⅓ yard	Diagonal Plaid - Green (B)	9370-66*
5/8 yard	Tossed Clover - Green (C)	9368-66
5/8 yard	Modern Melody Basics - Marigold (D)	1063-48
3/4 yard	Tossed Hats - Black (E)	9371-96
1 ½ yards	Tossed Leprechaun - Multi (F)	9365-16
3 ¹ / ₄ yards	Small Tossed Leprechaun - Green (Ba	acking)

Cutting Instructions

Please note: All strips are cut across the width of fabric (WOF) from selvage to selvage edge unless otherwise noted.

From the Panel - Multi (A):

• Fussy cut (1) 22 ½" x 42 ½" rectangle, centered on the panel.

From the Diagonal Plaid - Green (B), cut:

- (2) 2" x 42 ½" WOF strips, piece as needed.
- (2) 2" x 25 ½" WOF strips.
- (6) 2 ½" x WOF strips for the binding.

From the Tossed Clover - Green (C), cut:

- (5) 2" x WOF strips. Sew the strips together end to end with diagonal seams and cut (4) 2" x 47 ½" strips.
- (2) 2" x 24 ½" WOF strips.

From the Modern Melody Basics - Marigold (D), cut:

- (3) 1 ½" x WOF strips. Sew the strips together end to end with diagonal seams and cut (2) 1 ½" x 47 ½" strips.
- (3) 1 ½" x WOF strips. Sew the strips together end to end with diagonal seams and cut (2) 1 ½" x 42 ½" strips.
- (5) 1" x WOF strips. Sew the strips together end to end with diagonal seams and cut (4) 1" x 47 ½" strips.

From the Tossed Hats - Black (E), cut:

- (3) 3 ½" x WOF strips. Sew the strips together end to end with diagonal seams and cut (2) 3 ½" x 49 ½" strips.
- (3) 3 ½" x WOF strips. Sew the strips together end to end with diagonal seams and cut (2) 3 ½" x 48 ½" strips.

From the Tossed Leprechaun - Multi (F), cut:

• (2) 4 ½" x 47 ½" Length of Fabric (LOF) strips.

From the Small Tossed Leprechaun - Green (Backing), cut:


• (2) 56" x WOF strips for the backing. Sew the strips together and trim to make the 56" x 63" back.

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Block Assembly

Note: The arrows in figures represent the fabric print direction. Pay attention to the fabric and unit orientations when assembling the various components.

1. Sew (1) 2" x 42 ½" Fabric B strip to each side of (1) 22 ½" x 42 ½" Fabric A panel. Sew (1) 2" x 25 ½" Fabric B strip to the top and to the bottom of the Fabric A panel to make the Center Block (Fig. 1). **Trim the block to measure 24** ½" x 44 ½".



Unit 1

2. Sew (1) 1" x 47 ½" Fabric D strip to each side of (1) 4 ½" x 47 ½" Fabric F strip. Sew (1) 2" x 47 ½" Fabric C strip to each side of the newly sewn strip to make (1) Unit 1 strip (Fig. 2). Repeat to make a second Unit 1 strip.




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Quilt Top Assembly

(Follow the Quilt Layout while assembling the quilt top.)

- 3. Sew (1) Unit 1 strip to each side of the Center block.
- 4. Sew (1) 1 ½" x 47 ½" Fabric D strip to each side of the Center Block. Sew (1) 1 ½" x 42 ½" Fabric D strip to the top and to the bottom of the Center Block
- 5. Sew (1) 3 ½" x 49 ½" Fabric E strip to each side of the Center Block. Sew (1) 3 ½" x 48 ½" Fabric E strip to the top and to the bottom of the Center Block.

- 6. Layer and quilt as desired.
- 7. Sew the (6) 2 ½" x WOF Fabric B strips together, end to end with 45-degree seams, to make the binding. Fold this long strip in half lengthwise with wrong sides together and press.
- 8. Bind as desired.
