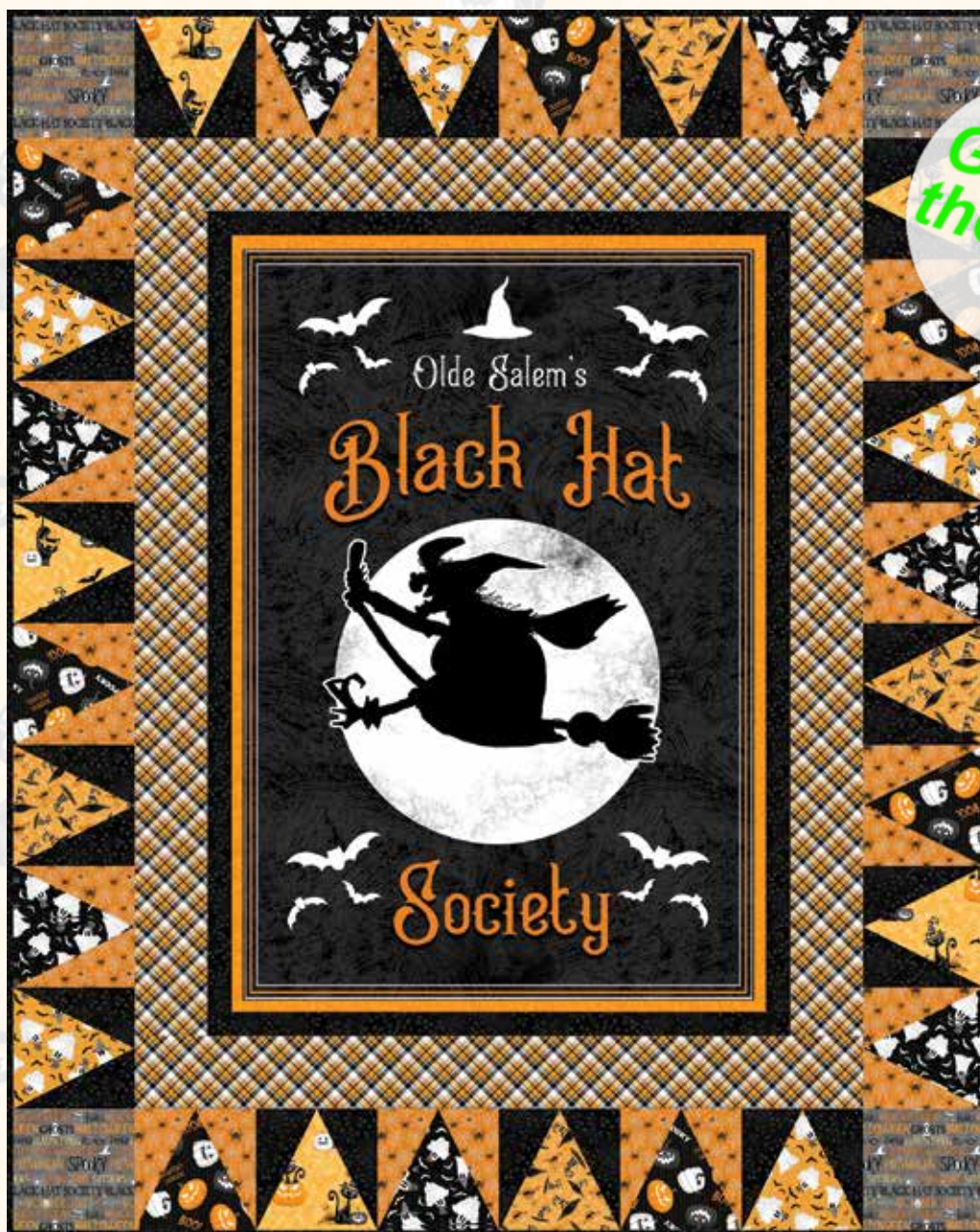

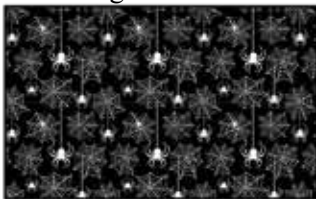

1 yard	Folio Basics - Black (B)	7755-99*
½ yard	Bias Plaid Glow - Multi (C)	321G-39
¼ yard	Black Cats & Pumpkins Glow - Orange (D)	316G-33
¼ yard	Ghosts Glow - Black (E)	317G-99
¼ yard	Ghosts Glow - Orange (F)	317G-33
¼ yard	Pumpkins Allover Glow - Black (G)	322G-99
¼ yard	Black Hats Glow - Orange (H)	319G-33
¾ yard	Spiderweb Glow - Orange (I)	323G-33
¼ yard	Words Glow - Multi (J)	318G-90
3 ¼ yards	Patchwork Glow - Multi (Backing)	320G-39

*Includes binding

Cutting Instructions

Please note: All strips are cut across the width of fabric (WOF) from selvage to selvage unless otherwise noted.

From the 24 Inch Panel Glow - Multi (A):

- Fussy cut (1) 22 ½" x 32 ½" rectangle, centered on the panel.

From the Folio Basics - Black (B), cut:

- (2) 2" x 32 ½" WOF strips.
- (2) 2" x 25 ½" WOF strips.
- (14) Template 1 triangles.
- (14) Template 3 triangles.
- (5) 2 ½" x WOF strips for the binding.

From the Bias Plaid Glow - Multi (C), cut:

- (2) 3 ½" x 34 ½" WOF strips.
- (2) 3 ½" x 30 ½" WOF strips.

From the Black Cats & Pumpkins Glow - Orange (D), cut:

- (5) Template 2 triangles. Note: Pay attention to the orientation of the template when cutting the triangles.

From the Ghosts Glow - Black (E), cut:

- (7) Template 2 triangles.

From the Ghosts Glow - Orange (F), cut:

- (5) Template 2 triangles.

From the Pumpkins Allover Glow - Black (G), cut:

- (7) Template 2 triangles.

From the Black Hats Glow - Orange (H), cut:

- (4) Template 2 triangles.

From the Spiderweb Glow - Orange (I), cut:

- (14) Template 1 triangles. Note: (6) are cut LOF and (8) are cut WOF.
- (14) Template 3 triangles. Note: (6) are cut LOF and (8) are cut WOF.

From the Words Glow - Multi (J), cut:

- (1) 5 ½" x WOF strip. Sub-cut (4) 5 ½" squares.

From the Patchwork Glow - Multi (Backing), cut:

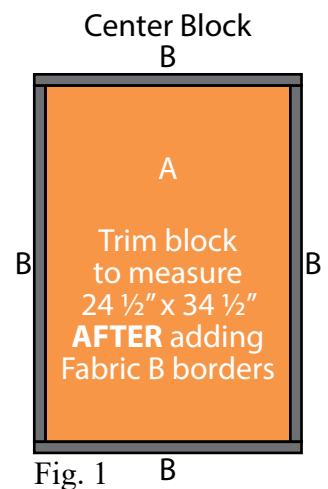
- (2) 58" x WOF strips for the backing. Sew the strips together and trim to make the 48" x 58" back.

Block Assembly

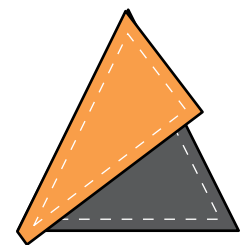
Note: The arrows in figures represent the fabric print direction. Pay attention to the fabric and unit orientations when assembling the various components. Use a ¼" seam allowance with right sides together (RST) unless otherwise noted.

1. Sew (1) 2" x 32 ½"

Fabric B strip to each side of the 22 ½" x 32 ½" Fabric A rectangle. Sew (1) 2" x 25 ½" Fabric B strip to the top and to the bottom of the Fabric A rectangle to make the Center Block (Fig. 1). Trim the block to measure 24 ½" x 34 ½".



2. Place (1) Fabric I Template 1 triangle on top of (1) Fabric G Template 2 triangle, right sides together, aligning the left sides (Fig. 2). Sew the (2) triangles together along the left side. Press the smaller triangle open.



3. Place (1) Fabric I Template 3 triangle on top of the Fabric G Template 2 triangle, right sides together, aligning the right sides (Fig. 3). Sew the (2) triangles together along the right side. Press the smaller triangle open to make (1) Unit 1 square (Fig. 4). Trim to measure 5 ½" square.

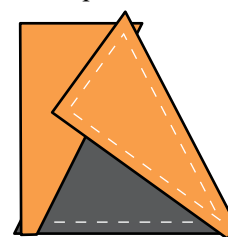

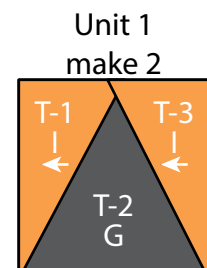

4. Repeat Steps 2-3 to make a second Unit 1 square.

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5. Repeat Steps 2-3 and refer to Figures 5-17 for fabric identification, placement and orientation to make the indicated number of 5 1/2" unit squares for Unit 2 through Unit 14.

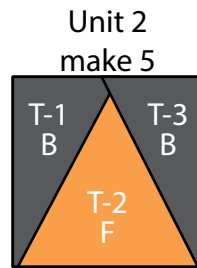

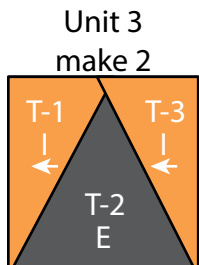

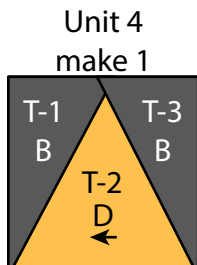

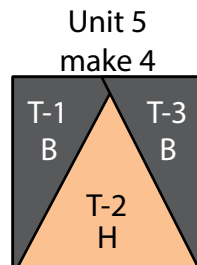

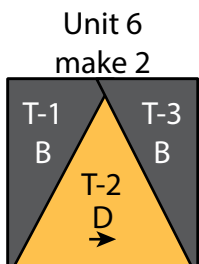

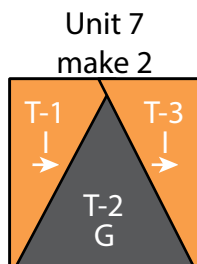

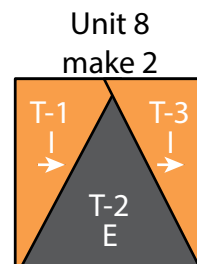

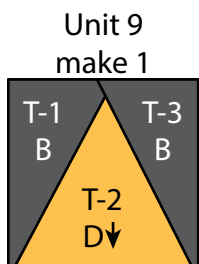

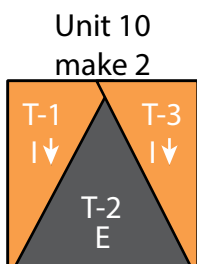

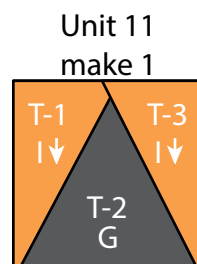

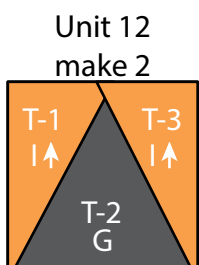

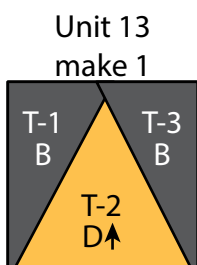

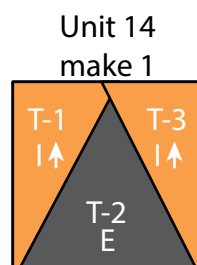

6. Follow Figure 18 and sew together (8) assorted Units to make the Left Side Border.

7. Follow Figure 19 and sew together (8) assorted Units to make the Right Side Border.

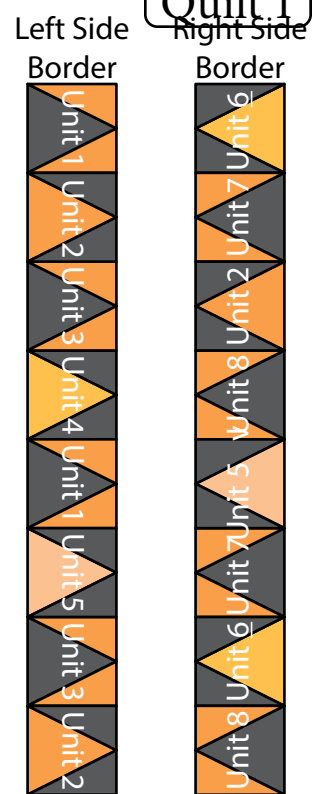

8. Sew (6) assorted Units together. Sew (1) 5 1/2" Fabric J square to each end of the newly sewn strip to make the Top Border (Fig. 20).

9. Sew (6) assorted Units together. Sew (1) 5 1/2" Fabric J square to each end of the newly sewn strip to make the Bottom Border (Fig. 21).

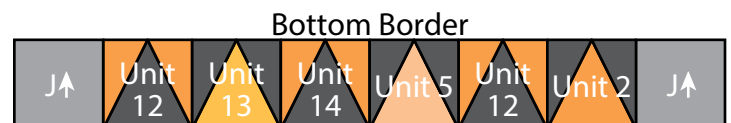

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Quilt Top Assembly

(Follow the Quilt Layout while assembling the quilt top.)

10. Sew (1) $3\frac{1}{2}$ " x $34\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric C strip to each side of the Center Block. Sew (1) $3\frac{1}{2}$ " x $30\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric C strip to the top and to the bottom of the Center Block.

11. Sew the Left Side Border and Right Side Border to the left and to the right sides of the Center Block.

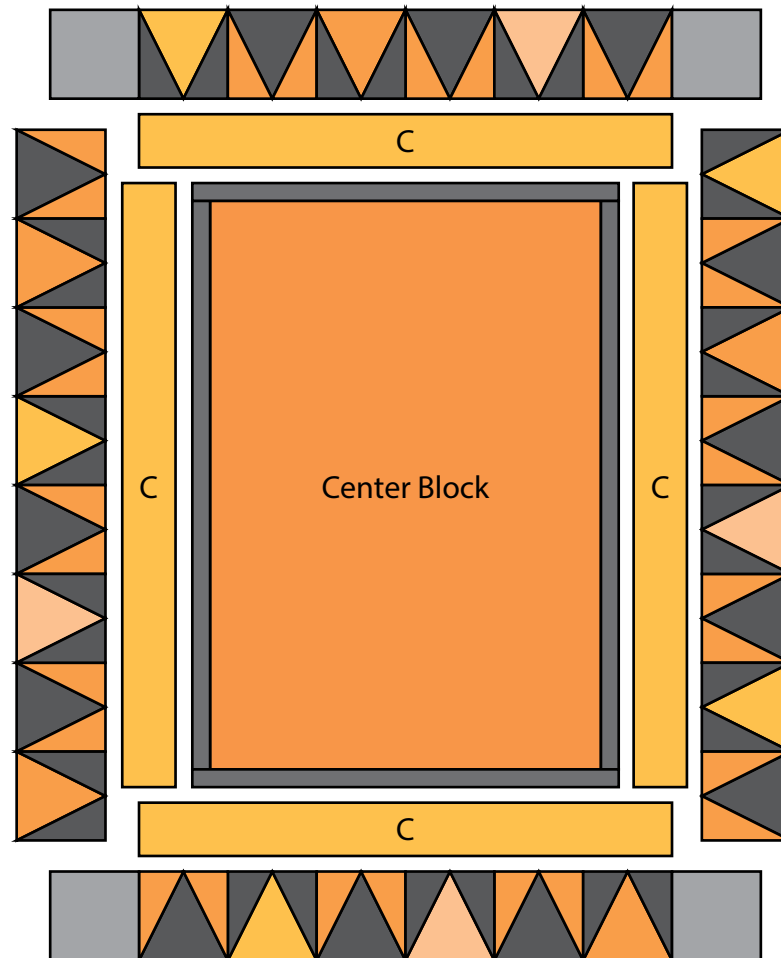
12. Sew the Top Border and Bottom Border to the top and to the bottom of the Center Block to make the quilt top.

13. Layer and quilt as desired.

14. Sew the (5) $2\frac{1}{2}$ " x WOF Fabric B strips together, end to end with 45-degree seams, to make the binding. Fold this long strip in half lengthwise with wrong sides together and press.

15. Bind as desired.

Quilt Layout

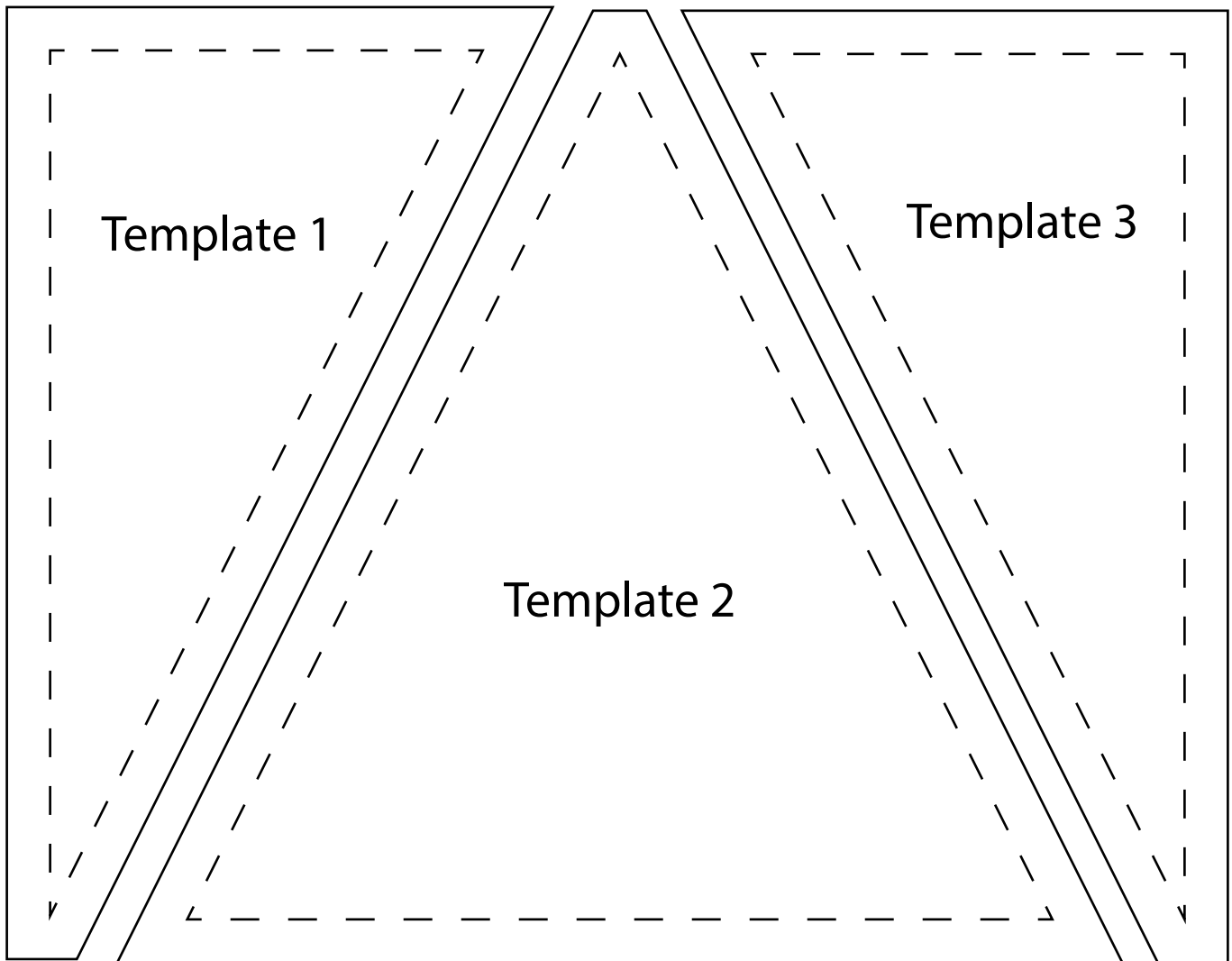
