1/3 yard	Harvest Plaid - Green (E)	2670-66
2/3 yard	Folio - Off White (F)	7755-04
1/2 yard	Harvest Marble - Pumpkin (G)	2668-35
3/8 yard	Folio - Sepia Brown (H)	7755-39
1 1/4 yards	Swirls - Cream (I)	2669-33
1/4 yard	Sunflower - Black (J)	2662-99
1/4 yard	Swirls - Pumpkin (K)	2669-35
5 1/2 yards	Daisy Bouquet - Cream (Backing)	2667-33

### Cutting Instructions

*Please note: All strips are cut across the width of fabric (WOF) from selvage to selvage edge unless otherwise noted.*

#### From the Harvest Panel - Cream (A):

- Fussy cut (1) 41 1/2" x 35 1/2" rectangle centered on the panel.

#### From the Folio - Black (B), cut:

- (2) 2 1/2" x 35 1/2" WOF strips.
- (3) 2 1/2" x WOF strips. Sew the strips together end to end with diagonal seams and cut (2) 2 1/2" x 45 1/2" strips.
- (8) 2 1/2" x WOF strips for the binding.

#### From the Border Stripe - Cream (C), cut:

- (1) 80 1/2" x WOF strip. Fussy cut (2) 4 1/2" x 80 1/2" strips from the dark brown and (2) 8 1/2" x 64" strips from the inner light colors.
- (1) 70 1/2" x WOF strip. Fussy cut (2) 4 1/2" x 70 1/2" strips from the dark brown and (2) 8 1/2" x 58" strips from the inner light colors.

#### From the Pumpkin Toss - Pumpkin (D), cut:

- (1) 4 1/2" x WOF strip. Sub-cut (6) 4 1/2" squares.

#### From the Harvest Plaid - Green (E), cut:

- (3) 2 1/2" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (48) 2 1/2" squares.

#### From the Folio - Off White (F), cut:

- (5) 2 1/2" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (40) 2 1/2" x 4 1/2" strips.
- (3) 2 1/2" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (40) 2 1/2" squares.

#### From the Harvest Marble - Pumpkin (G), cut:

- (5) 2 1/2" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (40) 2 1/2" x 4 1/2" strips.

#### From the Folio - Sepia Brown (H), cut:

- (3) 2 7/8" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (40) 2 7/8" squares.

#### From the Swirls - Cream (I), cut:

- (3) 2 7/8" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (40) 2 7/8" squares.
- (8) 2 1/2" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (120) 2 1/2" squares.
- (4) 1 1/2" x WOF strips. Sew the strips together end to end with diagonal seams and cut (2) 1 1/2" x 78 1/2" strips.
- (4) 1 1/2" x WOF strips. Sew the strips together end to end with diagonal seams and cut (2) 1 1/2" x 62 1/2" strips.

#### From the Sunflower - Black (J), cut:

- (1) 4 1/2" x WOF strip. Sub-cut (4) 4 1/2" squares.

#### From the Swirls - Pumpkin (K), cut:

- (2) 2 1/2" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (32) 2 1/2" squares.

#### From the Daisy Bouquet - Cream (Backing), cut:

- (2) 96" x WOF strips for the backing. Sew the strips together and trim to make the 78" x 96" back.

### Block Assembly

*Note: The arrows in figures represent the fabric print direction. Pay attention to the fabric and unit orientations when assembling the various components.*

1. Sew (1) 2 1/2" x 35 1/2"

Fabric B strip to each side of the 41 1/2" x 35 1/2" Fabric A panel. Sew (1) 2 1/2" x 45 1/2" Fabric B strip to the top and to the bottom of the Fabric A panel to make the Center Block (Fig. 1). **Trim the block to measure 44 1/2" x 38 1/2"**.

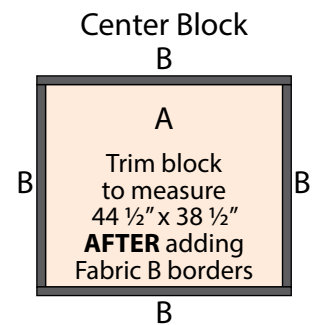

2. Place (1) 2 7/8" Fabric H square on top of (1) 2 7/8" Fabric I square, right sides together. Draw a line across the diagonal of the top square (Fig. 2). Sew 1/4" away from each side of the drawn diagonal line (Fig. 2). Cut the (2) squares apart on the drawn diagonal line (Fig. 3) to make (2) half-square triangles. Trim the half-square triangles to measure 2 1/2" square to make (2) Unit 1 squares (Fig. 4). Repeat to make (80) Unit 1 squares total.

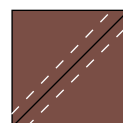

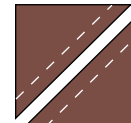

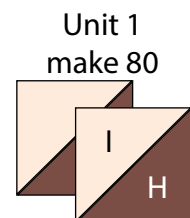

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3. Sew (1) 2 ½" Fabric I square to the left side of (1) Unit 1 square to make the top row. Sew (1) Unit 1 square to the left side of (1) 2 ½" Fabric F square to make the bottom row. Sew the (2) rows together lengthwise to make (1) Unit 2 square (Fig. 5). Repeat to make (40) Unit 2 squares total.

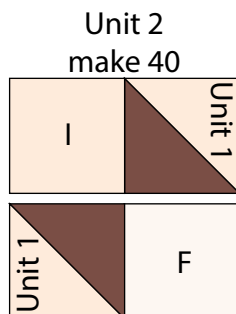

4. Place (1) 2 ½" Fabric I square on the left side of (1) 2 ½" x 4 ½" Fabric G strip, right sides together (Fig. 6). Sew across the diagonal of the square from the upper right corner to the lower left corner (Fig. 6). Flip open the triangle formed and press. Trim away the excess fabric from behind the triangle, leaving a ¼" seam allowance (Fig. 7).

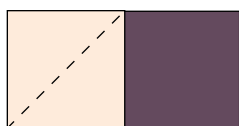

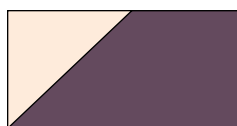

5. Place another 2 ½" Fabric I square on the right side of the 2 ½" x 4 ½" Fabric G strip, right sides together (Fig. 8). Sew across the diagonal of the square from the upper left corner to the lower right corner (Fig. 8). Flip open the triangle formed and press. Trim away the excess fabric from behind the triangle, leaving a ¼" seam allowance to make (1) Unit 3 strip (Fig. 9).

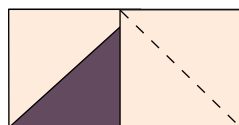

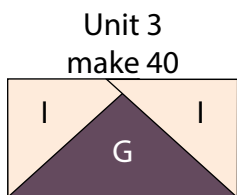

6. Repeat Steps 4-5 to make (40) Unit 3 strips total.

7. Repeat Steps 4-5 and refer to Figures 10-11 for fabric identification, location and seam direction to make (24) Unit 4 strips and (16) Unit 5 strips.

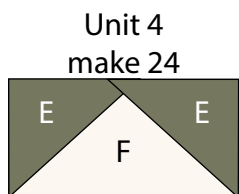

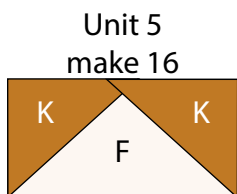

8. Sew (1) Unit 3 strip to the top of (1) Unit 4 strip lengthwise to make (1) Unit 6 square (Fig. 12). Repeat to make (24) Unit 6 squares total.

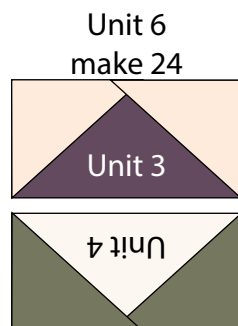

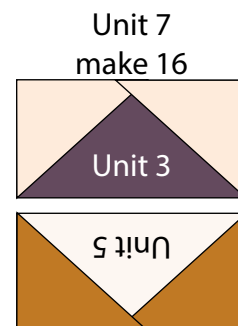

10. Sew (1) Unit 2 square to each side of (1) Unit 6 square to make the top row. Repeat to make the bottom row. Sew (1) Unit 6 square to each side of (1) 4 ½" Fabric D square to make the middle row. Sew the (3) rows together lengthwise to make (1) Block One square (Fig. 14). Repeat to make (6) Block One squares total.

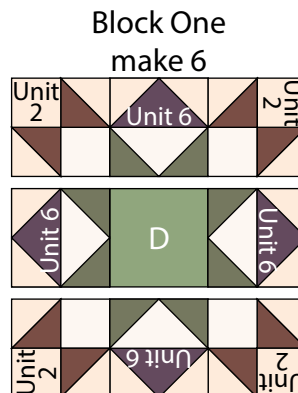

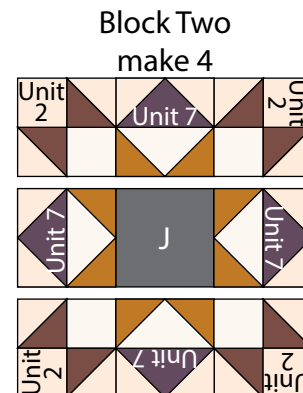

11. Sew (1) Unit 2 square to each side of (1) Unit 7 square to make the top row. Repeat to make the bottom row. Sew (1) Unit 7 square to each side of (1) 4 ½" Fabric J square to make the middle row. Sew the (3) rows together lengthwise to make (1) Block Two square (Fig. 15). Repeat to make (4) Block Two squares total.



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12. Sew together (3) Block One squares and (2) Block Two squares, alternating them from left to right, to make the Top Border (Fig. 16). Repeat to make the Bottom Border.

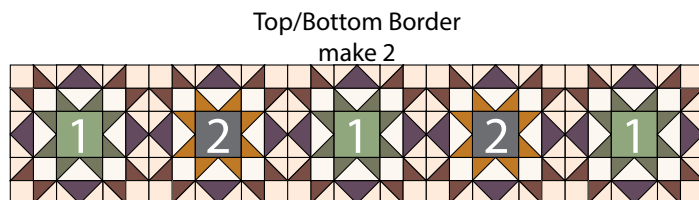

### Quilt Top Assembly

*(Follow the Quilt Layout while assembling the quilt top.)*

13. Center (1) 8 1/2" x 58" Fabric C strip on (1) side of the Center Block and pin in place. Start sewing the strip a 1/4" from the top edge of the block and stop a 1/4" from the bottom edge. **DO NOT TRIM THE EXCESS.** Repeat with the opposite side.

14. Repeat Step 13 to sew (1) 8 1/2" x 64" Fabric C strip to the top and to the bottom of the Center Block, making sure to stop and start 1/4" away from each end of the block. To miter each corner, fold the Center Block on a diagonal, wrong side together. This should line up the strips from adjacent sides (Fig. 17).

15. Starting at the sewn seam (represented by the arrow in Figure 17), draw a 45-degree line to the edge of the fabric. Sew on the drawn line. Trim the excess fabric leaving a 1/4" seam. Repeat this step with the remaining corners.

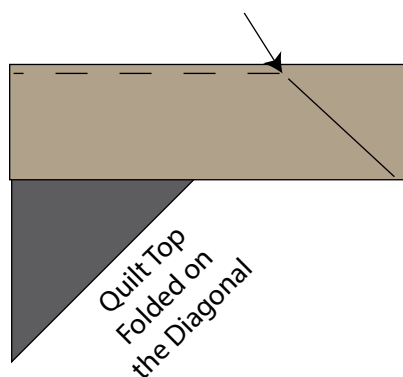

16. Sew the Top Border and Bottom Border to the top and to the bottom of the Center Block.

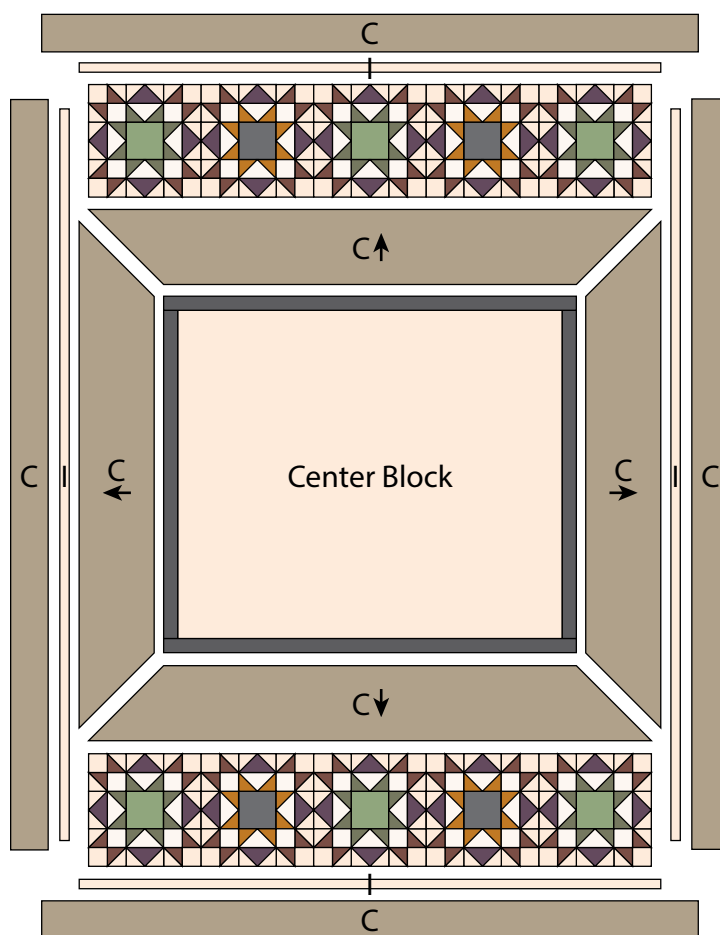
17. Sew (1) 1 1/2" x 78 1/2" Fabric I strip to each side of the Center Block. Sew (1) 1 1/2" x 62 1/2" Fabric I strip to the top and to the bottom of the Center Block.

18. Sew (1) 4 1/2" x 80 1/2" Fabric C strip to each side of the Center Block. Sew (1) 4 1/2" x 70 1/2" Fabric C strip to the top and to the bottom of the Center Block to make the quilt top.

19. Layer and quilt as desired.

20. Sew the (8) 2 1/2" x WOF Fabric B strips together, end to end with 45-degree seams, to make the binding. Fold this long strip in half lengthwise with wrong sides together and press.

21. Bind as desired.
