#### Materials

⅔ yard	Block 24 Inch Repeat - Multi (A)	627-78
1 ½ yards	Folio Basics - True Red (B)	7755-82
2 <sup>1</sup> / <sub>4</sub> yards	Folio Basics - White on White (C)	7755-01
3/8 yard	Stars - Red (D)	630-88
3/8 yard	Stars - Navy (E)	630-77
5/8 yard	Tossed Picnic Baskets - Navy (F)	631-77
⅓ yard	Patterned Stripe - Multi (G)	633-87
1 % yards	Patriotic Trucks - Light Blue (H)	628-11
4 1/8 yards	Stars - Beige (Backing)	630-44

#### **Cutting Instructions**

Please note: All strips are cut across the width of fabric (WOF) from selvage to selvage edge unless otherwise noted.

#### From the Block 24 Inch Repeat - Multi (A):

• Fussy cut (10) 7 ½" x 10 ½" rectangles, each centered on a block.

#### From the Folio Basics - True Red (B), cut:

- (5) 1 ½" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (20) 1 ½" x 10 ½" strips.
- (5) 1 ½" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (20) 1 ½" x 9 ½" strips.
- (3) 1 <sup>1</sup>/<sub>4</sub>" x WOF strips. Sew the strips together end to end with diagonal seams and cut (2) 1 1/4" x 57 1/2" strips.
- (3) 1 1/4" x WOF strips. Sew the strips together end to end with diagonal seams and cut (2) 1 1/4" x 52" strips.
- (8) 1 1/4" x WOF strips. Sew the strips together end to end with diagonal seams and cut (6) 1 1/4" x 50 1/2" strips.
- (7) 2 ½" x WOF strips for the binding.

#### From the Folio Basics - White on White (C), cut:

- (5) 2 \%" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (60) 2 \%" squares.
- (8) 2 ½" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (120) 2 ½" squares.
- (3) 2" x WOF strips. Sew the strips together end to end with diagonal seams and cut (2) 2" x 59" strips.
- (3) 2" x WOF strips. Sew the strips together end to end with diagonal seams and cut (2) 2" x 55" strips.
- (7) 1 ½" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (20) 1 ½" x 11 ½" strips.
- (7) 1 ½" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (20) 1 ½" x 12 ½" strips.
- (5) 1" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (20) 1" x 10 ½" strips.
- (4) 1" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (10) 1" x 12 ½" strips.

#### From the Stars - Red (D), cut:

• (3) 2 1/8" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (30) 2 1/8" squares.

#### From the Stars - Navy (E), cut:

• (3) 2 %" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (30) 2 %" squares.

#### From the Tossed Picnic Baskets - Navy (F), cut:

• (4) 4 ½" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (30) 4 ½" squares.

#### From the Patterned Stripe - Multi (G), cut:

• (4) 2" x WOF strips. Sew the strips together end to end with diagonal seams and cut (3) 2" x 50 ½" strips.

#### From the Patriotic Trucks - Light Blue (H), cut:

- (2) 5 ½" x 62" Length of Fabric (LOF) strips.
- From the remaining fabric, cut (2) 5 ½" x 65" WOF strips, piece as needed.

### From the Stars - Beige (Backing), cut:


• (2) 73" x WOF strips for the backing. Sew the strips together and trim to make the 73" x 80" back.

#### **Block Assembly**

Note: The arrows in figures represent the fabric print direction. Pay attention to the fabric and unit orientations when assembling the various components. Use a 1/4" seam allowance with right sides together (RST) unless otherwise noted.


1. Sew (1) 1 ½" x 10 ½" Fabric B strip to each side of (1) 7 ½" x 10 ½" rectangle. Sew (1) 1 ½" x 9 ½" Fabric B strip to the top and to the bottom of the Fabric A rectangle to make (1) Unit 1 rectangle (Fig. 1). Trim the block to measure

8 ½" x 11 ½". Repeat to make (10) Unit 1 rectangles total.



2. Sew (1) 1 ½" x 11 ½" Fabric C strip to each side of (1) Unit 1 rectangle. Sew (1) 1" x 10 ½" Fabric C strip to the top and to the bottom of the Unit 1 rectangle to make (1)10 ½" x 12 ½" Block One rectangle (Fig. 2). Repeat

to make (10) Block One rectangles total.


3. Place (1) 2 ½" Fabric C square on the top left corner of (1) 4 ½" Fabric F square, right sides together (Fig. 3). Sew across the diagonal of the smaller square from the upper right corner to the lower left corner (Fig. 3). Flip open the triangle formed and press. Trim away the excess fabric from behind the triangle 1/4" away from the sewn seam (Fig. 4).






4. Follow Figure 5 for the seam direction to add a 2 ½" Fabric C square to each of the remaining corners of the 4 1/2" Fabric F square to make (1) Unit 2 square (Fig. 6).

5. Repeat Steps 3-4 to make (30) Unit 2 squares total.






6. Place (1) 2 1/8" Fabric D square on top of (1) 2 1/8" Fabric C square, right sides together. Draw a line across the diagonal of the top square (Fig. 7). Sew 1/4" away from each side of the drawn diagonal line (Fig. 7). Cut the (2) squares apart on the drawn diagonal line (Fig. 8) to make (2) halfsquare triangles. Trim the half-square triangles to measure 2 ½" square to make (2) Unit 3 squares (Fig. 3). Repeat to make (60) Unit 3 squares total.








7. Repeat Step 6 and refer to Figure 10 for fabric identification and placement while using (30) 2 %" Fabric E squares and (30) 2 1/8" Fabric C squares to make (60) Unit 4 squares.




8. Sew (1) Unit 3 square to the left side of (1) Unit 4 square to make the top row. Sew (1) Unit 4 square to the left side of (1) Unit 3 square to make the bottom row. Sew together the (2) rows lengthwise to make (1) 4 ½" Unit 5 square (Fig. 11). Repeat to make (30) Unit 5 squares total.



9. Sew (1) Unit 5 square to the top and bottom of (1) Unit 2 square. Sew the newly sewn strip to the left side of (1) 1" x 12 ½" Fabric C strip. Sew (1) Unit 2 square to the top and bottom of (1) Unit 5 square. Sew the newly sewn strip to the right side of the 1" x 12 ½" Fabric C strip to make (1) Unit 6 strip (Fig. 12). Repeat to make (10) Unit 6 strips total.



10. Sew (1) 1 1/4" x 12 1/2" Fabric C strip to each side of (1) Unit 6 strip lengthwise to make (1) 10 ½" x 12 ½" Block Two rectangle (Fig. 13). Repeat to make (10) Block Two rectangles total.




11. Sew together (3) Block One rectangles and (2) Block Two rectangles, lengthwise and alternating them from left to right, to make Row One (Fig. 14). Repeat to make Row Five.

- 12. Sew (1) 1 1/4" x 50 1/2" Fabric B strip to the top and bottom of (1) 2" x 50 ½" Fabric G strip lengthwise to make Row Two (Fig. 14). Repeat to make Row Four and Row Six.
- 13. Sew together (3) Block Two rectangles and (2) Block One rectangles, lengthwise and alternating them from left to right, to make Row Three (Fig. 14). Repeat to make Row Seven


14. Sew the (7) rows together lengthwise and in numerical order from top to bottom to make the 50 ½" x 57 ½" Center Block (Fig. 14).



#### **Quilt Top Assembly**

(Follow the Quilt Layout while assembling the quilt top.) 15. Sew (1) 1 1/4" x 57 1/2" Fabric B strip to each side of the Center Block. Sew (1) 1 1/4" x 52 1/2" Fabric B strip to the top and to the bottom of the Center Block.

- 16. Sew (1) 2" x 59" Fabric C strip to each side of the Center Block. Sew (1) 2" x 55" Fabric C strip to the top and to the bottom of the Center Block.
- 17. Sew (1) 5 ½" x 62" Fabric H strip to each side of the Center Block. Sew (1) 5 ½" x 65" Fabric H strip to the top and to the bottom of the Center Block to make the quilt top.
- 18. Layer and quilt as desired.
- 19. Sew the (7) 2 ½" x WOF Fabric B strips together, end to end with 45-degree seams, to make the binding. Fold this long strip in half lengthwise with wrong sides together and press.
- 20. Bind as desired.
