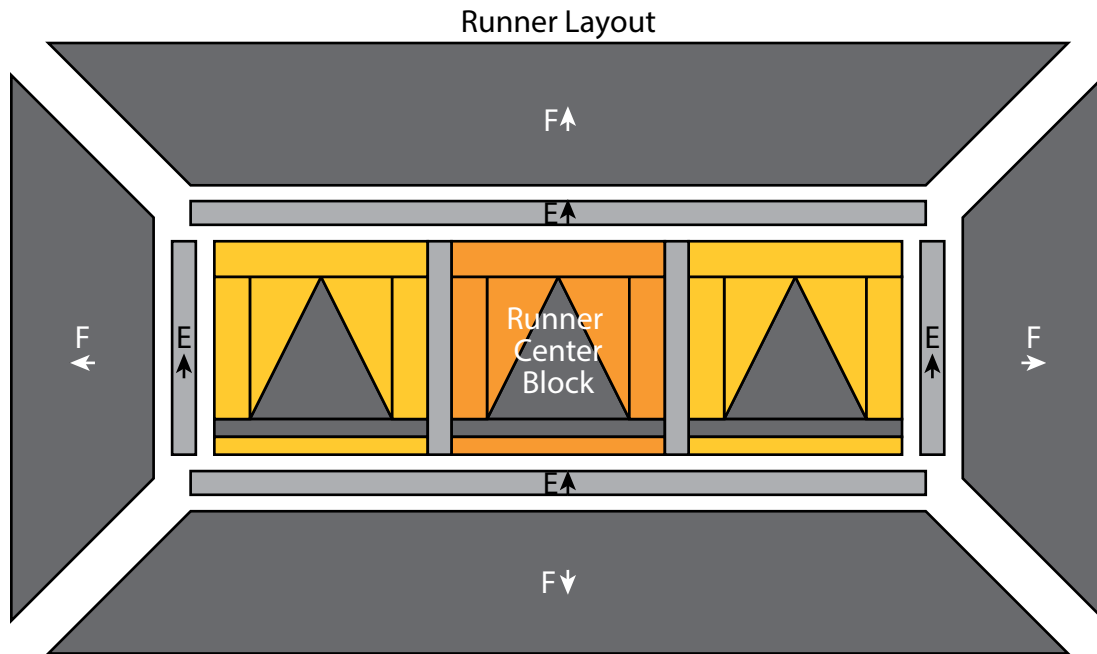

¼ yard	Ghosts Glow - Orange (E)	317G-33
¼ yard	Ghosts Glow - Black (F)	317G-99
¼ yard	Pumpkins Allover Glow - Black (G)	322G-99
¾ yard	Bias Plaid Glow - Multi (H)	321G-39*
1 ⅔ yards	Patchwork Glow - Multi (Backing)	320G-39

Place Mat Cutting Instructions

Please note: All strips are cut across the width of fabric (WOF) from selvage to selvage unless otherwise noted.

From the 6 Block 24 inch repeat Glow - Multi (A):

- Fussy cut (6) 11" squares with (3) centered on orange blocks and (3) centered on black blocks.

From the Spiderweb Glow - Black (B), cut:

- (2) 2" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (6) 2" x 11" strips.
- (2) 2" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (6) 2" x 14" strips.
- (1) 2" x WOF strip. Sub-cut (6) 2" x 3 ½" strips.

From the Spiderweb Glow - Orange (C), cut:

- (2) 2" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (6) 2" x 11" strips.
- (2) 2" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (6) 2" x 14" strips.
- (1) 2" x WOF strip. Sub-cut (6) 2" x 3 ½" strips.

From the Black Cats & Pumpkins Glow - Orange (D), cut:

- (1) 3 ½" x WOF strip. Sub-cut (6) 3 ½" squares.

From the Ghosts Glow - Orange (E), cut:

- (1) 3 ½" x WOF strip. Sub-cut (3) 3 ½" squares.

From the Ghosts Glow - Black (F), cut:

- (1) 3 ½" x WOF strip. Sub-cut (6) 3 ½" squares.

From the Pumpkins Allover Glow - Black (G), cut:

- (1) 3 ½" x WOF strip. Sub-cut (3) 3 ½" squares.

From the Bias Plaid Glow - Multi (H), cut:

- (10) 2 ½" x WOF strips for the binding.

From the Patchwork Glow - Multi (Backing), cut:

- (3) 19" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (6) 19" x 16" rectangles for the backs.

Place Mat Block Assembly

Note: The arrows in figures represent the fabric print direction. Pay attention to the fabric and unit orientations when assembling the various components. Use a ¼" seam allowance with right sides together (RST) unless otherwise noted.

17. Sew (1) 2" x 11" Fabric B strip to each side of (1) 11" Fabric A (Orange) square. Sew (1) 2" x 14" Fabric B strip to the top and to the bottom of the Fabric A (Orange) square to make (1) Block Three square (Fig. 12). **Trim the block to measure 12 ½" x 12 ½"**. Repeat to make (3) Block Three squares total.

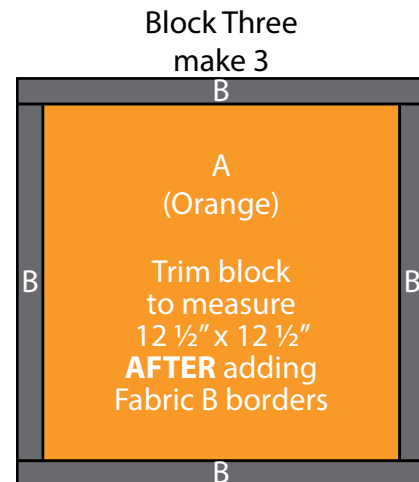

18. Sew (1) 2" x 11" Fabric C strip to each side of (1) 11" Fabric A (Black) square. Sew (1) 2" x 14" Fabric C strip to the top and to the bottom of the Fabric A (Black) square to make (1) Block Four square (Fig. 13). **Trim the block to measure 12 ½" x 12 ½"**. Repeat to make (3) Block Four squares total.

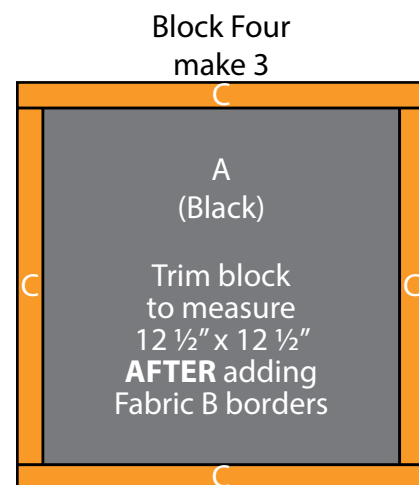

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Table Set

19. Sew together (1) 3 1/2" Fabric D square, (1) 2" x 3 1/2" Fabric B strip, (1) 3 1/2" Fabric E square, (1) 2" x 3 1/2" Fabric B strip and (1) 3 1/2" Fabric D square, in that order from top to bottom, to make (1) Block Five strip (Fig. 14). Repeat to make (3) Block Five strips total.

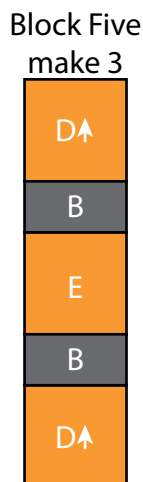

20. Sew together (1) 3 1/2" Fabric F square, (1) 2" x 3 1/2" Fabric C strip, (1) 3 1/2" Fabric G square, (1) 2" x 3 1/2" Fabric C strip and (1) 3 1/2" Fabric F square, in that order from top to bottom, to make (1) Block Six strip (Fig. 15). Repeat to make (3) Block Six strips total.

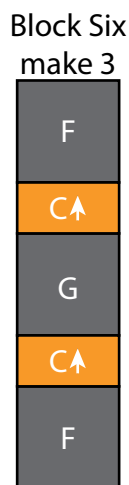

21. Sew (1) Block Five strip to the right side of (1) Block Three square to make (1) Place Mat #1 top (Fig. 16). Repeat to make (3) Place Mat #1 tops total.

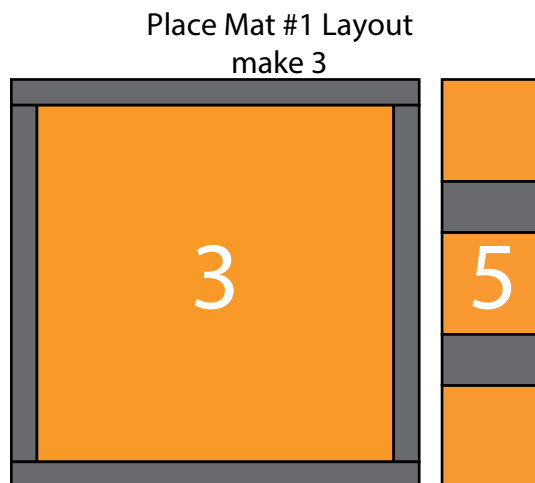

22. Sew (1) Block Six strip to the right side of (1) Block Four square to make (1) Place Mat #2 top (Fig. 17). Repeat to make (3) Place Mat #2 tops total.

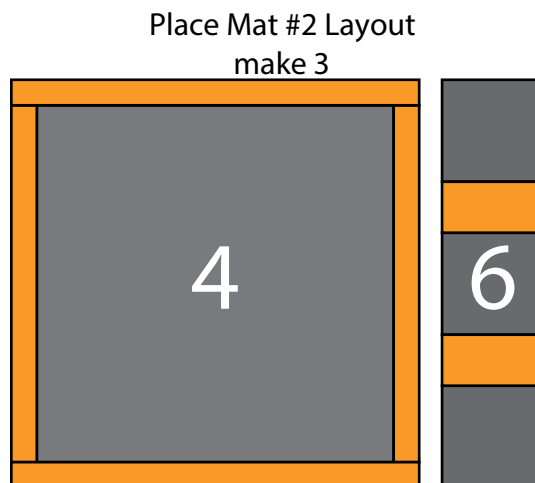

23. Layer and quilt as desired.

24. Sew the (10) 2 1/2" x WOF Fabric H strips together, end to end with 45-degree seams, to make the binding. Fold this long strip in half lengthwise with wrong sides together and press.

25. Bind as desired.

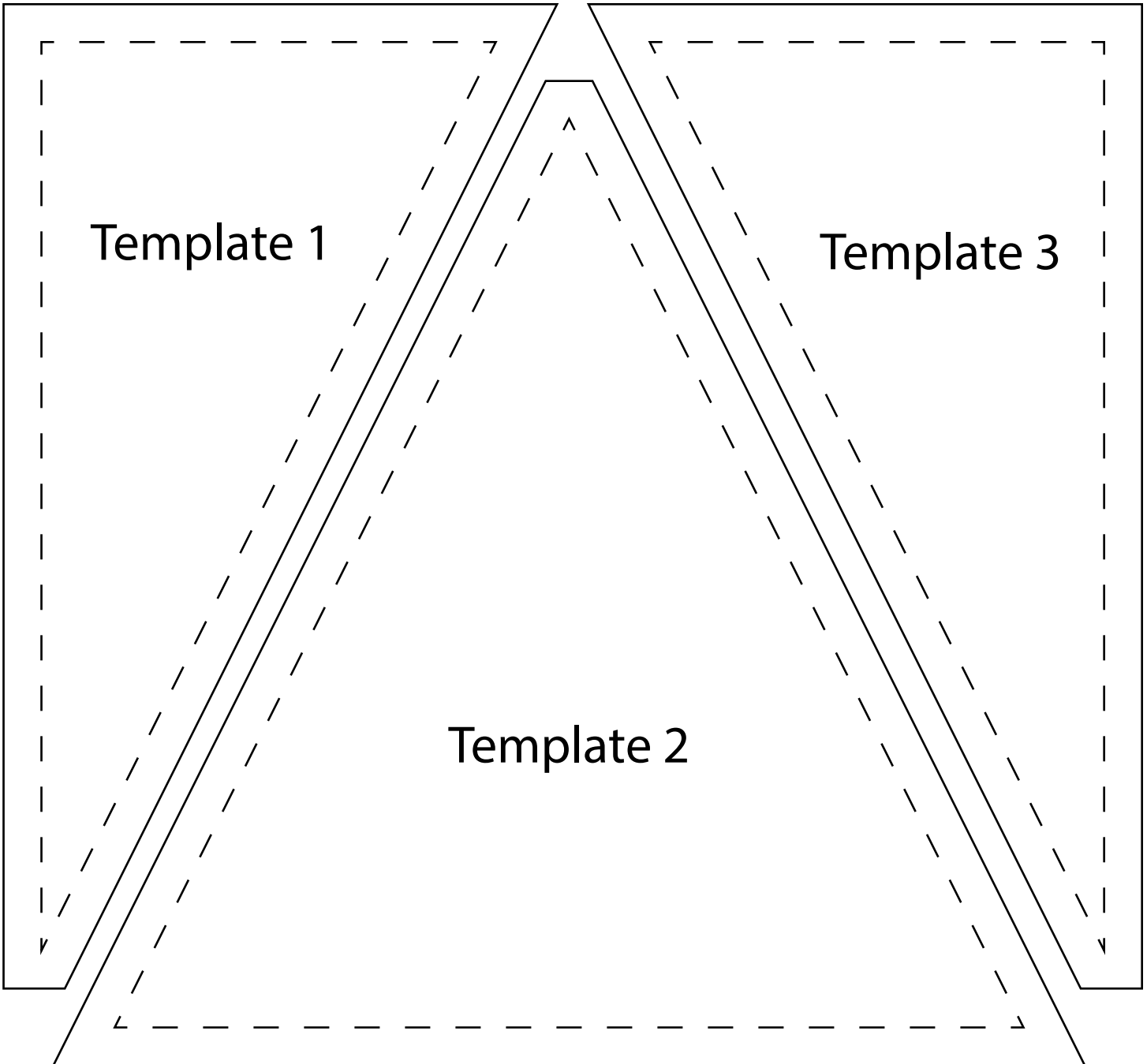
