Cutting Instructions

Please note: All strips are cut across the width of fabric (WOF) from selvage to selvage edge unless otherwise noted.

From the Patriotic Trucks - Light Blue (A):

• Fussy cut (1) 6 ½" x WOF strip. Sub-cut (4) 6 ½" squares.

From the Stars - Red (B), cut:

- (6) 3 ½" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (64) 3 ½" squares.
- (2) 2" x 36 ½" WOF strips.
- (2) 2" x 39 ½" WOF strips.

From the Stars - Beige (C), cut:

• (3) 3 ½" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (32) 3 ½" squares.

From the Folio Basics - White on White (D), cut:

- (8) 3 ½" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (48) 3 ½" x 6 ½" strips.
- (2) 2 ½" x 39 ½" WOF strips.
- (3) 2 ½" x WOF strips. Sew the strips together end to end with diagonal seams and cut (2) 2 ½" x 43 ½" strips.

From the Tossed Picnic Baskets - Navy (E), cut:

• (3) 3 ½" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (32) 3 ½" squares.

From the Tossed Images in Boxes - Navy (F), cut:

- (3) 6 ½" x WOF strips. Sew the strips together end to end with diagonal seams and cut (2) 6 ½" x 43 ½" strips.
- (3) 6 ½" x WOF strips. Sew the strips together end to end with diagonal seams and cut (2) 6 ½" x 55 ½" strips.

From the Patterned Stripe - Multi (G), cut:

• (6) 2 ½" x WOF strips for the binding.

From the Flags - Multi (Backing), cut:

• (2) 63" x WOF strips for the backing. Sew the strips together and trim to make the 63" x 63" back.

Block Assembly


Note: The arrows in figures represent the fabric print direction. Pay attention to the fabric and unit orientations when assembling the various components. Use a 1/4" seam allowance with right sides together (RST) unless otherwise noted.

1. Place (1) 3 ½" Fabric B square on the left side of (1) 3 ½" x 6 ½" Fabric D strip, right sides together (Fig. 1). Sew across the diagonal of the square from the upper right corner to the lower left corner (Fig. 1). Flip open the triangle formed and press. Trim away the excess fabric from behind the triangle, leaving a ¼" seam allowance (Fig. 2).






- 2. Place another 3 ½" Fabric B square on the right side of the 3 ½" x 6 ½" Fabric D strip, right sides together (Fig. 3). Sew across the diagonal of the square from the upper left corner to the lower right corner (Fig. 3). Flip open the triangle formed and press. Trim away the excess fabric from behind the triangle, leaving a 1/4" seam allowance to make (1) Unit 1 strip (Fig. 4).
- 3. Repeat Steps 1-2 to make (16) Unit 1 strips total.






4. Sew (1) 3 ½" Fabric C square to each end of (1) Unit 1 strip to make the top row. Repeat to make the bottom row. Sew (1) Unit 1 square to each side of (1) 6 ½" Fabric A square to make the middle row. Sew together the (3) rows lengthwise to make (1) 12 ½" Unit 2 square (Fig. 5). Repeat to make (4) Unit 2 squares total.


5. Place (1) 3 ½" Fabric B square on the left side of (1) 3 ½" x 6 ½" Fabric D strip, right sides together (Fig. 6). Sew across the diagonal of the square from the upper right corner to the lower left corner (Fig. 6). Flip open the triangle formed and press. Trim away the excess fabric from behind the triangle, leaving a ½" seam allowance (Fig. 7).






6. Place (1) 3 ½" Fabric E square on the right side of the 3 ½" x 6 ½" Fabric D strip, right sides together (Fig. 8). Sew across the diagonal of the square from the upper right corner to the lower left corner (Fig. 8). Flip open the triangle formed and press. Trim away the excess fabric from behind the triangle, leaving a ¼" seam allowance to make (1) Unit 3 strip (Fig. 9).


7. Repeat Steps 5-6 to make (16) Unit 3 strips total.




8. Repeat Steps 5-6 and refer to Figure 10 for fabric identification, placement and seam direction to make (16) Unit 4 strips.




9. Sew (1) Unit 3 strip to the left end of (1) Unit 4 strip to make (1) Unit 5 strip (Fig. 11). Repeat to make (16) Unit 5 strips total.



10. Sew (1) 3 ½" Fabric C square to each end of (1) Unit 5 strip to make the top row. Repeat to make the bottom row. Sew (1) Unit 5 strip to each side of (1) Unit 2 square to make the middle row. Sew together the (3) rows lengthwise to make (1) 18 ½" Block One square (Fig. 12). Repeat to make (4) Block One squares total.



11. Sew together (4) Block One squares into a 2 x 2 matrix to make the 36 ½" x 36 ½" Center Block (Fig. 13).





Quilt Top Assembly

(Follow the Quilt Layout while assembling the quilt top.) 12. Sew (1) 2" x 36 ½" Fabric B strip to each side of the Center Block. Sew (1) 2" x 39 ½" Fabric B strip to the top and to the bottom of the Center Block.

- 13. Sew (1) 2 ½" x 39 ½" Fabric D strip to each side of the Center Block. Sew (1) 2 ½" x 43 ½" Fabric D strip to the top and to the bottom of the Center Block.
- 14. Sew (1) 6 ½" x 43 ½" Fabric F strip to each side of the Center Block. Sew (1) 6 ½" x 55 ½" Fabric F strip to the top and to the bottom of the Center Block to make the quilt top.

- 15. Layer and quilt as desired.
- 16. Sew the (6) 2 ½" x WOF Fabric G strips together, end to end with 45-degree seams, to make the binding. Fold this long strip in half lengthwise with wrong sides together and press.
- 17. Bind as desired.
